IAN GOODE OAM - CRONULLA SLSC

A lifetime commitment to surf life saving as a competitor, coach and administrator has led to Cronulla's Ian Goode being honoured with the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM).

Ian's journey in Surf Life Saving began in 1962 and has spanned over 50 years. He has been heavily involved at a club, branch, state and national level and his record ranges from being an outstanding competitor achieving the highest of success at all levels, through administrator and official, to being a mentor to many emerging lifesavers.

Despite holding numerous and important management, referee and competition positions Ian regards some less noticeable work as amongst his most satisfying achievements.

Ian got great satisfaction helping Nippers moving into the senior ranks after numerous changes were made. He encouraged young people to get involved saying that it taught children life skills and how to work in a team. Ian was chairman of the Cronulla Crays for six years.

Helping with the development and promotion of women after they were admitted into the surf lifesaving and competition ranks was also high on his agenda. His wife Michelle was the first female to gain her bronze medallion with Cronulla SLSC in 1984. Ian is part of an extended family committed to surf life saving and he holds their achievements more dearly than he regards his own.

Ian Goode has received the OAM for service to life saving as a competitor, coach and administrator in the sport over the past 53 years.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It has been another long season for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club, one that particularly felt like it was dragged out towards the end due to the late date for the Australian Titles. It was, once again, a successful season. Allow me to briefly tell its story.

The first thing we should always report on is our lifesaving activities. This season our lifesaving was managed in a professional manner by Club Vice Captain, Darryl Easton and we ran very good patrols, kept our beach safe and we met both the standards and expectations of those who monitor us and those who rely on us. Well done Patrol Members and families.

We had a good season in lifesaving awards again, very good numbers in basic awards including the Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallion - meaning new and trained lifesavers on our beach. Our instruction was coordinated by Chief Instructor, Kerrie Hammell. Kerrie went on to be named the SLSS Trainer of the Year and has now been nominated for the SLSNSW Trainer of the Year. During the season she was ably assisted by Brian Dalgarno, Dave Brukmann, John Mamacan, Jenn MacLachlan, Kerry O'Neill and Tony Coffey - a very able team. Chris Barber, Craig Jordan and Daniel Wood ran the IRB squads assisted by new trainers, Rob Walker and Chris Hodge. Thank you to you all for a season of good squads and high award numbers.

Our lifesaving was driven, once again by a very proactive Lifesaving Committee. There is a new life in this committee comprised of very enthusiastic group of patrol leaders and elected Club Officers. They were provided with very good, up to date statistics on rescues performed, patrol member numbers and member qualifications on a monthly basis by Darryl. Each meeting saw vigorous discussion and analysis of our rescues, incidents on patrol, ways to manage patrols better and the exploring of new ideas. Our Club Captain and Vice Captain did trial a few new concepts in our lifesaving activities and on our patrols this year. Some worked well. Not all were as successful as would have been liked but once again we proved that Cronulla would always try to be innovative - and if something does not work then we will reassess and try something else.

A great achievement and recognition for a heroic lifesaving feat was made just after the end of last season. Richard Garnsey was lauded last season for a life saving rescue which he performed mid-season. In September, Richard was awarded a SLSA Meritorious Award for Bravery in Rescue. This is a major honour and just recognition of a great lifesaver.

This season saw a continued growth in Crays numbers meaning a full beach of activities each week. The sight of several hundred young Cronulla Members on the beach each Sunday is a joy to see - several hundred junior lifesavers in development. Particularly impressive was the number of Surf Ed awards gained by our nippers. Many of these young people will play key roles in our Club in the future. And those who do not stay that long - well, we can rest easy knowing that we have helped develop friendships and impart at least some skills to these young people that they will carry forward into their later life.

The Black Caps nipper group for young members with special needs continues to operate very successfully thanks to the good work of Cameron Pyett and Lauren Pyett, who attended with her own relatively new born baby on most Sundays. This year, Sherie and Emma Lisser stepped in to assist.

Another great new initiative this past season was the nipper Learn to Swim and Assessment Program. This program, put together and operated by Mike Vitnell, Michele Cole and

Mark Simpson saw hundreds of young nippers and their parents exposed to the basics of a learn to swim process. It resulted in many parents enrolling their children in formal swim school programs and virtually all nippers improving their water skills over the season. This makes it a success in anybody's books. The occurrence, late in the season, when a young nipper, a program member, saved his younger brother from drowning in the family pool emphasised the importance and success of the program.

The Coaching and Competition section continues the re-establishment and development process of the last couple of seasons. Strong team spirit, effective communication, good organisation and well run processes at carnivals led to another extremely well run Aussies campaign. The young athletes competed strongly and also committed completely to their teams and to the Club. The separation of beach and water events to different times of the day allowed cross discipline attendance. It was fantastic to see the beachies turn up to support the water competitors and the "whole club" presence at the finals of many beach events was absolutely awesome.

Our results at Aussies were an improvement on the previous year. We came away with seven gold medals from the three separate carnivals which combine to make Aussies. Gold medals and congratulations to Ngaire Hadfield in U17 Beach Sprint, Chloe Mannix-Power in U15 Beach Sprint and Isabellah Walker in the U14 Beach Sprint. The beachies continued their success in the U15 Female Beach Sprint Relay and the U17 Female Beach Sprint Relay. Carla Papac finished off the carnival with an amazingly dominating win in the U19 Ironwoman. In the middle of all of that Tim Tardent flew the flag for the Masters competitors with a win in the 40-44 year Beach Flags. Chloe, Ngaire and Carla went on to be awarded as the Branch Female Athlete of the Year in their respective age categories.

We have a high standard of expectations at Cronulla and this team is surely the indicator of even better things to come. Congratulations to the Section Heads and Coaches. The team management group committed heavily in time and effort to make sure everything worked well and the competitors were

well supported. Thank you to our excellent Team Manager, Paul Cavanagh and the others on the team management and coaching group including Georgia Carter, Sherie Lisser, Mike Vitnell, Don Robertson, Richard Ford, Ant Lyon, Mark Redrup, Sasa Vujanic, Daniel Neilson, Scott Rofe and the veterans, Kevin and Sandra Neilson.

A large number of Cronulla Members also serve as officials at carnivals from local events to the Aussies. Without these people our athletes could not compete. Thank you to all of you. Special mention must be made of our Club Captain, Wayne Druery who in a busy and difficult year was named the Sydney Branch Official of the Year and has now been nominated for the SLSNSW Official of the Year.

Sutherland Council has commenced a very significant amount of internal and external maintenance work on our premises. Some areas of our buildings were in a very poor state of repair and there was a risk of further deterioration and permanent damage or damage to internal fittings. It also presented the Club in a poor light to visitors and community groups who regularly make use of our premises. Council responded very positively and very promptly to our request for some attention to the issues. The roofs over the Purcell Room and the Monro Room ends of the building have been repaired and replaced. The doors and windows in the Purcell Room have been replaced and all of the timber windows in the older part of the building have been repaired. The leaks have all been fixed and now Council has embarked on a complete painting of the building, inside and out. Our clubhouse will soon be back in a state fitting such an iconic building in our area.

The building refurbishment and development process has been long and arduous at times. A lot of work has gone into this project over the past few years to ensure that we get it right, especially within the confines and constraints of staying within our existing Club footprint plus heritage and other conditions with which we must comply. Since the Special General Meeting in May 2015 detailed plans have

been compiled and consultants feedback and essential reports compiled so that the project is now ready for final Council approval. While this has been happening a funding plan is also under development. I am sure that all Members look forward to seeing, considering and endorsing the final recommendations and plans for the future of our Clubhouse, and indeed, the future of our Club. I refer Members to a report elsewhere in this annual report and to information on the Club website.

The beach remained in good condition during the season and this made it a very pleasant and safe place to be. This season we continued to enjoy the benefits of the rejuvenated Esplanade. This remains a wonderful gathering place in front of our Club with abundant space for Club activities and is a fantastic focus point for our community.

Cronulla Life Member, Vice-Patron and Past President, John Bentley chaired the District Council again this season. John continues to lead a good team of people from all four local clubs who look after joint local surf club interests.

Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch continued its harmonious relationship with the Clubs. The Branch is led by President George Shales from Maroubra. Cronulla's Wayne Druery has continued in the role of Director of Surf Sports where he continues to introduce new ideas and processes to improve surf sports and keep pace with the needs and expectations of the current generation.

Your Management Committee and the various sub-committees have continued as good forums where vigorous discussion is promoted to ensure good and measured decision making. The sub-committees have generally delivered on their responsibilities, though some could meet more often and/or provide more comprehensive and timely reports to the Management Committee.

The Club Executive, Brad, Paul, Daryn and Wayne have worked to manage the day to day affairs and some bigger issues of our Club. In particular, our administrative

We also launched a new IRB and proudly named it after Daniel Wood to highlight the many years of wonderful service Daniel has provided to our IRB Section.

CLUB VICE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Fellow Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club members,

My first season as Vice-Captain has proven to be both extremely rewarding and extremely challenging. I came into the role without previously sitting on management, or even having been a permanent member of the Life Saving Committee. I was voted into the role in August, and Patrols started only a month later. Needless to say I had a lot to learn in a short space of time. My sincere thanks go to last season's Vice Captain, Paul Cavanagh, for his patient handover, and ongoing assistance and advice.

Personally, I was willing to take on the role, as I am keenly interested in Life Saving, and in working on improvements to the Life Saving activities at our club. I believe that our club should have at its core, a mission to have Life Saving standards at least equal to or better, than our competition results.

Through the pre-season and into the full Patrolling Season, the Life Saving Committee, had two main aims; to drive the capacity and capability of our patrols to maintain public safety, and to reduce the burdens and obstacles to patrolling for our active members.

We initiated a few trials and made some changes to facilitate these aims. Some worked very well, others less so.

We created a Sunday only patrol, to enable members who would otherwise either not patrol, or be able to patrol only reduced hours, due to Saturday work commitments. The Sunday Patrol, Patrol 10, had the 3rd highest average member patrol hours for the season. Thank you to Jeremy Macpherson for managing the Sunday Patrol.

Patrol 3 trialed a Split Patrol for the season, where a larger patrol was split into two sub-patrols that combined to patrol the beach for the full day. The Patrol Captain was able to move members between the morning and afternoon to shift suit individual member's availability and the anticipated needs of the day. This managed flexibility allowed Patrol 3 to perform 8 additional patrols over the season, with a similar number of team members as other patrols. Thank you to Chris Barber for taking on the additional administration duties to enable the trial of the Split Patrol.

This season, we re-introduced the Outstanding Patrol Attendance Award. The Life Saving Committee recognize that often it is circumstance, not dedication, that prevents a member from achieving a 100% Attendance Award; the club's highest recognition of patrol service for regular members. We further wanted to encourage a culture of self-management by our members, through the use of substitutes when members can't attend a patrol. This enables better planning of resources, and gives Patrol Captain's confidence that they will have sufficient resources to maintain a high level of public safety. This year the club happily bestowed 30 members with the 100% Attendance Award, and an additional 15 members with the Outstanding

Patrol Attendance Award. Congratulations and thank you to our 100% Attendance Award recipients, and our Outstanding Patrol Attendance Award recipients.

This season saw a return of competition to the Patrol Competition, in the form of a Surf Sports competition day and, a First Aid and Resuscitation competition day. The Life Saving Committee felt that, over time, the patrol competition had become weighted towards lifesaving management, with a reduced focus on lifesaving interventions. The competition days were re-introduced to bring more of a balance to the patrol competition. Whilst there were some teething issues, both days were thoroughly enjoyed by those that attended, and achieved the aim of recognizing a more rounded contribution to life saving by our members. This year's Patrol Competition was won by Patrol 5, led by Kari Larssen, who performed well across all sections of the competition. Congratulations to Kari and Patrol 5.

Finally, to our Patrol Person of the year. A process of nominations from each Patrol Captain, the Club Captain, and myself as Vice Captain decided this award. A short list was discussed with members of the Executive before the winner was decided. This year's winner was one of our highest contributors of rostered and volunteer patrol hours. He took a keen interest in the administration of Life Saving at our club through regular attendance at the Life Saving Committee, despite not being a committee member. He also undertook additional training and contributed a great deal to water safety for our competition section. Congratulations to this year's Patrol Person of the Year, Rodney Dunn.

This patrol season was a typically busy one on our beach. We provided over 10,000 patrol hours to keep a recorded 59,000 people safe. We recorded 177 first aid instances, including 4 where the victim required ambulance transport. We helped 6 lost children. We rescued 71 people whose day at the beach could have ended tragically if not for our intervention. Most importantly, we recorded 489 instances where we intervened before someone got himself or herself into serious danger.

Thanks must also go to all of our Life Saving Committee, Patrol Captains, Vice captains and IRB crews, a special thanks to Chris Barber (IRB Captain), Wayne Druery (Club Captain) and Kerrie Hammell (Chief Training officer) and her team of trainers for all your support and hard work once again this last season.

Finally to our Patrolling Members. Thank you all for your service over the season, and willingness to trial the changes that the Life Saving Committee introduced for the season. Without your contributions, our club would not be able to meet our obligations to our stakeholders, and most importantly, keep the public safe from harm. I hope that you will return next season to continue our life saving service and maintain our club's high standards of Life Saving.

WATER SAFETY REPORT

This season we have had fairly good support for water safety on Sundays at our beach from bronze qualified nipper parents and also others from within the club, in particular the Patrol Captains have worked well with us helping out when requested whilst they manage the beach for the general public

We saw some challenging conditions at the Elouera Ohana carnival where our water safety guys and girls had to look after many 100s of kids in the water in fairly large conditions. Each Bate Bay club was given an entire water area to manage and our members represented us well including an IRB from our club, as well as setting up cans supplied by us for our area. Cronulla always helps out.

We sent an IRB around to Deer Park for the U11's and U13's Development Camps. Sydney Branch organisers of the Development Camp were very appreciative

There were two bronze medallion courses run this season, as a result we now have more bronze qualified nipper parents available to help us. It appears that we still need a few more parents of competitive nippers to do the bronze medallion as there were times when we struggled with

water safety numbers at carnivals. At each carnival I compared the nipper entries to the list of bronze qualified nipper parents and there were surprisingly few nipper competitor parents holding the bronze medallion. Then we had parents of non-competitive nippers whose kids were not attending carnivals going above and beyond and doing water safety at carnivals when their kids weren't even there. This was a common theme at most carnivals.

There were about 30 people who helped out with water safety on a regular basis and on average we had about 15 there on Sundays, which covered the requirements. 30 water safety regulars equates to about 5% of parents, hopefully a few more parents will want to get involved with water safety next season. Being out there on a board or with a tube really is the best place to be on Sunday morning, there is no closer place to the action. There is always plenty of time for a coffee once the water events are done.

I thank everyone who helped out with water safety this season and the Patrol Captains for working with us. I look forward to the coming season and doing it all over again.

CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

Cronulla SLC has a history of plenty of lifesaving equipment in good condition always available for patrols and water safety. This past season Cronulla's equipment was prepared, repaired, renewed and submitted for the inspection held on Sunday 30th August 2015. The IRB display and equipment laid out in the IRB Shed, Ballroom, Training Room, Radio Room and Monro Room is always quite impressive. This year was no exception and all equipment passed successfully, ensuring we were ready for the season.

The gear submitted included:

- 20 rescue boards
- 2 Stretchers
- 36 rescue tubes
- Patrol area and tent
- 10 radios
- Patrol uniforms
- 4 oxy-viva kits
- Board and tube stands
- 2 patrol first aid kits
- Signal flags and evacuation (shark) flags
- 1 club first aid kit
- 18 resuscitation mannequins
- 12 spinal collars
- 3 trainer defibrillators
- 3 spinal boards and straps
- 5 IRB
- 2 defibrillators
- 5 outboard motors
- 4 Suction equipment sets
- 7 trailers

A single inspection team of dedicated officials visits all clubs in the Branch over one weekend. After completion of the Cronulla inspection we supplied refreshments to the inspection team before they set off for the long trek into the National Park beaches. The following members helped prepare the club gear and premises for the start of the season -, Rob Short Jr., Ken English, Brian Dalgarno, Carlo Villanti, John Tangohau, Daniel Wood, Chris Barber, Mitchell Barber and Craig Jordan. Mark Simpson organised the repair of all rescue boards.

Purchases of replacement equipment this season were again high, but lifesaving is our core business and the equipment is well worth the expense. We were required, by SLSNSW rules, to expand our stock of spinal management and resuscitation equipment. Cronulla's patrols are always well equipped with necessary tools so we purchased a range of new items at some expense. Excluding IRB items, the expenditure this season was a little over \$11,200. This included purchase of a rescue board (\$1300), board repairs (\$1000), radio servicing (\$385), oxy-viva and resuscitation manikin servicing (\$697), resuscitation, spinal management and defibrillator items (\$1847), first-aid supplies (\$619) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$392). We also purchased some uniforms, rash shirts, caps, log books and other patrol items from the SLSA shop(\$3300)

plus patrol caps (\$1700). This latter sounds like a lot but we present a uniform to all new awardees - Bronze Medallion and Surf rescue Certificate. Having more than ninety newly qualified lifesavers is an expense the Club welcomes.

The Australian Government, for the second season, funded every Club in the country with a \$5000 grant towards the cost of lifesaving. Surf Life Saving Australia provided \$1499 from the DHL subsidy to purchase most of our patrol uniforms. Surf Life Saving New South Wales distributed approximately \$6,500 from the SLSA fundraising activities to each Sydney Club. The remainder of the lifesaving expenditure was supported by Club funds.

Once again, this season, new Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLSA patrol jacket and peaked cap and all IRB drivers and crewpersons were provided a SLSA rash shirt and peaked cap to wear while on duty. The Club continued to subsidise the purchase of PFDs by members if they wanted to purchase their own

As in the past season, I believe that we have been able to provide Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club with the best possible equipment for patrol, training, competition and community purposes.

See you on the beach at Cronulla – where else would you rather be?

CRONULLA SLSC BUILDING PROJECT COMMITTEE REPORT

The Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Building Project has progressed to a significant stage during the past season.

A Special General Meeting of Cronulla SLSC Members was held on Sunday 17th May 2015. At that meeting the previously developed concept design was endorsed and approval was given for the Club Building Committee to proceed with all arrangements required to take the project to DA and to continue to seek the necessary funding.

Subsequent to this, Redshift AA was confirmed as the project architect and they immediately began preparation of detailed plans and engaged appropriate consultants to support the process. These included surveyor, town Planner, BCA & DDA consultant, Section J (energy efficiency) consultant, building engineer, a heritage consultant, kitchen consultant, hydraulic (water, sewer, stormwater) & fire engineer, mechanical (ventilation) consultant and an acoustic consultant. Landscape and external civil works discussions have been held with Sutherland Council.

Draft plans were prepared and subsequently reviewed by the Club Building Committee through several stages of development and refinement. The refinements included mainly internal features. Some extended discussion was held related to:

- Placement and configuration of a gym and the change rooms in the available space on the ground floor.
- Shape and structure of the southern (retained Monro) balcony
- Shape and structure of the roof

In November 2015 the draft plans were at an appropriate state of readiness and a request for a pre-DA (PAD) was submitted to Sutherland Council. Delays resulted in a meeting being deferred until 13th January 2016. At the PAD meeting the SSC Architect advised that a consultation process through the SSC independent Architectural Review Advisory Panel (ARAP) would be part of the PAD. This consultative meeting was ultimately held on 25th February 2016.

The reports from the PAD and ARAP were received close to the close of business on 15th March 2016. They did not contain any major issues. The reports were reviewed and responses considered by a group including the project architect, the consultant planner, the consultant heritage architect and Club representatives. There were some recommendations related to the size and shape of the roof lines on both the existing southern and northern balconies. Our response included changes to the plan based on some comments and retention of some features which were believed necessary with explanation for their retention. A report was prepared to submit with the DA.

All plans, consultants reports and PAD responses were at a DA ready stage at the end of April.

An early submission of a DA was deemed necessary and beneficial to the project. SSC officers, councillors, local members of parliament and other advisors strongly recommended DA submission at the earliest possible opportunity. The submission of the plans for DA allows any issues, with primarily the external features, to be identified and considered for final modification. It also allows us to obtain an accurate and confirmed costing for the building work.

Funding for the DA process was allocated from a \$100,000 Federal Government grant plus \$40,000 committed by Sutherland Council for the DA process. Total financial

commitments for the DA preparation and costing process totalled ~\$138,000.

A full QS costing is currently underway. However, elemental costing by the Club's honorary Building Advisor places the cost at approximately \$6,000,000 with some determination to be made on possible additional costs to do with primary services of water and power.

Current funding available includes Club capacity of:

Cash funds	\$0.5m
Borrowing	\$1.5m
SSC	\$1.0m commitment

Cronulla SLSC is now seeking external support to raise the second half of the funding required to complete this project and provide a surf life saving club for our community. DA approval allows us to seek the required additional funds from public money and grants - almost all of which is only able to be applied for regarding DA ready projects. Potential source of other funds include Sutherland Shire Council, State Government grants, Federal Government grants, Surf Life Saving parent body assistance, sports facility grants from various sources and a Member, sponsor & public appeal. Our recent approaches have been to Sutherland Shire Council, our local Members of both State and Federal Parliament plus discussions with Surf Life Saving Australia and Surf Life Saving New South Wales.

Sutherland Shire Council has established a Surf Club Building Working Party to assist with development of a co-ordinated, comprehensive and viable funding model to support the Club refurbishment. Club Members are liaising regularly with Council on this project.

The above summarises the project activity and status to end of season.

Immediately post season, due to the need for a DA to finalise certainty of the plans, confirm costing and to assist with the quest for public funds, a DA was lodged with Sutherland Shire Council. It is not anticipated that major changes will be required to the external structure or features of the building. However, if required, they can be made post DA and a variation requested. Any required subsequent tuning of internal features and layout can be done with little or no impact on the DA.

At the time of publication, the Club awaits the outcome of the DA submission and continues to develop the necessary funding. In the interim, the plans and drawings have been displayed for Members to view.

No final decisions regarding commitment to major building work or the borrowing of money can be made without a vote of Club Members at a General Meeting. Once the DA is approved and any changes required are identified and made, final plans and costing can be confirmed. While this is occurring we will continue to develop the funding model and apply for and confirm fund sources. Once this is done the Club can call a General Meeting for Members where a complete package of information can be presented in order to make the final decision and start building.

My thanks go to the Members of the Building Committee for their ongoing work and diligence in this area. The Club is also grateful to the Mayor and Councillors, General Manager and officers of Sutherland Shire Council plus our Federal and State Members of Parliament for their ongoing support and assistance.

After sorting the wanted from the unusable, two loads of old equipment and furniture were removed to the rubbish tip. Thank you to all but especially Paul and Jack for their efforts on the day.

Early in the season James Young initiated some repair and remediation projects at the Bay Shed. These involved repair and replacement of the main stairs and decking structure and as these were unsafe. Commercial quotes were obtained but in the end Club Member, Gary Allman completed repairs to the stairs and he and the Boat Section replaced the ageing and broken boat ramp - all done at cost of materials. The bay environment is not friendly to immersed timber and plans are underway for a new, long lasting ramp. Thank you to Gary and all of the people involved in this ongoing project.

Daryl Ward has looked after all repairs and maintenance to the Sports Complex and has been very successful at having all issues there resolved quickly and efficiently.

Post season we had some small damage due to the storm seas. Thank you to all of the volunteers that assisted with the clean up of the sheds, foyer and Ballroom. In particular, thanks to Billy Lloyd who was on the scene first thing the morning after and cleaned all of the high traffic areas and also attended to some electrical issues.

We ask all Members to continue to care for the Clubhouse - just like a second home.

VALE - PAUL STERLING SINCLAIR

A profound deep heartfelt sympathy was felt by many members of Cronulla Surf Club with the passing of Paul Sterling Sinclair, on Sunday 20th March 2016 at the Holy Spirit Aged Care Centre Dubbo. Paul was aged 76 and was admitted to the centre in November 2014 following his personal struggle with dementia that had progressively got worse. Many fond memories were rekindled of Paul, who was a giant of a man to his peers, not just in physique but also with his genteel personality who always saw the best in people. Paul joined Cronulla Surf Club as a junior member in October 1955 and gained his bronze medallion that year. He was quick to gain recognition for his swimming ability in his first season finishing 2nd in the Club Junior Belt Championship along with many monthly point score placings. Paul loved to swim and was a natural. His self-trained personal buoyancy stroke style along with his team spirit made him uniquely adaptable to surf belt racing, water polo and R&R competition. He was a member of the Club's Australian SLSC Championship Touring Team held at Torquay in conjunction with the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games. Following his progression to senior competition from 1958/59 season till his departure to country membership in early 1960, Paul made his presence felt at surf carnivals in both surf and belt races, culminating in winning the Club Senior Belt Championship in 1958/59. Additionally that season he was rewarded with a bronze medal in the Metropolitan Senior R&R Championships along with gaining the Club's Most Improved Membership award. He was the prominent centre forward go to man as a member of the inaugural successful Cronulla Water Polo Team, and later Captained the Dubbo team at State Country Championships. Following his long involvement with the Dubbo Swimming Club as Captain and Secretary, he was elevated to Life Membership. If you went body surfing with Paul you needed 2 hours to spare as he never came in, always waiting for the perfect wave. Paul was one of the few big seas body surfers credited with body surfing

a wave well off Cronulla Point in a huge sea all the way to the beach.

As a member of his Sutherland High School Army Cadets he accepted his National Service call up along with several Cronulla Club mates. On returning from his National Service duties his beach attire was noticeably his daggy khaki army shorts, which resulted in his nickname of 'Sindag'. His mode of transport to surf carnivals was his 1927 Morris Bullnose Cowley car, whose last trip resulted in being towed back from Wollongong Carnival to Cronulla, mechanically beyond repair. Paul's family heritage was involvement with the Royal Agricultural Society of Queensland. Visits to his Uncle's 80,000 acre managed property at Charleville, created his love for the bush and agriculture and his career as a Livestock Auctioneer. Paul and his wife Annette, along with their two children, Lisa and Scott built a home, a very successful livestock business and were all involved with their local community. Annette passed away 2005 and Paul married his second wife, Maree in 2007. Maree's two children, Philip and Simone, joined the extended family. On his retirement Paul and Maree travelled extensively overseas and around Australia. As Paul's health deteriorated, Maree's comfort and devotion showed how deeply dedicated she was to his wellbeing. Swimming trips to the local Dubbo Pool culminating with a weekend trip to his beloved Cronulla Beach and catching up with old club friends occurred regularly. All those who knew Paul "Sindag" Sinclair his friends and especially his family will always share fond memories of his wonderful achievements in his life, sport, local community, business and as a devoted family man. CRONULLA SHORT COURSE SURF CARNIVAL

OVERVIEW:

Cronulla SLSC's 5th Annual Short Course Carnival was conducted on Saturday, 21 November 2015.

There were 18 surf life saving clubs in attendance from as far afield as Port Macquarie to the north and Warilla Barrack Point to the south with over 1000 surf club members from Under 8 to Over 40 Years of age.

The weather and surf conditions were kind with a festival atmosphere on the beach and in the park including club BBQ and Snow Cone stalls complemented by a number of supporter stalls.

The major club sponsors were Doran Financial Services, Caltex, and 7 News. In addition, support was received from Vici, Engine, Catfish, Affiniti Living, Ohana, Get Hooded, Finepoint Carpentry and Grants Engraving. Thank you to these valuable and sponsors and supporters.

The U8 to U13 age competitors competed over a maximum of four hours in the morning with the U14 to Masters age competitors participating over three hours in the afternoon. The two sessions were separated by the Vici Shark Island Ski Challenge and the All age Beach Relay.

This type of format is proving popular as competitors and their families have the opportunity to participate in a number of races and they do not need to spend the whole day at the beach.

HIGHLIGHTS:

The Crays and the Senior Club working seamlessly together as one Club to deliver a magnificent event;

Prizes, medals, trophies and random draw give-aways totalling significantly more than \$5,000 advertised, were distributed to around 40% of the event winners and participants attending on the day.

Cronulla SLSC retaining the Frank Doran Trophy for the Overall pointscore for the 172 events with 720 points ahead of Wanda SLSC on 586 points. North Cronulla finished third on 519 points and Elouera was fourth on 456 points;

Cronulla Crays finishing a strong second to Elouera for the morning events demonstrating significant skill development in the younger age categories.

Cronulla again showing its beach strength in winning the Male and Female All Age Beach Relays. These races involved 10 competitors from each club in each race ranging from U9 to Open age;

Master Competitor and North Bondi Olympian Jimmy Walker winning the Men's Vici 2km Shark Island Ski Race

Cronulla Star Carla Papac winning the Women's Vici 2km Shark Island Ski Race and Open Ironwoman double.

More than 220 U8 competitors entered for their first day of inter-club conditions. They were well managed in their own group and they raced in individual beach sprint, flags, wading race and relays;

The whole of the Club fully committed to the success of the Carnival. Particular acknowledgement is made of the work of the Auxiliary, Office, Executive, Crays, officials, water safety, patrol, first aid, IRB, and workforce;

Great support and cooperation from the Sutherland Shire Council led by Brad Whittaker and his Lifeguard Service.

Excellent publicity for the Club through Paul Haigh at the "St George and Sutherland Shire Leader"

Significant and on going support and promotion by Brad Forrest from "Cronulla News"

An expected strong financial return to the club (see below for details).

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS:

The Carnival Sub Committee further reviewed its financial arrangements and agreed unanimously that the event should be a "one club effort". To this end the income and expenditure (with the exception of the BBQ and the Snow Cone net income) was to be split evenly between the "Senior" club and the "Crays".

Note: The BBQ profit is being distributed equally between the World Team and the Crays and the Snow Cone profit is to be directed to the U14 Touring Team.

Whilst exact the financial position is still being determined the net profit from the carnival is expected to be in the vicinity of \$6391.85 plus retention of approximately 250 towels for use either by the Club as prizes or uniform this year and/or prizes for the 2016 Carnival.

CONCLUSION:

The Carnival Sub Committee was delighted with the outcome of the day and looks forward to an even better result in 2016.

The net profit of around \$4,110.15 is to be split 50/50 between the Seniors and the Crays plus BBQ and Snow Cones profits was an excellent result and reflected the efforts of the whole Club.

The Carnival Sub Committee thanks all those involved to make the event as successful as it was and looks forward to an even better event in 2016.

Also, of course it gives us an opportunity to recognise the donation of such a valuable and expensive asset for our Club and at the same time to honour a good Club Member.

In recognising the donor of this craft, the Holt Group and indeed the Holt family, we welcomed Phillip Holt to our

beach and into our Club. The Holt Group donate a fully kitted IRB every year on a rotating basis to one of the surf clubs along our beaches - so every four years we receive a brand new boat and motor. This process has continued for twelve years, Cronulla receiving its third IRB and motor this season. In a brief response, Phillip stated how committed his family was to supporting our local community and how highly and important he held our surf clubs.

In the naming of this IRB we also recognise a great Club Member, our immediate past IRB Captain, Dan Woods. Amongst other achievements Daniel has spent twelve years as IRB Captain and two as IRB vice-captain. This is a service unparalleled in this Club. However, it is more than that - Daniel’s contribution has gone beyond running a section. He has driven at carnivals and fund raising days. BOARD CAPTAIN'S REPORT

My first year as Board Captain required inspection location and assessment of all club boards. Bluey's training sessions were twice weekly to December and from January onwards three times a week with an average of twenty to thirty paddlers per week. 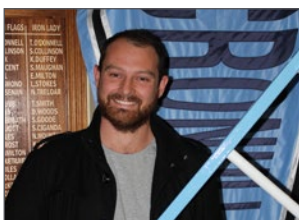
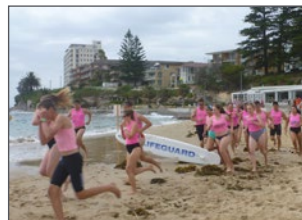
