GEOFFREY FORSHAW – LIFE MEMBER, SURF LIFE SAVING NEW SOUTH WALES

Cronulla's Geoffrey Forshaw's foray into Surf Life Saving began as a 17-year-old when he obtained his Bronze Medallion in 1961. Over the next five decades his passion for the movement would continue to grow as he went on to make significant contributions across a diverse range of areas.

A more than handy surfboat rower in his youth, Geoffrey has held many important positions at club and branch level.

He has held almost every leadership position at his beloved club and has served an incredible 48 years on various committees.

In the late 1980s he served as Sydney Branch President for five years during a time of great change, and was instrumental in overcoming operational issues within the helicopter rescue service. It was just one of many roles this quiet achiever performed at branch level.

Geoffrey is also a recipient of the International Lifesaving Society (ILS) citation of merit, an award he achieved in 1993.

Today he continues his role as respected Patron of Cronulla SLSC where his counsel is often sought.

He was made a Life Member of Cronulla SLSC in 1978 and of Sydney Branch in 2001.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This first year as President of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club has passed extremely quickly and that was largely due to the final preparations for the commencement of the building project. In just a few short months the tender documentation was prepared by our architects Redshift Architecture & Art, after a selection process The Project Studio was appointed as our project managers, we successfully applied for and received a grant of \$350,000 towards the project from the NSW Government Surf Club Facility Program, discussions were held with the Commonwealth Bank and we negotiated a finance facility of \$1.5M to fund the project, a tender for the construction of the building was conducted with Momentum Built Pty Ltd being the successful tenderer, arrangements had to be made to vacate our building and relocate a temporary office at Hungry Point, negotiations were held with Sutherland Shire Council regarding our lease renewal and that was on top of conducting our normal patrol, competition and nipper activities. This was achieved with the assistance of many members and I thank everyone for their assistance in making the building project a reality.

Firstly, I would like to acknowledge all of the members who volunteered their time to keep our beach and surrounds safe. Our patrols did this in an efficient and professional manner and this occurred due to the diligence of our Club Captain Chris Barber, Vice-Captain Darryl Easton and all of our Patrol Captains. It goes without saying that the training and education that our members receive is responsible for the skills that they possess, this is a monumental but important task so many thanks to our Chief Instructor Scott Rofe and all the trainers who assisted in educating our members. Without your dedication our core activity of lifesaving would be hard to achieve. Apart from the many rescues and preventative actions performed this year two incidents emphasised the importance of this training, they were:-

- Patrol 2 in attending to a patron of Zimzala who was unconscious and suffering multiple seizures. This event occurred in the middle of a busy restaurant which meant that the patrol had to deal with the confusion of the diners in addition to attending to the patient. I received emails commending the actions of this patrol from both the lifeguards and paramedics in attendance. I would like to mention a paragraph from the email received from the paramedics – "your patrol were well prepared, professional and courteous and provided an excellent handover of the patient. They made good notes and provided me with a succinct and accurate timeline of events. They also took great care of the patient's wife; reassuring her and making sure her needs were well taken care of".
- Then there was the solo rescue made at 7:30pm last December by Darcy Macpherson who without any other assistance rescued a swimmer in difficulty in hazardous conditions. There is no question that Darcy saved that gentleman's life that evening.

Well done to everyone who has kept our beach safe.

In the competition arena the many hours put in by our coaches is showing dividends. Whilst we still have some way to go with our young team the improvement is clearly apparent and importantly the attitude and camaraderie amongst the members evident. Our Cronulla short course carnival is proving to be immensely popular and competitor numbers increased significantly this season. The Club's Sunday Surf races have been re-energised with a large number of members across all sections participating each

week in the handicap format. This has been pleasing to see and the Club spirit is clearly evident at these races every week, but like most things it does not occur without someone(s) putting in hours of work behind the scenes, thank you Darryl and Wendy Ward, your efforts are appreciated. Apart from the Sunday surf races Darryl has also for many years been the Clubs point of contact with our commercial tenants which is another demanding role.

Throughout this Annual Report there are the reports of the various sub-committees that make our Club great, they provide the operational and financial platform for our existence and I know that they are working diligently to overcome the operational difficulties while our building renovations occur, yet at the same time they are planning for moving back in when construction is complete. I must mention, congratulate and thank one particular member who this year has announced that they are not seeking re-election. That is Vice Patron and Life Member John Hollingdale. John has given outstanding service for twenty nine years on the Photo and Trophy Committee and was the Convenor for twenty six of those years. What a fantastic contribution to the Club. John has also for many years provided his wisdom to other committees and the Club is in a much better space thanks to John's contributions. Thanks Holly.

The next season will involve some operational hurdles but I am certain that with the patience and co-operation of members that the time will pass as quickly as the last season did. Our operational plans are mostly completed but it is an ongoing process and they will change as situations arise. The Club has never previously had to deal with such a comprehensive building process interrupting our activities so there will be challenges ahead but we will keep members informed as the project evolves. Twelve months ago I said at the AGM that management would have to make some hard decisions in our budgeting to ensure that the building project was financially responsible and to not leave future generations with a debt that might be difficult to manage. The management committee has acted responsibly in this regard and our financial position is sound, thank you to all committee members for being financially responsible and having a view to the future not just the present. Our future generations will benefit from this.

Being my first year as President I wish to thank the members for their acceptance of me and also my fellow Bate Bay Presidents, Geoff Budd, Peter Carney and Mark Sargeant for their assistance and guidance throughout the year, I look forward to working with you again next season. To identify all of the individuals and committees that have made this year a success in this report would make for a long list so I would ask that you read this annual report comprehensively and to everyone that has contributed to the Club's operations I say thank you. There are, however, two groups that I would like to especially acknowledge:-

- To our office staff of Jenny Pinker, Robyn Cole and Kathy Ford, thank you for everything you do. I am sure that every member who has been to our office can see the tremendous workload you deal with daily and your diligence makes every committee's job much easier. You will never see any of these staff taking a break and they do many hours of volunteer work at home, they are not asked to they just do it to make sure everything happens when it needs to.
- To my fellow Executive members Daniel Wood, Emma Larssen, Chris Giles and Chris Barber, thanks team. It has been a pleasure working with you, everyone has contributed as a team to make a successful year. The Club has been successful financially, administratively, in lifesaving and education, in competition and in seeing the building project commence, and all of you have played a large part in those successes. On a personal level I particularly thank you all for the extra effort you made since February this year when I succumbed to a serious illness, you worked together as a good team does, at a point in time when some very important decisions needed to be made, possibly the most important decisions in the Club's history. I was not available to assist but I had complete faith that the Club was in good hands, you proved me right and I was able to concentrate on my recovery. I am extremely pleased that you have all chosen to remain part of the Executive during a very important period ahead.

I could write much more on the year that was but I will leave it there. I anticipate an extremely exciting year ahead and also being able to see you everyone back on the beach.

Welcome to the 111th Annual Report for the 2017/18 season, the season that will most likely be known as the one of great changes. It has been a long and hard road to get here and it will be challenging for the season ahead, but the results we are all looking forward to when the new Club House is built will be well worth the wait.

I won't say too much more about the Building Development as that is covered elsewhere in this report, but to all the members who have put in countless hours of their time to get us to this stage, I say thank you.

The Annual Report aims to capture and reflect the many milestones accomplished throughout the season by our members including, patrolling our beaches to ensure no lives lost, competing under the sky blue, black and white, developing our future generations, educating our members, supporting various social engagements and the overall functioning of the Club.

There were several faces welcomed back onto the Management Committee this season, in particular the President Richard Pinker, Treasurer Chris Giles and of course Denise Rayner in the position of Assistant Secretary/Treasurer. For me personally, it was great to see Denise back on Committee and I thank her for all her help this year in keeping the Management Meeting minutes and supporting me in my role as Secretary. Her presence has also increased the number of female representatives on Committee.

It has once again been a successful year for Cronulla SLSC. Successful for many reasons but most importantly, being able to report that no lives were lost whilst on patrol this season, the primary reason of our function. A great effort by the Lifesaving Committee and indeed, by all patrolling members. The season also saw another patrol member join the ranks of 10-years of 100% Patrols. Congratulations Nathan Wild on reaching this outstanding achievement! Nathan is now chasing down his father, Bryan Wild, who has just clocked up an astonishing 14-years of 100% Patrols! Fantastic effort!

The Club also saw individual successes rewarded earlier in the year with Wayne Druery being awarded SLSNSW Volunteer of the Year for the 2016/17 season and Rob Short being recognised with a Cook Community Award for his

contribution and service to the community. This rounded out the events that celebrated 10 Years of the Cook Community Classic and saw the event raise over \$1 million dollars for local charities during this time. The lifesaving training function is a major role in the club. Thanks to the leadership of Chief Training Officer Scott Rofe, we excelled in the number and type of educational awards achieved including recognition by Sydney Branch. We have great trainers in our club including David Brukmann, thanks for his exhaustive efforts in taking several of the bronze and SRC courses with Scott Rofe and our other trainers (Scott Phillips, Brian Dalgarno, Rodd Sanchez, Tony Coffey). Hayden Sawyer expressed a keen interest to really ramping up his IRB training efforts with the support of Max Walker, which really put us in good stead in this area. I heard this quote at a SLS forum this year, which is so true - everyone who assists with training and mentoring our lifesavers and competitors act as trainers and coaches in some way. This example extends to our nipper age group leaders who coach, train and mentor our 620 plus future nippers/lifesavers. Thanks to Max Walker as the gala starter and referee and all the competitors, members and friends who turned up to support from the 'Tony Purcell' balcony. Thanks to Nathan Robinson for the cooking the BBQ. Awards / prizes went to Katrina Jones (best crewie and best effort), Phoebe La Coste and Cody Gaddes as the best new young gun drivers for their involvement.

Garie Voluntary Weekend – Unfortunately the Nipper Garie weekend didn't proceed this year due to accommodation issues at Garie but rest assured this event will proceed next year. However the senior club proceeded with the Garie pilgrimage to hold a patrolling weekend to support their club. Always a great experience and we hope more members will get involved in this great social and community opportunity, supporting Garie SLSC next year.

Cronulla Short Course Carnival and Cook Classic Support - The entire club fully committed to the success of the Carnival. Particular acknowledgement is made of the excellent work of the Auxiliary, Office, Executive, Crays, officials, water safety, patrol, first aid, IRB, and workforce. The Crays and the Senior Club worked seamlessly together as one Club to deliver a magnificent event. We were honoured to have several senior officials including Wayne Druery, Carlo Villanti, Kieran Day and Wayne Pierce. A major highlight, if you want to call it that, was the shark sighting by Marcus Kennedy and Graham Burt in the IRB and the rescuing of a nipper and others in the vicinity. Overall a good outcome for an important delay of the carnival ensuring competitor safety. Once again Greg Allum, the carnival was a credit to you as a born organiser. The next day the club then backed up with the Cook Classic too.

SLSNSW State Championships at Blacksmiths Beach, Swansea Belmont - Great "one club" result from our age (nippers), masters and open. Nippers finished 5th overall, Masters 17th overall (from 53 clubs) and Opens finishing in 6th place overall. Look out next year. Six boatie crews participated in challenging and dangerous conditions which provided very good spectating but unlucky results. Beachies held their heads up high with even more improved results and some of the water areas bringing home plenty of points, forecasting a good transition from these age groups to Opens, which is crucial to the future success of the club. Another strong improvement for the nippers with a strong contingency of 116 nippers entered, including R&R and March Past and very much in the running to climb up the point score ladder. The goal to beat last season's 90 points to just over 100 was achieved.

Australian SLS Championships all the way across at Perth - Great team representation with over 70 competitors and



many spectators and supporters making the pilgrimage to WA. Great final results with gold medals being won by U/14 Male Beach Flags - Sasha Popovic, U/17 Female Beach Sprint - Chloe Mannix-Power, 30-34yrs Female Beach Flags and Beach Sprint - Nicole Jones and 40-44yrs Male Beach Flags - David Haggart. Silver medals went to Harry Came, Lachlan Vitnell, Ngaire Hadfield. Bronze medals to Tim Ford, Ngaire Hadfield and Harry Came. Followed by 5 team (including an Open Boat Mixed Relay team) / 1 individual 4th place positions, 4 individual 5th place positions, and 2 individual and 1 team 6th place positions. Great support and cheering all around with the wateries supporting the beachies when they weren't competing. Forecast poor weather for the Sunday compressed the timetable leading to an action packed final fever Saturday.

The community spirit of the club was continually demonstrated throughout the year at every event, with the major fundraising events for Richard (Bluey) Garnsey also supported by the Bate Bay clubs including the Swim-a-Thon. What an amazing end to the season with the closing of the club doors event was huge on the same day as the lowering of the flags ceremony. The next week the major renovation of the club began with the construction fencing being erected the next day. Leading up the renovation, well organised working bees were arranged and again well supported. These examples again demonstrate the community and unified spirit of our club. Without the exhaustive efforts of the Building Committee with again years of endless hours, none of this would have ever eventuated so we owe our thanks to these members. Anyone who's ever attempted to gain these type of approvals will attest to their hard work and perseverance. The next 12 to 15 months we know will be very exciting and not to overlook will be challenging as we enter the next season. An operational plan will be provided as we develop our temporary patrol operations, office facilities, club activities and other contingencies.

CLUB VICE-CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Fellow Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club members,

My third season as Vice-Captain, and things are chugging along nicely. We have had a great season, with good patrol attendance, lots of 100% awards, a strong patrol competition, and most importantly, great lifesaving and no lives lost.

The monthly Life Saving Committee meetings have been extremely positive. We generally start each meeting sharing patrolling moments from the month, so the patrol captains can learn from each other's experiences. This is the best forum for information to make it's way to the wider Life Saving Community of the club, so I encourage all Patrolling Members to ask their Patrol Captains what is happening.

Patrols teams and structure were pretty stable from the prior season, giving us a chance to solidify the strong base that we have built. There will be some small changes next season, with a couple of long standing patrol captains stepping aside and new captains stepping up.

The patrol competition was hotly contested this year. We had good participation in all areas; new awards, competition days, Lifesaving Awards, Patrol Leadership, and patrolling members competing in Sunday races 563 times.

After chasing the patrol competition for years, and winning last year, Patrol 6 Captained by Nick Rubbi, took out the Patrol Competition for the season by a good margin, placing in the top 3 across all competition criteria. Congratulations to Patrol 6, and Nick.

This season 43 members earned the 100% Award and 2 members the Outstanding Patrol Attendance Award (100% less one with a substitute). Cronulla has always held the 100% Award in very high regard, and sets an equally high criteria to achieve the award. Thank you to all the 100% Award and OPAA recipients for your service over the year, and congratulations on your achievement.

Finally to our Patrol Person of the year. This award was decided by a process of nominations from each Patrol Captain, the Club Captain, and myself as Vice-Captain. 11 candidates were interviewed by the Club Captain and last years' winner, Daryn Metti (I was unavailable). Chris and Daryn reported that it was very difficult to split the candidates, but the eventual winner was Paul Peters from Patrol 9.

This patrol season was typically busy on our beach. We provided over 11,200 total patrol hours and 9250 rostered patrol hours, to keep a recorded 77,056 people safe. We recorded 163 first aid instances, including 3 where the victim

required ambulance transport. We helped 6 lost parents. We rescued 62 people whose day at the beach could have ended tragically if not for our intervention. Most importantly, we recorded 692 instances where we intervened before someone got themselves into serious danger.

As a Life Saving Committee, our big push is to drive the number of people patrolling to the roster. This season Rostered Hours attendance was a little over 60%. That means to be confident we can get a target 10 members to a rostered patrol, we need 20 in the Patrol Team. If we can increase rostered attendance, we can reduce patrol sizes, increase the total number of patrols, and therefore reduce the number of patrol days we are each rostered for. This will continue to be a focus for next season as we work with all sections of the club to improve our Life Saving activities, and we hope you will support us and each other by doing your best to patrol to the roster.

Thanks must go to all of our Life Saving Committee, Patrol Captains, Vice captains and IRB crews, a special thanks to Chris Barber (Club Captain), Robert 'Max' Walker (IRB Captain) and Scott Rofe (Chief Training Officer) and his team of trainers for all your support and hard work once again this last season.

It is with some sadness that we farewell Nick Rubbi as a Patrol Captain, although not as a patrolling member, and Jonathan Clark as a Patrol Captain and from the club. Nick has been Patrol Captain for 9 years, and is going out on a high as the captain of the winning patrol for the last 2 years. Jonathan Clark moved to the Sunshine Coast where he will undoubtedly find his place with another club. Johnathan did a stellar job as Patrol Captain, bring the organisational skills from his professional life to Surf Lifesaving, and managing his team with great skill. Thank you to Nick and Jonathan for your great service at Cronulla.

Finally to our Patrolling Members. Thank you all for your service over the season, and willingness to trial the changes that the Life Saving Committee introduced for the season. Without your contributions, our club would not be able to meet our obligations to our stakeholders, and most importantly, keep the public safe from harm. I hope that you will return next season to continue our life saving service and maintain our club's high standards of Life Saving.

No lives lost starts with good education and the Cronulla education team has provided the necessary skills and knowledge

The impact our lifesaving trainers have on our membership is vast and ensures compliance with our patrolling obligations. These very special members volunteer and dedicate much of the season attending to their own re-endorsement processes, including attending planning meetings, branch upgrade courses, proficiency and new skill development, just to mention a few. This is all before we even start training lifesaving squads. Many volunteer hours are spent in preparation so that our lifesavers meet our patrolling obligations. So, who are our trainers:

At the September 2017 Lifesaving Committee Meeting it was accepted that the club would make several changes to its proficiency and skills maintenance process by adopting the SLSNSW Proficiency Delegated Authority guidelines. This change allowed the club to appoint our patrol captains as Delegated Authority Members. The patrol captains oversaw the physical side of the proficiency, which included the Run Swim Run, Board and Tube rescues, water and beach carries and Intra- team communications. The trainers were on hand

for every patrol from the 23rd of September to 11 November to assist in the process. Upon completion of the physical components every patrol member attending CPR, Oxygen, First Aid, Radio Communication, Spinal management, IRB Drivers/Crew and general knowledge training to complete the skills maintenance proficiency process. Of the 325 patrolling members 281 had completed their proficiency by 11 November 2017. A further 16 proficiency dates captured the remaining club members.

New awards and up-skilling our members is a key goal and to achieve this the training team meet to develop a training plan for the season ahead. Of particular importance was to incorporate club lifesaving training to include the Crays membership. To do this we needed assistance of the club committee, Crays committee and a number of our trainers. Strategically the training team felt we could better deliver ongoing support and improvements with lifesaving education by starting with the eligible nipper membership and we completed 33 SRC awards by 2 October 2017. Thanks to Carlo Villanti, Brian Dalgarno and David Brukmann for their work in this area.

Whilst still with the Crays our trainers assisted with 67 Age Managers awards and the delivery of 463 Junior Surf Education awards. This would not have been possible without the direct involvement of the age managers and the Crays Executive. Furthermore we held two lifesaving education days for the Crays where various members of the club volunteered to demonstrate different aspects of lifesaving. Trainers and patrol members presented and offered demonstrations in IRB and RWC, CPR, First Aid, board and tube skills and patient assessment and care. This great achievement would not have been possible without a special mention going to Michele Cole,

A summary of the operations of Zimzala restaurant, Barefoot on the Beach Juice bar, Elite/ Cronulla Swim School sports complex and the Tony Purcell function room for the 2017/18 period.

Zimzala restaurant Cronulla SLSCs jewel in the crown has continued to trade well offering a varied variety of affordable dining including daily specials with some promotions being available to all club members at a reduced price.

From owner – Ray Nelson:

The last 12 months has seen Zimzala continue to grow and improve its events and general menu performance. We have hosted weddings, anniversaries, and family events from birthdays to christenings. CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

Cronulla SLSC lifesaving equipment was prepared and presented for the annual inspection held on Saturday 2nd September 2017. All equipment was laid out in the IRB Shed, Ballroom, Patrol Room, Training Room, Radio Room and Monro Room and as usual the display was quite impressive. This equipment included the following items.

- 20 rescue boards
- 36 rescue tubes
- 10 radios
- 2 patrol first aid kits
- 1 club first aid room and supplies
- 1 trauma/haemorrhage kit
- 3 spinal boards and straps
- 3 defibrillators
- 4 oxy-viva kits
- 4 suction equipment sets
- 2 stretchers
- 18 resuscitation mannequins
- 3 trainer defibrillators
- 5 IRB
- 6 IRB fuel cells
- 9 outboard motors
- 11 lifejackets
- 7 trailers
- Patrol area and tent
- Signal flags, evacuation (shark) flags and beach signs
- Miscellaneous items including fins, loud hailer, binoculars, patrol bum bags.

The inspection team visited all clubs in the Branch in one day this season. This was made possible due to new computer based recording technology and a large dedicated inspection team. Starting at North Bondi on Saturday morning they arrived at Cronulla mid afternoon. After completion of the Cronulla inspection we supplied refreshments to the inspection team to finish up their day.

Rod Dunn took up the role of Radio Officer this past season and ensured that all radios were in top condition and available for patrol and water safety uses throughout the season. David Dalla-Camina continued in the role of First Aid Officer and all first aid equipment and consumables were available and of a high standard throughout the season. The following members helped prepare the club gear and premises for the start of the season - David Dalla-Camina, Rod Dunn, Rob Short Jr., Bill Lloyd, Brian Dalgarno, Carlo Villanti, Robert Walker, Maximillian Walker, Graham Burt, Craig Jordan and Chris Barber.

Lifesaving is our core business and the cost of purchases of new and replacement equipment along with service and

repairs is a necessary and justifiable expense. Cronulla's patrols are always well equipped with all necessary items. Excluding IRB items, the expenditure this season was a little over \$13,800. This included purchase of four rescue boards (\$4691), board repairs (\$1082), purchase of three new radios (\$2250), radio servicing (\$320), oxy-viva and defibrillator servicing (\$541), oxy-viva and defibrillator items (\$1403), first-aid supplies (\$847) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$150). We also purchased a new patrol tent frame (\$461), some uniforms, rash shirts, caps, log books and other patrol items from the SLSA shop (\$1135) plus patrol caps (\$930).

As in previous seasons all new Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate awardees had a uniform, patrol cap and sunhat presented at their assessment and all IRB drivers and crewpersons were presented a SLSA rash shirt and peaked cap presented at their assessment - all to wear while on duty. New Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLSA patrol jacket and peaked cap. The Club continued to subsidise the purchase of PFDs by IRB Crewpersons and Drivers if they wanted to purchase their own. Having these lifesavers fitted properly and safely on the beach and in the water is a high priority.

The Australian Government, for the fourth season, funded every Club in the country with a grant towards the cost of lifesaving equipment. This season that amount was doubled from previous years and we received \$10,000. Surf Life Saving Australia provided \$2230 (66 uniforms) as a patrol uniform subsidy. Cronulla RSL donated the full cost of an IRB motor. The remainder of the lifesaving expenditure was from Club funds.

Cronulla SLSC has a large amount of lifesaving equipment which must always be in good condition and ready for purpose. Once again, this season, I believe that we have been able to provide the Club with the best possible equipment for patrol, water safety, training, competition and community purposes.

See you on the beach at Cronulla – where else would you rather be?

BUILDING DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

This last year has finally seen what many thought may not be possible, at least for a long time - the commencement of construction of our refurbished Clubhouse.

A BRIEF RECAP OF LEAD UP EVENTS

The Development Application for our building, submitted in June 2016 was approved by Sutherland Shire Council and the NSW Joint Regional Planning Panel on the 21st October 2016.

At this stage we had only approximately half the funds required. On Sunday 9th April 2017 our local Federal Member of Parliament, Scott Morrison delivered the momentous news that he had secured a \$3 million Federal Government Grant for the refurbishment of the Clubhouse. This Commonwealth Development Grant pushed us towards a construction phase starting at the end of the 2017-18 season.

2017-18 ACTIVITY

A Special General Meeting of Members was held on Sunday June 4th 2017. At this meeting the final plans and the funding model were unanimously endorsed and approval was given to proceed with the required preparations and ultimately commence construction.

The first part of the preparation was assembly of detailed design documents for all aspects of the building. This was done by the architect in association with a range of engineers and other professional consultants. The design documents include complete architectural drawings and specifications plus details of materials, finishes, furniture and fittings. These documents provide all of the information required to be used for the tender process to select a builder and are also submitted to obtain a Construction Certificate. Full design documentation was completed and tender documents assembled in early December 2017.

The Club appointed an independent project management company, The Project Studio (TPS) on 27 November. The project manager is responsible for running all facets of a successful build and liaising with all parties on behalf of and in the best interests of the Club. Shane Henn, Managing Director of TPS has taken ownership of our project and has worked closely with the Club and all other parties since that date.

A detailed tender requirements and review process was designed and documented by the project manager in consultation with the Building Committee. This process was, in turn, reviewed and endorsed by the Management Committee. A tender package which included the full design documentation plus tender process information was issued to a shortlisted profile of builders on 15 December. A Tender Review Panel comprising the project manager, project architect and Chris Giles as the Club representative was proposed by the Building Committee and endorsed by the Management Committee.

Five companies had indicated intent to submit tenders with four finally being submitted. These were assessed by the Tender Review Panel against the criteria in the predefined process and the highest ranking tender company was subsequently interviewed. The Tender Review Panel then provided a recommendation on preferred builder to the Building Committee which they accepted after extensive deliberation. On 19 March 2018 the Management Committee endorsed selection of Momentum Built as the successful builder. Momentum Built is a local company based at Taren Point. They have been involved in several local projects including a project for Sutherland Council.

BUDGET

The cost of construction presented to the Special General Meeting, was \$6.5 million dollars based on early quantity surveyor estimates. Following provisional acceptance of the successful tender, discussions were held with Momentum and significant early savings of approximately \$130,000 were identified prior to signing the contract. The contracted construction cost with Momentum is \$5.99 million. The Club has included a contingency amount of 10% to cover unforeseen issues so the full budgeted construction costs are now set at \$6.59 million.

Momentum have identified some other areas of potential savings which are being explored in the early stages of construction. These savings are based on the use of some alternate suppliers and products and may offer the Club further savings in the range of \$50,000-\$100,000.

To ensure good financial governance, processes have been developed for the approval of all payments to Momentum, contractors and consultants and also for the consideration and approval of variations to the contract. These processes were developed by the Building Committee in consultation with the project manager and were reviewed and endorsed by the Management committee. In simple terms, these processes require scrutiny by the project manager and Building Committee prior to payment approval plus additional scrutiny and approval by the Club Executive and/or Management Committee for high cost or unprogrammed invoices and payments

CONSTRUCTION SITE PREPARATION

Construction was notionally planned to start immediately post season at the end of April 2018 with a twelve month build period.

To allow this, an extensive process for decanting and storage or disposal of Club items was put in place. For the majority of Club items, the decant was successfully completed by Saturday 28 April. This was achieved due to great input from Club Members. There were two well attended working bees at which a large amount of items were moved to storage locations while unwanted items were discarded to the tip. Essential lifesaving equipment and Purcell Room furniture and fittings were removed a few days after patrols finished. The Club engaged Cronulla Removals to pack and relocate all memorabilia, the bulk furniture and all of the office furniture and fittings. Sutherland Shire Council assisted with the removal of three tippers of unwanted metal items. These latter activities were completed and the Club effectively empty by Wednesday 2 May.

The construction site was established immediate post season in the first week of May. A large site compound was erected in the south western corner of Cronulla Beach Park in the first week of May. Momentum installed their site sheds close to the clubhouse and a construction access road was laid through this area to minimise impact on the park and the normal access road. Site fencing was placed around Clubhouse on Friday 4 May and Momentum formally took control of the site on Monday 7 May and site preparation then proceeded for a week.

Building demolition commenced on 16 May. The project at this stage was on schedule with completion date set as the end of May 2019.

FUNDING AND SUPPORT

As previously reported, the funding model includes a Club cash commitment, Sutherland Council cash commitment, the Commonwealth grant and a Club financed bank loan.

As the funding plan includes a bank loan, earlier discussions with the Commonwealth Bank were continued by Richard Pinker and Chris Giles. Sutherland Shire Council agreed to guarantor the loan and a Deed of Guarantee was signed. Subsequent to this, the bank gave final approval of our loan and provided a formal Letter of Offer to the Club.

A Member and Sponsor appeal for financial assistance has been launched. The Members appeal has seen a reasonable early response with almost \$25,000 donated by the end of April 2018. The Club continues to seek financial contributions from the wider membership base. There has also been response from some corporate sponsors with offers to contribute directly to specific components of the building materials or process. These offers will be developed further with the builder and sponsor.

In late 2017 the Club applied for a NSW Government Surf Club Facility Grant and on 19 December we were advised that we had been successful and a grant of \$350,000 was awarded for our project. The Finance and Sponsorship Committee continues to seek other grants to direct to fit-out of specific areas and to lessen the impact on the Club of its own financial commitment.

Sutherland Shire Council has committed heavily to our project. As well as providing funding for the DA and construction it has also committed to a large range of frontage works and parks works to the rear of the Club. Council is also providing valuable support with project planning and delivery and a group of Council officers meets with Building Committee representatives on a scheduled fortnightly basis, or more often as required.

CLUB OPERATIONS

The establishment of good Club operations during construction has been a keenly discussed topic and one which has received considerable focus. An operational plan,

ensuring good access to equipment and other Club facilities and the operation of the Club's essential activities has been established and continues to evolve. These operations incorporate lifesaving, surf sports, education, administration, nippers, social and community activities. Our Club Executive is planning and managing this process under the umbrella of their various briefs and will ensure an interesting, exciting and at times challenging but highly successful 2018-19 season.

NEXT

Immediate post completion of season, the construction site is well established and demolition is well under way. No project is without issues and those encountered early are in process of resolution. I hope to be able to advise in next year's annual report that the project is close to completion and reoccupation of the building is imminent.

In closing, I thank all of those people who helped in the latter stages of preparation, specifically the decant and store process. The working bee attendees came from all sections of the Club and are too numerous to mention by name. However, I particularly thank Bill Lloyd, Graham Bruce and Dick Bignold for the roles they played.

Importantly, I again offer my thanks and that of all Club Members to the members of the Building Development Committee who have all contributed extensively over the length of the project. They are Daniel Wood, Steve Mackay, Doug Murray, John Suann, Ken Adams, Richard Pinker, Chris Giles, Greg Holland, Lee Schmalfeldt, Alan Metti and Brad Turner. The success of this project has relied on their commitment of time and effort plus their very professional approach.

PHOTO & TROPHY COMMITTEE REPORT

Our main aim for this year was to prepare for the clearing out of all the items in the clubhouse that were the Photo and Trophy Committee's responsibility in readiness for the building renovations to start.

We started eighteen months ago working through a mountain of paperwork and items in the Archive Room that had accumulated since our present clubhouse was built. Many important decisions had to be made as to what was important to save and what we needed to discard, keeping in mind the amount of space needed to store these items in the renovated clubhouse. Twenty-two boxes of items have gone into storage, these boxes have been numbered and itemised. I thank Ken English, Bob Johnson and Bruce Maclachlan for the many hours they spent clearing out the Archive Room, which was not the best environment to work in.

We decided after much discussion to store the mural on the stage of the Bill Marshall OAM Memorial Ballroom of our beach and clubhouse from the early 1950's. The mural of the boat that was on the wall leading up to the Purcell Room, also

the Australian Championship Touring team photos will also go into storage. The N.S.W State point score winning plaques on the wall of the Monro Room above the fireplace had deteriorated due to salt corrosion and we have kept six of these plaques and put them into storage. The winning Crays State Championship team Perma Plaque photos that were in the entrance foyer of the Tony Purcell Room were also badly damaged by salt corrosion and had to be destroyed, fortunately we do have photos of these winning teams.

GARRY ALLMAN – A TRIBUTE

When you split time between Sydney and London, you inevitably miss some of life's milestone moments, as they unfold on the other side of the world. Weddings, funerals, boat launches. I was gutted not to be able to attend the launch of the Garry Allman surfboat, so I could not say yes quick enough when Emma asked me to pen an article about "Gaz" for the annual report. I thank her for this opportunity.

The office kindly provided a copy of Garry's membership record, but they needn't have bothered; anyone who knows Garry well enough, knows that he has never been near a committee in his life. And we'll get to his competitive record in a moment. Thus, about the only thing of note on file was that Garry has now served in the capacity of Surfboat Captain and head sweep/coach, for more years than not, since he joined Cronulla back in 1997.

Garry's love for Cronulla is partially born from the absolute disdain he holds for the other Bate Bay surf clubs. He has been heard to joke about this from time to time. "When I die, don't scatter my ashes off Cronulla. You can wrap me up in black plastic and dump me overboard off Greenhills. I want to wash up on Wanda beach, a stinking, rotting carcass." It's fair to say the tempers that once flared upon mention of our northern neighbours, are now more of a warm simmer, and Garry has forged strong bonds with sweeps, coaches and rowers from not just Sydney branch but all over Australia. There must be a level of respect reciprocated, as he is even invited to stand for the boat panel on the odd occasion.

Anyone who has spent time with the boat section, will know Gaz not just as a coach or sweep, but as a great mate, probably even family. His is the face that springs to mind whenever you think of the Cronulla boaties. Short and stocky, he has biceps thicker than most rowers legs, and a chest that could rival any belt swimmer (though you will never, ever find him in the water voluntarily). He sports a mop of wavy blond hair that would befit any surfer that grew up in the 70's, which has only just started to show signs of fading with age. Garry delights in telling people about the time he found his first grey pube, "I just picked it off the pizza and kept munching away." He loves telling jokes (in fact, the same jokes) over and over again. When you're onto a good thing, stick to it.

Given that his stature (and enormous upper body strength) lends itself more to holding 'the big oar up the back', it might come as a surprise to some, to learn that before he picked

up a sweep oar, Garry cut his teeth as an actual rower, spending several years at Elouera, where he gained his Bronze Medallion and allegedly did some patrols. Eventually he realised the sand was squeakier down the south end of Bate Bay.

As you would expect from somebody who lives and breathes surf boat racing, Garry has a drawer full of medals, with gold in nearly every division at the Sydney Branch championships, and several accolades at a State and National level too. He seems to have a knack for drawing alleys one or six (a constant bugbear, which again is now just another running joke) and also a knack for qualifying in lifesaver relay and boat medleys, sweeping many successful teams through the qualifying rounds and into State and Australian finals. To maximise the clubs ability to include star open competitors from other disciplines, Garry has been challenged with some interesting team combinations over the years, often incorporating younger members with little-to-none experience in actual rowing, leading to some exciting... spectacles.

It is almost a statistical anomaly that Cronulla's long bemoaned Aussie gold medal drought hasn't been broken under his watch. We have teetered on the cusp of glory several times, with some outstanding Junior and U23 crews in recent years, the odd women's combination that has shown great promise, rounded out with an exceptionally experienced core of senior rowers that rotate through the section, year after year. These are guys that you can throw into a boat and trust with their surf skills, honed by over a decade or more in the game. I've always maintained that good crews make their



own luck, and the reality is, at the top end, there isn't room to make mistakes in this sport anymore, and dumb luck never seems to be on your side. Thus, that Aussie gold continues to elude us for the time being. What doesn't elude however, is the famous Gaz 'bitter taste of defeat' which manifests as a battered sav from the Dagwood Dog stall at Aussies – a mandatory stop once your crew has been eliminated. This should come as no surprise, given we once discovered that Gaz had setup a kebab shop on speed dial.

As a licensed builder, Garry has been instrumental in several bay shed working bees, and on two occasions has completely rebuilt the ramp, as well as constructing the original front steps. When I was Club Captain, he helped construct and fit-out the new club gym – the first facility of its kind that club members could truly call our own, without and commercial interests getting in the way. He did all of this for free, with materials at cost. He has towed boats to most Australian championships and to nearly every surf carnival up and down the east coast. He repairs broke oars, charges the pump batteries, helps man the BBQ's, checks that the lights work on the trailers, bending rowlocks back into shape, mentors new sweeps, the list goes on. These are the things that aren't ever mentioned on any membership card, but maybe they should!

One of Garry's most brilliant traits is his ability to be able to teach a novice - who has never picked up an oar in their life - the basics of surfboat rowing, in just a single water session. Over the years, this has been incredibly useful so that we can onboard junior rowers with confidence and integrate them into the more senior crews quickly.

Unsurprisingly, Garry has been the recipient of several major club awards, including the Gibson Howlin award in 2013 (for his contribution to training and instruction of club members) and also the Nick Dixon Memorial Boatman's Trophy in 2007. Given that he was the Boat Captain at the time, I should clarify that he did not award this to himself.

If you ask anybody in the surfboat scene what stands out about Cronulla's boaties, it's our fearlessness in the surf. We are a 'big wave' club, much preferring to row in large surf than on a flat millpond, any day. Gaz is one of a handful of veteran sweeps around Australia, still on the carnival circuit today, that carries huge respect in the big surf. With recent tragedies at the Aussie Championships, the new, younger generation of sweeps (and rowers) will rarely, if ever again, race in the conditions that we were allowed out in 20 years ago. We once cracked an enormous 16ft screamer off the Queenscliff bombie, with Garry standing up the back. The blokes in the boat that day will never forget it and happily recount the story over a beer (where of course it gets bigger with every schooner!). Garry makes cracking waves look so easy, he could almost do it with his eyes shut.

One of the best things about the new 'Garry Allman' surf boat, is that it is named after a member who is still actively competing. That is a rare thing these days, and I think last time this happened, it was because Ken English came out of retirement to sweep his own namesake. This resurgence didn't last for long thankfully, as the club was nearly sent bankrupt through the cost of repairing all of Superman's broken oars. Gaz, on the other hand, probably holds the club record for the longest stretch of having not broken a single oar, either in training or competition, while a surfboat was under his command. It lasted well over a decade I believe, probably longer, and this alone would have saved the club a repair bill with Croker, nearly up there with the value of his new boat.

It can't go without mention that this surfboat is not the first 'namesake' to bear Garry's name, to have made itself a part

of the furniture at Cronulla SLSC. There is another, and I'm talking about that, yapping, entitled ball-of-wool that goes by the name Jim. Yes, Garry 'James' Allman named his prize poodle after himself. We've known each other for over twenty years, and I never took Garry to be a dog lover, until one day a few years back, he turned up with this black pedigree poodle (so 'nulla these days). Gaz and Jim quickly became inseparable, from the jobsite, to coffee at Grind, to helping pull chicks at the beer garden, regular trips to Bunnings... they go everywhere together. Jim took to water like a fish, and is regularly 'ballast' in the boat when Cronulla crews train up and down Gunnamatta Bay. I'm not sure if Jim is the first dog to ever crack a wave in a surfboat, but he's certainly the first to be seen doing it on Channel 7 News. Jim is also a much better swimmer than Garry ever will be, and perhaps that's why Gaz is so at ease with Jim in the boat (he floats).

It would be remiss not to mention Linda, Garry's wife who has to put up with her adopted surfboat 'family' nearly every waking hour. If ever there was a rowing widow, it was Linda, and she needs to be thanked for being so bloody tolerant over the years. There is only ever one evening every year where Garry won't make himself available for rowing, and that is Linda's birthday. There's a joke there too, but I'll let Gaz tell that one. I'm not sure when Jim was born, so it's possible there's now a second birthday evening permanently off the cards too. No joke.

I could go on and on about the great times I've shared with Gaz, his achievements and contributions over the years, and we haven't even touched the subject of the infamous 'C-Crew'... but we need to save something for his eulogy... So I'll finish by saying, on behalf of all surfboat rowers that have ever had the privilege of being under his sweep oar, that we are honoured to have had Gaz 'up the back' and it's fantastic that there are still future generations of rowers coming through our ranks, that will have the opportunity to be coached by Garry before he finally hangs up his club cap. There's plenty of life in the salty dog yet. And Gaz.

Having known Gaz like family for over half my life, I can say with complete certainty that this is honour is thoroughly deserved. Let's hope that the club can finally bring home some of that elusive surfboat 'Aussie gold'. Keep that clown wheel turning, one day I hope we can write a song about it.

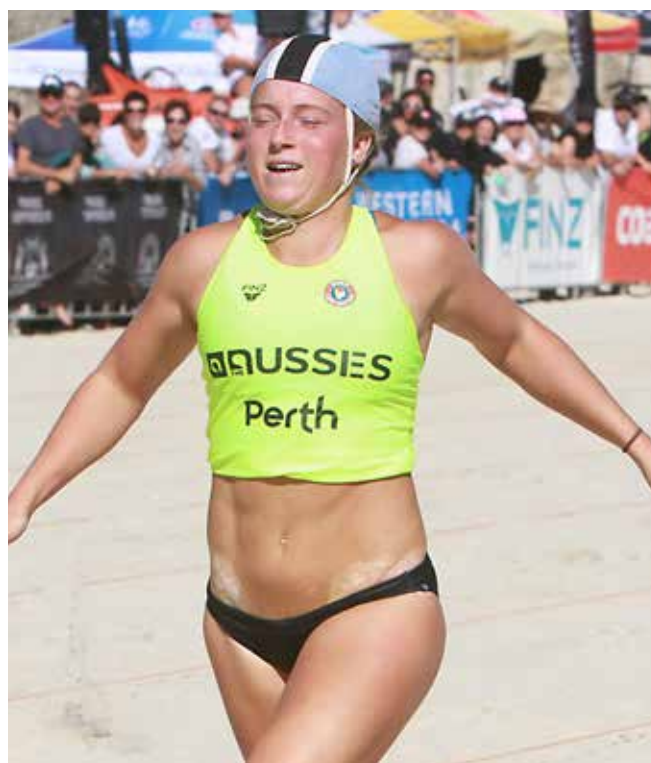

COACHING COORDINATORS REPORT

Firstly I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the Cronulla coaches this season. Whether it be Hayden Allum and Michael Banister at board and iron training, Michael Roye and Mike Vitnell and myself at Ski or the Beach captains Daniel Karagianis and Ngaire Hadfield who assisted me at beach training each week, we had a positive season with increased numbers in each section, and are building something quite special for the future.

Training numbers were consistently at 20 plus for the board section, around 12-15 for the ski and well in excess of 30 for the beach section (some sessions had to be split into 3 hours to accommodate individual needs). Tempo run training saw the peak in the numbers with 53 at training on one of the social dinner nights, and were consistently over 40.

BOAT CAPTAIN REPORT

The 2017/2018 season was a successful one for the Cronulla boat section. With several brand new rowers making up some developing crews and plenty of seasoned rowers making up the more experienced crews.

We had seven crews in action this season, which started off strong with some good results from crews in the first rounds of the Warilla Bowls Surf Boat Premiership and the NSW Australian Surf Rowers League state point score carnivals and continued on with crews making finals at the Branch Championships and the Manly Open Carnival. There were great results at the Sydney Branch Championships with the Wildcats finishing 2nd and the Vision Blasters finishing 1st, beating some strong local competition and becoming the Sydney Branch Champions.

Testing conditions saw some of our crews eliminated earlier than expected at the NSW State Championships. Wildcats made top 12 with our best result by the Vision Blasters who finished 6th in the final.

By far the most successful carnival for our section this season was the ASRL Australian Open, which took place in our very own backyard at Elouera beach with near perfect surf boat racing conditions. This year the Australian Open was the biggest carnival of the season for boat rowers, with over 320 crews competing from across the country and New Zealand, it saw more boat competitors than at the SLSA Australian Championships. The season ended on a high with our boat relay team finishing 4th in the final at the Australian Titles and the Vision Blasters finishing top 8.

Garry has put a huge amount of time and effort into the Cronulla boat section over the last twenty plus years, and is very deserving of this honour. RWC REPORT

Rescue Water Craft (RWC), sometimes referred to as the Jet Ski, is operated by club members additional to their rostered patrol roster and hours. This year 6 Cronulla SLSC members were newly trained to operate the RWC to primarily patrol the Bate Bay beaches.

Cronulla RWC operators dominated the operation of the RWC for Bate Bay, which is a major achievement. Some members did up to 99 hours which is an amazing contribution to surf lifesaving and keeping our beaches safe. As a group, over 400 hours were recorded which is an amazing fete.

The RWC's are controlled by Sydney Branch and not assigned to any specific club. The RWC is a very maneuverable watercraft and extremely fast, which aids rescues very much. They can be assigned to assist between Botany Bay and as far south as Burning Palm. Some of the rescues included several beach rescues (including a person rescuing their dog that were caught in a rip), assisting overturned & distressed boats off Cape Solander, and evacuations during bush fires at Garie. While in quieter times the RWC may be escorted by the dolphins that regularly visit Bate Bay.

TREASURERS REPORT

It is with great pleasure that I report to you the financial results for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club for the financial year ending 30 April 2018. This year, the club recorded a consolidated operating surplus after depreciation of \$309,778, a 103% increase from 2016/17. Revenues were strong, increasing to \$1,127,045 and expenditure fell to \$817,267.

This result is a \$40,000 improvement on our budget and is testament the diligence of the clubs management committee and all sections of the club. The focus of our committees on revenue generation – Operations, Food & Beverage, Finance & Sponsorship, Golf Day, 200 Club and Shark Island Swim is to be commended. The increased returns from these activities were outstanding. Of equal importance however, has been the responsible spending practices adopted by all areas of the club, but particularly the Coaching and Competition Committee, Lifesaving Committee and the Crays. The spending restraint shown throughout the year has shown what can be achieved when required. Such restraint places us in a good position moving into the building redevelopment period ahead.

Total cash and deposits declined by \$47,664 throughout the year, to end the year at \$1,185,952. We achieved a positive Operating Cash Flow of \$403,490 which allowed for net expenditure on Property, Plant and Equipment of \$451,154, including \$376,000 of preparatory expenditure to allow the commencement of construction for the redevelopment work.

Once again, Cronulla SLSC were greatly supported through the generosity of our sponsors and donors who assisted all aspects of the clubs operations, including our very successfully run fundraising events. This year, we welcomed two new major sponsors to our club, with Grind Espresso supporting our Boat section and Aussie Home Loans with assistance to

the Crays. All of our donors and sponsors are listed elsewhere in this report, and we thank you all for your contribution.

Throughout the year, we have continued to work on securing our funding for the building redevelopment. Through the generous support from all levels of government and in particular, the assistance provided by our elected representatives, we have secured sufficient funding to complete the project. Part of this funding plan is a \$1.5 Million Bank Loan which the club has secured. To reduce our reliance on this loan and reduce the long term debt burden, we have also launched a fundraising appeal, calling on members and the community to support this significant project. To those that have supported our appeal to date, thank you for your generosity. Without the support of members such as yourself, the financial burden on the club both now and into the future would be so much greater. Donors who have given to the appeal to 30 April 2018 are listed with other club donors elsewhere in this report. Yet, since this time, we have continued to receive donations. At the time of writing, 19 people have contributed to the fundraising effort, with total donations sitting at \$39,400. This is an amazing achievement, however with a total membership in excess of 1,000 I would hope that there are some more donors ready to give. No matter how large or small, all donations are appreciated – the more we can receive the less we will need to borrow.

Finally, I would like to thank the support and assistance I have been provided in my first year as Treasurer. To the office staff – Jenny, Robyn and Kathy, the support you provide to the members and that you have particularly provided to me as Treasurer is stellar. Thank you for this support. To the executive, I have appreciated your assistance and have enjoyed working with you all. I believe the way we have approached collective decision making has been exemplary and positions us well to face the challenging period ahead. Next year, with significant expenditure due on the building and a loan to be repaid, our cash flow and budget management will be stretched. However this year has shown what we can achieve when focussed and sets us up well for the challenging year ahead.
