Patron's Message

At the last Annual General Meeting, you the Members, elected me as your Patron. Prior to the AGM, following the passing of Bill Marshall OAM, I was elected by the Management Committee. So to receive your endorsement to represent you as your Patron, I regard this to be a great honour.

I thank you for your confidence in me and I promise to fulfil my obligations as Patron, to the best of my ability, during my time in office.

It's pleasing to once again observe that *"no lives were lost"* whilst our Patrols were on duty on Cronulla Beach during the past twelve months. I acknowledge the outstanding job done by our Patrolling Members and I commend them for their dedication.

It must always be remembered that our very existence is due to our commitment to the surfing public on Cronulla Beach.

I remind every Member of our objectives as outlined in our Club Rules which are – (partly), *"To provide and maintain an efficient Rescue Service"*.

During the season, a historical decision was made by the Management Committee to provide financial assistance to some of our leading competitors, on a scale which hasn't been seen within our Club before.

An amount of fifty thousand dollars was allocated to this task on a trial basis.

This was done because other Clubs were making financial offers to our competitors and it was felt that if our Club didn't match or better these offers, we would lose many of these Members.

It is my opinion, if this scheme is to continue, many of the lessons learnt during its inaugural year must be applied.

It is most important that all decisions are fully discussed, and that they are ratified by the Management Committee prior to them being implemented.

Also when spending such a large amount of Club funds, all transactions must be seen to be transparent.

In February the Interclub Championship was contested at Elouera. I was very pleased, with many of my fellow Life Members, to witness a clean victory by our competitors.

To see the prestigious "Bill Marshall Trophy" in its rightful and almost permanent home in the Monro Room, is a sheer delight. Thanks to every Member who gave their all to ensure that this happened.

During the season, I travelled to Swansea-Belmont for the State Championships and to Kurrawa in Queensland, for the Australian Championships.

At the State, it was pleasing to see our competitors perform so well, allowing us to finish a creditable second to Manly in the pointscore. I'm confident that with just the slightest bit of luck, we will be able to topple Manly next year.

The Australian Championships were a big disappointment due to the cancelation of all the Water Events, as a result of the tragic accident which occurred on the Friday.

As we all know, nineteen-year-old Saxon Bird, from the Queenscliff Club, was tragically killed during an Ironman event.

There were many very disappointed Cronulla competitors who were so keen to compete, but unfortunately weren't given the opportunity. I was so very proud of the way these athlete's accepted this decision and for their understanding of the situation. They are such a credit to our fine Club.

The Beach Section of the Championships was held and I congratulate those who got medals.

This was a most moving ceremony and over five thousand Surf Lifesavers from all around Australia attended.

This was a fitting tribute to a young man, who was in the prime of his life and was so cruelly taken from us, doing the thing he loved most.

I extend congratulations to the Surf Lifesaving Association for their organisational skills and for their genuine attempt to show Saxon's family just how deeply all Surf Lifesavers felt during this very sad time.

This accident was indeed a tragedy and fortunately it is a rare occurrence. However, we must never lose sight of the fact that our sport is dangerous and that accidents like this may happen again.

Last year I mentioned the debt owed by the Club on the loan to construct the Kiosk/Restaurant.

It's very pleasing to note that over fifty per cent of that loan has been repaid during the past twelve months and that we are well on track to have the loan fully repaid by this time next year.

This is an outstanding achievement by our Executive, and I congratulate them for their diligence.

The year just passed has been one of tests and of triumphs. I'm pleased to be able to confirm that your elected representatives have performed their allotted tasks to the very best of their ability.

I commend them for their dedication and enthusiasm and for ensuring that Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club remains the leading Surf Life Saving Club in Australia.

One-Hundred and Third Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the Season 2009-2010

My second year as Secretary ensured that I spent another great season down on the shores of Cronulla Beach. My first term was a rapid learning curve given the number of tumultuous events that occurred during the season and so this time around I was able to continue in the position much more comfortably and confidently. I am thoroughly enjoying learning about the Clubs history, traditions and development, not to mention meeting some of the "characters" that fit the names that are so often referred to. There are many Members with good ideas and intentions to progress the Club into the future and I would like to be a part of that progression.

Cronulla SLSC is first and foremost a Lifesaving Club and I wish to thank all the Patrolling Members who give up their time each summer to maintain "*Vigilance and Service*" on Cronulla Beach.

Congratulations once again to Patrol 9 and their Captain Michael Murray, for winning the "Patrol Competition" for the second year running, an outstanding effort. This year we also saw record numbers complete 100% Patrols, giving them the opportunity to attend the Club Ski Trip weekend away. Kimberley Short also achieved 10 consecutive years of 100% rostered Patrols and the Club congratulates her on this great achievement. Luis Catalan only joined the Club this season and after completing various awards and patrolling, was honoured with the title of "Patrol Person of the Year". Well done!

On the competition side, the Club saw some changes implemented with the decision to start financially supporting some of our athletes on scholarships. A Senior Water Skills Coach position has been created as well as Ian Goode and Carlo Villanti forming the Youth Development Committee, which I am sure will take off in leaps and bounds next season. It is great to see these changes occurring and people getting involved in setting Cronulla SLSC up as a Club that will continue to develop in future years.

The NSW State Championships saw us just pipped out of first place by rivals Manly LSC. We had however, some outstanding performances across the board.

The Australian Championships spent their first year back "home" at Kurrawa Beach, after a three year stint in Perth.

Unfortunately, the tragic drowning of Queenscliff SLSC Member Saxon Bird, marred these Championships. A decision was made to cancel the remaining Water Events and as such our athletes did not have the chance to put into competition all their hard hours of training. This did however, give them time to reflect on the risks that we as Lifesavers take, both in competition and on Patrol.

Once again, it was fantastic to see so many social and fundraising activities take place around the Club. The off-season saw our first ever Christmas in July, which was so well attended that the 12 Days of Christmas had to be extended to include "13 Cronulla Mermaids, 14 Spunky Lifesavers, 15 Ice Cold Schooners and 16 Burly Boatsies".

We then had three of our successful annual events – the Golf Day and the 200 Club, followed by the 23rd Shark Island Swim. Well done to Warren Sawyer, Chris Gough and Glenn Carter, on another year of terrific events.

Our World Team that will be heading to Egypt in October 2010, also held several "fundraisers" during the season. Kevin and Sandra Neilson will be managing their last Worlds

Club Vice Captain's Report

I don't know if it's just me and old age, but the Patrol Seasons seem to be getting longer and busier.

The 2009-2010 Season proved to be another successful one. There were a record number of Patrol Members who received their 100% Awards.

A special mention must be made about Kimberley Short, who obtained her "10 Years 100% Award". Kimberley has been involved in the Club since the Under-6 Nippers and went on to become a very successful Patrol Captain. She has been an excellent role model to her peers and I wish her all the best in her travels overseas.

Other Members who deserve mention are Ashleigh Timbrell and David Kerr, who have achieved eight years 100%, Bryan Wild on six years 100% and Chris Barber, Brian Dalgarno, James Kerr, Sean Macfarlane-Bentley, Kate Murray and Michael Murray on five years 100%.

Well done to those Members and to all fifty-six Members who received their 100% Awards this season (43 Members obtained 100% last season). Patrol 6 had eight Members obtain 100% (53.3%), Patrol 9 had thirteen Members obtain 100% (50%) and Patrol 4 had six Members obtain 100% (37.5%).

This year I introduced a new system for recording Patrol attendance. Each week the Patrol Rosters were printed off and placed in the Patrol Log. This enabled Patrol Captains to monitor attendance, check to see which Members were financial, which Members needed to complete their Proficiencies, made it easier for the District Inspector to check who was on Patrol and also made it easier for me to input the Patrol Logs into Surfguard each week. This resulted in fewer mistakes being made.

This season a total of 7568 Patrol hours were performed by the twelve Patrols – an increase of 1405 hours from last season (6163 hours last season).

An additional 1432 voluntary hours were also performed (2015 hours last season). The average attendance for all Patrols this season was 65.54% compared to 57.38% last season (55.62 2007-08, 47.51 2006-07).

Patrol 9 received 79.1%, Patrol 6 77.9% and Patrol 11 75.7%. A big thank you to all Patrol Members who contributed to the above patrol hours.

It is pleasing to note that there has been a 14% increase in the attendance rate of Patrols from last season. On a less positive note, it was disappointing that a few Patrols struggled to maintain their numbers during the season.

Active Patrol Members need to attend as many of their Patrols as possible and organise substitutes if they are unable to attend, so that they don't let their colleagues down.

Kieran and I will implement positive strategies next season that encourage all Patrol Members to strive for 100% attendance.

Once again the Club maintained a strong presence on the beach during the State and Aussie weekends.

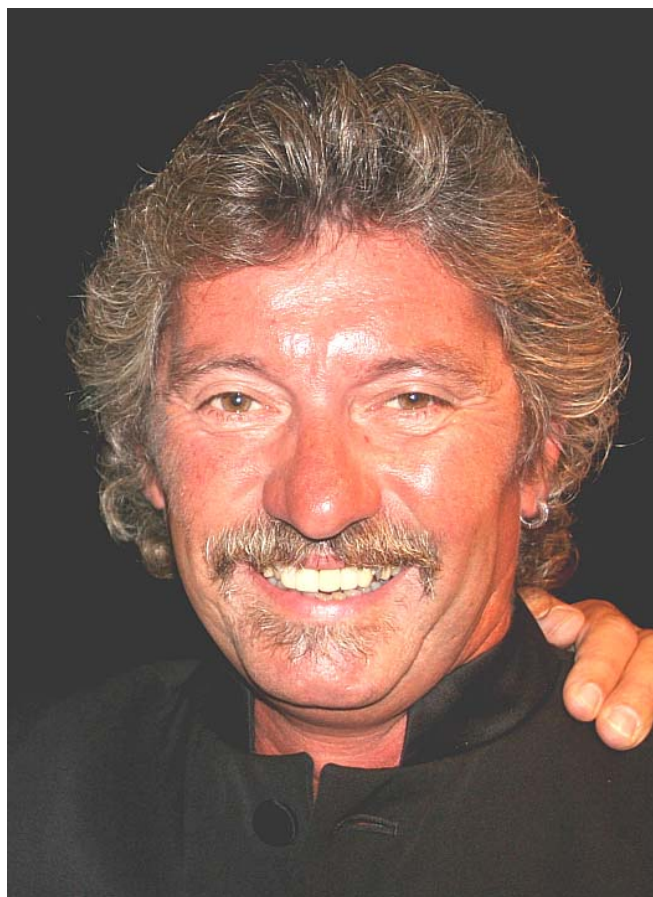
Our last competition was the Sydney Branch Carnival which had been postponed due to bad weather, so it was actually held after the NSW Age Championships.

Chief Gear Steward's Report

It was a relatively quiet year regarding Lifesaving related equipment this year. After the usual hectic few weeks of preparation in August-September, the Gear Stewards did not have much to do for the rest of the season.

We have a lot of equipment and it was used extensively and cared for well by Club Members.

All of Cronulla's Patrol equipment and Nipper Water Safety equipment was prepared, repaired, renewed and submitted for the Annual Gear Inspection, held on 12th September 2009.

The Gear submitted included:

- 16 Rescue Boards
- Stretcher and Spinal Boards
- 21 Rescue Tubes
- Patrol Area and Tent
- 7 Radios
- Patrol Uniforms
- 3 Oxy-Viva Kits
- Board and Tube Stands
- 2 Patrol 1st-Aid Kits
- Signal Flags and Shark Flags
- 1 Club 1st-Aid Kit
- 11 Resuscitation Mannequins
- 9 Spinal Collars
- 4 IRBs
- 3 Spinal Boards and Straps
- 5 Outboard Motors
- 1 Defibrillator
- Boat Trailers

This improves on last season and once again is the most equipment that the Club has ever put up for inspection, ready for Patrol use.

It was a good inspection, with a single Inspection Team visiting all Clubs in the Branch over the weekend.

This is a great effort by these people and they received our thanks and appreciation for their time and commitment.

The outcome for Cronulla was great, with not one fault found with any of our equipment.

We supplied lunch and a few beverages to the Inspection Team before they set off for the descent into the National Park Beaches.

The following Members helped prepare the Club Gear and premises for the start of the season – Col Haywood, Ken English, Bryan Wild, Brian Dalgarno, Michael Murray, Daniel Wood, Chris Barber and Ai Wood.

Purchases of replacement equipment this season were minimal due to the condition of the existing equipment.

However, new Spinal and Defibrillation equipment was needed.

As a result, the expenditure this season was reasonably high, approximately \$6200 outlay, plus \$3500 of sponsored items.

This included Board repairs (\$1001), Radio servicing (\$528), Oxy-Viva and Resuscitation Manikin servicing and Masks (\$780), Spinal Injury Management Equipment (\$443), Defibrillator equipment (\$1170), Log Books (\$150) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$105).

We also bought four new Training Manikins and accessories (\$1400), Binoculars (\$100), two new Radio Bags (\$140) and two new Rescue Boards (\$2600) which were sponsored by the Lions Club. We bought Patrol Caps (\$400) and Surf Life Saving Australia provided Uniforms from the DHL Subsidy. The Kingsway Night & Day Pharmacy (Gannons Road), a great supporter of the local community and our Club – donated almost one thousand dollars worth of 1st-Aid supplies.

Our thanks go to Peter Notaras, who has not only provided this support for many years, but is also a Senior Vice-President, who shows a keen interest in Club activities.

During the season, we spent a small amount (\$200) on tent repairs – not bad considering the age and use of our tents. We also purchased rash shirts for all IRB Crew (\$980) as SLSA recommended these following a decision that the new Patrol Shirts presented some safety issues when worn in the IRB.

Some of the older Rescue Boards were replaced this season and the retired items which were still in good order were passed to South Coast Club – Coalcliff, who found good use for them. This assistance is something which our Club can afford and has been greatly appreciated by the recipient Clubs in the past.

Unfortunately, the storage issues of the past few seasons have still not been resolved – there still being inadequate storage facilities for IRBs, Belt Reels and Surfboats.

This will surely be a focus point of the Club's future Development Plan.

Gear Steward Ken English and Radio Officer Col Haywood have ably supported the management of Patrol equipment through the season. I believe that once again, we have been able to provide Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club with the best possible equipment for Patrol, Training, Competition and at times – recreational purposes.

See you on the beach at Cronulla – where else would you rather be?

My first year at the helm of the Cronulla Shark Island Swim, introduced me to a side of the Surf Club I had never seen before.

They are the “hands on” working Members of the Shark Island Swim.

The events were held on Sunday 14th March, 2010. A fine sunny day, but a south-easterly wind had been blowing all the previous night.

With the 1 km Ocean Swim resulting in approximately 35% of swimmers being stung by *Pelagica Noctiluca*, belonging to the family Cnidarian, I don't think people realise just how close the major race was to being cancelled. With that statistic, our Water Safety, Council Lifeguards Wilko and Bede (thanks Brad Whittaker, Beach Operations Manager, Sutherland Shire Council), Dr Robyn Jordan (thanks Doctor) and Cronulla Surf Club Members, were expecting some 300 odd swimmers to be stung in the 2.5 km Swim.

As a duty of care to both swimmers and our own Water Safety – including members of North Cronulla, Elouera



and Wanda Surf Clubs – Greg Holland President, Announcer and Master of Ceremonies (thanks Greg) warned swimmers of the risks.

Fortunately, the stingers seemed to be on the northern end of the beach and as the swimmers ventured south and around the island – we were spared from attack.

The preparation done, the course set and the buoys were laid by Richard, Daniel and the IRB Teams with their trusty GPS. Our official Starter Mrs Faye Marshall (wife of the Late Bill Marshall OAM) got the 793 swimmers away in three waves, wearing their Eyeline Swimcaps and timing bands (thanks to The Timing Guys – Chris and June).

In a nutshell, we coped but our Water Safety (numbers and efficiency) was tested. Great job everyone – Well Done!

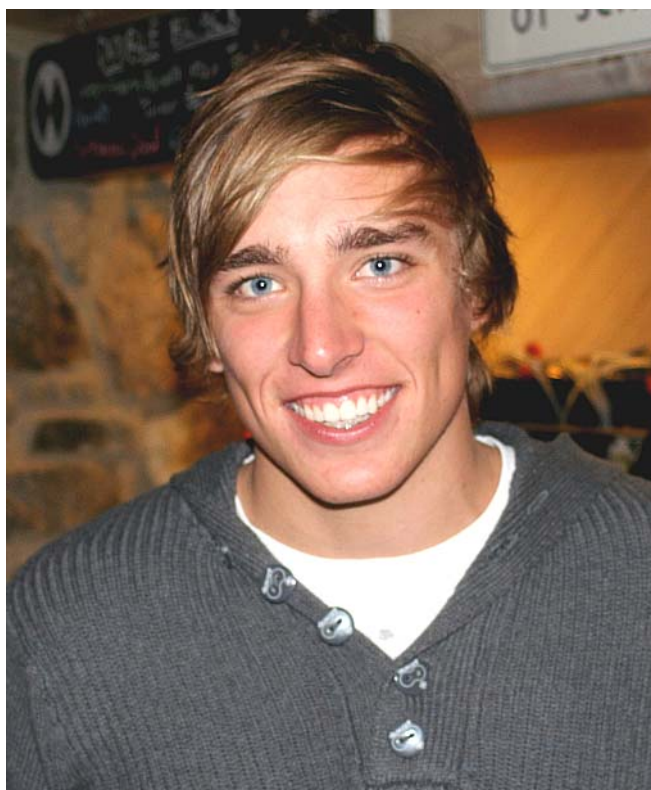

Coaching and Competition Report

The 2009-2010 Season was one of great change and innovation for the C & C Committee. Consisting of the Section Captains for each discipline, the Committee is responsible for the recruitment and retention of competitors and the ongoing development of their skills.

Following open forums of interested parties in April 2009, it was recognised that our Club had become complacent in fostering the young talent in our Club.

In December, the C & C Committee approached Management for funds to provide scholarships to our elite athletes to help offset the cost of training and competing for our Club. It was proposed to create two tiers of scholarship. A group of six was established to determine the criteria for receiving a scholarship and to determine who was eligible. This group consisted of the President, Captain, Treasurer, Convener of the C & C Committee and two nominations from the C & C Committee.

While the criteria were based on performances over the past season and early part of the 2009-2010 Season, scholarships were not viewed as a reward for past services, but as an incentive for athletes to continue training and competing for our Club. In some cases whole teams were included, as "the whole" was more important than "the individuals". In February, Kevin Neilson and Col Elliott interviewed each nominated competitor.

In March, Kevin Neilson stood aside as convener of the C & C Committee due to lack of time to commit to the task, and he was succeeded by Col Elliott.

There are more exciting plans for the 2010-2011 Season. Recognising that our athletes need a more comprehensive coaching structure, the C & C Committee invited applications for a Senior Water Skills Coach.

After interviewing three very impressive candidates, our former Australian Iron Man champion, Nathan Smith, was appointed. "Smithy" has indicated that he will be winding back on his competitive schedule, but is passionate about developing the talent at Cronulla as Coach, while competing in Ski and Team Events as the need arises.

Nathan will co-ordinate our team of specialist Coaches including "Bluey" Garnsey, Nathan Steiner, Tony Schumacher, Mark Simpson and others. Concurrently, Sectional Captains will be developing other neglected areas such as Champion Lifesaver, R & R, Marchpast and Patrol Competition.

For the coming season, the emphasis will be directed towards providing expert coaching with specific training programs, trips to designated carnivals, training camps etc.

In October 2010, a squad of our athletes will be travelling to Alexandria in Egypt to compete in the World Life Saving Championships. This team has been raising funds over the last year under the direction of Coach Kevin Neilson and Manager Sandra Neilson.

The Beach events however, proceeded and our competitors represented our Club proudly. Our team continued the tradition of winning a Beach Gold Medal at the Aussies for each of the last ten years and for nine of those years, we have won a Girl's Relay Gold.

This year's champions were: Bree Masters – Gold in Under-15 Sprint and Relay, Silver in Under-15 Flags, Siobhan Dibley – Gold in Under-15 Flags and Relay, Bronze in Under-15 Sprint, Sarah Cook – Gold Under-19 Sprint. Our Open Women and Under-19 girls finished fourth and fifth in their Relays.

Overall we finished with 41 points – our third highest total ever – though no official Carnival Pointscore was released, due to so many cancellations.

The Re-Union Dinner was a wonderful night and many people were heard to say – "When are we having the next one?"

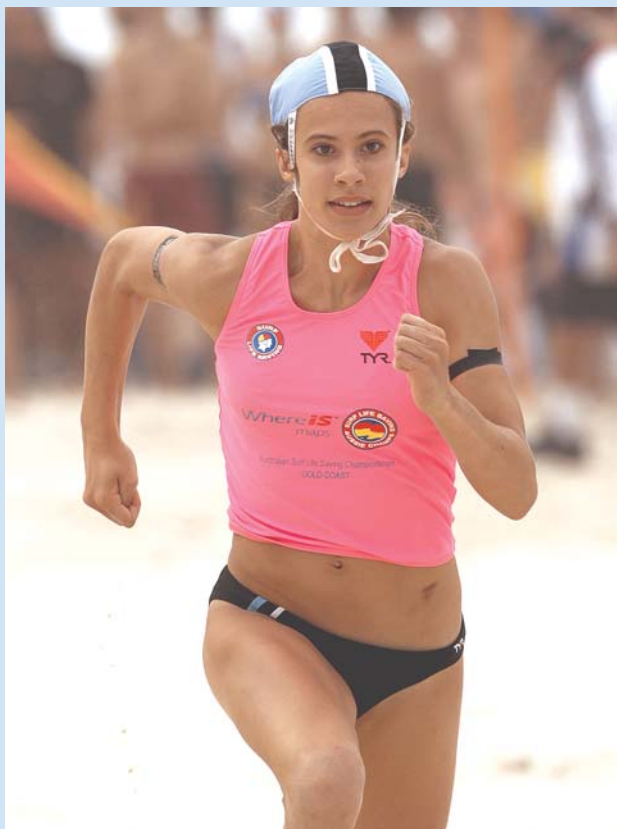

Also thanks to those who gave up their spots, to allow our younger Members an easier alternative for their mums and dads.

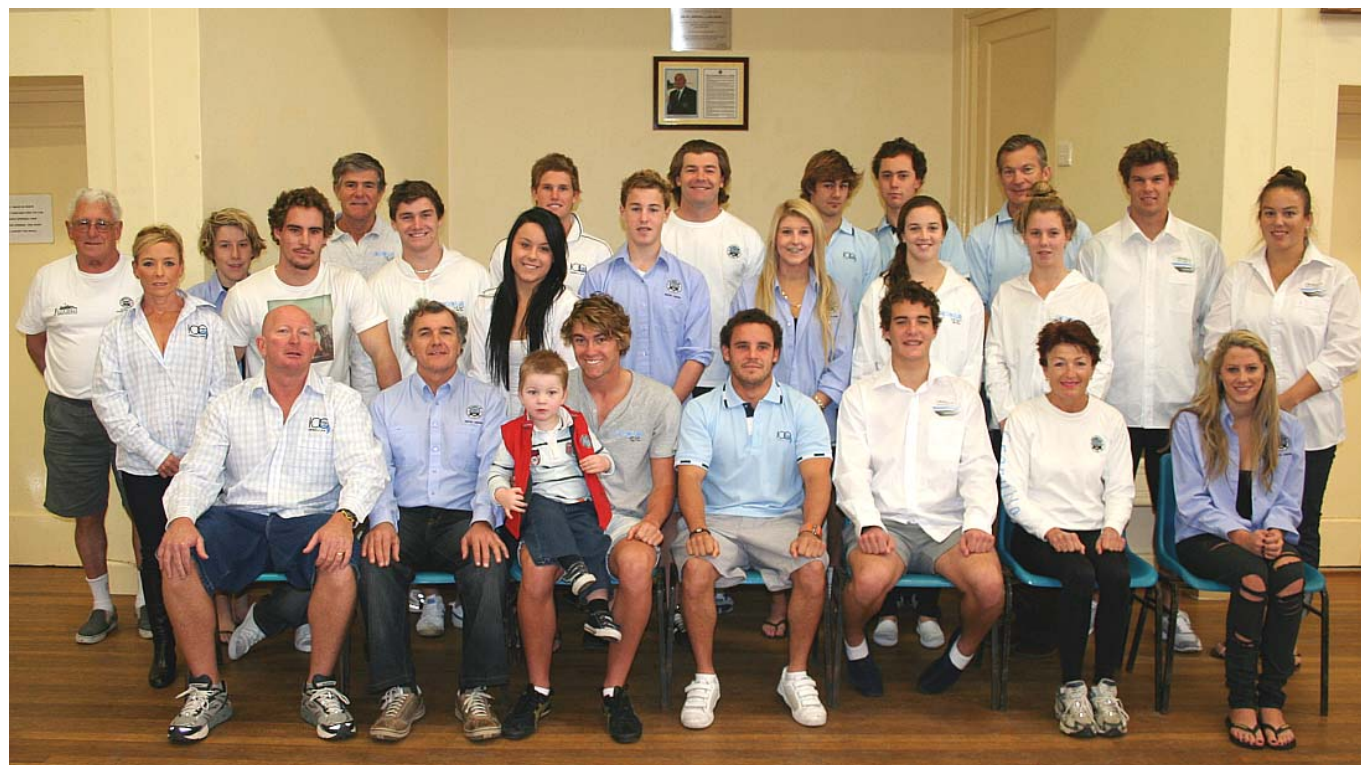

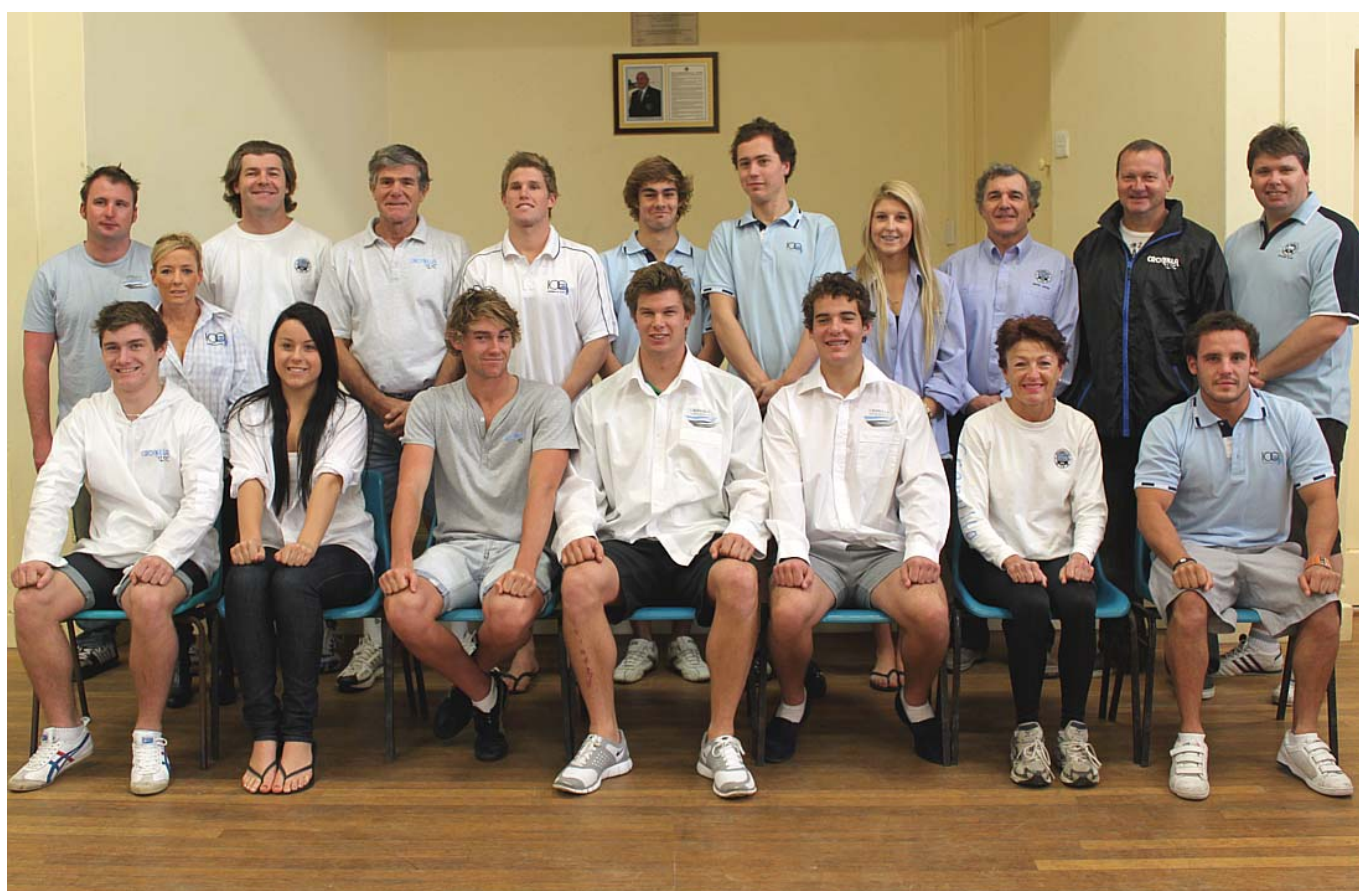

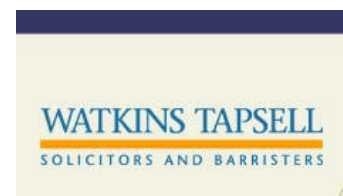

Treasurer's Report

The Financial Statements for the year ended 30th April 2010 disclose an operating surplus of \$207,013 which is a substantial increase on prior years. This result reflects the efforts and decisions made by the Management Committee over a number of years.

Total revenues increased to \$809,436 and the major contributor to this increase was from the lease of premises to Zimzala. Additionally, the Shark Island Swim had its best ever year with revenues surpassing the \$50,000 mark and the Club again benefited greatly from sponsorships and donations which are listed separately in the Annual Report.

The surplus for the year is reflected in improvement in our cash position, the acquisition of plant and equipment and the reduction of debt. Cash reserves have increased to \$467,029, plant and equipment totalling \$61,842 was acquired and our loans have decreased by \$96,769. The capital expenditure on new equipment included replacement of the boilers in the Complex, improvements to the audio system, the acquisition of a new trailer, replacement of the television, a replacement dishwasher, new honour boards and various items of rescue equipment. At the current rate of repayment, the Club should repay the borrowings in full within the next financial year.

As well as the Shark Island Swim, the Club held a number of successful fundraising events such as the Golf Day, the 200 Club, the Melbourne Cup Day, the Sportsman's Lunch together with a number of evening events and I would like to thank the various Committees involved in organising these events. There is an enormous amount of work that goes on behind the scenes to prepare and run these events and collectively they have contributed significantly to the Club's surplus.

I ask that you take time to review the list of Sponsors and Donors that are listed in the Annual Report and ask where possible that you support these businesses as they have contributed significantly to the success of the Club.

President's Addendum

As your President, it is an honour to provide this Addendum to the 2009-2010 Annual Report.

The past twelve months have been exciting as the Club has made progress in a number of areas identified by the new Executive upon their election in 2008. Progress and reform of past practices of the Club does not come easy.

We have instigated a Youth Development Program for our Members leaving Nippers and moving into the Senior Ranks. This program will ensure that we have a sustainable recruitment and retention plan to guide new Members into the Club and to assist those younger Members with a structured program that will enhance their Life Saving skills, along with Competition and Administrative skills.

Members will soon begin to notice changes to the Clubhouse to better serve our Members and Staff. Deputy

President, Rob Short has completed the first stage of a five year program to deliver an effective and operating Clubhouse that reflects the demands and requirements of our Members.

During the next twelve months, we will present to the Members the first round of suggested changes to the Clubhouse so that it can be properly utilised and wasted space used efficiently.

I would not be able to complete the job of President without the hard work and dedicated support of our Executive, Management Committee and Staff. Rob Short has continued to be an effective Deputy President often stepping up to represent the Club and myself when either work or other commitments prevented me doing so. Rob has also managed to coordinate our Sub-Committees to ensure that all aspects of the Club and its Members are reported to Management in an effective and efficient way.

It is no secret that Rob takes his position as the Club "Owner" seriously and he is to be congratulated and thanked for the amount of time that he spends at the Club.

Jenny or Robyn is usually the first port of call for anyone entering into or enquiring about the Club. Unfortunately, they are sometimes the subject of disagreement with Members. In all instances all of our Staff perform their duties and responsibilities beyond the call. On behalf of all Members I thank them.

I have not forgotten our effervescent, efficient and effective Honorary Secretary, Emma Larssen. Emma has done a fantastic job over the past two years. Her nature and professionalism have ensured that all our Secretarial duties and activities were carried out with aplomb. The financial report

We have audited the accompanying financial report of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2010, and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the statement by members of the committee.

Committee's responsibility for the financial report

The committee are responsible for the preparation and fair representation of the financial report in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and the *Associations Incorporation Act of New South Wales*. This responsibility includes establishing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditors Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report and the remuneration disclosures contained in the directors' report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the members of the committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*.

Basis for Qualified Auditor's Opinion

Our audit report has been issued with the following qualifications:

1. As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for the club to maintain an effective system of internal control over donations, subscriptions, sales and fundraising activities until their initial entry into the accounting record. Accordingly, our audit in relation to such revenue was limited to amounts recorded.
2. We did not observe the counting of the physical inventories as at 30 April 2010. Owing to the nature of the association's records, we were unable to satisfy ourselves as to inventory quantities by other audit procedures.

Qualified Auditor's Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects on the financial report of the matters referred to in the qualification paragraph, the financial report of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is in accordance with the *Associations Incorporation Act of New South Wales*, including:

- (a) Giving a true and fair view of the association's financial position as at 30 April 2010 and of its performance for the year ended on that date
- (b) Complying with Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS).
- (c) That the financial statements show a true and fair view of the financial results of fundraising appeals conducted during the year.
- (d) That the accounting and associated records have been properly kept during the year in accordance with the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991* and the regulations.
- (e) That monies received as a result of fundraising appeals conducted during the year have been properly accounted for and applied in accordance with the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1001* and the regulations; and
- (f) At the date of this report there are reasonable grounds to believe that the organisation will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

Notes to the Financial Statements – For the Year Ended 30 April 2010

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, the Charitable Fundraising Act and regulations and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of New South Wales.

The financial statements cover Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated as an individual entity. Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporations Act 1984.

The financial report of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated as an individual entity complies with all Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) in their entirety.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Accounting Policies

a. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

b. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

c. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

d. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Plant and Equipment

The carrying amount of plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

The cost of fixed assets constructed within the association includes the cost of materials, direct labour, borrowing costs and an appropriate portion of fixed and variable overhead.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the income statement during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Property

Buildings are shown at their cost less depreciation.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets is depreciated over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

i. Depreciation Rates

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Buildings 5%

Plant and Equipment 10% – 50%

Gym Equipment 37.5%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

e. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other shortterm highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

f. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

g. Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. Any consideration deferred is treated as the provision of finance and is discounted at a rate of interest that is generally accepted in the market for similar arrangements. The difference between the amount initially recognised and the amount ultimately received is interest revenue.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from properties is recognised on an accruals basis in accordance with lease agreements.

Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

h. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

i. Financial Instruments

ii. Initial Recognition and Measurement

Financial instruments, incorporating financial assets and financial liabilities, are recognised when the association becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Trade date accounting is adopted for financial assets that are delivered within timeframes established by marketplace convention.

Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs where the instrument is not classified as at fair value through profit or loss. Transaction costs related to instruments classified as at fair value through profit or loss are expensed to profit or loss immediately. Financial instruments are classified and measured as set out below.

iii. Derecognition

Financial assets are derecognised where the contractual rights to receipt of cash flows expires or the asset is transferred to another party whereby the association no longer has any significant continuing involvement in the risks and benefits associated with the asset. Financial liabilities are derecognised where the related obligations are either discharged, cancelled or expire. The difference between the carrying value of the financial liability extinguished or transferred to another party and the fair value of consideration paid, including the transfer of non-cash assets or liabilities assumed is recognised in profit or loss.

iii. Classification and Subsequent Measurement

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss

Financial assets are classified at fair value through profit or loss when they are held for trading for the purpose of short term profit taking, where they are derivatives not held for hedging purposes, or when they are designated as such to avoid an accounting mismatch or to enable performance evaluation where a group of financial assets is managed by key management personnel on a fair value basis in accordance with a documented risk management or investment strategy. Such assets are subsequently measured at fair value with changes in carrying value being included in profit or loss. Realised and unrealised gains and losses arising from changes in fair value are included in profit or loss in the period in which they arise.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Loans and receivables are included in current assets, except for those, which are not expected to mature within 12 months after the end of the reporting period, which will be classified as non-current assets.

Held to maturity investments

Held-to-maturity investments are non-derivative financial assets that have fixed maturities and fixed or determinable payments, and it is the association's intention to hold these investments to maturity. They are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Held to maturity investments are included in non-current assets, except for those, which are expected to mature within 12 months after the end of the reporting period, which will be classified as current assets.

If during the period the association sold or reclassified more than an insignificant amount of the held-to-maturity investments before maturity, the entire category of held-to-maturity investments would be tainted and would be classified as available-for sale.

Available-for-sale financial assets

Available-for-sale financial assets are non-derivative financial assets that are either designated as such or that are not classified in any of the other categories. They comprise investments in the equity of other entities where there is neither a fixed maturity nor fixed or determinable payments.

Available-for-sale financial assets are included in non-current assets, except those, which are expected to be disposed of within 12 months after the end of the reporting period, which will be classified as current assets.

Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities (excluding financial guarantees) are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

iv. Fair Value

Fair value is determined based on current bid prices for all quoted investments. Valuation techniques are applied to determine the fair value for all unlisted securities, including recent arm's length transactions, reference to similar instruments and option pricing models.

v. Impairment

At each reporting date, the association assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial instrument has been impaired. In the case of available-for-sale financial instruments, a prolonged decline in the value of the instrument is considered to determine whether an impairment has arisen. Impairment losses are recognised in the statement of comprehensive income.

j. Impairment of assets

At the end of each reporting period, the association reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the statement of comprehensive income.

k. Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

l. Adoption of New and Revised Accounting Standards

During the current year, the association has adopted all of the new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations applicable to its operations, which became mandatory.

The adoption of these Standards has impacted the recognition, measurement and disclosure of certain transactions. The following is an explanation of the impact the adoption of these Standards and Interpretations has had on the financial statements of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated:

AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements

In September 2007, the Australian Accounting Standards Board revised AASB 101, and as a result there have been changes to the presentation and disclosure of certain information within the financial statements. Below is an overview of the key changes and the impact on the association's financial statements.

Disclosure Impact

Terminology changes – The revised version of AASB 101 contains a number of terminology changes, including the amendment of the names of the primary financial statements.

Reporting changes in equity – The revised AASB 101 requires all changes in equity arising from transactions with owners in their capacity as owners to be presented separately from non-owner changes in equity. Owner changes in equity are to be presented in the statement of changes in equity, with non-owner changes in equity presented in the statement of comprehensive income. The previous version of AASB 101 required that owner changes in equity and other comprehensive income be presented in the statement of changes in equity.

Statement of comprehensive income – The revised AASB 101 requires all income and expenses to be presented in either one statement – the statement of comprehensive income, or two statements – a separate income statement and a statement of comprehensive income. The previous version of AASB 101 required only the presentation of a single income statement.

The association's financial statements now contain a statement of comprehensive income.

Other comprehensive income – The revised version of AASB 101 introduces the concept of 'other comprehensive income', which comprises of income and expense that are not recognised in profit or loss as required by other Australian Accounting Standards. Items of other comprehensive income are to be disclosed in the statement of comprehensive income. Entities are required to disclose the income tax relating to each component of other comprehensive income. The previous version of AASB 101 did not contain an equivalent concept.

19. Financial Risk Management

a. Financial Risk Management

The Club's financial instruments consist mainly of deposits with banks, short term investments, accounts receivable and payable.

The Club does not have any derivative instruments at 30 April 2010.

Risk management is carried out by the management committee. The main financial risks of the Club are exposures through its financial instruments in the form of liquidity risk, credit risk and interest rate risk.

Financial Risk Management Policies

The association's treasurer is responsible for, among other issues, monitoring and managing financial risk exposures of the association. The treasurer monitors the association's transactions and reviews the effectiveness of controls relating to credit risk, financial risk and interest rate risk. Discussions on monitoring and managing risk are held bi-monthly and minuted by the committee of management.

The treasurer's overall risk management strategy seeks to ensure that the association meets its financial targets, whilst minimising potential adverse effects of cash flow shortfalls.

Liquidity Risk

The Club manages liquidity risk by monitoring forecast cash flows and maintaining sufficient cash and marketable securities.

Credit Risk

The Club has no significant concentrations of credit risk. The maximum exposure to credit risk at balance date to recognised financial assets, is the carrying amount, net of any provisions for impairment of those assets, as disclosed in the Statement of Financial Position and Notes to the Financial Statements.

Price Risk

The club is not exposed to any material commodity price risk

b. Interest Rate Risk

The Club's exposure to interest rate risk, which is the risk that a financial instrument's fair value will fluctuate as a result of changes in market interest rates and the effective weighted average interest rates on those financial assets and financial liabilities, is as follows:
