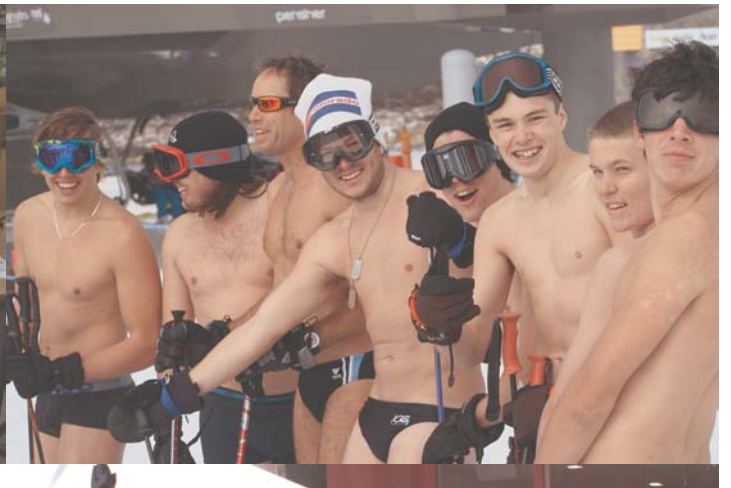

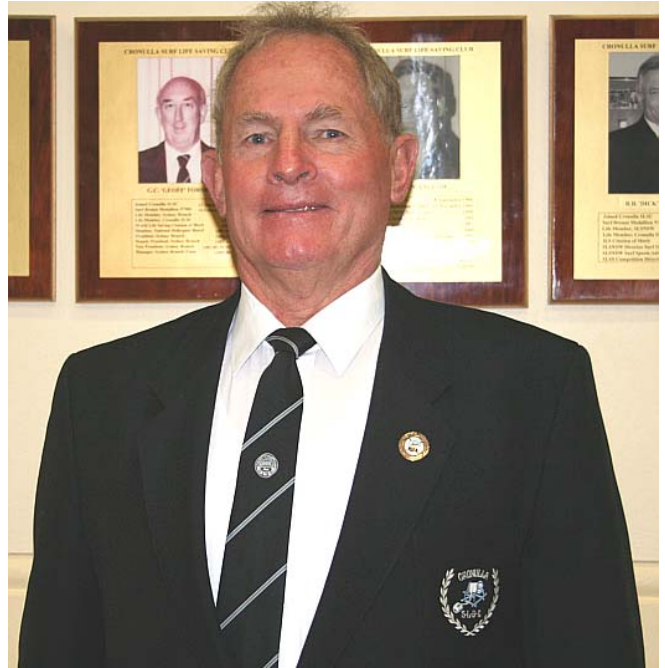
A very pleasing aspect of the year just passed is the extremely sound financial position the Club is in at present. Full details of this welcome news can be found in the Treasurer's Report. I congratulate all of our Administrators for their diligence.

On the low side of the ledger – was the losing of the Bill Marshall Interclub Trophy to Wanda. I congratulate them on their win and I suggest that they not get too used to having the Trophy in their Clubhouse – as it will be returning "home" very soon! This result suggests that we may be losing our competitive supremacy. We must answer that challenge. This is the only way to ensure that what is best for the whole Club is achieved. If this project proceeds, I believe a considerable amount of money will have to be borrowed. In other words, the Club will once again have to go into debt to secure the funds required to complete this mammoth rebuild. The proposed project is comparable to the successful construction of the Sports Complex just over thirty-five years ago. That was a mammoth undertaking for the Club and I envisage that this project could prove to be just as big – if not bigger.

On the subject of loans, I am delighted to tell you that the loan of three hundred thousand dollars required to build the

In doing so, Richard saved the Club in excess of \$90,000 in interest. What a magnificent achievement!

This goes to show that should we need to borrow funds in the future, we do have the ability to repay it.

We at Cronulla SLSC pride ourselves in conducting these types of functions in a manner worthy of the respect and dignity which the occasion deserves. Our dynamic President, Greg Holland, is a master at conducting these occasions. Greg's statesman like ability to M/C a function and to fully research the subject is very much appreciated by Members and visitors alike. Good on you Greg!!!

One-Hundred and Fourth Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the Season 2010-2011

This year we had forty-two Members complete 100% of their Rostered Patrol hours. 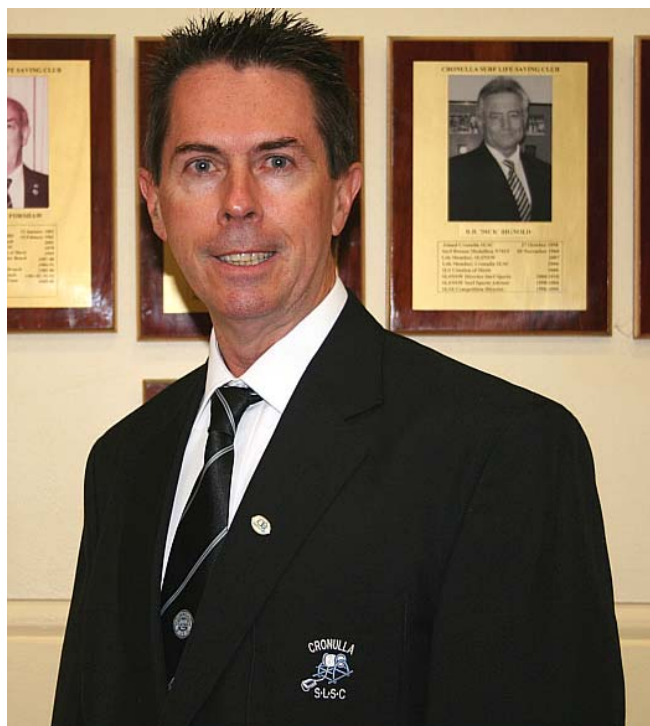
A few of the regulars missed out this year, due to carnival, study and work commitments.

Patrol Statistics for the season:

This season the Club clocked up a total of 9687 Patrol Hours. This included Water Safety for Nippers (342.5), Cook

Classic Carnival (79.5) and Shark Island Swim (101), Rostered, Voluntary and Substitute Patrol Hours (9164).

When you add up the Patrol Hours for all the Clubs around Australia, you realise just how much Volunteers contribute to keeping the beaches safe.

Overall Patrol Attendance this season was 62.72%. This figure compares favourably with the figures for the past three seasons – 65.54%: 2009-10, 57.38%: 2008-09 and 55.62%: 2007-08. Patrol 11 had the highest Patrol Attendance at 77.3% – followed by Patrol 8 on 76.3% and Patrol 12 on 71.9%.

Surf Lifesaving Awards for the season:

It was very pleasing to note the number of Awards gained by Patrol Members this season.

Patrol 4 gain the most Awards (13) followed by Patrol 7 (12) and Patrol 1 (9). I encourage all Patrol Members to gain as many Awards as possible.

Not only do you gain valuable skills for your Patrol. But you also help the community by being able to cope with any life-threatening situation on the beach or elsewhere.

Patrol Competition:

Every year, I get very excited, as I calculate the results of the Annual Patrol Competition. With my wife's assistance, we work out the different sections to the competition.

This year, like last year, the competition was very close. There was only 114 points separating first and second place and only 68 points separating second and third place.

This shows that the standard of Patrols has been gradually improving over the past few years and hopefully will continue to improve. Thank you to all Patrol Members for your professional approach to your Patrol responsibilities.

Special congratulations to the winning Patrol Captain for the third year in a row – Michael Murray. He is a great role model to all Patrol Captains and Patrol Members.

It was a great pleasure to announce the Winning Patrol person at the Club Presentation Night. Ashleigh Timbrell is a great role model to all Active Patrol Members.

Chief Gear Steward's Report

It is always a busy lead up to the season, with preparation of lifesaving equipment for the use of our patrols, water safety and competitors.

This preparation involves repair or servicing of existing equipment and purchases to replace old equipment or to serve new requirements or meet Surf Life Saving guidelines.

All of Cronulla's patrol equipment and Nipper water safety equipment was submitted for the annual gear inspection held on 11th September 2010.

The gear submitted included:

- 16 Rescue Boards
- 3 Spinal Boards
- 21 Rescue Tubes
- Patrol Area and Tent
- 8 Radios
- Patrol Uniforms
- 3 Oxy-Viva Kits
- Board and Tube Stands
- 2 Patrol First Aid Kits
- Signal Flags and Shark Flags
- 1 Club First Aid Kit
- 12 Resuscitation Mannequins
- 9 Spinal Collars
- 2 Training Defibrillators
- 1 Defibrillator
- 3 IRBs and 3 Outboard Motors
- 2 Stretchers Boat Trailers

This is a lot of equipment and the good news was that it was all passed as ready for patrol use. It was a good

inspection with all clubs in the Branch being visited by a single, very dedicated inspection team over the weekend.

The gear storage areas and Club premises were also inspected.

The following members helped prepare the club gear and premises for the start of the season – Col Haywood, Bryan Wild, Brian Dalgarno, Daniel Wood, Chris Barber and Mitchell Barber.

The Club's surfboats and belt lines and reels were also prepared by the Boat and Swim Sections.

Expenditure on gear this season was significant – this is an expensive game at times – with total expenditure approximately \$15,000.

This included board repairs (\$1440), radio servicing (\$511) and oxy-viva and resuscitation manikin servicing (\$593). We bought a new radio (\$780), rescue tubes (\$585), training manikins (\$449), resuscitation masks (\$190), suction devices (\$295), spinal collars (\$53), patrol caps (\$300) first-aid equipment (\$435), log books (\$65) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$128).

Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch provided uniforms to the value of \$1900 from the DHL subsidy. The Kingsway Night & Day Pharmacy (Gannons Road) donated several hundred dollars worth of first-aid supplies.

Our thanks go to Peter Notaras, who has not only provided this support for many years, but is also a strong supporter of our Club and other local community groups.

During the season we purchased ten new rescue tubes for competition purposes (\$1070).

We spent a small amount (\$150) on tent repairs and also purchased three pop-up tents and one new tent canopy (\$5900) which, in gratitude, were named for Club sponsors – Gibson Howlin Lawyers, Commonwealth Bank, Caltex and Frank Doran Financial Services.

We donated two second hand rescue boards to Stanwell Park Nippers.

This assistance is something which our Club can afford and has been greatly appreciated by the recipient clubs in the past.

We also sent a rescue board as a donation with Emma Larssen, who has spent most of the season running a surf safety program in Bali.

We replaced these during the season with two new boards (\$2200) from funds donated by family and crew off HMAS Kanimbla, in memory of Jeremy Wagstaff RN, who had been a keen local surfer.

The storage challenges of the past season have still not been met – including establishing adequate storage facilities for belt reels and improvements to the IRB and surfboat storage areas. These will hopefully be addressed as part of the club's future development plan.

Thanks to all of the patrols and training squads who looked after the gear while making great use of it.

Ken English as Gear Steward and Col Haywood as Radio Officer and Gear Steward have successfully supported the maintenance of patrol equipment through the season.

I believe that once again we have managed to provide Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club with the best possible equipment – equivalent to any club in the Branch.

Hopefully members found the equipment maintained, accessible and readily available for use for patrol, training, competition and, at times, recreational purposes.

Shark Island Swim Report

We were down in swimming numbers, but up in spirits and support. The 24th Annual Shark Island Swim has come and gone. Again, I can not show enough appreciation to the Committee that has supported both the event and me. On behalf of the Surf Club – the Committee thanks Frank Doran, for once again being the Major Sponsor.

With bad weather and a southerly swell – all was not looking good for a successful event. Our pre-race numbers were down and the forecast indicated that our on the day race entries, would not bring record numbers. But they did come. For only the second time in the history of the event, the swimmers did not have to go around the island and back through the swirling wash pit in front of Blackwood's Beach. Although the Water Safety Crew was cold and windswept – they went back out after the 1km Swim for a longer second bout, without complaint. They looked after the swimmers and encouraged them around the buoys.

The majority of swimmers stayed for the presentations and social happenings in the Purcell Room, while special invited guests, were wine and dined by our Auxiliary in the Monro Room.

People came to us after the race, to say we conducted the best run Ocean Swim – and that they liked the friendly, family atmosphere – and that they liked the prizes.

A tribute to 100 years of Surfing and Surf Life Saving on Cronulla Beach

The history of Surfing and Surf Life Saving on Cronulla Beaches has had over a century of spectacular evolution, with the formation of four world-class Surf Clubs and in recent years, an abundance of Champions from the Surfing Fraternity.

Sutherland Shire was proclaimed in 1906 with the new Council holding its first meeting on 18th June that year.

This has resulted in the development of Council and the Shire, running parallel to the evolution of activities on our beaches.

It has been felt for more than a decade, that this history should be recorded for all to see.

Sutherland Shire Council has made a significant start by creating an Organising Committee from prominent Surf Life Savers and Surfers, to start the process.

The first stage was completed in 2010, with the official opening on the 18th December, at the Cronulla Community Centre – by the Mayor, Councillor Phil Blight.

Cronulla SLSC was represented by History Committee Member, John Salmon and Cronulla's first Craft Australian Champion (Surf Board 1955) – Brian Keene.

Other Surfing notables present were North Cronulla's great surfboard champion Steve Warren and Wanda's Brian Jackson – a pioneer Surfer and long time Surf Board manufacturer.

He made history when he combined in 1962 with Cronulla's Ron Cansdell and John Salmon, to make the first racing Malibu Board – designed by John and finished in Cronulla's colours.

Greats from the Surfing Fraternity included Andrew Lester and Kathy Lette. Andrew is the son of Gary Lester, author of "The Cronulla Story" and a long time Champion Body Boarder.

He has spent 13 years in worldwide competition, resulting in winning the World Body Boarding Championship. Kathy Lette won fame on the fringe of the Surfing Fraternity by writing her famous book – "Puberty Blues", which captured all aspects of Surfing life on Cronulla Beaches in the 1970s.

As the Foundation Surf Club, we are a prominent feature of the Gallery and our proud history is now on permanent display for all to see and enjoy.

The Surf Gallery not only shows the history of Surfing at Cronulla – but how the nation has changed.

It is part history of Australia and the Sutherland Shire story.

As an Ex-Serviceman, Les was a member of the Cronulla RSL Sub Branch and served with the Fleet Air Arm of the Royal Navy, during his armed services career. A keen lawn bowler, he was also a member of the Cronulla RSL Men’s Bowling Club and served a two year term as President of that Club.

Lovable moved away from the Shire to see out the rest of his days in Dubbo, but his links with the Club remained. We had the pleasure of his company and will hold fond memories of his time, contribution and commitment to our Club and trust that he now rests in peace – having served his Country, our Club – and the people of this great Nation.

VALE – William (Bill) Athol Free

It’s with deep sadness that we record the passing of Bill Free, on the 11th of November 2010.

Bill was a Member of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club for many years and during that time he gave exceptional service to the Club and at the same time, made his mark as a valued Member. He was a Member of the Management Committee on numerous occasions and was renowned for his desire to see that the best decision was made by the Club. He was never backward in fiercely debating his particular point of view.

Bill received his Bronze Medallion at the North Cronulla Club, where he was an Active Member for six years before joining Cronulla in the early 1970s. He received his 25 Year Badge in 1999.

A claim to fame enjoyed by Bill, was that he was the son of Dawn, the barmaid at the Club’s now closed “Watering Hole” the Hotel Cecil. Dawn was regarded as a mother figure to many Club Members during her time of – “caring for her boys”.

Following on from his three sons and his daughter joining the Crays, Bill became very involved in the administration of our Junior Club. After a number of years as an Age Group Leader, he became the eleventh Chairman of the Crays in the 1976-1977 Season – a position he held with distinction for a total of four seasons.

As his children grew older, Bill soon progressed to the Administrative side of the Senior Club. He was Convenor of

the Finance and Sponsorship Committee on several occasions, as well as Publicity Officer and Senior Vice-President on Committee. He served on numerous sub-Committees, too many to mention here. He was the Team Manager of our Club’s Touring Teams competing in the World Life Saving Championships in Japan in 1992 – in Wales in 1994 and in New Zealand in 1996.

As Manager, it was Bill’s task to oversee the fundraising to finance the overseas travel and accommodation of the teams. He slotted into this position like a hand into a glove.

Bill had a rare gift of convincing businessmen to part with many dollars in aid of the Club. As a result, Bill was able to raise hundreds of thousands of dollars – ensuring our teams had the very best travel facilities and accommodation available – as well as being the best attired team in each of the Championships that he was the Manager. Thanks to Bill’s efforts – many other teams were very envious of Cronulla always having the best.

Bill had a wonderful gift of holding the team together when many a stressful situation arose, which is natural with a large group of young people, who were sometimes on their first overseas trip. Many of our them fine young people, will remember Bill with deep affection for his “father like” devotion to his job as Team Manager.

Some people might say Bill was sometimes quite unorthodox in his method of doing things – and as a consequence, managed to rile the feathers of some of the more conventional Members of the Management Committee. Taking this into account though, no one could ever doubt Bill’s sincerity and integrity to seeing that the very best possible result could be achieved for Cronulla SLSC.

On Sunday the 1st of May 2011, a large gathering of family, friends and fellow Club Members gathered at the Club to bid Bill a final farewell – at a ceremony to scatter his Ashes off his beloved Cronulla Beach.

To Bill’s widow Gay and their children, Matthew, Stewart, Kate and Murray – Cronulla SLSC shares your grief and we offer you all our sincere condolences. Bill Free was a big man, with an equally big heart and a lovable personality.

He may be gone – but he will never be forgotten by his fellow Surf Life Savers at Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club.

VALE – Kenneth James Brown

25th December 1949 – 11th December 2010

Great Surf Clubs often produce great characters and this year saw the passing of one of Cronulla’s best in Ken Brown, ‘Brownie’ or “KB” as he was known. Ken is survived by his sons James and Cheyne and his grandchildren Dallas and Wiley.

Brownie truly loved our Surf Club and was always quick to support his opinion, that Cronulla was the best Surf Club in the world – with statistics and records, particularly in Beach Events during the seventies – when he was Champion Competitor.

Ken joined Cronulla in 1965. He was a Junior Patrol Captain and a Senior Patrol Vice-Captain. Ken’s official Surf Club record has a long list of Championship Medals at all levels – from Club, to State and Australian Championships.

In 1968 he was a Member of the Cronulla Junior Beach Relay Side that won the Sydney Branch, Metropolitan and NSW Championships. In 1969 in a Club that boasted some of the best Beach Sprinters in the country – Ken was Club Beach Sprint Champion. Ken also won a NSW Championship in the now deleted Chariot Race.

Ken was also a most capable Rugby League player who played in premiership winning teams with Cronulla De La Salle. Brownie loved rugby league and loved the St George Dragons.

Ken could recall exactly, every Grand Final in which he played, every major Championship he contested and every Touring Team he went on – and every team he was in. He could recall all the teammates and the order in which they ran and who won the minor medals. Brownie also had an encyclopedic memory for rock music and bands.

Ken formed life long friendships in Cronulla with Members such as Ian Goode, Paul Bowmer, the Day brothers, Peter, Paul and David, John Kenny, Steve Haiser, Warwick Syphers and Kevin Neilson to name a few. Brownie seemed to have a great skill at retaining friendships and keeping in contact with his mates. Brownie was kind and generous beyond his means.

Over sixty of Brownie's mates had helped him celebrate his sixtieth birthday in his last year. All who attended will remember the night as one of the funniest of their lives.

Each guest was asked to recall his or her favourite Ken Brown story. The side-splitting recollections made the movie "The Hangover" look like a Boy Scout campout.

Sadly Ken suffered from bipolar manic depression. Many people with this illness lead normal stable lives by correctly taking their medication and applying a little self-discipline. Brownie rarely did either. This resulted in the peaks and troughs of his mania being amplified. The highs were higher and the lows were often painful and protracted.

Brownie seemed to be forever locked in 1968 – he never really moved on in time from that period and never really thought he had to. All of us others wrestled with marriages, careers and adventures that moved our lives on – but Brownie never seemed to think he had to – and maybe he didn't?

All of us are saddened by the passing of Ken Brown and all of us are better for having known him. We now only have our "Brownie" stories and fond memories.

Ken will be missed by all.

VALE – Graham John Giles

Graham was born on the 5th April 1951 and initially joined Cronulla SLSC, when his children Chris and Michelle joined the Nippers. A devoted family man and real team player, Graham and his wife Cheryl, became an integral part of all Club activities.

Graham gained his Bronze Medallion on April 23rd 1989, having previously gained his SLS Certificate in November the previous year. He was then elected Secretary of the Crays for the 1990-1991 Season. It was during this season that Graham instructed his first Bronze Squad of Nipper parents – affectionately known as "Gilesies Gerries".

This squad enjoyed Graham's training so much that it lasted for many months and Graham's ability to foster camaraderie resulted in one husband and wife pair from the squad going on to become a Member of Management and Chief Instructor respectively. Few people would be aware that Graham was also very athletic and ran a sub three hour Marathon and willingly devoted time to run with friends for local endurance events.

During his time with the Nippers, Graham was also the Delegate to the Senior Management Committee and Sydney

Branch and a regular Member of the Water Safety Crew, while Cheryl was one of the Age Managers for Michelle's Nipper Group and part of the State Uniform Committee.

Graham continued as Crays Secretary for five seasons and was also listed at various times as Assistant March Past Coach, R & R Coach, Selector and Assistant Gear Steward.

Both Graham and Cheryl began to devote their time to Sydney Branch Administration. In 1995-1996, Graham, who was trained as an Accountant and worked for the Taxation Department, was appointed Treasurer of Sydney Branch JAC.

However, his passion for Cronulla was never dulled and in 1996-1997, he became Chairman of the Crays. He continued into the next season in what was described by the Team Manager in the Annual Report as, "far and away the most successful year in the Crays' history".

In 1999, Graham designed the software for Cronulla's inaugural Masters Teams Carnival. This is still in use today.

The spreadsheets designed by Graham allow an immediate, progressive tally of pointscores and were based on programs Graham developed for Sydney Branch Carnivals. Graham could be found at carnivals from Branch to Australian – overseeing the points and recording of results.

Both Graham and Cheryl regularly represented Cronulla as Officials at Surf Carnivals.

In the Season of 2002-2003, Cronulla was reorganising its Administrative structure and Graham answered the call to become the Club's Honorary Treasurer. He proudly joined son, Chris (Club Captain) on the Club Executive.

Indeed it was in this 2002-2003 Season that Chris was awarded the Len Saville Award for "*His efforts in enhancing the reputation and standing of the Club*" – while Graham's daughter Michelle, was awarded Best Trainee Instructor and was Captain of the Winning Patrol. Graham continued to serve both Club and Branch till he lost his battle with cancer, just before his 60th birthday.

Graham epitomised the ideals of Surf Life Saving and he will be sadly missed – by both his immediate family and his extended family in Cronulla SLSC and beyond. He was a tireless worker – whose efforts often went unnoticed, but he had a profound influence on those who were close to him.

Those of us that knew him well, are better people because Graham was part of our life.

VALE – Phyllis Farleigh (nee Stroud)

In May 2011, we lost one of our long time supporters when Phyllis Farleigh (nee Stroud) passed away, aged 105. Phyllis was the daughter of one of our founding Club Captains and Life Member, Frank Stroud.

Frank was Club Captain during the entire First World War period, which must have been a testing time for our Club.

Phyllis was a major celebrity in the 1920s when she won the Miss Beach Girl Beauty Competition representing our Club and North Cronulla.

That beauty contest would appear to have been one of the biggest events to ever hit the Shire in those very early days.

A parade was held from Sutherland to Cronulla, where the eventual winner was selected from contestants from Surf Clubs from all over Sydney. It was estimated that around one hundred thousand people viewed the parade, which saw Phyllis crowned the winner in Cronulla Park.

It's suggested you read a full account of this historic event in the "Cronulla Story", pages 74 to 77.

There are photos there to help inform you of how important this fund raising event was to the then tiny village of Cronulla and to the two Surf Life Saving Clubs. Admire how beautiful Phyllis was, resplendent in her Cronulla Club costume.

Phyllis is fondly remembered for her long lifetime of support of our Club. Many will remember her attending the launching of the "Cronulla Story" in 2007, when she was a hail and hearty 102 years young. She will be very sadly missed by all who knew her.

A number of Members from our Club and from North Cronulla attended Phyllis' funeral service to pay our last respects to one of our great supporters of Surf Life Saving from a bygone era.

VALE – Leo Mayhew (1939 – 2011)

Our oldest Club Member, Leo Mayhew passed away on the 4th May 2011.

Leo joined the Club in 1939 and at the time of his death was 91 years old.

Over the last number of years, Leo had lived in Canberra, however in a letter to the Club following his death, his daughter Lee – said that he "was always interested in the news and events of the Club, although since moving to Canberra in his later years, could not have participated as he would have liked".

The Shark Island Swim, the rivalry of the Allum brothers and of course the arrival of the Smith twins, has also been a bonus and cause for backpage sports coverage over the past 12-odd months.

Possibly one of the greatest feats of exposure, was Cronulla SLSC's featuring in the TV series MasterChef Australia. Literally 'taking over' the entire Clubhouse for a day of filming, Cronulla Beach and our Sunday Nippers provided the backdrop for a Surf Club BBQ team challenge.

An audience of over 2.47 million people nationwide viewed the particular episode. This kind of publicity doesn't just come by every day, so the Club should be congratulated at grabbing this gig and making the most of it! You couldn't really ask for better opportunity.

We continued with a limited (colour) print run for posting to some of our older Members and for pickup from the Friday/Sunday Bars and the Office. Coaching and Competition Report

The Coaching and Competition Committee (C & C) initiated many changes to the way our competitors are developed and prepared, during the 2010-2011 Season.

Fundamental to these changes was the production of our initial "Sports Plan" which sets out our Club's Goals and the strategies to achieve them. This was released in August 2010 – after extensive consultation at Open Forums and feedback from Management.

Former Club Captain and current Beach Captain, Chris Giles who works for SLISA, coordinated the development of the draft document with assistance from Greg Allum and Col Elliott. Each strategy has an estimated time-frame for implementation and an associated budget. Every competitor should make an effort to become familiar with this document and how he or she can access the assistance offered by Cronulla SLSC.

The Sports Plan is a "living document" and will be reviewed and modified annually.

Our Sports Policy established, for the first time, the means to reimburse expenses incurred by our Senior Coaches. Under our Head Water Skills Coach, Nathan Smith and Branch Coach of the Year, "Bluey" Garnsey, our Water Competitors made great progress. By reimbursing travel and accommodation expenses for the State and Australian Titles, we were able to ensure these Coaches and

our Beach Coach – Anthony Lyon, were able to prepare and advise our competitors at these carnivals.

Our competitors were also able to claim reimbursement for the cost of attending these carnivals. Management allocated a pool of \$30,000 for athlete assistance and competitors qualified for shares in this fund by finishing in the top three at the State or top six at the Aussies – the previous season – 2009/10.

This season, 2010-2011 – 35 athletes earned 151 shares in the pool of funds – yet to be determined.

We also established a second offer of assistance for our elite athletes – not based on results but on the following 10 criteria:

1. Representing Cronulla SLSC in Branch, State or National Teams.
2. Competing at State and National Pool Championships.
3. Competing at World Lifesaving Championships.
4. Losing income due to representing Cronulla SLSC
5. Attracting craft sponsorship and thereby reducing the demand on Club subsidies.
6. Adopting a leadership role on Patrols: Captain, Vice-Captain, IRB Driver.
7. Attending special events such as Nipper Presentations, Sponsors Nights etc
8. Assisting Club Coaches in developing younger athletes
9. Competing at Club Championships
10. Gaining publicity for Cronulla SLSC in newspaper articles etc.

The distribution of funds to athletes will be reviewed annually but the C & C Committee will strictly adhere to the guidelines that athletes must have competed for Cronulla SLSC for 12 months before being eligible for assistance and that receipts for expenditure must be submitted.

A further change this season was the way we subsidise craft and training fees. Competitors can submit receipts for purchase of craft – once every 2 years and training fees – every year. At the beginning of each season, they will be reimbursed up to 30% of their outlay to a maximum expenditure of \$10,000 by the Club. Competitors now retain complete ownership of the craft and income from its resale.

Beyond financial issues, the C & C Committee is also conscious of enhancing social experience, improving communication and developing the recruitment and retention of competitors. This season we reintroduced the concept of a central Club tent at carnivals – we successfully



trialled a bus trip to the Coogee Carnival and trialled after carnival BBQs. We also invited the Cadet Captain and Under-14 Age Managers to C & C meetings to better assist the transition from Nippers to Under-15s. More valuable work is planned by Paul Cavanagh, Ellyse Isaacs and Mick de Haan, in this area, for the coming season.

The Coaching and Competition meetings are held on the 1st Monday of each month and any Club Member is welcome to attend or offer an item for the agenda.

I will leave the results for another section of the report, but when evaluating the success of the new Sports Policy, we ask Members to remember that change is a gradual process and the seeds we have planted this season, may not bear fruit for several years.

I would like to thank each Member of the Committee for the passion and enthusiasm they have shown this season and also the Coaches, who have overseen the development of our competitors – not just as athletes, but as fine young adults with high moral values.

An indication of our optimism for the future is that each Member of the Committee is standing for re-election and that we have already had several Water Competitors enquire about joining us next season – because of the infrastructure we have in place.

Beach Captain's Report

For the Beachies, 2010-2011 can be described as nothing short of remarkable. We enjoyed some amazing individual performances and equally impressive Relay results. And we saw these successes from carnival one – right through to the big one – the Australian Championships.

At the Major Championships, our results were superb and continued our run of success at these events.

At the State, we won five Gold Medals, four Silver Medals and countless minor places – amassing a total of 62 points.

At the Aussies we won an equally impressive three Gold, one Silver, two Bronze and two minor placings, for a total of 35 points. What makes this even more impressive, is that these results were achieved without any Under-15s or any men participating in these Championships.

While these two groups were not at the State and Aussies, we did have some at the earlier carnivals. In the Under-15s we saw Bianca Ward return after joining us as an Under-14 last year and showed some impressive results.

As an Under-14 Jessie-Rae Trevitt joined us at some of the local carnivals this year – including the Branch. At the Branch Championships, she proceeded to take the Gold Medal in both the Under-15 Women's Sprint and Flags. An outstanding achievement in her first year as an Under-15. Jessie-Rae's performances saw her take out the "Most Improved Cadet Beach Competitor Award" this year.

Our Under-17 Girls have been arguably our most dominant Age Group. As Under-15s last year, they took out every Title on offer and as first year Under-17s this year, have practically repeated that performance. At the State, the girls took out the quinella in both the Sprint and the Flags – with Bree Masters taking Gold in the Sprint and Silver in the Flags – and Siobhan Dibley taking Gold in the Flags and Silver in the Sprint. Siobhan and Bree were then joined by Olivia Brooks and Grace Strawbridge, to take Gold in the Relay. These same girls then went on to repeat this



Relay success at the Aussies. At the Aussies, Bree Masters made it three Australian Beach Sprint Titles in a row –taking Gold in the Under-17 Women's Sprint. Siobhan Dibley took the Bronze in the Sprint and went on to gain Silver in the Under-17 Women's Flags.

Our small band of Under-19 Women supported by some of our Under-17s also performed well. Laura Fitzpatrick made the State Final in the Under-19 Women's Sprint.

Lauren Archer took Silver in the Under-19 Women's Flags and made the final in this same event at the Aussies.

These girls were then joined by Grace and Olivia at the State and Olivia and Siobhan at the Aussies – to take out second and fourth respectively.

The results achieved by our Open Women were some of the most pleasing. As a first year Under-17, Bree Masters





took out the NSW Open Women's Beach Sprint in a high class field. Sarah Cook and Bernadette Dibley also finished just outside the Medals taking fourth and fifth respectively.

Bree also went on to take the Bronze in the Open Women's Beach Sprint at the Aussies – an outstanding achievement and a sign of more big things to come for her.

In the Relay, our Open Women have scooped the pool this year, taking out the Interclub, Branch, State, Aussies and World Titles during 2010-2011. Throughout the year, all of girls contributed to the Open Women's Relay successes, with Sarah Cook, Bernadette Dibley, Maddi Elliott and Bree Masters forming the team that took the Gold at the State and Aussies.

With Kurrawa having recruited heavily during the off-season – supremely confident of Australian Championship success, it was extremely satisfying to see the girls pull away from the competition in the last leg. And despite a late stumble, the girls convincingly took the Gold!

In a year of highs – it's difficult to single out the achievements of individuals. This year we have however, introduced a new Award – "The Roger Archer Award" for the person who has made the greatest contribution to the Beach Section. Roger, the late father of Lauren, was taken from us suddenly last year. Prior to his passing, Roger was an outstanding supporter of our team and could always be found on the edge of the track. This Award is made in his memory.

The winner of the Roger Archer Award for 2010-2011 is



Bernadette Dibley. Bernie has improved her running out of sight this year and was rewarded with a spot in the State Sprint Final and well deserved Gold Medals in the Open Women's Relay at the State and Aussies. Of even greater significance was her contribution to the team.

Her enthusiasm, advice, research on rules and continual support of our younger Members did not go unnoticed and was appreciated. Bernie is extremely deserving of being named the Inaugural Winner of this Award.

To Col Elliott and Anthony Lyons, who stepped in while I was otherwise occupied and who supported me and the team throughout the year – thank you. Om Swastiastu!

As some of you already know, I am over here in Bali as an Australian Youth Ambassador for Development, working as a volunteer for Balawista Indonesia-Indonesia Surf Life Saving.

I began my assignment at the end of October 2010, after deciding that the first farewell I received wasn't quite up to scratch and tearing my Lisfranc ligament, which required surgery – playing soccer *not* falling from the Fusion's Podium – as some of you may suspect. I had my final farewell and set off.

My first week in Bali started out well with a friendly greeting that included 48 hours of “Bali belly”, a trip to hospital, a kidney infection and a dose of antibiotics – after which I settled in nicely.

I found myself a little one-bedroom apartment 10 minutes walk to work at Kuta Beach and 10 minutes walk to Paddys – so I had my weekdays and weekends sorted!

Part of the work that I have been doing up here mainly involves teaching Water Safety Education to children and the Community.

As such through Balawista, we have held school programs teaching basic Lifesaving techniques, CPR and First-Aid skills.

These are so enjoyable to watch and be involved in as Water Safety Education and being around the beach, are not common teaching environments in Bali.

We have begun a Nipper Program which is held every Sunday morning from 8-10am on Kuta Beach.

I have been writing programs and training the Balinese Instructors to teach the children, as it is something they have never done before.

The funding for the program comes from a 10-year-old Nipper from Sorrento SLSC in WA.

Toni-Lee Bromley approached Balawista and I back in January, provided us with funding and Nippers began in Bali!

We had hoped to get 30 children registered when we started in April.

However, to everyone's surprise, we now have 105 children registered with 50-60 regular attendees each week.

It is a free program that will run until October.

The children receive a uniform, water and snack each week, as well as Instruction on Swimming, Board Paddling, Beach Flags, Water Safety, the Beach Environment and other activities.

This race shows the depth of our Club and it will take a mighty effort for anyone to take this away from us – so well done swimmers.

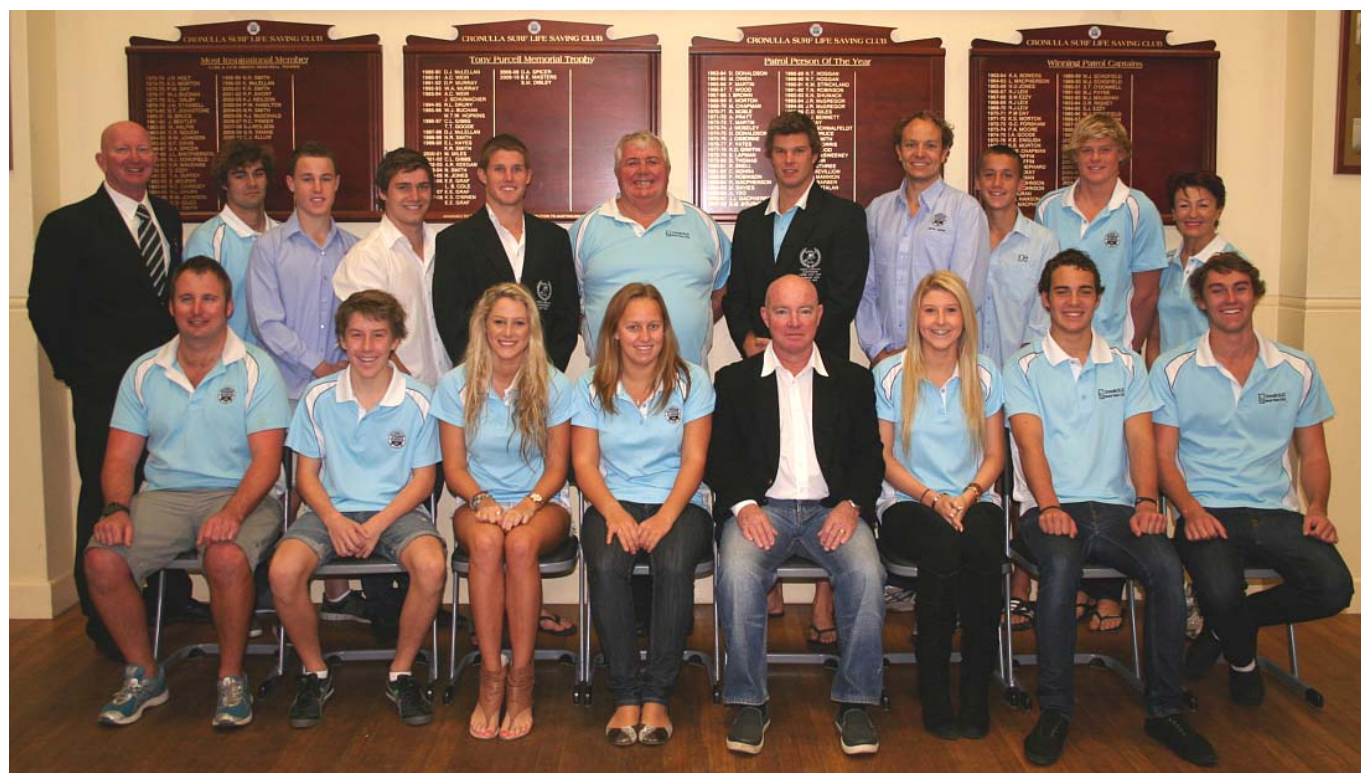

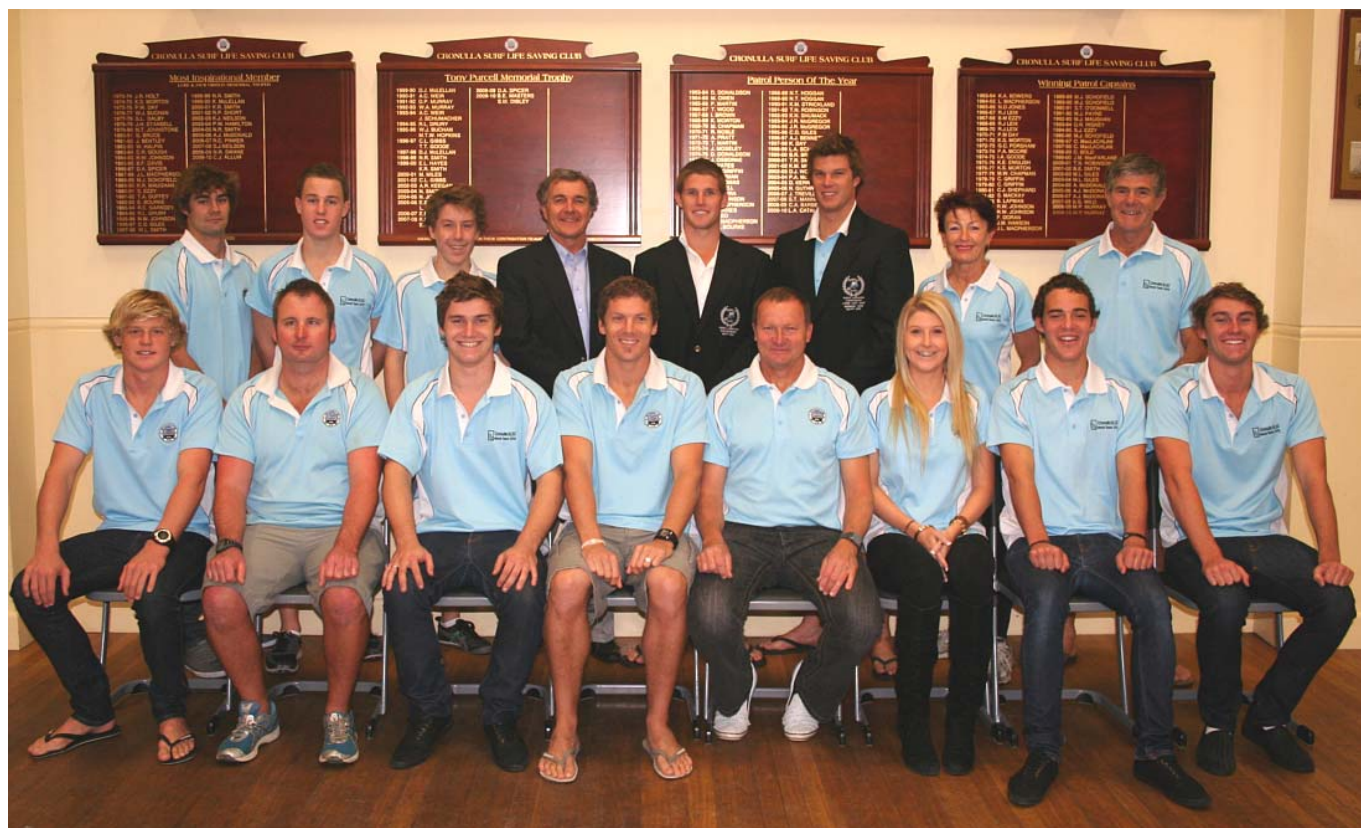

I would like to personally thank all the recognised Club Water Coaches throughout the year for their dedication,

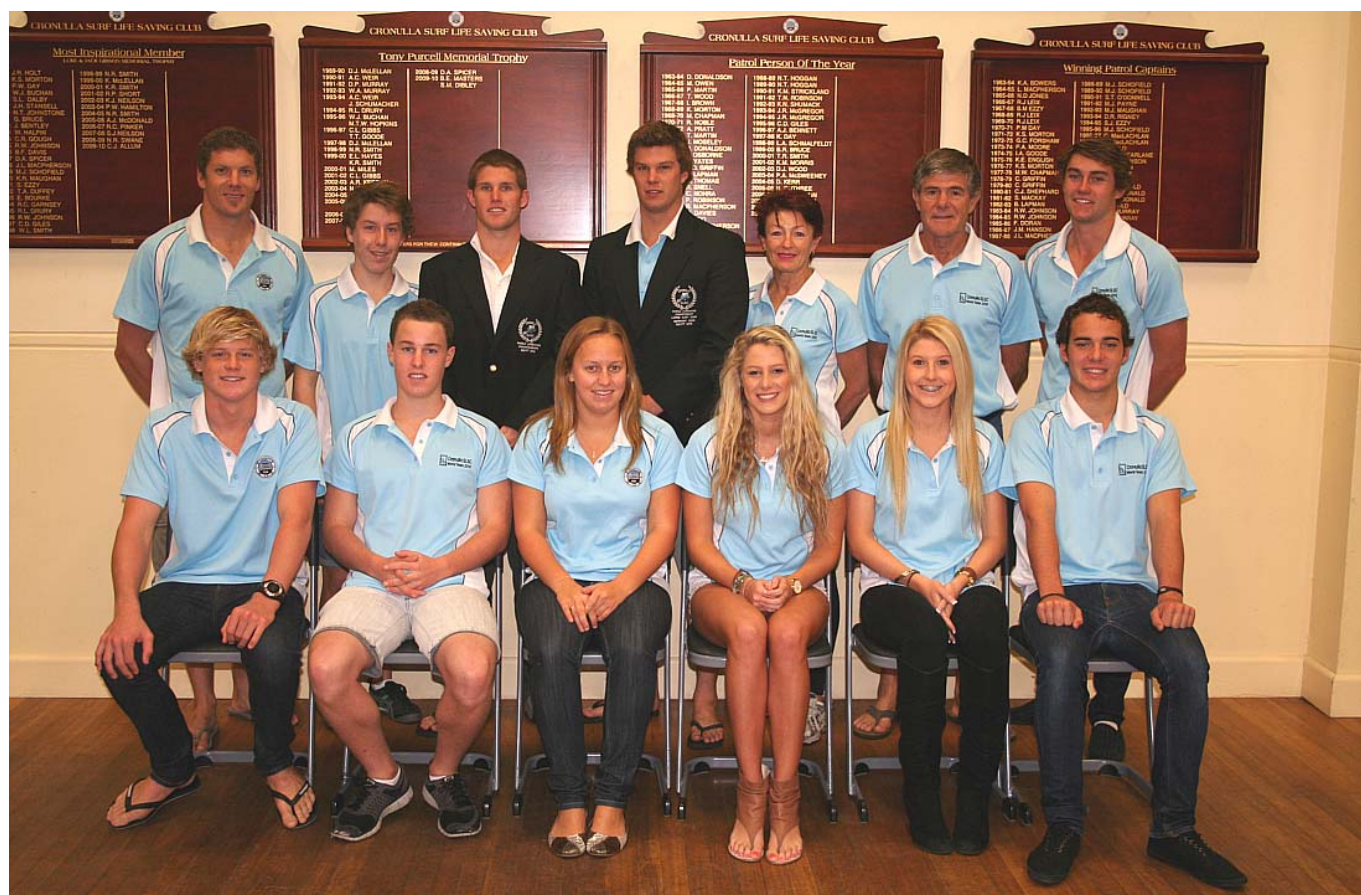

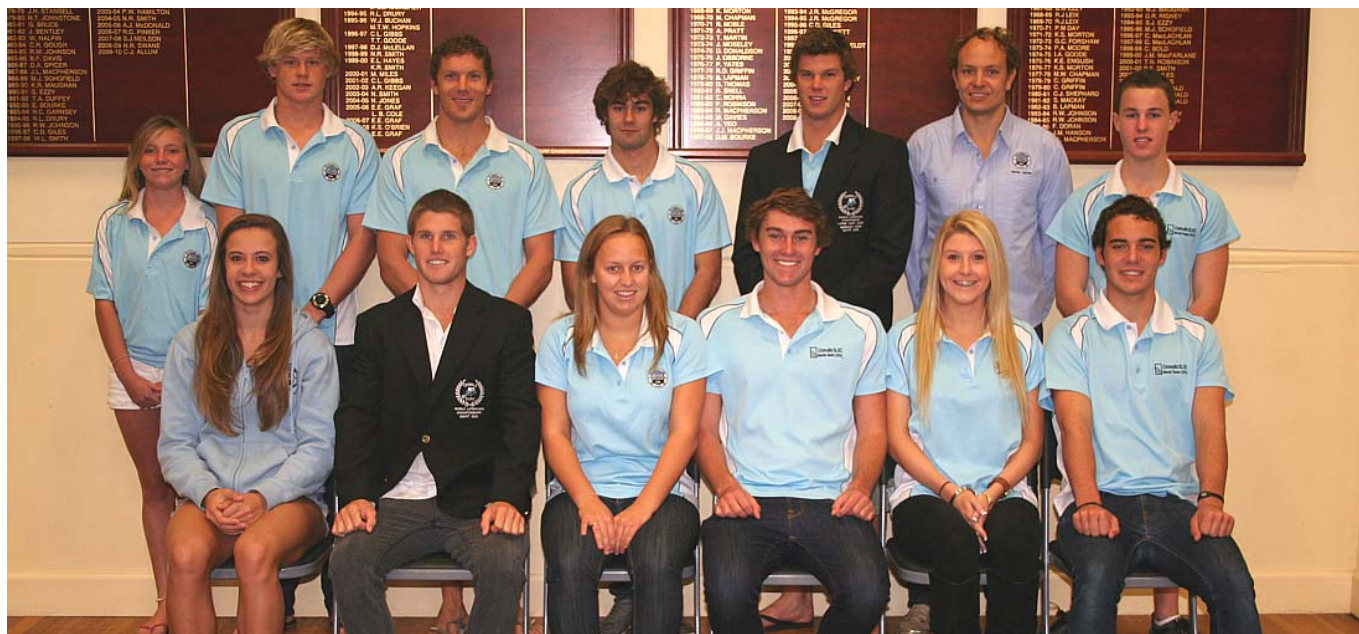

Rescue 2010

Cronulla SLSC sent nine young competitors to represent the Club in the World Life Saving Championships (Rescue 2010) in Alexandria, Egypt.

Male: Chris Allum, (Team Captain) Hayden Allum
Kyle O'Brien and Aaron Markey – *Female:* Sarah Cook
Maddi Elliott, Emma Groves, Ras Gill and Jaime McKee.

After four days in Cairo, the team settled in well to their clean, air-conditioned accommodation in Alexandria – ready to start competition.

The Pool Events were held at the Mubarak Military Pool, about a 30 minute bus ride away from our hotel.

Day 1: The Pool Competition saw our Male Competitors pick up a Silver Medal in the SERC Competition, (Simulated Emergency Response Competition) – which tests the initiative, judgment, knowledge, and abilities of four Lifesavers who, acting as a team, apply Lifesaving skills in a simulated emergency situation – unknown to them prior to the start. This competition is judged within a 2-minute time limit. All teams respond to the identical situation and are evaluated by the same Judges. There were 68 teams. This was a fantastic start to their campaign.

A special mention goes to Kyle O'Brien, for his fourth place in the 200m Obstacle Race.

This was a PB to someone who had flown from the NZ International Competition, only a few days before.

Day 2: Our Team Captain got a Silver Medal in the 200M Superlifesaver event. The competitor swims 75m Freestyle and then dives to recover a submerged Manikin. The competitor surfaces the Manikin within 5m of the pick-up line and carries it to the turning edge. After touching the wall, the competitor releases the Manikin. In the water, the competitor dons Fins and Rescue Tube within 5m of the turning edge and swims 50m Freestyle. After touching the wall, the competitor fixes the Rescue Tube around a floating Manikin within 5m of the turning edge – and tows it to touch the finish edge of the pool. The Beach Events were held in the Mamoura Beach Area, a protected area with access controlled by security and tourist police – approximately 10 minutes from our hotel by taxi.

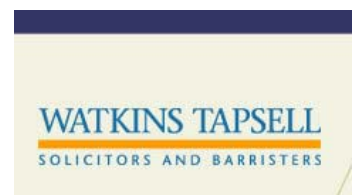

Treasurer's Report

I am pleased to report that the Club's sound financial position continues to grow and for the 2011 financial year the surplus was \$151,848. Again both the Senior and Junior Committees have shown sound management and this is reflected in our accounts.

The major achievements during the year were the full repayment of borrowings to the Commonwealth Bank that was utilised for the construction of the restaurant facility, the refurbishment of the Resident Member's quarters, the refurbishment of the Office, the acquisition of plant, Lifesaving equipment and capital works totalling \$109,868, and the increase in cash at bank and short term deposits by approximately \$100,000 – to bring the balance of cash deposits held at 30 April 2011 to \$568,852. This result has been assisted by the various Sections and Committees being conscious of their spending and keeping this within their budgets.

The Club again held a number of fundraising activities and in particular I would like to thank the Shark Island, Golf Day and 200 Club Committees for their efforts in raising substantial funds throughout the year.

I would again say thank you to the many Sponsors for their support and those who have generously donated to the Club, as without this support over many years, we would not be in the sound position that we are now in. These are listed in the Annual Report and I would ask that you take time to review the list. In particular, I would like to thank the partners at Gibson Howlin Lawyers, who donate their services to assist with the many legal matters that arise throughout the year. Their prompt and efficient assistance with these matters is greatly appreciated.

Looking to the future, we are currently preparing our budgets for the ensuing season and I am confident that our sound financial position will continue. In doing this, I would like to extend my appreciation to the Management Committee for their support, the Nipper's Treasurer Michele Cole, for her diligence in maintaining their affairs and the Office Staff for their assistance in recording the daily transactions.

President's Addendum

I am pleased once again to say thanks you to all those who have contributed to this excellent Annual Report. In particular, I commend our Honorary Secretary, Paul Larssen, for this, his first Annual Report and I hope that it is the first of many Annual Reports to come.

When I reported to you at the end of my first year as President, I outlined four areas that I had asked the Management Committee to commit to in the 2008-2009 Season.

Those four areas of commitment were Lifesaving, Competition, the usage of the Clubhouse and our financial viability.

At the conclusion of my third year as your President 2010-2011 – I wish to provide to you a very quick progress report on those four areas of commitment.

The first of these areas is Surf Life Saving – the core reason for our existence. Whilst many people flock to Cronulla because of its perceived safety, like any beach or open waterway, whilst it can be inviting on a hot summers day or challenging when the swell is up – it can be deceptive, dangerous and life threatening.

I am very proud to report that once again, that in the past season – the patrolling Members have performed their duties to the utmost of their ability – and "No Lives Lost" whilst Patrols were on duty.

The provision of a first class Life Saving service comes not only from the patrolling Members, but from all of our Members and supporters, who train our Lifesavers, purchase and maintain our gear and equipment – and provide the necessary support through fundraising, maintaining our Clubhouse and Administration.

This season we will continue to provide the best to assist our Patrolling Members with additional services and equipment to replace the Offshore Rescue Boat, provide personal Surf Rescue apparel and fund Patrol Members' participation in courses and training – where before,

Members were expected to pay for these courses from their own pockets.

Without the Club as a whole, with the Members acting with providing Vigilance and Service, we would not be able to fulfil our charter of protecting the surfing public.

Two years ago, I committed and the Executive and Management endorsed, a program to ensure that our competitors would be provided with every opportunity to represent Cronulla at all levels of Surf sports and to also reach their personal ambitions. That commitment and endorsement included the hope that we would, within the next three years – win another Australian amateur Championship.

I say amateur, because that is our aim – to win the Australian Championships without a single paid contracted athlete. Athletes who are true Australian Surf Lifesavers who complete their requirements as Patrolling Members before they are able to compete for Cronulla.

For I am one that will not allow our Club colours to be sullied by professionalism, ring-ins and those that seek to win Gold Medals merely because they represent wealthy Clubs who have surrendered their community assets as Surf Clubs over to discos, mini-casinos and gin palaces.

I am proud to report to you that over the past two years, we have developed a sustainable and comprehensive athlete financial support and subsidy program, that is available to all Members.

To receive any financial assistance or participate in a craft or training subsidy program from Cronulla, you are not only expected to represent Cronulla just at Carnivals or other events, but represent Cronulla as a Member of this Club in its Lifesaving, training, coaching, fundraising, administrative and social life. Nothing more or nothing less. It's what we called being honoured to wear the Sky Blue, Black and White – and being part of the team.

Also, in terms of competition, we acknowledge and appreciate the hard work and long hours that our Officials put in on the beach, on the water, on the back of beach and in the countless hours of meetings and briefings that they attend. In recognition of our Officials we have therefore extended our financial assistance and subsidy program to all of our Officials – so that they can travel to and be accommodated at carnivals and events and that they too can maintain their level of education and training.

Members, throughout the Annual Report, you will read references and reports to the renovation and possible reconstruction of our Clubhouse over the next three years.

This is in accordance with the commitment that I gave to you two years ago, that we would address the operation and workings of this building – so that it meets the new requirements of our Members and that of the community.

I cannot emphasise that this new building will not be a building that any individual Club Member wants, nor will it be a building that panders to the desires of one particular group of Members. Report on the Financial Report

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The committee of the association are responsible for the preparation and fair representation of the financial report in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the Associations Incorporation Act of New South Wales and such internal control as management determines necessary to enable the preparation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the members of the committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report. We believe that the evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our audit we have complied with the independence requirements of the corporations Act 2001.

We confirm that the independence declaration required by the corporations Act 2001, which has been given to the management committee of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated, would be in the same terms if given to the management committee as at the time of this auditor's report.

Basis for Qualified Auditor's Opinion

Our audit report has been issued with the following qualifications:

1. As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for the club to maintain an effective system of internal control over donations, subscriptions, sales and fundraising activities until their initial entry into the accounting record. Accordingly, our audit in relation to such revenue was limited to amounts recorded.
2. We did not observe the counting of the physical inventories as at 30 April 2011. Owing to the nature of the association's records, we were unable to satisfy ourselves as to inventory quantities by other audit procedures.

Qualified Auditors Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects on the financial report of the matters referred to in the qualification paragraph, the financial report of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act of New South Wales, including:

- (a) Giving a true and fair view of the incorporated association's financial position as at 30 April 2011 and of its performance for the year ended on that date;
- (b) Complying with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements;
- (c) That the financial statements show a true and fair view of the financial results of fundraising appeals conducted during the year;
- (d) That the accounting and associated records have been properly kept during the year in accordance with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the regulations;
- (e) That monies received as a result of fundraising appeals conducted during the year have been properly accounted for and applied in accordance with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the regulations; and
- (f) At the date of this report there are reasonable grounds to believe that the organisation will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

Notes to the Financial Statements – For the Year Ended 30 April 2011

The financial statements cover Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated as an individual entity. Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporation Act 1984.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

The incorporated association has early adopted AASB 1053 'Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards' and AASB 2010-02 'Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements'. No other new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have been early adopted.

Any significant impact on the accounting policies of the incorporated association from the adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations are disclosed in the relevant accounting policy.

The adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations did not have any impact on the financial performance or position of the incorporated association. The following Accounting Standards and Interpretations are most relevant to the incorporated association:

AASB 1053 Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards

The incorporated association has early adopted AASB 1053 from 1 May 2010. This standard establishes a differential financial reporting framework consisting of two Tiers of reporting requirements for preparing general purpose financial statements, being Tier 1 Australian Accounting Standards and Tier 2 Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements. The incorporated association being classed as Tier 2 continues to apply the full recognition and measurements requirements of Australian Accounting Standards with substantially reduced disclosure in accordance with AASB 2010-2.

AASB 2010-2 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements

The incorporated association has early adopted AASB 2010-2 from 1 May 2010. These amendments make numerous modifications to a range of Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, to introduce reduced disclosure requirements to the pronouncements for application by certain types of entities in preparing general purpose financial statements. The adoption of these amendments has significantly reduced the incorporated association's disclosure requirements.

AASB 2009-5 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from the Annual Improvements Project

The incorporated association has applied AASB 2009-5 amendments from 1 May 2010. The amendments result in some accounting changes for presentation, recognition or measurement purposes, while some amendments that relate to terminology and editorial changes had no or minimal effect on accounting. The main changes were:

AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements' – classification is not affected by the terms of a liability that could be settled by the issuance of equity instruments at the option of the counterparty;

AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows' – only expenditure that results in a recognised asset can be classified as a cash flow from investing activities;

AASB 118 'Revenue' – provides additional guidance to determine whether an entity is acting as a principal or agent; and

Basis of preparation

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB'), New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. These financial statements do not comply with International Financial Reporting Standards as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ('IASB').

Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Critical accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the incorporated association's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are disclosed in note 2.

Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the incorporated association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Grants

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attached conditions will be complied with.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

Income tax

As the incorporated association is a charitable institution in terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with financial institutions, other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

Trade and other receivables

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any provision for impairment.

Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised lease assets is depreciated over the assets useful life commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the incorporated association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Impairment of non-financial assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Employee benefits*Wages and salaries and annual leave*

Liabilities for wages and salaries, including non-monetary benefits, and annual leave expected to be settled within 12 months of the reporting date are recognised in current liabilities in respect of employees' services up to the reporting date and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled.

Defined contribution superannuation expense

Contributions to defined contribution superannuation plans are expensed in the period in which they are incurred.

Goods and Services Tax ('GST') and other similar taxes

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the tax authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority is included in other receivables or other payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the tax authority, are presented as operating cash flows.

Commitments and contingencies are disclosed net of the amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority.

Note 2. Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

Estimation of useful lives of assets

The incorporated association determines the estimated useful lives and related depreciation and amortisation charges for its property, plant and equipment and definite life intangible assets. The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down.

Impairment of non-financial assets other than goodwill and other indefinite life intangible assets

The incorporated association assesses impairment of non-financial assets other than goodwill and other indefinite life intangible assets at each reporting date by evaluating conditions specific to the incorporated association and to the particular asset that may lead to impairment. If an impairment trigger exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is determined. This involves fair value less costs to sell or value-in-use calculations, which incorporate a number of key estimates and assumptions.

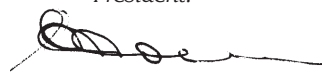

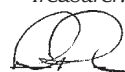
