PATRONS MESSAGE

Fellow members, once again I proudly acknowledge the fine work performed by our Patrols last season, and report to you that no lives were lost while they were on duty. This is a fine achievement and is the very essence of our aim to provide a safe environment for the general public to surf, with the knowledge that they can do it safely at Cronulla beach. In the season just passed, I'm informed that a very high standard of Life Saving and good Patrol attendances were achieved throughout the season. I congratulate all of our patrolling members for their dedication in helping keep Cronulla beach as safe as it is. Thank you.

Last year I advised you of a heroic rescue performed by Club member, Michael Banister, at North Cronulla, and that Michael has been recommended by our Club to be awarded a Meritorious Award. I was hopeful that this matter would have been resolved by now, but unfortunately it's still with SLSA awaiting their decision. We are all very disappointed it's taken so long to be resolved, so on behalf of the Club I wish to apologise to Michael for this unexpected, drawn out delay. Hopefully I will be able to announce in next year's Annual Report that the matter has been given a favourable outcome.

On the competition side of things, the Club did particularly well at the various Championship Carnivals. Our sixth place in the Australian Championship Point Score at North Kirra was outstanding. To the seven gold, six silver and five bronze medal winners, I offer you the Club's heartiest congratulations for a job well done. Unfortunately we weren't able to retain the Bill Marshall trophy at the Inter Club this year, and I offer my sincere congratulations to the host Club North Cronulla for their fine win. It's encouraging to note North's final return to the winners' circle after many years in the doldrums. Well done, but don't get too used to the trophy being there, as Cronulla is coming back.

I wish to acknowledge my sincere appreciation to the Management Committee for naming the Club's newest surfboat after me. THE FEARSOME BLACK CAPS 2012/13

Some of you may have noticed a new group on the sand this summer – the fearsome Black Caps! For the first time, the Cronulla Surf Club, in partnership with The Cerebral Palsy Alliance, ran a nippers group for children with disabilities. This was an initiative that was sparked by combining Cameron's work as a Beach Education Officer with Lauren's work with The Cerebral Palsy Alliance.

The 'Black Caps' maiden season, which was intended as a trial, saw a group of 10 children between the ages of 6-12 years, with predominately physical disabilities such as cerebral palsy, take to the sand and water. The nature of the group members' physical disabilities can make participating in mainstream sport very difficult, so this was intended to create an environment which is supportive of their individual needs and one in which they are able to compete against others with a similar ability level to themselves. Like all kids, the Black Caps are competitive and love to win. And the group was able to provide a more level playing field, a space in which their disability was not a barrier to them participating in sport (and winning!!).

The group's favourite activities were flags, sponge-bob (a wade game), board paddling, swimming in the pool and, of course, the hole digging and sand-castle building competitions. The improvement every single member made over the season was truly inspiring, in fact nothing short of amazing. Over the weeks, we watched their skills and confidence soar as they began diving for the flag, paddling on a board independently and coming together as team, cheering on their fellow group members.

The benefits of the nippers program for this group went much further than being on the sand on Sunday mornings. For many, the physical activity has improved their strength, coordination and balance, all areas in which children with Cerebral Palsy can have difficulties. It also created an opportunity for both the children and their parents to meet others who are in a similar position to themselves and build these relationships.

As the Black Caps leaders we couldn't be prouder of each and every single member of the group and the determination and eagerness they showed ever week to always try their hardest and the improvements we saw made every Sunday morning with them worthwhile. Every week they would show up full of smiles and ready to take on whatever challenges we might throw at them.

With the success of this first season The Cronulla Surf Club is hoping to continue to run this group for children with disabilities into the future. We will be meeting with the Club during the off-season to discuss ways we can improve the program in the future. If anyone has any particular interest in this area and would like to be involved in either the planning or the running of group we would love to hear from you!

CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

Gear Inspection day is a day of real achievement for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club. After a hectic month or so of preparation it gives us a chance to present and ensure good condition of the very large amount of equipment that the Club has available for patrols, water safety and lifesaving training. This year was no exception and the display of equipment passed successfully, ensuring we were ready for another season. After this it was a pretty quiet time for the Gear Stewards for the rest of the year.

All of Cronulla's patrol equipment and nipper water safety equipment was prepared, repaired, renewed and submitted for the annual gear inspection held on Sunday 9th September 2011. The gear submitted included:

- 17 rescue boards
- 2 stretchers
- 36 rescue tubes
- Patrol area and tent
- 9 radios
- Patrol uniforms
- 4 oxy-viva kits
- Board and tube stands
- 2 patrol first aid kits
- Signal flags and evacuation (shark) flags
- 1 club first aid kit
- 13 resuscitation mannequins
- 9 spinal collars
- 2 trainer defibrillators
- 3 spinal boards and straps
- 5 IRB
- 1 Defibrillator
- 5 outboard motors
- 3 Suction equipment sets
- 7 trailers

A great effort by a team of dedicated Branch officials once again saw a single inspection team visiting all clubs in the Branch over the weekend. Cronulla was inspected on a fantastic Sunday morning and afterwards we supplied lunch and a few beverages to the inspection team before they set off for the descent into the National Park beaches. The following members helped prepare the club gear and premises for the start of the season - Col Haywood, Rob Short Jr., Ken English, Bryan Wild, Brian Dalgarno, Carlo Villanti, Daniel Wood, Mitchell Barber and Chris Barber.

Purchases of replacement equipment this season were significant, though not unreasonably high. Additionally, essential repair and maintenance costs continue to increase. As a result, the expenditure not including IRBs, this season was a little over \$14,000 Club outlay plus \$2,700 of sponsored items. This included board repairs (\$1630), radio servicing (\$423), oxy-viva and resuscitation manikin servicing (\$1029), resuscitation, spinal injury management and defibrillator equipment (\$2810), log books (\$145), first-aid supplies (\$630), one new radio (\$919), signs and flags (\$40), seven rescue tubes (\$714), four new rescue boards (\$5400) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$145). Surf Life Saving Australia provided patrol uniforms (\$2064) from the DHL subsidy. We also purchased rash shirts for all IRB drivers and crew (\$270). The Kingsway Night and Day Pharmacy (Gannons Rd), a great supporter of the local community and our Club, donated several hundred dollars worth of first-aid supplies. Our thanks go to owner, Helen Nakhla for continuing to provide this support which has been ongoing for more than fifteen years.

In a new initiative this season, every patrol member was supplied with a light weight spray jacket (\$6000) and a reversible Club-Patrol cap (\$1280) as part of their uniform allocation. Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLSA patrol jacket (\$900) and peaked cap (\$520) - total outlay \$8700, very worthwhile support of our patrol members.

This season we also rejuvenated a tired old Patrol Room with a clean-out, patch and paint, new electrical fittings, furniture, freezer and first-aid bed at a total cost of \$4900. Thanks to Gary Cole for doing the work. Additionally, Club Member Luis Catalan donated several hundred dollars worth cupboards from No. 96 Furniture. Thanks Luis. The room looks great and importantly, works much better than previously.

In all we spent approximately \$28,000 on patrol related items. This is money well spent.

This year we had plenty of tents for competition, social and fundraising activities and just to top it off, Neil Swane donated a new tent (again) at the very end of the season. The real Radio Officer, Col Haywood, as well as looking after the radios, has successfully supported the management of patrol equipment through the season and his behind the scenes work has been invaluable to the Club. I believe that once again we have been able to provide Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club with the best possible equipment for patrol, training, competition and community purposes.

OPERATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

The seawall and promenade upgrade by council commenced on the 28th May, 2012 and was due to be complete by the 14th October, 2012. The project consists of reconstructing the sea wall and esplanade from Cronulla Park southwards to the headland. The works include reconstruction of the seawall, re-paving of the esplanade, construction of low sandstone seating and retaining walls, and installation of lighting, seating and bollards.

The expected completion date of the 14th October was not met and works recommenced on the 18th May, 2013 and is due to be completed by the end of July, 2013.

During the upgrade, both Zimzala restaurant and Barefoot on the Beach juice bar suffered extreme financial pain in the hope of long-term gain. The Elite Sports complex, due to their business activities, were not affected as much.

These proudly owned family businesses have struggled financially over the past two years due to the promenade upgrade and I encourage all members to support them with your patronage. Good luck and we hope that the future years bring prosperity.

MAJOR WORKS, REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE SPORTS COMPLEX

After many years of neglect, this 38-year-old sports complex has had a major face-lift with both men's/ladies upstairs amenities totally renovated. The old Rainbow clubroom was also upgraded to provide a modern office for the staff and Council replaced the two sewer injectors on the pool deck.

These overdue upgrades, along with a total repaint and concrete repairs on the pool deck last year, have brought this important asset for the club up to a suitable standard.

PURCELL ROOM

During the summer months, the Friday night bar was moved from the Monro Room to the Purcell Room. To accommodate the move, the old furniture was replaced with modern café style tables, chairs and wicker furniture to allow for the increased patronage by members and their guests. VALE WALLACE HALPIN OAM

Wallace was born 7th June 1924, and grew up in Lithgow with three other siblings, Joan, Keith and Patricia. At 18, he enlisted in the Navy and served in the Pacific. In 1949 he married Phyliss, his wife of 63 years and together they had three children, Michele, John and Melissa. Wallace ran a successful engineering business, in partnership with his brother Keith, and from an early age he was interested in involving himself in the community. He was a Legatee advisor, member of Cronulla Masonic Lodge, a member of Apex and was a foundation member and later president of Cronulla Lions Club. He had a passion to help people, particularly the youth of the Shire, and he became involved in youth organisations. He helped form many sporting youth clubs within Cronulla RSL including the swimming, water polo, hockey, rugby and the softball clubs.

In 1966 he joined Cronulla Surf Club and was one of the founding group leaders of the Nippers and 20 years later he was still taking a group with his grandson Dion. His engineering business regularly repaired the Club's aluminum surfboat as well as fashioning equipment for the skis, all at no cost. The surf club became his passion. He competed in the Marchpast and was the Manager of the first Cronulla team to compete at the World Championships, which were held in Bali. As a father he was very proud to see his children become members of Cronulla and then equally as proud to watch his grandchildren also become involved and compete with the club. He was Chief Instructor of the Surf Club for 10 years and during that time he put a record number of members through, including several of his grandchildren. In this capacity he was able to help and encourage many of the younger members as Instructor and Nippers group leader and for this he was awarded Life Membership of the Surf Club in 1988 - an honour of which he was very proud. As a final tribute to his life he was awarded the OAM in 2007 for his services to Surf Life Saving and to youth in sporting clubs.

He was a true gentleman, with high morals and integrity. He had a zest for life, enjoying his runs and later walks to North Cronulla, having a coffee and sharing a yarn with people. He would have said that his greatest achievement was his family but he achieved so much more. He lived a life of purpose, of service, of principle and integrity, and one of kindness and generosity. At 88 he had a life well lived.

VALE KEN WILES

6th January 1937-
28th December 2012

As a respected member of our Club, a large number of Members remember and were influenced and trained by the great Ken Wiles, a legend in both pool and surf life saving training and mentoring.

After a battle with cancer in his final years, Ken passed away just after Christmas 2012. Ken fought his illness with the same determination that he showed in his years as a champion surf lifesaver. The members of Cronulla SLSC pass on their sympathy to Ken's family.

In 1965 Ken moved from Queensland to coach at Sans Souci and thus began his association with Cronulla. The window of time that Ken spent coaching in Sydney formed only a small part of an interesting and diverse life. However the legacy of that time and influence on his swimmers and surf lifesaving will be long remembered.

I was Ken's first swimmer on his first day at the pool in Sans Souci. It has been a relationship that I have treasured all my life. Since Ken's passing I have spoken with, or received emails from, champions like Kevin Neilson, Greg Allum, Barry Eager, Steve Warren, John Wilken, Ian Goode, Graham Geldart, Robert Chapman, Russell Cooper, Graham "Arthur" Elliot, Peter Tibbitts, Rick Wilkinson, four time Olympian Andrew Kerr, his brother Peter Kerr, Greg Stewart, Baden Green, Warwick Syphers, Craig Ellis and Peter Stone, just to name a few. Each of these men said that Ken Wiles was a major influence on their lives.

Ken, was a "favourite son of Kirra", but at Cronulla he took on a much more paternal role as mentor, coach and father figure to many of Cronulla's great champions. Ken had an amazing ability to motivate and guide his swimmers to perform, even above their own expectations. He shaped and guided their aspirations, both in and out of the pool. Ken toughened his swimmers with a combined program of surf and pool sessions. Ken loved Cronulla, however he took the time to develop great friendships with members of all the clubs of Bate Bay. Ken's advice on all things surf was respected and sought by the members of Wanda, Elouera and North Cronulla. By the late 60s, Ken's swim squad at Sans Souci was the dominant force in New South Wales surfing. In one season, Ken's squad won every single swimming event at the Sydney Metropolitan Championships and all but one event at the NSW titles. In 2004 when Surf Life Saving Australia selected only twenty-two surf athletes for inaugural induction into the Hall of Fame, Ken had coached four of them from their early teens; Steve Warren, Greg Allum, Peter Tibbitts and myself.

Not only was Ken successful with his athletes, he was a great coach of coaches. Many of Ken's assistant coaches, with Ken's encouragement, went on to be great coaches in their own right.

One of Ken's first champion swimmers, and Cronulla Life Member, Kevin Neilson, has himself become one of the truly great Australian surf coaches. Dennis Cotterill, arguably the most successful swim coach Australia has ever produced, spent some of his early years as a swimmer, working under Ken.

Ken also developed great friendships with the other surf coaches of Bate Bay. Coaches like Warren Rennie



and Ted Larsen from North Cronulla and Bill Eady, Dick Bignold, John Holingdale and Doug Murray from Cronulla all acknowledge the guidance and advice that was freely given to them by Ken.

Ken has been recognized in both the surfing and racing fraternities as one of the greatest ever judges of form. It was Ken who believed that Graham "Arthur" Elliot was the only belt man capable of beating the unbeatable Olympian Graham White in the Australian Open Belt in 1969. Ken was Graham Elliot's first linesmen in a crack crew that ensured "Arthur" won the championship.

Ken also contributed to Cronulla in other ways. He was an astute businessman. His guidance in relation to the planning and development of the Cronulla Surf Club indoor pool and Sports Complex has left a legacy that the members of Cronulla will never forget. Ken's name was included on the bronze plaque that is located in the entrance foyer of the Cronulla Sports Complex. The plaque will be forever a true recognition Ken's contribution.

The Ashes Ceremony held at Kirra on the 13th of April 2013 was an occasion worthy of a great man such as Ken. Ken's elder brother "Gus" had attended to every detail, as is his way. The speakers covered all parts of Ken's diverse life. Each of the speakers emphasized Ken's ability to make your friendship with him feel special. Many of Ken's Sydney swimmers traveled to join Kirra and Queensland teammates, officials and friends in a moving tribute.

The legacy of a man's life can be measured in two ways, what he achieved in his own right and in what he has inspired and encouraged others to achieve. Ken's own achievements were outstanding. However for his family, for all the swimmers and people who have spent time with Ken, the legacy of his influence will live on in their lives forever. Cronulla will never forget Ken's friendship and the most valuable contribution he made to our lives and our great club.

Ken will be sadly missed wherever Surf Life Savers meet.

VALE LLOYD ROY WEBSTER

A popular long-serving member, Lloyd died on December 18, 2012. Lloyd was affectionately known as 'Titch' in his younger years and 'Snow' more recently.

FOREIGN CORRESPONDENT REPORT - BALI

Well another year has passed in beautiful Bali and what a year it has been! After a successful AYAD assignment over 2010-2011, I was asked to return and continue my work with the Indonesia Surf Life Saving Association (Balawista).

My main focus, on return in July 2012, was to begin coaching for competition with two teams being selected to go to the World Life Saving Championships in Adelaide in November 2012. The National team representing Indonesia, took part in the Life Saving and Sport Development Program, whilst the Club team represented the Badung Surf Life Saving Club of Bali, competing in the InterClub Competition.

With limited equipment, inclusive of one racing malibu, one pool rescue manikin and a couple of pairs of donated fins, training for the World Championships was held on the beach at Kuta and in a local swimming pool. For some competitors it was their first experience of pool lifesaving events so it presented as a little challenging, but, when the team finally arrived in Adelaide they were quite pleased with their efforts.

Special acknowledgement must go to the Women's National team, which consisted of four 16 & 17 year-olds. Although they passed with flying colours, the girls had only completed their Bronze Medallion in the weeks leading up to the competition, so well done to the girls!

In another years time at Rescue 2014 these girls will still be young enough to contest the Youth category and so with a little more training keep your eyes open for them in France.

As mentioned above, the National team participated in a three day Life Saving and Sport Development Program made available by SLSA during the event and took in coaching tips from specialists in beach, ocean and pool. They were fast on the sand and placed in several A finals of the Beach Sprint, Beach Relay and Beach Flags, with the InterClub Team also making the Beach Relay A final.

At this time in Adelaide it was also great to catch up with Cronulla SLSC members competing and officiating at the competition. It was great to see Cronulla do so well especially on the beach and in the youth section.

I would like to thank Sutherland Shire Council for their generous donation of five second-hand lifeguard boards to Balawista and to all those involved in getting the boards down to Adelaide for the Bali Team to bring back, especially Mum and Dad. I must also thank the Markey family for their generous donation of goggles, caps, cossies and water

bottles that were passed onto me to take back to Bali. All this equipment was greatly appreciated by everyone over here!

Returning to Bali and sunshine, it was fantastic coming back to see the Nipper program that I originally started as an AYAD still in full force on Kuta Beach. With this program now self-sustainable, it was time to branch out and look at other areas of Bali to conduct free Nipper programs for the local children to educate them about the surf. A location was chosen and through one of the local lifeguards a meeting was arranged with the local villagers. After sitting in the banjar (an outdoor community hall), at 9pm on a Wednesday night, being attacked by my mosquitoes and praying I wouldn't get dengue again, the men of the village were excited and announced that we would start on Sunday! Excellent! Except that was four days hence and I had my doubts we would be able to get a decent number of children to attend in such a short amount of time.

Anyway, I went with it and after buying a few pairs of goggles, some kickboards and a donation of one of the SSC lifeguard boards, turned up on Sunday morning 24th March, 2013 to a group of 276 children! Lets just say I was a little shocked and obviously through the coconut wireless, word had got around. With a group of eager children and local volunteer lifeguards as instructors and water safety, we set about our first day of Balawista Gianyar Nippers at Pantai Lebih. Every week after saw numbers well over 200, bigger than some Clubs in Australia. With what little resources we had, we still made it work successfully.

Due to the overwhelming success of this local village Nippers program, I have now been in talks to start another program in the area of Canggu, which will kick off later this year. Again, they are hoping for big numbers and with the help of newly trained lifeguards in the area there will soon be another free program for locals by locals. A truly amazing effort!

Throughout my year here I have had many equipment donors and visitors (read: mules) and I would like to thank them for donating and bringing over vital lifesaving equipment but also for taking the time out to come and say hi,

check out Nippers, listen to my problems or shout me a meal - it hasn't gone unnoticed and I do very much appreciate it! 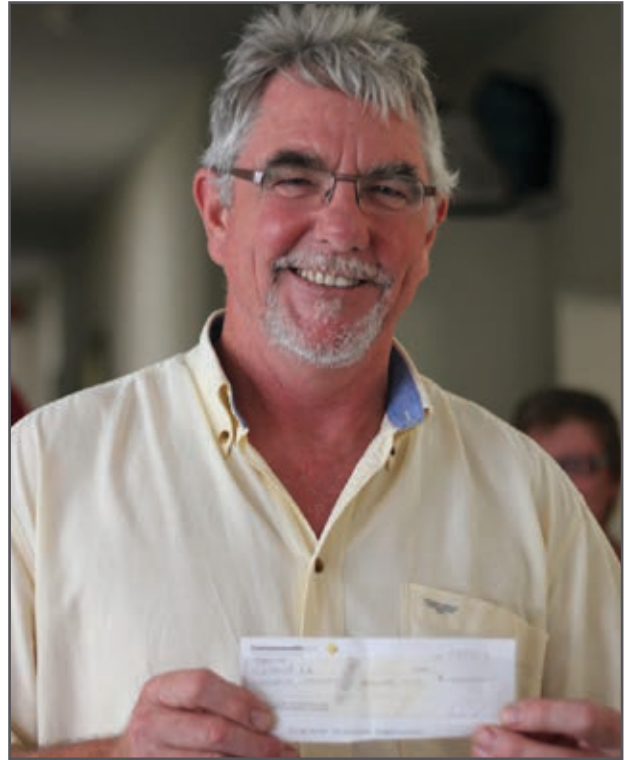

COACHING AND COMPETITION COMMITTEE

The C&C Committee is responsible for setting the guidelines and structure of the coaching and competition within our great club. The committee consists of the Coordinator, Club Captain, Section Heads and what the sub-rules refer to as "other appropriate persons" such as representatives from the Youth Development Committee. Meetings were held on the first Monday of most months throughout the season and have continued on since as we continue with our planning for next season.

Priorities for this season were to increase the participation of members in competition while also increasing club moral. These goals were realised through the tireless efforts of the Section Heads along with Cadet Captain, Paul Cavanagh and the newly recognised Age Managers. We saw an increase in participation rates right across the younger age groups U/15 through to U/19's.

Our club coaches did a great job throughout the year lead by: Nathan Smith (Head Water Coach), Bluey Garnsey (Board), Anthony Lyon (Beach), Kevin Neilson (Pool), Garry Allman and David Young (Boat) Fern Elliott (Lifesaving), Michael Roye (Beginner Ski), and other helpers.

The Financial Assistance Scheme was modified this year to allow a fairer distribution of club funds across our competitors. It is now in its fourth year and allows our athletes to be compensated for the expenses accrued in competing at the State and Aussie Championships which involve so much travel. This has undoubtedly increased our number of competitors at these carnivals.

The Craft and Training Subsidy is also in place and allows competitors to be reimbursed some of the costs of their Craft and Training expenses. There were a large number of subsidy requests this year and the allocation of funds was distributed amongst the eligible competitors that put in a claim.

The C&C Committee was relatively pleased with the results achieved by competitors at the major carnivals.

These major carnivals include the Interclub that was a very close contest in the end North Cronulla won by 1 point.

The Branch Championships were held at Wanda Beach

and we finished first ahead of North Cronulla, Wanda, Coogee and Elouera.

The State Championships were in early March at Umina on the Central Coast of NSW and we finished a Second behind the winning club Manly.

Our Competitors perform exceptional well at the Australian Championships at north Kirra in much calmer conditions than we have seen in recent Australian Titles. We finished sixth overall behind 4 Queensland Clubs and Manly from NSW. Our medal winners are outlined at the rear of this journal.

As preparations for next season take shape, members of the C&C Committee are active in finalising the action plan for next season. If you have any comments or suggestions we are always pleased to hear them and they can be directed to any member of the C&C Committee or via the club office.

BEACH CAPTAINS REPORT

Surf Life Saving is a movement built on camaraderie, team work and service to the community. For over 100 years, Cronulla surf club members have been living out these values when they patrol, when they train and when they compete and it was these values that drove the Beach Section to the lofty successes we have achieved this year.

It has certainly been a long season, particularly for those that trained for and competed at the World Championships, but sustained efforts on the training paddock have certainly paid off. We had teams contest both the U/20s and the Open competition with Bree Masters, Siobhan Dibley, Olivia Brooks and Bianca Ward contesting the U/20s and Bernadette Dibley, Laura Fitzpatrick, Jaime McKee and Melissa Miles in the Opens. It was great to see one of our past competitors in Melissa come out of retirement for this event to help our Open team out. Prior to competing for Cronulla, Bree had the honour of representing Australia in the U/20s competitions where she excelled, taking out the U/20s Beach Sprint and Flags and being part of the winning beach relay team. This mirrored the results she achieved in Japan earlier in the year competing for the Australian Development Team. Then onto the interclub competition where Siobhan won the Bronze medal in the flags, Bree took silver in the Sprint and our U/20s relay team also took silver. To all those who trained and competed in Adelaide and to those that prepared and supported the team, thanks and well done.

Between then and the end of the season, we tracked well through our carnivals from the Sydney Water Series, through local branch carnivals and those on the Northern Beaches, to the Branch Championships where the Beachies helped Cronulla take out the championship points score, and also finish as the best beach section in the branch. Also, importantly, our team contested the Interclub championships and again took out the Beach Shield – the only shield to be retained by the club this year. I must place on record my thanks to all our regular athletes who took time to compete on this day on what was a busy weekend for the club, but also to all the water competitors who helped us out to fill our complement of competitors. We were short on numbers at Interclub, particularly in the men's events, but everyone I asked to compete for us agreed to do so with pleasure. It really made me proud to be a member of Cronulla Surf Club.

During such a long season, it has been really important for the team to maintain its enthusiasm and training intensity. The season's results certainly show this to be the case for our beach team and this has been achieved through the hard work and tenacity of our dedicated coach Anthony Lyon. Anthony has built a strong rapport with all of our athletes and has truly built strong unity among our team of (mainly) girls and boys. There is no doubt in my mind that Anthony has been the biggest contributor to the successes of the beach section this year and it is for this reason that

he has been given the Roger Archer award.

Our winning team continued its successes at the State Championships. It was pleasing that we had a few boys having a run with James Karagiannis and Joel Ryder contesting the U/17 boys events and then teaming up with Anthony Lyon and Jack de Haan (a water competitor with a beachie pedigree) in the Open Men's Beach relay to win a place in the final and finish a commendable 8th. We once again welcomed Nathan Breen to the beach where he picked up a silver medal in the U/17 men's 2km run and 5th in the Opens. Little by little, Nathan has improved his results over the last few years, and perhaps a Gold medal at the State Championships is just around the corner.

But our Women's team again excelled with some outstanding results. Bernadette Dibley was our only Open female competitor this year, but she was ably joined by a number of our age competitors in each of the disciplines. Our two champion U/19s made open finals with Bree qualifying for the sprint final (4th) and both Bree (4th) and Siobhan (6th) for the flags final. They then joined Bernie and Olivia Brooks to take out silver in the Open Women's Beach relay. In the U/19s the champion relay team of Bree, Siobhan, Olivia and Bianca Ward again showed their class when, despite dropping the baton, they finished with the silver medal. This result should not be a surprise, with all three of our Under 19 competitors qualifying for the sprint final, Siobhan taking out the gold, Bree the silver and Olivia 5th place.

The Under 17 girls also excelled with two girls in the Flags final, Bianca taking 8th and Tiarne Cavanagh 5th place. This is a fantastic achievement for these girls. Both have put in an enormous amount of work over the last 12 months, and their improved results are testament to this added effort. The girls were then joined by Jessie-Rae Trevitt and Olivia Crawford to take out the Bronze. Each year, it is pleasing to see a new crop of fine young competitors join our section in the Under 15s and this year has been no exception. We had five regular competitors in our U/15 squad this year – Avalon Punch, Charlotte Laurence, Lara Masters, Ngaire Hadfield and Olivia Clark. These girls excelled throughout the year, including at the state championships. Individually, two girls (Ngaire in 4th and Avalon in 5th) qualified for the flags final and three girls made the sprint final – Charlotte finishing 7th, Avalon in 6th and Ngaire winning a fantastic silver medal. The girls then joined together to take out the Gold medal in the U/15 Women's Beach Relay.

Following one of the longest breaks between State and Aussies on record it would not be unusual if competitors

focus on surf lifesaving was to wain. But not for our guys and girls, where in many instances, our results at Aussies surpassed those at the state championships. Individually we again had a couple of boys competing in the sprints with both James Karagiannis and his brother Daniel contesting the U/17 and U/15 Men's beach sprints respectively. Both boys, but particularly James, impressed all in our team with their continued efforts and tenacity. James qualified for the semi-finals – the top 16 in Australia. James has certainly not put as much into training this year as he possibly could, but his results at Aussies certainly showed his natural abilities. With another year in the U/17 age group, James has the potential to shine next year with a bit of strength work over the off season and a bit more training throughout the year. We also had three of our competitors contest the 2km run – Jae Withers in the U/15 Girls, Jaslyn Brown having her first crack at the event in the U/17 Girls and Nathan Breen back in the U/17 Men's. All competitors did themselves and their club proud on a very gruelling soft sand course. Once again, Nathan went to another level and won the Aussies silver medal – a fantastic effort for his first Aussies.

On to our girls, and in the U/15s all of the girls did exceptionally well progressing through preliminary rounds, quarters and semis of the sprints and flags. Avalon Punch once again showed her class, qualifying for the final of both the U/15 girls sprint and flags, finishing 7th in the sprint and 4th in the flags. Both results are a fantastic achievement. And while I know Avalon would have loved to improve on her Bronze medal in last year's Aussies, I believe her abilities have continued to improve. An U/15 girl, who did not even win the U/15 sprint, went on to take out the Open Women's beach sprint. This goes to show the strength of this group of competitors, and Avalon has been able to step it up this year and compete amongst this illustrious company. It is for this reason that Avalon has been awarded the Most Improved Cadet Beach Competitor award this year.

Our results in the other age groups were equally impressive. In the Open Women's events, all girls competed outstandingly and many upstaged their more fancied rivals. In the final of the Open Women's Beach Flags, Siobhan Dibley showed outstanding concentration and focus to pick up a 4th place – one off a medal. I still think that Siobhan is one of the next generation's flag champions, and this result is just another indication of her rise through the ranks. In the Under 19s, Bree Masters again showed her class by picking up a 4th place in the Beach Sprint. Bree has had a tough year with the highs and lows of injury and transition into a new full time dance program. It was evident that she was not running at the peak of the form that has seen her excel in past seasons. However, to still finish with a 4th place at the Aussies is testament to her abilities. I am certain she will bounce back next year and excel. In the U/19 flags, both Bree and Siobhan qualified for the final, and after extended delays caused by protest, both girls walked away with medals – Bree taking the Bronze medal and Siobhan backing up her Open's result to take out the Gold medal and be crowned 2013 Australian Champion.

On to the piece de resistance – our beach relays. We have had some amazing results in relays in the past, but nothing can compare to the exhilaration felt by the entire team on the Saturday afternoon during the relay finals. We fielded relays in all four of the women's events including two teams in the Under 19s. All five teams qualified for finals. And, in all but the Open Women's, we won Gold medals with our second under-19 team picking up the Bronze. What was most pleasing about this was that there were members of our team who have never won a medal at the state or Aussies. There were some relay performances that were out of this world – some changes that pushed the boundaries, some extra acceleration that didn't seem possible. And to see the smiles on everyone's faces, but particularly on the faces of our Under 17s – the ducklings who all picked up a medal –

was priceless. I even think our Gold medal winning Under 19 girls took more pleasure out of the Bronze medal to our second team than they did out of their own win – a true day for our team.

So another successful Aussies – second only to Mooloolaba as the best beach club, but surpassing Kurrawa who beat us to the title last year. We will get there soon!!! Each year, we select one member who has made the biggest contribution to the beach section at the Aussies to be awarded the Ken Brown memorial award. This year there were many contenders. In our relays, there were some amazing performances – the changes by both Olivia Brooks and Tiarne Cavanagh in both relays that they ran in were game changers; Jessie-Rae's final legs in both the U/19s and U/17s relays ran the teams into Bronze and Gold respectively, they were really gritty performances; Bianca Ward finished as a dual relay gold medallist. But our winner this year, also a dual gold medallist, was Siobhan Dibley. Siobhan again excelled in her relay runs, but it was the determination she showed in the Flags that was really inspirational. Our only individual gold medallist this year, showed a level of patience, maturity and toughness that I have not seen before. She has always had talent but has really excelled at the latter half of this year – proof of the time and hard work she has put in.

So another long season is over. There have been some highs and lows, but all in all I think we have finished this season successfully. My thanks go to all of the athletes and their parents for their time and support throughout the year. I'd also like to thank Anthony Lyon and my deputy Col Elliott for the work they continued to put in this year. Col will stand down as Beach Vice-Captain this year, drawing to a close over 15 years of association with the Beach section. I was a young Under 18 sprinter when Col started as Beach Captain, and I have seen him build and nurture a team that is now amongst the best beach sections in Australia. Col has helped many athletes and relay teams achieve successes over the years. I would like to congratulate Col on his contribution and thank him for his support in my past three years as Beach Captain.

As a member of the winning Australian Senior R and R team in the 1965-66 season, Cronulla's first R and R Championship. Barry was also a member of the Senior Surf Team that won gold at the Australian Championships in Warrnambool in 1963. Barry still holds the record for winning six club Senior Belt Race Championships.



In response, Barry thanked the large gathering for their attendance. He thanked the club for the honour bestowed on him by the naming of the new surfboat. Barry said it had been an honour to be elected a Life Member, Past President and Patron. He spoke of his love for his family and said he was a proud man to have his family with him on the day.

HANDOVER OF SURF LIFE SAVING RECORDS FROM THE LATE BILL MARSHALL OAM

The handover to Sutherland Shire Council of almost 500 reports capturing more than 60 years of surf life saving history from clubs on Bate Bay and in NSW marked the last step in honouring the final wishes of our well-known and much loved and respected former Patron and son of Cronulla, the late Bill Marshall OAM.

Bill tirelessly collected the reports during his long service to surf life saving in Australia.

The late Bill Marshall OAM (1927-2008) joined the Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club on 7 December 1942 – a year to the day after the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbour in World War II.

For more than 60 years Bill held numerous offices within the surf life saving movement in our Club and in Surf Life Saving Sydney and later Surf Life Saving Australia. He was widely recognised for his commitment to the movement.

During this time, Bill collected the annual reports of the four Bate Bay surf life saving clubs, and surf life saving governing bodies Surf Life Saving Sydney, Surf Life Saving NSW and Surf Life Saving Australia. He also collected the annual reports of the Ladies Committee of Cronulla SLSC, the reports of the Cronulla Crays as well as the Surf Life Saving Sydney's Board of Control.

It was Bill's wish that these documents would later be bound in order, and become a permanent record of the history of surf life saving. After his death on 30 December 2008 the Bill Marshall OAM Foundation, under the guidance of our current Patron, Barry Ezzy, was formed to achieve this.

Over two years, Bill's daughter Julia Catt, of Engadine, and Barry Ezzy, set about honouring his wishes to find any

missing volumes, to bind them and hand them over to the Sutherland Shire Council's historian.

"It is a great relief to finally get it all together and it is a great legacy Bill has left of surf life saving history," said Barry.

"Bill wanted to see the records kept and he was a stickler for making sure things were correct. I think he was aware of the significance of these records for this very day when they would be handed over and become a permanent record for people to use and research," Barry said.

The records were officially handed over to then Sutherland Shire Mayor, Carol Provan, during a civic ceremony at the Council Chambers on Wednesday 29 August 2012. Bill's wife Faye, their daughters, Julia, Sandra, Vanessa and extended family, attended the Ceremony.

President Rob Short, the Executive Paul Larssen and Richard Pinker, immediate past President Greg Holland and members of the History Committee that was the organising force behind the presentation, proudly represented the Club.

"By all accounts Bill Marshall was one of a kind, and I am sure he would be delighted to see the handover of these records finally achieved," Cr Provan said.

The Bill Marshall OAM record books are kept in Council's archive section and will continue to be added to by the Bill Marshall OAM Foundation.

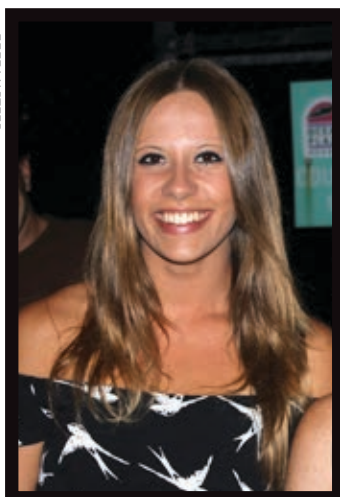

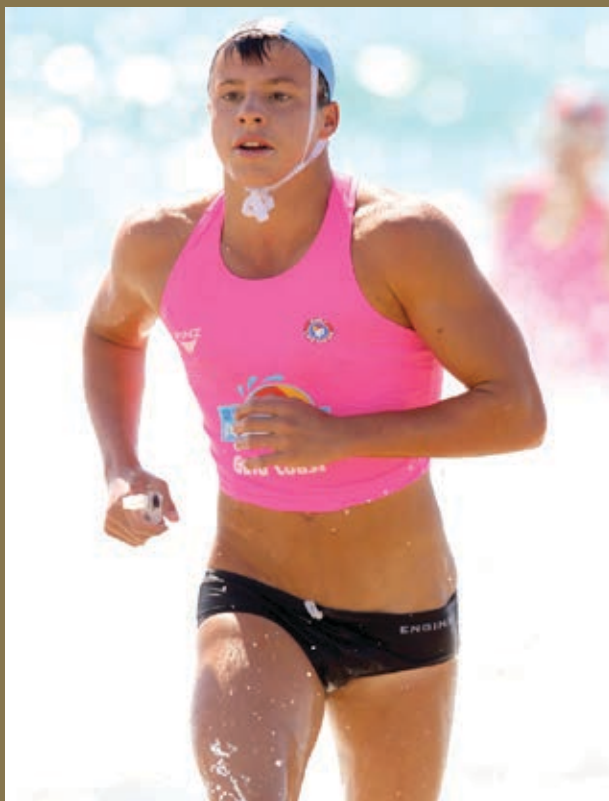

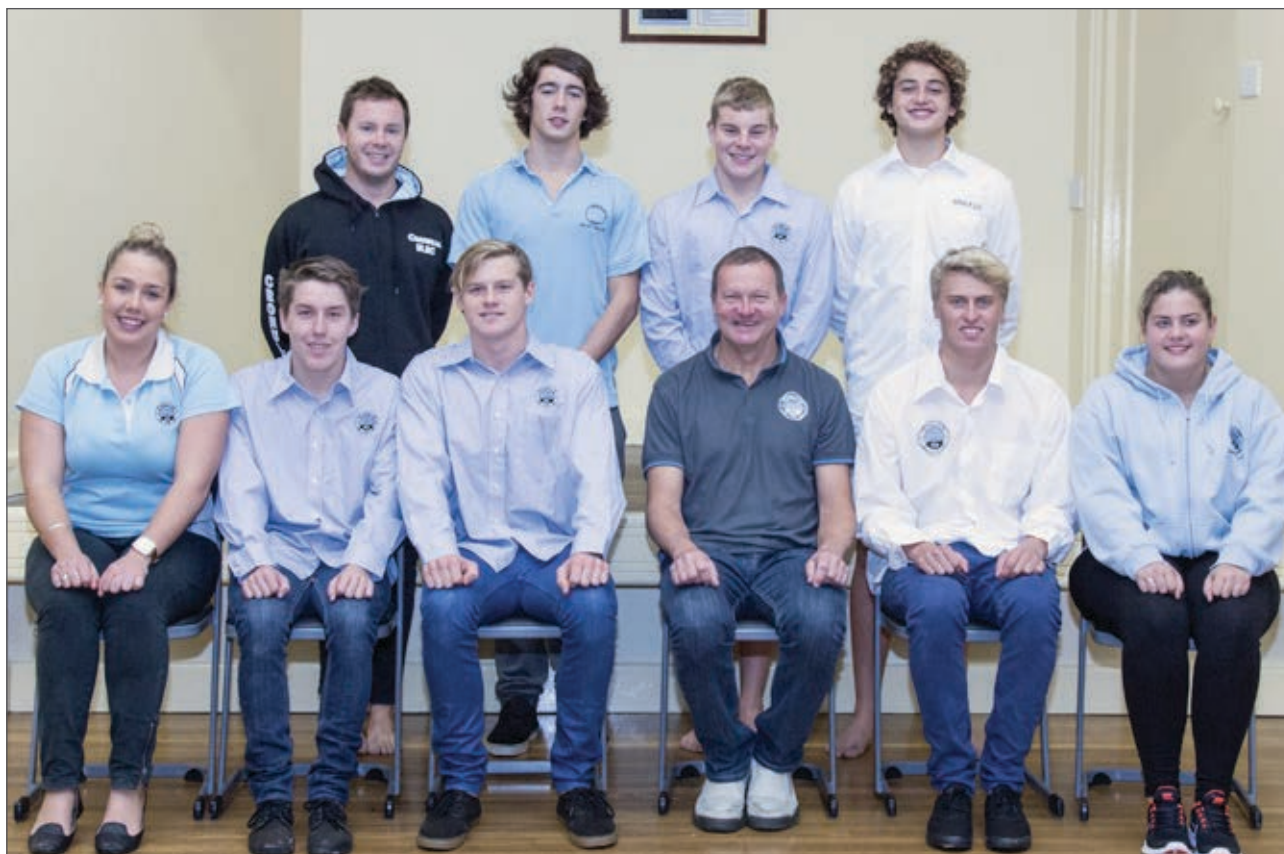
and technique of our members and they were then able to use Sasa's knowledge of Olympic Kayak training.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to be able to report that the Club has reported a surplus for the year amounting to \$119,908 after allowing for depreciation of \$102,791. The Club's overall financial position has strengthened with net assets totalling \$1,981,142 and the cash reserves increasing to \$750,099. In addition to the increase in cash reserves the Club acquired new plant and equipment totalling \$69,157 and incurred expenditure of \$35,987 on various building improvements and repairs.

Throughout the year the Club conducted the traditional annual fund raising activities, the major ones being the Shark Island Swim, the Golf Day, the 200 Club and of course the weekly BBQ. I would like to thank the organising committees and everyone who assists in the running of these events as they add substantially to the Club's income.

Once again the Club has benefited from the generosity of our sponsors and those that have made donations to the Club and I would ask that you take time to read those that are listed within the annual report. Substantial support is received from some of these sponsors by way of donating their services at no charge to the Club and in particular I would like to thank Gibson Howlin Lawyers for the many hours of advice and for making themselves available for meetings on a number of occasions throughout the year at short notice. Their support throughout the year has greatly assisted the smooth operation of the Club.

I would also take this opportunity to thank Michele Cole for her role as Crays' Treasurer and also the office staff for their assistance in recording the day to day transactions of the Club.

PRESIDENT'S ADDENDUM

Welcome to the end of a long and successful season for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club. I thought that I might write this report as a record of the past year's events and highlights. This might make it a bit like a travelogue but if it is, it will be a record of the journey through the 2012-2013 season.

At our 2012 Annual General Meeting we saw the election of two new Life Members. I was honored to receive this recognition, as was Sandra Neilson. Sandra has made her own bit of history in more ways than one. Sandra is not only the first female Life Member of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club but her father, the late Merv Costello, was a Life Member and

her husband, Kevin Neilson is also a Life Member. Additionally, her brother, husband and both sons are all Australian Gold Medalists. Cronulla is a family Club and the Neilson-Costello clan is certainly a Club family.

This season saw the passing of Club members and family and friends of Club Members. All of these are remembered with respect and sympathy. I must mention particularly, the passing early in the season of Life Member, Wallace Halpin OAM, patriarch of the Halpin-Goode clan. It was a sad but great honor that the first official function that I performed was to speak at the gathering of family and friends at our Club following Wal's memorial service.

This past season, Management Committee meetings and sub-committee meetings continued as good forums for open and vigorous discussion and decision making. At the first Management Committee for the season, my message of goals as new President was the same as those that I presented to the AGM last year. I did not have a strong agenda. I believed that there were some simple things that needed to be done to allow us to continue to operate at a high level. There were, of course, some significant outstanding matters such as the rejuvenation of the Clubhouse, settlement of the ORB issue and the usual range of ongoing operational matters. I believed that the best way to effectively address all of these issues was through our Club's due processes.

We needed to continue to have our Club Officers, Section Heads and Committee Conveners know and do their jobs - to look at their position and understand what it was that they were expected to do, and to take on all of the responsibilities of their role and, in those cases where they were too busy or the tasks too big, to ensure that they had the assistance from deputies, committee members or others able to help. If this did not work, then I asked them to let the Deputy President, Brad Turner or another member of the Executive know so we could look at providing assistance or advice. Our Club Officers and sub-committees continue to be the strength of our Club and it was good to see that this season they again rose to the challenge of making the Club operate well.

The season start was impacted by Sutherland Shire Council's program to rebuild the sea wall along the Esplanade at Cronulla Beach. The old sea wall had been in place since the 1930s. Patrols and rippers were challenged early in the season as a large area of beach and most of Esplanade was fenced off for several weeks. This presented major difficulties getting patrol equipment, especially the IRB, onto the beach. Patrol Members worked very hard to not compromise the quality of operation and they were successful at maintaining patrol standards and assuring public safety at all times. Our thanks go to SSC Lifeguards and Council Officers for their support during this time. Work commenced on the resurfacing of the Esplanade immediately following the end of the patrol season and we look forward to seeing a completely rejuvenated Esplanade and enjoying the benefits of the work.

The Club undertook a few major internal works this season.

There was a complete refurbishment of the upper level change rooms plus other work elsewhere in the Sports Complex. This allows this building to continue as a source of revenue for the Club and also as a major community asset.

A new security access system was installed to control entry to the gym and Club office. I thank Club member, Pat Burke, for installing this system at no cost to the Club and also to Senior Vice-President, Michael Banister for coordinating the installation and performing the electrical component at no cost.

We also rejuvenated the Patrol Room which has been very popular with Patrol members and this has seen that area function much better.

The District Council operated successfully again this season. Cronulla Life Member and Past President, John Bentley took on the role of District Chairman and was immediately faced with a busy agenda of issues and activities which he handled well within that team of people. Thank you John. The major

achievement of the District this season was the settlement of the ORB issue, reached through negotiations with SLSNSW. The craft has been handed to SLSNSW and the future of the craft and service now lies with them. The finalisation saw a bulk cash settlement to the District. This has been placed in trust for the conduct of life saving services within the Bate Bay area and will be administered via a formal trust set up between the four Clubs and Sutherland Shire Council.

Surf Life Saving Sydney (Branch) was very active. We have seen a more vigorous approach taken to the management of patrol issues over the past season or two. This has resulted in concerns expressed by most Clubs. Our Clubs are tasked with maintaining a high standard service staffed by volunteers, albeit very dedicated, in a busier and busier world. A mid-season meeting of Club Presidents and Captains saw some guidelines agreed to and we will see these develop further as we enter the next season. As well as coordinating lifesaving and competition activities, this season the Branch took on the task of a redesign of its own operations and hierarchal structure. This task is ongoing and the Management Committee is kept informed of development and proposals.

Our lifesaving ran quite well this season and I commend the Captain and Vice-Captain's reports to you. I must mention a couple of patrol highs. These include the demands placed on our Australia Day patrols with large crowds present at the festivities at Cronulla. The afternoon patrol was confronted by a huge array of major challenges in a space of a few short hours - all met successfully. The patrol was given high praise in a letter from the SSC lifeguard on duty and it was praise indeed. Congratulations to Patrol 6 and Patrol Captain, John Adamson. Secondly, one morning in February saw high seas and a number of swimmers and surfers still braving the ocean. On this day the patrol was called on to rescue swimmers and also to undertake a major search operation off Shark Island in very challenging conditions. These are the challenges we train for. These are the challenges to which we rise. Well done.

Our lifesaving awards were again coordinated by Chief Instructor, Brian Dalgarno, who was personally involved with every squad and every squad member at some level. Brian put in an enormous number of hours and deserves the thanks and accolades of all Club members.

On the competition front we could only be happy this year with a first at Branch, Second at State and a sixth at Aussies. And we had fun at the InterClub.

The members of the Club Executive, Brad, Paul, Richard, Kieran and myself, worked hard together at times and we played hard as well at times and we had a bit of fun doing it. I think that is the sign of a good team and our Club administration operated well. Deputy President, Brad Turner, in his first year of office helped steer the Executive with his rational and sensible advice, seasoned with the passion of a highly respected veteran Club Member. Our Club Secretary, Paul Larssen was, as usual, reliable, efficient and thorough in the conduct of the Club's day to day affairs, communications and general administration. Your Club funds were managed in a completely professional manner by Richard Pinker. The professionalism in our financial management must make us the envy of other Clubs. Club Captain, Kieran Day, was again committed to high standards of lifesaving and competition and worked to these standards all season. Well done Captain.

Of course, the administration and day to day operations of our Club could not be as successful as they are without the wonderful work of our Office staff - our Administrative Coordinator, Jenny Pinker, and her workmate, Robyn Cole. These ladies are great friends and a great team. The whole Club thanks them for their dedication and achievements. Jenny and Robyn are also assisted from time to time by the individual who drops in and offers the benefits of his knowledge and helps with his labors.

We could not survive as a Club without funds and we raise most of those ourselves. I thank all involved in our

Towards the end of the season we had a bit of an education focus on young members, with a large number gaining Advanced Resuscitation, Spinal Management and IRB Crew awards. Congratulations Lifesavers. I hope this continues into next season.

Finally though, the way the season ended left most of us on a real high, especially the two great weeks leading up to Sunday 28 April.

The competition period from Branch to Australian Championships was a great success. It was crowned by the great Aussies week at Kirra with fantastic team spirit, support and harmony which saw all of us (including, or especially, me) come home very happy.

This high was then topped off by a really successful twenty-fifth Shark Island Swim, with a large field of happy swimmers, held in the most perfect conditions that you could wish for on a glorious last day of the 2012-13 season. What a way to end a good season.

Thank you Cronulla. Thank you Friends.

This is a great Club. I will be back next season. I am sure you will be too. I will see you on the beach at Cronulla. Where else would you rather be?
