In the early 1960s John transferred his interests to Wanda where he became involved with the administration of the club, serving time as President.

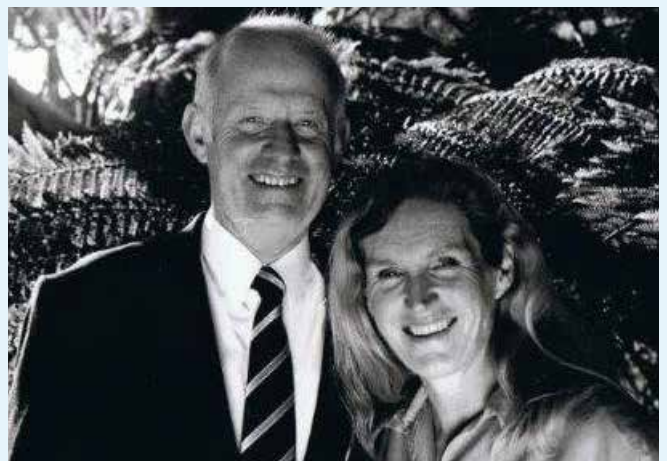
At Wanda John and Kerryann were involved for the first nine years in the organisation and running of the Sutherland to Surf fun run and walk.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It has been an interesting season for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club with good delivery and mixed successes and outcomes across our lifesaving, nipper, surf sports and community activities. As usual each season unravels a story.

Our Club lifesaving activities were of a high standard this past season. We had approximately two hundred and seventy active patrol members. What an amazing number and fortunately so, as in a very busy season we saw a fifty percent increase in rescues and preventions and doubling of first aids. This obviously kept the patrols busy.

Club Vice Captain, Darryl Easton organised very good patrols with good numbers regularly in attendance. Darryl provides up to date statistics on a monthly basis to Lifesaving Committee meetings reporting on rescues performed, patrol member numbers, attendance patterns and member qualifications. This allows proper allocation of new award members to the right patrol. The Lifesaving Committee has adopted and embraced an agenda that fosters sharing of knowledge and experiences which has strengthened the lifesaving group and increased attendance at meetings.

The beach remained in good condition for most of the season and this made it a very pleasant and safe place to be. However, toward the end of the season sand erosion and rock exposure presented several challenges for patrol and our daily activities.

Of particular note this past season were a couple of rescues performed by our younger SRC holding Cadet Members. I would like to mention, in particular, the rescue, by a young Cadet, of a swimmer who proved to be the mother of a family of past patrol members - just to show you that what goes around comes around.

Once again we kept our beach safe, supported those who rely on us and we met the standards and expectations of those who monitor us. We were recognised formally when at the SLSS Awards of Excellence we were awarded the Patrol Efficiency Award for our area.

We had a good season in lifesaving education, with very good numbers in basic awards including the Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallion - meaning new and trained lifesavers on our beach. Many thanks go to Scott Rofe who stepped in as Acting Chief Instructor mid season when the CTO, John Mamacan's availability became limited due to work requirements. Scott was continually supported by Dave Bruckmann and at various times during the season by Brian Dalgarno, Jenn MacLachlan, Carlo Villanti, Tony Coffey and others - a very able team.

Rob Walker, Chris Barber, Craig Jordan and Daniel Wood ran the IRB squads assisted by some "trainers in training". We achieved high IRB award numbers, achieving the most IRB awards in the Branch for the third time in four years. For our last IRB squad of the season we invited the other area Clubs to attend with both candidates and trainers and this was a great co-operative success.

Thank you to you all for a season of good squads and high award numbers. Well done Life Savers - Patrol Members, Trainers and Club Officers.

Our Junior Activity Group, the Cronulla Crays ran a very good program this season. We saw a continued growth in Crays numbers meaning a full beach of activities each week. The sight of several hundred young Cronulla Members on the beach each Sunday is a joy to see - several hundred junior

lifesavers developing friendships and learning skills that they will carry forward into their later life.

The Black Caps nipper group for young members with special needs continues to operate very successfully thanks to the good work of Cameron and Lauren Pyett plus Sherie and Emma Lisser.

The very successful Learn to Swim and Assessment Program, sponsored by Tradies, was run again for our younger nipper groups. I believe that an extension of this program is in planning to allow it to achieve even greater success.

Junior surf sports also had a good season. A commitment to improving nipper competition results was obvious to anybody that attended nipper training sessions and carnivals. There were increased numbers at training virtually every day, regardless of the weather and this led to improved carnival results throughout and at the end of the season.

All of the above came in the year that the Crays celebrated fifty years as an official sub-committee of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club. The celebrations were marked by an afternoon at the Club where many current and past Crays and committee members attended to greet old friends and to reminisce. As well as some motivational words from the most successful Cray of them all, Kevin Neilson, those gathered heard recollections of the formation of the Crays and its successes and history since. What a great achievement.

The Club Coaching and Competition section continues the re-establishment and development process of the last couple of seasons. Large and increasing numbers were evident at craft, surf swim and beach training sessions. Strong team spirit, effective communication, good organisation and well run processes at carnivals led to another extremely well organised Aussies campaign. Unfortunately the weather was not so well organised.

Our results at Aussies were good in a cyclone interrupted carnival and it was unfortunate that our Cadet to Open water competitors including boaties were largely unable to compete. We came away with eight gold medals from the three separate carnivals which combine to make Aussies and in the truncated open division carnival we came tenth over all. Despite the disappointment, the cancellation of water events on the days the beach events were held meant that we had a "whole club" presence at virtually all beach events which was absolutely fantastic to be part of.

Congratulations to all of our competitors who trained hard all season and in particular to our Gold Medal winners, Paul Larssen, Jacinta Davidson-Bunch, Ngaire Hadfield, Chloe Mannix-Power, Isabellah Walker, Phoebe Lacoste, Kate Hawkings, Bridget Cole, Chris Breen and Nathan Breen. Please see the full results and details elsewhere in this annual report.

Some of our athletes were recognised at high levels this past season. Isabellah Walker was named as the Branch U15 Athlete of the Year at the annual SLSS Awards of Excellence. Carla Papac and Ngaire Hadfield were selected in the Australian Youth Team to compete in the Sanyo-Busson Cup in Japan at the end of last season and Ngaire capped her year off by being selected in the Australian squad now in training for Rescue 2018, the World Lifesaving Championships to be held in Adelaide next year. Congratulations.

Thank you and congratulations to the Section Heads, Coaches and team management group who committed heavily in time and effort to make sure everything worked well and that the competitors were well supported. Especially, I must thank our Team Manager, Paul Cavanagh and logistics co-ordinator, Scott Rofe who both worked tirelessly and continuously throughout the nine days of Aussies. Thanks also to the others on the team management and coaching group including Sherie Lisser, Mike Vitnell, Don Robertson, Richard Ford, Ant Lyon, Mark Redrup and Daniel Neilson. A big shift for the team was the absence at Aussies, for the first time in memory, of the veterans Kevin and Sandra Neilson.

A large number of Cronulla Members also serve as officials at carnivals from local events to the Aussies and also at higher levels within the association. Without these people our athletes could not compete and events would not be organised. Thank you to all of you.

Sutherland Council has continued its support with internal and external maintenance work on our premises. At the end of the 2015-16 season Council embarked on a program of internal repairs and complete painting of the inside of the building. I am certain that Members are very happy with the outcome. In May this year work started on repair, remediation and painting of the outside surface of the core heritage part of our building to bring it back to as good a condition as possible, ready for commencement of our building refurbishment program. Our clubhouse will soon be back in a state fitting such an iconic building in our community.

The building refurbishment and development process has been long and arduous at times. However, major progress has been made and there are three significant points to mention. The approval of a Development Application in November 2016 meant that the Club could effectively seek public funding. The announcement of the three million dollar Federal grant in April 2017 meant that the funding gap had been bridged and the project was now truly within financial reach. Finally, the Special General Meeting held after season end on June 4th 2017 approved the plans, funding and progression of the project to the preparation for and commencement of construction. Please see the full report elsewhere in this annual report and information on the Club website. I extend my personal thanks to all



Members of the Building Development Committee for their sustained efforts and also to Club Members for the support they have shown this project.

Cronulla Life Member, Vice-Patron and Past President, John Bentley chaired the District Council again this season. John continues to lead a good team of people from all four local clubs who look after joint local surf club interests.

Paul Larssen ably assisted by a committee from all four local Clubs organised the second Bate Bay Ball which was held just after season close. The ball was well attended and was a great evening. This is a great local initiative set in place two seasons ago and now continued by Paul. Thanks mate.

Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch continued its harmonious relationship with the Clubs. The Branch is led by President George Shales from Maroubra. Cronulla's Wayne Druery has continued in the role of Director of Surf Sports where he continues to introduce new ideas and processes to improve surf sports and keep pace with the needs and expectations of the current generation.

Your Management Committee and the various sub-committees have continued as good forums where vigorous discussion is promoted to ensure good and measured decision making. The sub-committees have generally delivered on their responsibilities, though some could meet more often and provide more comprehensive and timely reports to the Management Committee.

The Club Executive, Daniel, Emma, Chris and Daryn have worked to manage the day to day affairs and some bigger issues of our Club. In conjunction with our Office staff our administrative processes have been thorough and efficient and our financial management remains sound. The Executive members put in a lot of hours, often at personal cost and I appreciate this very much. Hopefully, as a group,

we have provided the right support and decision making this past season.

Our Club relies heavily on our Office staff for the administrative and other support that they provide. Our Office staff structure changed a little this year. Robyn Cole changed her work pattern, Emma Larssen departed to take up a very good position elsewhere to follow her career path and we employed Kathy Ford to take up the vacancy. Our Administrative Coordinator, Jenny Pinker and her fellow workers Robyn, Emma and Kathy all regularly stepped well beyond what was expected or required and they ensured that we continued to operate very well. I thank them for their dedication, hard work and achievements and the continued excellent way that they conduct our daily operations.

In February the Club, through the Operations Committee, appointed a new Function Manager, Angela Vanderlouw. Angela brings a range of experience in hospitality and her role is to develop the potential of the Purcell Room. There are some very positive early indications that this will be a successful venture.

I thank all involved in our fundraising activities and processes but especially those who organise and coordinate them. These include Chris Gough (200 Club), Michael Banister and Ross Diver-Tuck (Golf Day), Glenn Carter and Kieran Day (Shark Island Swim), Frank Doran (Convenor, Finance and Sponsorship), Darryl Ward (Convenor, Operations) and any others that I have missed.

Unfortunately, our fundraising program took a significant blow this season when the Shark Island Swim was cancelled for the second year running due to dangerous ocean conditions. The impact on the Club is measured in several tens of thousands of dollars and this will have to be taken into account for future financial and budget planning.



On behalf of our Club I formally thank our local representatives for their ongoing support. The Sutherland Shire Mayor, Carmello Pesce and Councilors have been highly supportive in all of our activities but especially so with our building project. We are also fortunate to be represented by two fabulously supportive members of Parliament with the Hon. Scott Morrison at Federal level and Hon. Mark Speakman SC at State level. Scott and Mark have both been active in seeking and obtaining grant funds for our Building Project. A full report is elsewhere in this annual report. However, it would be remiss of me if I did not mention the fabulous announcement by Scott Morrison, made in our clubhouse on 9th April, of the three million dollar Federal grant which he had obtained on our behalf. This is possibly the greatest gift ever made to our Club, a gift for which every Member is enormously grateful.

The passing of Club members and family and friends of Club Members is a sad occasion. We were again fortunate that this season there were not so many, though some did hit home hard. You will find a list of Members and family who have passed on elsewhere in this annual report plus some vale written in memory and respect. I commend them to you.

This season a major goal was the refinement of a comprehensive and integrated communication system using electronic and other tools. As a result, we have seen the development of a more e-copy and paper Capers, a new Club website, increased use of Facebook, Instagram and Team App and continued use of SMS messages and group e-mails, though with a decreased volume and reliance on the latter. Daniel Wood and Kathy Ford have worked on expanding the capabilities of the newsletter software and are on the verge of developing a good integration process to co-ordinate our communications. This should be a very comprehensive set of linked tools to ensure good communication to our Members.

Another important goal is one that I have set for the last five years. I ask all elected officers, Section Heads and volunteers to know their role and fulfil all of the requirements of their position and allow others to do theirs. Unfortunately this does not always happen in a volunteer role. We hear the expression "time poor" used or people say they are (too) busy. The up-side of this of course is that hopefully if we are time poor we are "life rich". We are lucky to be busy in this wonderful world full of opportunities. However, we carry the responsibilities of the positions we accept and please remember, there are always others there to help. They just need to be asked. We all get the benefits of being in this great organisation - we all need to put something in.

The support of our families is important and often essential for the participation of many in their involvement in our Club. Thank you for all of the understanding and encouragement from wives, husbands, partners, parents, children and others who contribute in their way and allow us to make this a great Club. I have now spent five years in the President's role and thank my own wonderful family for understanding and allowing me this privilege. To my children Kimberley, Rob and Johannah, all of whom have been patrolling Members, I am proud of you and so appreciative of what you do for me. To my wife, Deb - what amazing support you give me. Simply, thank you.

In closing, I will repeat what I have concluded with for the past couple of seasons. This is a great Club. When we talk about what the Club has done or what the Club should do, remember friends - you are the Club. I look forward to next season when I am sure that I will see you on the beach at Cronulla. Where else would you rather be?

SECRETARY'S REPORT

To the Members and Supporters of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club, I present to you, the 110th Annual Report and Financial Statement for the 2016/2017 Season.

I initially passed the role onto my father, Paul in 2010, when I accepted an offer and moved to Bali as a voluntary Youth Ambassador for Development under the auspices of AUSAID, to assist with drowning prevention. This was to have been for one year but in fact, became five years. During that time, Paul remained Secretary for six seasons and achieved above and beyond in his performance of the duties expected from the incumbent. There were big shoes to fill on my return but the handover was easy when keeping it in the family. CLUB VICE-CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Fellow Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club members:

My second season as Vice-Captain has been and extremely rewarding experience. I feel like I half know what I am doing now, and some of the more time consuming tasks from the previous season take slightly less time.

The monthly Life Saving Committee meetings have been extremely positive, with great sharing of experience and knowledge. This is the best forum for information to make it's way to the wider life saving community of the club, so I encourage all Patrolling Members to ask their Patrol Captains what is happening.

This season, we decided not to continue with the Split Patrol that we trailed last season. Whilst successful in isolation, allowing for better than average rostered attendance, and therefore maintaining strong patrols with fewer rostered members, we just didn't feel it would be possible to scale out more widely.

What did return for this season was the 'Boaties Patrol', a patrol predominantly made up of our Surf Boat Crews. The aim of the Boaties Patrol, was to allow the Boat Crews to patrol to a roster that was organised around the major Boat Carnivals and to allow Boaties to patrol together as a team. Under the captaincy of Stuart 'Stewie' Spencer, it was a great success. Patrol 4 almost took out the Patrol of the Year Competition, had very good rostered attendance, and performed very well in all areas of life saving over the season.

This season also saw the return of the Sunday Races to the Patrol Competition. Over the season, Patrolling members competed 490 times in the Sunday Races (multiple races on the same day only counted as one). The aim of the inclusion of this in the Patrol Competition was to encourage members to maintain their 'water skills' and fitness throughout the season. A big thanks to Wendy Ward for helping to maintain the results for me, Darryl Ward of course did nothing :D

After many years as the proverbial bridesmaid, Patrol 6 Captained by Nick Rubbi, finally took out the Patrol Competition for the season. As the results later in the report show, it was a close battle and a deserving win. Nick's Patrol took out top points on the Surf Sports Competition Day, and was in the top 2 or 3 in almost all competition areas. Congratulations to Patrol 6, and Nick.

This season 44 members earned the 100% Award and five members the Outstanding Patrol Attendance Award (100% less one with a substitute). Cronulla has always held the 100% Award in very high regard, and sets an equally high criteria to achieve the award. 100% Award winners are recognised for their exceptional contribution with an invitation to the Annual Snow Trip and an award at the presentation night. Thank you to all the 100% Award and OPAA recipients for your service over the year, and congratulations on your achievement.

Finally to our Patrol Person of the year. This award was decided by a process of nominations from each Patrol Captain, the Club Captain, and myself as Vice-Captain. A short list was developed, and four candidates interviewed by the Club Captain and myself. The four finalists were Richard Wenden, Maj Sibai and David Dalla-Camina, with the eventual winner being Daryn Metti. Surprisingly after his decades of exceptional service, Daryn has not previously received this award. Congratulation to Daryn.

This patrol season was typically busy on our beach. We

provided over 10,000 total patrol hours and 8500 rostered patrol hours, to keep a recorded 25,000 people safe. We recorded 394 first aid instances, including four where the victim required ambulance transport. We helped five lost parents. We rescued 125 people, whose day at the beach could have ended tragically if not for our intervention. Most importantly, we recorded 862 instances where we intervened before someone got themselves into serious danger.

As a Life Saving Committee, our big push is to drive the number of people patrolling to the roster. This season Rostered Hours attendance was a little under 60%. That means to be confident we can get a target 15 members to a rostered patrol, we need 25 in the Patrol Team. If we can increase rostered attendance, we can reduce patrol sizes, increase the total number of patrols, and therefore reduce the number of patrol days we are each rostered for. This will continue to be a focus for next season as we work with all sections of the club to improve out life saving activities.

Thanks must go to all of our Life Saving Committee, Patrol Captains, Vice captains and IRB crews, a special thanks to Chris Barber (Club Captain), Robert 'Max' Walker (IRB Captain) and John Mamacan and Scott Rofe (Chief Training Officer and acting CTO) and their team of trainers for all your support and hard work once again this past season. Finally to our Patrolling Members - thank you all for your service over the season, and willingness to trial the changes that the Life Saving Committee introduced for the season. Without your contributions, our club would not be able to meet our obligations to our stakeholders, and most importantly, keep the public safe. I hope that you will return next season to continue our life saving service and maintain our club's high standards of Life Saving.

CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

Cronulla SLSC has a large amount of lifesaving equipment which must always be in good condition and available for patrols and water safety. This past season Cronulla's equipment was prepared, repaired, renewed and submitted for the inspection held on Sunday 4th September 2016. All equipment was laid out in the IRB Shed, Ballroom, Patrol Room, Training Room, Radio Room and Monro Room, and the display was quite impressive. This equipment included the following items:

- 21 rescue boards
- 36 rescue tubes
- 10 radios
- 4 oxy-viva kits
- 2 patrol first aid kits
- 1 club first aid kit
- 2 spinal boards and straps
- 2 defibrillators
- 4 Suction equipment sets
- 2 Stretchers
- Patrol area and tent
- Patrol uniforms
- Signal flags and evacuation (shark) flags
- 18 resuscitation mannequins
- 3 trainer defibrillators
- 5 IRB
- 8 outboard motors
- 7 trailers

The inspection team of dedicated officials visits all clubs in the Branch over one weekend. This year an innovation saw paperless gear checks with results recorded on iPads and the inspection was very quick. After completion of the Cronulla inspection we supplied refreshments to the inspection team before they set off for the National Park beaches.

David Dalla-Camina took on the role of First Aid Officer this year. He embraced the responsibilities of the position and ensured that all first aid equipment and consumables were available and of a high standard. The following members helped prepare the club gear and premises for the start of the season - Rob Short Jr., David Dalla-Camina, Ken English, Brian Dalgarno, Carlo Villanti, Robert Walker, Maxwell Walker, Craig Jordan and Chris Barber.

Purchases of replacement equipment this season were again high, but lifesaving is our core business and the equipment is a necessary and justifiable

expense. Cronulla's patrols are always well equipped with necessary equipment. Excluding IRB items, the expenditure this season was a little over \$11,300. This included purchase of a rescue board (\$1360), board repairs (\$1730), purchase of two new radios (\$1940), radio servicing (\$530), oxy-viva and resuscitation manikin servicing (\$540), resuscitation, spinal management and defibrillator items (\$990), first-aid supplies (\$1010) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$170). We also purchased some uniforms, rash shirts, caps, log books and other patrol items from the SLSA shop (\$1070) plus patrol caps (\$2000). All new Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate awardees had a uniform, patrol cap and sunhat presented at their assessment and all IRB drivers and crewpersons were provided a SLSA rash shirt and peaked cap to wear while on duty. New Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLSA patrol jacket and peaked cap and the Club continued to subsidise the purchase of PFDs by IRB Crewpersons and Drivers if they wanted to purchase their own. Having these lifesavers fitted properly is a welcome expense.

The Australian Government, for the third season, funded every Club in the country with a \$5000 grant towards the cost of lifesaving equipment. Surf Life Saving Australia provided \$2742 (83 uniforms) as a patrol uniform subsidy. Surf Life Saving New South Wales distributed approximately \$6,000 from the SLS fundraising activities to each NSW Club. Cronulla RSL donated the cost of an IRB motor. The remainder of the lifesaving expenditure was from Club funds.

Once again, this season, I believe that we have been able to provide Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club with the best possible equipment for patrol, water safety, training, competition and community purposes.

See you on the beach at Cronulla – where else would you rather be?

After a couple of years the "Commercial Activities" name was dropped due to the complexities of the wording "Commercial" and it was renamed the Operations Committee. These committees were and are responsible for overseeing the construction of the restaurant in 2007, the Juice Bar in 2009, the operations of the Sports Complex and Purcell Function Room as well as the Polar Bears swimming club.

The past 10 years has seen a huge growth in new infrastructure along with the overdue upgrading of the Sports Complex and the refurbishing of the Purcell Function Room. During these years as Convenor there have been a number of members that I would take this opportunity to make special mention for their significant contribution to this Committee. Namely Life Member Neale Johnstone for his dedication, foresight, perseverance and facilitating the construction of the restaurant and for his vision for a juice bar, which was created from a disused amenities block in the Sports Complex.

The income from both of these operations has made and will continue to make a significant contribution to the Club's solid financial future. I would also like to acknowledge and thank all the committee members over the years for their support including the current committee members, Life Member Phill Hamilton, Life Member Richard Pinker, Life Member John Bentley, Bill Lloyd and Paul Larssen.

BUILDING DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

This last year has been a year of progress in the building project, a year which has brought us closer to the turning of the first sod and laying of the first brick.

After the development and fine tuning of the concept plans approved by the Club Members at the Special General Meeting in 2015, a final set of building plans were submitted to Sutherland Shire Council in June 2016 as part of a Development Application. This DA drew much scrutiny from Council and the independent officers it involves in review of public building proposals. The plans went through two processes of scrutiny by the Council appointed independent Architectural Review Advisory Panel. Minor changes were made in response to their comments and the final plans were then reviewed by the NSW Government appointed body the Joint Regional Planning Panel (JRPP). There were some neighbour objections and the JRPP listened to these plus a Club presentation in a public hearing on 20th October 2016. On the 21st October 2016 the JRPP issued formal approval for our building.

Since October, our focus has been on the search for funding sources and development of a funding plan. In doing this we made strong approaches to Sutherland Shire Council, our local State & Federal Members of Parliament and SLSA and SLSNSW.

While waiting the outcome of our approaches to government bodies we commenced applying for suitable grants. In August we applied for a Club Grants Category 3 and in January we applied for a NSW Government Surf Club Facility Grant. Unfortunately, we were unsuccessful in that round of submissions. Each grant body offers feedback on unsuccessful applications and our feedback was that we were unsuccessful with each grant as our project and funding plan was not advanced enough at that time. Comments provided were very positive with an indicator of likely success in the next grant rounds. These are approaching in the next few months.

On Sunday 9th April 2017 our local Federal Member of Parliament, Scott Morrison visited the Club to deliver the momentous news that he had secured a \$3 million Federal Government Grant for the refurbishment of the Clubhouse. Scott explained that the heritage consideration and iconic

nature of our building plus the historical status of our Club in the community had resulted in good government support and this funding for the refurbishment and restoration project. This grant, of such a large amount, meant that the funding for construction was now available to the Club.

The Federal grant is now the major contributor to the total cost of our project. The rest of the project funding will be from a combination of Council contribution, Club cash funds and a bank loan taken out by the Club. As the funding plan includes a bank loan discussions were immediately commenced with Commonwealth Bank. We will also continue to seek other grants to lessen the impact on the Club contribution.

The grant offered by the Federal Government is a Commonwealth Development Grant (CDG). This grant is offered with a range of conditions and requirements and the grant Deed of Agreement (contract) provides some very defined timelines for acceptance of the grant and then subsequent commencement of construction. These timelines push us towards a construction phase starting at the earliest opportunity - the end of the 2017-18 season. If the grant had not been offered then the construction would not have started for at least another twelve months, or longer.

Our Club rules provide that any major building project must receive Member endorsement for the project. A project such as this involves a large financial commitment by the Club so the funding model proposed should also be presented for Member approval. The CDG timelines meant that this approval was required at the earliest opportunity. Therefore, a General Meeting of Members was held, post season, on Sunday June 4th 2017. At this meeting the final plans and the funding model were unanimously endorsed and approval was given to proceed with the required preparations and construction. Approval was given for the Club to obtain a bank loan of up to \$1.5 million for the project.

It is planned for construction to start at the end of April 2018 with a twelve month build period and occupancy of the refurbished premises in June 2019. The Club has now committed to the CDG and the conditions of the Agreement and the processes leading to construction have commenced.

The first part of this is preparation of detailed design documents by the architect, a range of engineers and other professional consultants. This process should take until late October to complete. These documents will then be submitted for a Construction Certificate and be used for a tender process to select a builder.

The next part of the preparation is the planning and activity required to prepare the Club for the lead up to and the period of construction. This includes planning for decanting and storage of Club items, for Club operations during construction and for minimisation of local impact by the project.

Of particular importance is ensuring required access to equipment and other Club facilities and the operation of the Club's essential activities. Preliminary work on this has started and will involve many Club officers but it will also require input from the selected builder towards the end of the preparation phase plus Sutherland Shire Council input. Discussions will be held with our immediate neighbours to ensure minimisation of impact on their operations.

Sutherland Shire Council, as well as providing funding for the DA and construction has also committed to a large range of civil works and parks works to the rear of the Club. Council is also providing valuable support with project planning and delivery and a group of Council officers meets on a scheduled basis with Building Committee representatives fortnightly or more often as required.

As mentioned above, we will continue to seek further funds to reduce the financial burden on the Club, to reduce our cash contribution and the loan debt. These are expected to come from further grant opportunities and fundraising through a Sponsor and Member appeal for assistance.

To assist with financial planning, a project cash flow has been prepared and this will ensure that the timing of project expenditures is matched by the availability of funds from the various sources. Additional to this a Club cash flow is being prepared for the next three years. This will ensure that total Club budgeted expenditure matches Club expected revenue. This in turn will ensure that long term financial commitments of the project can be met while, at the same time, ensuring adequate funding for the range of essential Club activities.

This is a busy and challenging but exciting time for our Club and the Building Project. We can anticipate that at this time next year we will be able to report that construction is underway. I thank every Member for their comments, suggestions and continued support for this project.

In closing, I offer my thanks and that of all Club Members to the members of the Building Development Committee who have all contributed extensively over the length of the project. They are Daniel Wood, Steve Mackay, Doug Murray, John Suann, Ken Adams, Richard Pinker, Chris Giles, Greg Holland, Lee Schmalfeldt, Alan Metti and Brad Turner. The success of this project has relied on their commitment of time and effort plus very professional approach.

The passing of Brian Keane on 27th August 2016 was the loss of one of our greatest competitors from the late 1940s and early 1950s.

Brian joined the club as a Cadet in February 1945 and immediately started to dominate as a champion swimmer. He was Cadet Surf champion in 1946 and 1947, Junior Surf and Belt champion 1948 and 1949 and Senior Surf and Belt champion 1950. This achievement meant he was the first member to win the grand slam of swimming championships in the club. This record has only since been equalled once.

As a swimmer Brian was placed many times in surf and belt races at Sydney carnivals. From 1948 and 1953, Brian was a member of the Junior and then Senior R&R teams. Both teams won numerous carnivals and the Juniors gained a 3rd placing in the 1949 Australian Championships.

From the mid 1940s hollow surf board design rapidly developed for wave riding and racing. This coincided with Surf Life Saving Australia introducing an Australian Surf Board championship in 1946. Following this, a major change occurred in the early 1950s with the design of the 'banana' board, a sleek sixteen foot craft with an up turn at either end, shaped like a flattened banana. Its popularity snowballed in the 1950s in surf clubs on the east coast of Australia. By 1955 more than forty Cronulla members had banana boards.

Brian and his close Club mate, Barry Regan were impressed by these new craft with Barry the first Cronulla member to purchase one. Barry's success was immediate, winning the 1952-53 Board Championship and becoming well placed at carnivals over the season. Inspired by Barry's success Brian upgraded to the Banana board and with his swimming background he quickly adapted to his new love of surf board competition and developed into a formidable competitor.

Brian won his first Club Surf Board Championship in 1953-54 season and went on to win four consecutive titles. The season was a steep learning curve for him with little success. The 1954-55 season saw a dramatic improvement in results. He was consistently

placed at carnivals throughout the season and gained the Club's first craft medal in the State Championships with a second placing. Brian's success continued at the Australian Championships at North Steyne on the 12th March 1955. His magnificent win in the Surf Board Championships was our first craft National Title.

The 1955-56 season saw a change in conducting the Australian Championships. Normally held around March, they were postponed until December 2nd 1956 to coincide with the Melbourne Olympics. The Surf Life Saving Association of Australia also decided to conduct an international surf carnival one week earlier on the 25th November. The venue was Torquay Beach and a large team of competitors and supporters represented Cronulla, travelling south in several car convoys. Brian travelled with the team to defend his Australian title and up until March of 1956 had paddled consistently at Sydney carnivals.

Both carnivals at Torquay were held a week apart on consecutive Sundays to coincide with the lay days of the Olympics. Huge crowds of spectators attended both carnivals, many of them international visitors attending the Olympic Games.

The international carnival was held in squally conditions. Brian had an exceptional race and defeated a star studded Australian and international field which included competitors from the USA, Hawaii, South Africa, Ceylon, New Zealand, and Great Britain. The Australian Championships were held the following Sunday 2nd December 1956 and Brian again paddled brilliantly but had to settle for second place.

Following Brian's success at Torquay, he was selected in the Australian Team in the International Test Matches at Maroubra and Collaroy on the 8th and 9th December 1956. Brian again excelled and won the Board Races at both Tests. Brian's final year of competition in 1956-57 again produced excellent results, finishing with another second placing in the Australian Championships at Bondi on the 20th April 1957.

Brian was also involved with the Club's administration and during the peak of his competitive career he found time to spend two years as the Club's Publicity Officer.

As a member who trained and competed with Brian, I am pleased that his spirit and memory will live on, both off the shores of our beach where his ashes are scattered and within our club.

To bring to light all of Ike's extensive Surf Life Saving record is not possible in the short space that is available, however, these major threads will demonstrate how fully his active involvement from Club, Branch and State to National was over some 70 years. It is unlikely that anyone today could achieve a similar record as a volunteer.

Albert 'Ike' Moseley joined Cronulla SLSC on November 4th 1944, at the age of 16 years and 10 months. He qualified for his Bronze Medallion in March 1945, gained his Instructor's Certificate in 1947 and Examiner's Certificate in 1950.

From 1950 to 1957 Ike held various positions within the club including Assistant Secretary, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Instructor and Delegate to the Branch. On the active side he was a Patrol Vice Captain and gained 100% patrol attendance a number of times. Ike is also recorded as somehow having put a surf boat into the rock pool.

In 1965 for services rendered to the Club, Ike was elevated to Life Membership.

In the 1958-59 season Ike became Secretary of the Board of Examiners, at this time Sydney Branch consisted of both the now Sydney Northern Beaches and Sydney branches. Season 1960-61 saw the formation of the two Branches and from then to 1967-68 Ike became Deputy Superintendent of Sydney Branch under fellow Club member Jim Switzer who was the Superintendent. In 1968-69 Ike became Sydney Branch Superintendent and continued in that roll until 1973. During this period Ike served on many Committees and Panels as well.

The Power Boat was Ike's "baby". Just as Harry Brown is synonymous with IRB's, Ike is aptly known as the Harry Brown of Jet Boats.

Fittingly recognised for providing this sterling service Ike was elevated to Life Member of Sydney Branch in 1967.

In 1971-72 Ike became Deputy Superintendent of NSW and as usual served on many Panels and sub-committees. In 1973 he became NSW Superintendent and held that position until 1980.

Many stories from this period abound

most of which have been embellished but a common theme besides his hearing was at times his stubbornness. Remembering that during these years a Chief Referee at Carnivals was basically Judge, Jury and Executioner in that he made and interpreted the rules and his decision was final.

As NSW Superintendent, Ike built a great rapport with the Country Branches. Visits and demonstrations of new methods of life saving such as ARC etc. to country clubs were a great success.

Appropriately, for services rendered Ike was elevated to Life Membership of NSW in 1973.

At a National level Ike's achievements and participation in various aspects of Surf Life Saving continued unabated. He became a member of National committees involving Power Craft and Radios and Gear Handbook. He also officiated at all Australian Championships from 1951 to 1975.

Again through these exemplary efforts he was suitably rewarded with elevation to Life Membership of SLSA in 1975.

When perusing Ike's record, achievements and commitment to Surf Life Saving it is understandable that he justifiably joined an exclusive club within Cronulla SLSC of being Life Member of Club, Branch, State and Australia.

Albert was awarded an OAM for services to Surf Life Saving in 1996.

While still a student living in South Hurstville with his Father, Jim, Mother, Neva and younger brother Charlie, Lance joined Cronulla Surf Club in February, 1948. Lance soon became heavily involved in our Club's competitive activities and later became involved in Cronulla's administrative duties. This dedication spanned many years as his record reveals:

Lance was a powerful Boat Rower who possessed amazing attributes of dedication, concentration, style and endurance. He achieved notable results that included:

NSW State Senior Boat Champions, 1952-53;
3rd NSW Senior Boat 1953-54;
Qld Touring Team, 1953-54;
W.A. Touring Team 1957-58;
4th Australian Senior Boat, 1957-58;
2nd Australian Senior Boat 1958-59.

One of Lance's greatest tests of endurance was displayed as a member of the winning crew during the Bondi to Woolongong Surf Boat Marathon that was conducted over the two days of 13th and 14th March, 1959. This race was held before the introduction of a replacement crew member and before the innovation of sliding seats.

Lance was, in my opinion, the greatest surf boat rower never to have won that elusive Australian Gold Medal.

Lance won many Sunday morning surf races. He was always on good terms with the handicapper.

SOCIAL INVOLVEMENT:

Together with "Pommy" Geoff Todd and Lex Macpherson, Lance began the Sunday Bar. Cartons of beer were purchased from the Cecil Hotel and sold to Club members and guests after the surf race. Profits were passed on to the Club. Although Life Membership was not bestowed upon him, his record suggests that it remains unfortunate that this high honour did not come his way.

We who have known Lance Hunter Turbet have been blessed with his friendship and respect.

CRONULLA SHORT COURSE SURF CARNIVAL

The 6th Annual Short Course Carnival was conducted on Saturday, 19 November 2016.

There were 19 clubs in attendance from as far afield as Port Macquarie to the north and Warilla Barrack Point to the south with over 1100 competitors participating from Under 8 to Over 40 Years of age.

The major event sponsors were Doran Financial Services, Caltex, and 7 News. In addition, support was received from Vici, Engine, Catfish Designs, Affiniti Living, Ohana Ocean Athletics, Get Hooded, Slix and Slipstream. Thank you to these valuable sponsors and supporters.

The U8 to U13 age competitors competed for around about 3.5 hours in the morning and the U14 to Masters age competitors participated for about three hours in the afternoon. The two sessions were separated by a lunch break and the Vici Shark Island Ski Challenge and the All Age Beach Relay.

The Carnival lived up to its promise of delivering short, sharp and exciting surf sport complemented by a festival atmosphere on the beach and in the park featuring, BBQs, stalls and camaraderie.

This carnival format, pioneered by Cronulla, is becoming increasingly popular as competitors and their families have the opportunity to participate in a number of races and they do not need to spend the whole day at the beach. It is becoming a key model for contemporary surf sport.

The highlights of the Carnival included:

A one-club effort in the delivery of the event.

The feature Vici 2km Shark Island Ski Race attracted 50 competitors and was won by Max Brooks from Newport. Wanda's Danielle McMahon took out the Women's Division.

The club's beach depth in winning both the Male and Female All Age Beach Relays. These races involved 10 competitors from each club in each race ranging from U9 to Open age.

Over 130 U8 competitors enjoyed their first day of inter-club as they raced in individual beach sprint, flags, wading race and relays.

Kellogg's NutriGrain stars Max Brooks (Newport) and Lizzie Welborn (North Bondi) who won their respective Open Ironman and Ironwoman races.

Sponsor and Supporter prizes, medals, trophies and random draw give-aways totalling more than \$8,000 were distributed to around 40% of participants attending on the day.

A sound financial return to the Club for conducting the carnival.

The St George and Sutherland Shire Leader providing editorial and photographic support in the newspaper and on line publication.

The most exciting race of the day was the final event where Cronulla's injured Carla Papac was run down right on the finish line to come the closest of seconds to Wanda in the Open Women's Taplin Relay.

After dominating the beach results Cronulla had a late surge to overtake Wanda SLSC to win the Frank Doran Financial Services Perpetual Trophy. Elouera SLSC was third.

The success of the day was due to the efforts of whole club. DIRECTOR OF COMPETITION REPORT

The 2016/17 Season was one of mixed emotions.

Over the off-season, the club successfully secured the services of Hayden Allum as Head Coach. Hayden brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to our training programs, which is second to none. As a current Nutri Grain competitor, he is able to demonstrate to our members what it takes to be successful at the highest level. He also sets the bar for our senior competitors to chase week in and week out at training.

A sign of things to come and a highlight for the season was in the Open Male Surf Race at the Sydney Branch carnival. Our U17 boys, after failing to gain a place in their own age group, decided to compete up in the Opens. Having trained next to Hayden all year, lining up next to him in a surf race was not daunting or unfamiliar. They knew the pace required and were keen to show what brats could achieve. Harry, Callum and Tim all placed in the top 10, with Tim a close 4th behind Hayden in 3rd (also Robbo 2nd).

This is just one example that highlights the talent we have for the future across all section of our club. It shows what our competitors can achieve under Hayden's guidance.

However, unfortunately for our water and boat competitors, their season ended one carnival short. Due to the inclement weather at the Australian Championships, the majority of the carnival was cancelled in controversial circumstances.

However, as the saying goes, "One man's Dystopia is another's Utopia". This is where our beachies step in. After amassing 90 points at the State Championships in 2016, Mark Redrup set his sights on breaking the 100-point barrier. Our beachies brought home 106 points from State and another 53 at Aussies. After consultation with club historian Col Elliott, the beachies have set a new club record at Aussies with 63 points (including U15 events), passing the old record of 57.

At Aussies, you could constantly hear the results of Cronulla over the loud speaker. Cronulla was labelled as one of the beach team 'super powers', along with Currumbin and Kurrawa. Given the coaches at Currumbin and Kurrawa are paid as full-time beach coaches, this recognition is a testament to the job Mark does with our beachies.

TEAM MANAGERS REPORT

The following is a basic report on the 2016-17 season State and Australian Surf Life Saving carnivals undertaken late March and early April 2017.

Well, it was one of those seasons, for both the State and Australian titles with weather conditions interrupting and affecting both of these major events.

At the State Titles at Blacksmiths Beach, Swansea the surf conditions led to the cancellation of almost all events on the Friday which then had a flow on to many other events throughout the carnival. In particular, the surf belt events unfortunately didn't get run at any of the three major events this season, these being the Branch, State and Australian. Similarly, our boat crews had a season of frustration with cancellations in both the State and Australian also. In these two events in particular, our club has a very proud tradition but sadly due to surf factors, the Surf Life Saving management deemed these events either too risky to hold or too time consuming to be able to fit into the shortened programs.

In view of the conditions, large surf at the State and the cyclonic conditions (Debbie for the records) at the Australian, our competitors adapted and performed extremely well, with the club achieving a fifth position in the NSW State titles and then backing this up with a tenth in the shortened Australian Titles.

Of personal note, I have never witnessed wind and rain like that we received on the Thursday at the Australian titles with gusts of over 120kmh and torrential, almost biblical rain. That was an experience on its own, particularly trying to raise and lower canopies on the beach and pack away equipment due to storm and surf surge warnings.

From the competition that we were able to perform in at both of these carnivals we had some great results. Undoubtedly I will have left out or not mentioned some, and I apologise in advance for this, but for this report I'd like to focus on a couple that stood out to me personally.

Firstly, the team spirit was exceptional under the tent and to watch the whole Australian squad chant at the final of the U19 Female Beach Flag event which featured both Tara Stortenbeker and Ngaire Hadfield competing, was something that is hard to describe - in particular, with Ngaire then taking out the Gold Medal once again and Tara just missing out with a very commendable fifth. The second moment was the 2km beach marathon, once again the whole team down on Coolangatta beach cheering along our runners. This event was very much a family affair with the Breens and Streets fielding most if not all our competitors. To watch Chris Breen win the

U17 Male Gold Medal and then this feat to be replicated by his brother Nathan in the Open Male race was outstanding to witness. The third moment was in the Youth Carnival with the running of the beach events under lights and our whole team watching our U15 Beach Relay team run down the opposition to claim a Bronze Medal.

Add to this Isabellah Walker retaining her Beach Sprint title and pocket rocket, Jacinta Davidson-Bunch taking out the U14 Female Beach Flags - she had a smile bigger than herself. Similarly another moment was Chloe Mannix-Power's gold in the U17 Female Beach Sprint. Both Chloe and Isabella have never lost an Australian Championship individual sprint event, each girl snaring U14s and U15s and Chloe now achieving the U17s title. The U17s Male Beach Relay team winning an unexpected Silver Medal at the Aussies was a great highlight as was our junior boat crew entering a Beach Relay team and not running last.

Our U17 Female Beach Relay team then capped off the titles with a Gold Medal. I have never seen four girls (Phoebe, Chloe, Kate & Brigitte) smile and cry so much with joy. Finally, Daniel Karagiannis' Silver Medal in the U19 Male Beach Sprint brought the whole Club team to its feet. Daniel has been a stalwart of our male runners and it was so good to see his training and persistence finally pay off with a well-deserved medal.

In conclusion, I'd like to congratulate Chloe Mannix-Power for winning the Tony Purcell Memorial Trophy at this season's Australian Championships; it was well deserved against a very strong field of Cronulla candidates.

I could ramble along with others, but these really stood out to me on a very eventful carnival. Additionally, our team dinner was a very successful evening and I'd like to thank all those Life Members, Members, families and past club stalwarts who travelled to attend the event. Thanks also, to our Club President, Rob Short and Club Captain, Chris Barber for all your support and assistance over the duration of the carnival.

In closing this event report, a thank you must also go to all the assistant Team Managers, Richard and Kelly Ford, Sherie Lisser, Don Robertson, Michele Cole, Nathan Steiner, Michael Banister, Gabby Turner, Craig Hawkings, Emma Larssen, all our water safety team and Scott Rofe. Our Open Men's crew faced consistently stiff competition in their first few rounds of SLS Carnivals and respectfully represented the Club in the elite racing of Ocean Thunder. As bad luck would have it midway through the season they lost their stroke Jake Dalley to injury and faced a tough time making up for this loss. For the second year running Mark Cameron the "super sub" saved the Open Men's crew in their time of need filling in as best as he could while also supporting his new family. Competing in the Open Women's division from day one as "The Wildcats" the girls pulled their way into a nice second position for the ASRL South Coast Series opener. Even with

their years of experience and dedication to training the Wildcats faced one of the most competitive Open Women's fields in recent years. Just before the State Titles the crew made the call to move into the new division of Reserve Women. In challenging surf condition the girls claimed various victories throughout their State Championship campaign and made it all the way to the Final (even with a busted boat!). They claimed 4th place at the State Titles and the title of "Cronulla's best women's crew" to date.

The Under 19 Men's crew went from strength to strength under the control of their sweep Craig Hawkings. I really rate these guys as a future force to be reckoned with in the surfboat world. Their hard training started to pay off midway through the season and they seemed to be peaking at the right time of year. In their training leading up to State they kept pace with our Reserve Men's crew for a time. As fate would have it due to large swells at State and questionable competing times they made an unfortunate early exit thanks to a bad wave. With more experience under their belt we are expecting a huge season from these boys next year.

Last but not least our Veteran Men's crew. These guys had a good season for their first time as a crew. It was a great feeling have a few of the "old boys" around again. It seems that we lose a lot of our older competitors to family duties, careers and the like as time goes on so your efforts this year meant a lot to us all. Personally, I'd like to thank you guys for letting me practice my sweeping with your crew and for giving me my first race as a sweep this season. I really hope you guys will come to a few more carnivals next season.

As many can imagine our biggest disappointment of the season was the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships. As many of the other Club sections may understand the Aussies is the only carnival that matters at the end of the day. Cancelling competition in near perfect conditions at Tugan was the worst call I have ever experienced in my rowing career.
