Dick joined Cronulla SLSC in 1958 and held the positions of Club Captain for four years, Committee person for two years and membership of the Executive Committee for 10 years. He was also a foundation member of the Cronulla Jet Rescue Boat Service.

Dick has made a significant contribution to all levels of Surf Life Saving, where he has dedicated over 50 years of service and held numerous positions. Dick is a highly respected Surf Sports Official and is still active. He was a member of the National High Performance Squad (Official) and has been appointed to numerous senior positions covering multiple sporting disciplines at all levels of the Association within Australia and Internationally.

Dick is a Life Member of Cronulla SLSC, SLS Sydney, SLSNSW and SLSA and was awarded the Australian Sports Medal in 2000.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

What a year this has been. At last year's AGM there was a genuine belief that we would be occupying our Clubhouse within a few months, yet as it has passed that belief could not have been further from reality as the impact of last minute building delays, delays in our certification process and the effects of COVID-19 hit home hard. As I write this our delay in gaining our occupancy certificate still relates to the new fire hydrants' certification, and to give you some insight into the frustration of this process every time we are requested to provide information regarding this it takes four to six weeks to get a response and then further information is requested. This has happened numerous times and has been the cause of the delays. But putting aside these last minute frustrations which will be quickly forgotten once we attain occupancy, everyone should be proud of the project and the building that has been delivered, it is a credit to the patience of all members and I say thank you to everyone for your faith in the Committee to deliver this outcome. To give some perspective to the enormity of delivering this project, it commenced approximately ten years ago with the original building committee meeting that lead to a concept design being developed in July 2011. Since then the Club has had three Presidents, three Deputy Presidents, three Patrons, three Captains, three Treasurers, two Secretaries and at the Sutherland Shire Council there have been three Mayors and three General Managers. All the people that have held these important positions have worked together to deliver this project and I thank each of them for their contribution.

Recognition must also be given to the members who have served on our Management Committee over this period, some of whom have been there for the entire period of the project. The ultimate decisions of our Club are made by this Committee and I believe that this committee has reviewed all matters pertaining to this project in a diligent manner and gave due deliberation to the sometimes "hard" decisions that had to be made along the way. But without doubt members should all be proud and recognise the job that has been done by the building committee. There have been different members of this committee since inception but during the most critical phase of this project, being from the preparation of tender documents to completion, the Club has been fortunate to have the same group of members serve from start to finish. These people were largely unseen in doing this work for the Club, but their contribution needs to be recognised and the Club owes them a debt of gratitude.

There have been other significant achievements during the year and in particular the relationship between the Cray's Committee and our Management Committee has been strengthened with both Executive Committees working closely to improve the outcomes. Their Sunday program has seen changes to include an introduction to more lifesaving activities, recognising that there is more that can be taught to the nippers on Sunday mornings. On the sports side we have just developed and approved a sports plan that encompasses from U6 all the way to open competition which is a significant step forward for the Club. This is the first time in the Club's history that such a plan has been developed

and it comes from a recognition that nipper's membership of the Club does not cease when they become fourteen years of age, all that happens is they become fifteen. Through the development of this plan and the introduction of more lifesaving activities into the nipper program the goal is see higher retention rates across both lifesaving and surf sports when our young members complete the nipper program.

Our Club is one of the oldest in history and it now has a new modern building providing first class facilities for the generations ahead and hand in hand with that the Club needs to have modern standards of governance to ensure our relevance going forward. We have accepted \$4.5M in public funding to bring our building project to fruition and we need to repay that to the community in more ways than just our patrolling activities, we should be looking at our relevance in the community and how we can involve our Club in providing service to the community through other means. To do this and also to fund our own activities in whatever direction future Club Management Committees deem appropriate, the Club needs to be financially independent, master of its own destiny and the day of relying on handouts is in the past. You only need to look at the history of organisations that fail to recognise changes in society and economies and they eventually become irrelevant and disappear. We need to maximise the potential of our new building going forward and for this reason we have partnered with Cronulla RSL to provide corporate and private functions at times when we are not using the premises for our own purposes. Our arrangement is different than what is typically seen, we have not leased our premises to a third party, it is a joint venture with a 50:50 share of profits. It is an exciting development and judging on the number of enquires that have been received pending our occupation this will be a successful partnership. The attraction of this partnership is that we are able to retain use of the building when we require it and our partner, like us, is a not for profit entity that provides service to the community and neither party is a business seeking to maximise their personal profit potential. It is only the width of a driveway that separates the two Clubs and is a step forward for both to be working together.

And then there was COVID-19, no one was prepared for this. The effect that the pandemic has had on the Club extends far beyond the limitations on gatherings and sanitisation requirements that now must be met, there has been a significant financial impact on the Club at a time when we were completing the building project and finalising drawing down on a \$1.5M finance facility. Three of our four tenants, Elite, Cronulla Swim School and Zimzala were shut down with less than twenty four hours' notice and in line with Government requirements we were required to waive a significant portion of their rental payments and provide a deferral of payment for the balance. Three years ago when I was elected President of our Club I stated that during the period of the building project that unless expenditure was absolutely necessary then we would not be spending the money, the belt was to be tightened and I made no apology for warning that there may be some unpopular decisions ahead. Management supported this approach and it is due to this diligence in managing our budgets that we have and will survive the impact of COVID-19. The reserves that we had saved is what has got us through the near complete loss of income that occurred. There were some members who at the time were displeased with this approach but hopefully now, with the benefit of hindsight, they can appreciate the importance of making these decisions when commencing a major capital project with a high potential for variations. It also serves a lesson for the future, that the Club must have reserves for unforeseen circumstances and capital improvements that will be required in years to come.

I am not seeking re-election and will be standing down as President of the Club this year, having now served a total of thirteen years on the Club Executive. I am proud of what I have achieved during my period of service, there are still some matters requiring finalisation such as bringing our constitution in line with modern legislation but that is underway. Three years ago, when elected as President, I knew there would be difficulties ahead but the obstacles that eventuated were certainly not predictable and then there was the period of my illness which definitely wasn't in the plans.

To all members I say thank you for your understanding, dedication, consideration, and patience throughout what has been an unbelievably difficult period. To the Cray's committee, all the sub-committees, everyone who pitched in to make Sundays, patrols, and competition as normal as possible, thank you. To the members of our Management Committee, thank you for the manner in which you handled the matters that arose and in particular the acceptance of proposals such as our new sports plan and partnership with Cronulla RSL. These decisions show that as a committee your eyes have focussed forwards, not backwards towards the past, and this is what is required for future success. If we just kept doing the same things that previously were done then there will never be progression, only regression. To my fellow Executive members thank you for your support and for stepping in at times when I was unavailable, it certainly makes matters easier when you have a solid team backing you up. Emma Larssen, Chris Barber, Daniel Wood and Chris Giles collectively take a bow you have been an exceptional team and I was fortunate to have you during my presidency. Although I normally do not single out individuals, I must make a special mention of Daniel Wood and Chris Giles, both of whom were on the building committee with me. Daniel is the quiet one whose attention to detail is superb, he stepped in when I was ill and everything that I have asked Daniel to attend to, he has completed in a professional manner. Chris has been solid as a rock. There has hardly been a day when I have not had multiple calls, emails, messages or meetings with Chris, the amount of work he has undertaken in managing our finances is phenomenal. The work that is required to manage the financial affairs through a project such as ours is challenging and there is no margin for error. And finally, I must thank my wife Jenny and daughters Jessica and Rachel for allowing me the time to commit to this role and their patience and support when my health made matters difficult. Without their understanding it would not have been possible.

I'll see you on the beach (or in our new clubhouse).

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Once again here we are, the end of another surf club season and time for the compilation and presentation of the 113th Annual Report of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club. It is my intention that it will contain a comprehensive record of events of the past season and from what I have read and present to you, I trust that the information and reports received are satisfactory.

This past season has definitely been one like no other. We saw the cancellation of several competition events including Branch, Club Championships, Interclub and the Aussies; we unfortunately did not see the opening of our new clubhouse; we signed off our patrol season early due to a pandemic; we cancelled our Golf Day; we postponed our Presentation Night; and we had several Sunday Nipper sessions cancelled due to not only large seas and storms but blistering hot sand along with smoke from severe bush fires. Who would have thought?

However, rather than dwell on what did not take place, there was still so much that did happen and I would like to focus on these positives.

At last years 112th AGM we saw the elevation to Life Membership of two outstanding club members – Kieran Day and Graham Bruce. Kieran joined Cronulla SLSC in October 1994 having spent many years on the beach with his father, Paul. He has held several positions in the Club, most notably seven years as Club Captain. Kieran continues to hold position on Management Committee as a Senior Vice President. Congratulations are extended to Richard (Dick) Bignold OAM, John Holt OAM and Greg Allum AM. Dick was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) on 26 January 2020 for his service to Surf Life Saving. Dick has made a significant contribution to all levels of the association, where he has dedicated over fifty years of service and held numerous positions. On 18 November 2019, Life Member John Holt OAM was inducted into the NSW Hall of Champions at the NSW Champions of Sport Ceremony. John's contribution over the past fifty years to the Surf Life Saving movement has been tremendous and still continues today with his active involvement as our U7 Boys Assistant Age Manager. At the Queen's Birthday Honours in June 2020, Greg Allum was elevated from OAM to AM for his continued and significant service to surf lifesaving, to international federations, and to the community. After coming out of a 5-week induced coma, Gabby vowed she would one day ride to the top of Luz Ardiden that sits at 1715m in the Pyrenees. In July 2019, Gabby and her trusty Rosie did just that! The courage and determination this incredible woman has shown over the years is nothing short of inspiring. Just extraordinary, Gabby!

There have been many members give of their time over the years who are now stepping down from their positions, in whatever capacity that may be, and I wish to thank you for your time and commitment. In particular I would like to acknowledge the President Richard Pinker for his unwavering dedication and leadership, even in times of poor health. He has provided the Club great direction over the past three seasons not only through the building redevelopment but also through these very strange times experienced over the past few months. Thank you for your continued support to the Club, its members and myself. I am sure you will not be too far from the new clubhouse and its activities.

I also want to thank Marcus Kennedy for his years of commitment as Patrol Captain. The club, everyone will agree, looks absolutely amazing but we just couldn't formally occupy it but, onwards and upwards. By next season we promise you will say the wait was worth it.

Special thanks to the Life Saving Committee members. These include all our Patrol Captains, IRB Captain Max Walker, IRB Vice Captain Graham Burt, Gear Steward Rob Short, Radio Officer Rodney Dunn, First Aid Coordinator David Dalla-Camina, Cadet Captain Guy Telfer and our Chief Instructor Daryn Metti with the support of his trainers for their commitment, diligence and expertise. Congratulations to our 41 patrol members who gained 100% attendance including 7 outstanding attendance patrolling members. Winning Patrol was No.12 led by the highly experienced Scott Jackson as the Patrol Captain. Patrol 12 has some of the most experienced patrol members and this patrol won through sheer determination, great leadership, mentoring younger SRC members and by winning virtually every measurable aspect of the competition (100%, awards, attendance, surf sports). This year's patrol surf sports competition was one of the best I've ever witnessed with fierce competitiveness and turnout of nearly 100 patrolling members. So many competitive Lifesavers trying to win the patrol competition for their patrol. This is a unique competition and shows just how united and keen our club members are, with plenty of smiling faces demonstrating our club spirit. Special thanks to our organisers and judges.

This season our lifesaving was again very successful thanks to every patrolling member and especially my Vice Captain, Darryl Easton for his invaluable support. Cronulla patrols additionally voluntarily undertook 3 full patrols at Garie too. This put a strain on our patrol resourcing but we did it. Thanks to patrol members again putting in above and beyond patrol hours. This commitment attests to why Surf Life Saving Australia is the largest volunteer organisation in Australia.

Cronulla patrols did respond to several major rescues with one rescue winning the rescue of the month. Marcus Kennedy's Patrol No.5 identified an unmanned kite surfer's board off Cronulla Point on Boxing Day. The RWC responded and the Cronulla IRB picked up the kite board rider who was located well out in the middle of Bate Bay. If the kite board hadn't been identified, most likely the rider would have been swept out to sea and perished.

Thank you for the effort by Gear Steward Rob Short (who has amazingly undertaken this role for 21 years) and his valuable assistants (Rodney Dunn, David Dalla-Camina) and others including Max Walker, Graham Burt not to mention gear inspection that was held at Hungry Point again. Next year will be even more challenging given our gear has been exposed to the outdoor weather.

This year we submitted 4 nominations in the SLS Sydney Awards of Excellence in key areas. One of our highly regarded Patrol Captain's - Marcus Kennedy took out that award. Congratulations on this prestigious award. Unfortunately we narrowly and disappointingly missed out on the club of the year award.

Unfortunately, not everyone can be a winner, however we recognise every major prize winner nominee just to demonstrate how hotly contested every award was. It involved interviewing 9 high caliber candidates that were nominated by their patrol captains. The award was won by a young passionate female lifesaver, esteemed competitor and future leader of our club - Isabella Turner. Congratulations Isabella. I'd also like to recognise the other nominee's being Kayde Bruce, Nathan Schutt, Helen Grinter, Adam Watson, Ilana Crowe, Kelly Mountier, Anthony George and Graham Burt. Congratulations to you all for being nominated.

Most improved winner was Zoe Duchet-Catherine for her major improvement in the water, determined attitude, never missing a training session. Zoe started paddling ski's last season and it's one of her best areas and her confidence has boosted hugely. Most Inspirational Member was Darryl Ward for all his extraordinary duties in running the clubs Sunday Surf Races, Efforts in Enhancing the Reputation and Standing of the club was awarded to the Blue Fin Leaders -Yvette Larkin, Georgia Carter, Nicole Power and Lisa Dietrich. Efforts in Fundraising went to Michael Banister and efforts in training and instruction Rodd Sanchez. Congratulations to all these well-deserved awardees.

CLUB VICE CAPTAINS REPORT

Fellow Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club members,

My fifth season as Vice-Captain, and I almost feel like I know what I am doing, even if local and world events did everything they could to upset the apple cart.

Due to extensive delays in the construction of the new Club House, we disappointingly started a second season without club house facilities. The conditions were then made worse when pressure from a small group in the community lead the Council to convert the small area the lifeguards had made available to us the previous season into a temporary change room. Whilst obviously disappointed in this eventuality, our lifesaving group took things in our stride and made the most of what limited space was left to us.

Rob Short negotiated with the builders to create a small open air compound where we could secure the IRBs (which consequently deteriorated significantly over the season), gear was moved up and down from the shipping container in the park each day, and storing additional gear in the small locker under the stairs was a packing challenge fit for TV.

The Council Lifeguards continued to provide good support and be as accommodating as possible, despite themselves facing additional challenges due to the loss of these facilities.

In January, New South Wales saw some of the worst bushfires on record, with some members isolated up and down the coast unable to return for patrols. On the beach, poor air quality brought new challenges for the public and our patrol members due to airway irritation, and water quality was reduced due to ash and soot in the water. A group of 4 members answered the call and towed a couple of IRBs to Lake Conjola to assist with on-water evacuation of coastal towns if required.



Then in February, the global Covid-19 pandemic started to make itself felt in Australia. Despite social distancing measures for the public being mandated, large crowds flocked to beaches presenting additional challenges for our lifesavers. Eventually it was decided to stop all lifesaving and training activities altogether.

A number of factors contributed to this decision. There was a belief that the presence of lifesavers on the beach sent a message to the public that it was acceptable for them to also come to the beach. Importantly for our members, performing their role as a lifesaver and maintaining social distancing and infection control practices was almost impossible, and our members would be at risk. Patrolling ceased after 22nd of March, and would not return for the season, more than a month earlier than planned.

As a lifesaving group we worked together to overcome the challenges that presented themselves and continued to deliver our lifesaving capabilities for the community and most importantly, no lives lost.

The monthly Life Saving Committee meetings have been extremely positive with a lot of great information shared between captains and committee members. The meetings ended with a quick quiz created by one of the Patrol Captains, and some PCs chose to use the same quiz with their patrols. I encourage all Patrolling Members to ask their Patrol Captains what was discussed and the outcomes from the Lifesaving Committee.

Total patrol members change throughout the year as new members join, and non-attending members are removed or archived, but at the end of the season the patrol roster had 304 members.

Rostered attendance continues to be a challenge that is a focus area for the lifesaving committee with attendance just under 60%, and a disappointing 20% not advising their patrol captain that they wouldn't be at patrol. Obviously this makes balancing the roster a difficult task and we will again enlist the support of the Management Committee to assist in improving our performance in this area.

Cronulla SLSC was called upon and twice provided patrols to support Garie SLSC as they continue to struggle to attract sufficient members to fill a full roster. A big thank you to the members who volunteered to do extra patrols. Disappointingly, it was mostly members who already do a full roster at Cronulla who ended up volunteering. Garie can be a very challenging beach, and it would be great to see more younger members with better water skills there. It is also a great opportunity to push your skills in conditions very different to what we see at our home beach.

Next year there is again some changes of Patrol Captains as we make way for new leaders. Of note, Marcus Kennedy is stepping aside as a Patrol Captain after 5 years. I remember my feeling of relief when Marcus agreed to take on the role as I was trying to organise the patrols for my first year as Club Vice Captain. Since then Marcus has done a great job,

always contributing on committee and leading a great team on the Beach.

The patrol competition was hotly contested again this year. We had good participation in all areas; new awards, competition days, Lifesaving Awards, Patrol Leadership, and patrolling members competing in Sunday races 279 times. A change that made a significant difference this year was including maintaining the proficiency of advanced awards alongside new awards in the calculation. Some patrols had been disadvantaged in previous years, as almost all of their members had almost all available awards, and therefore couldn't perform well in that section. This year's winning patrol took out first place in 5 of the 7 criteria, leaving them 12 points clear of second place in a competition usually decided on count back. Congratulations to Patrol 12 and Patrol Captain, Scott Jackson.

This season 43 members earned the 100% Award, and 7 members the Outstanding Patrol Attendance Award (100% less one with a substitute). Making the effort to organise a substitute is a great help when we are managing our patrols and lifesaving obligations. This is an area that other clubs do very well and where Cronulla could do a lot better. Thank you to all the 100% Award and OPAA recipients for your service over the year, and congratulations on your achievement.

In context of the challenges we recognise members face to try and achieve 100%, it is exceptional that this year Chris Barber equaled Bryan Wild's record of 15 consecutive years of 100% Attendance.

Finally, to our Patrol Person of the year. This award was decided by a process of nominations from Patrol Captains. Nine candidates were interviewed by the Club Captain and Myself via video conference over two nights. All of the candidates spoke about how honoured they felt to have been recognised for their efforts, and it was very difficult to split the candidates. The eventual winner was Isabella Turner from Patrol 6, who continues to juggle her competition duties and schooling whilst showing an exceptional commitment to lifesaving. Congratulations Isabella.

Over the season Patrol Captains continued to learn and use the new Patrol Operations App on their phones and tablets. When operating and used correctly, the app enables real time recording of attendance, conditions and statistics. The Lifesaving Committee have provided detailed feedback to SLSNSW to help guide further developments in that area.

Once again, we were faced with the challenge of operating our Sunday activities without the luxury of the clubhouse. And once again our age managers, parents and helpers handled the situation with ease, unpacking the container early each Sunday morning and working out of the tents on the grassed area! None of this would have been possible without the cooperation of all involved.

An exciting prelude to the season for our executive team, was the amalgamation of accounts and processes to bring the Crays JAG under the one umbrella of Cronulla SLSC to further enhance and promote our 'One Club'. Providing stability and teamwork across all levels of the club structure will only benefit the Crays in the years to come. Thank you to the senior management team for all their support over this process.

The season was certainly not one without challenges. Unfortunately, many Sunday activities were lost due to circumstances beyond our control. The tragic bushfires, severe heat (the sand was simply too hot to hold nippers on one day), cyclonic surf conditions, beach erosion, all had an impact on our Sunday and carnival activities. Credit goes to the Crays executive, water safety team and local lifeguards. All teams worked together to make crucial decisions, with the number one priority of our children's safety paramount.

At the start of the season, our under 14 group came together to select the Cronulla JAG Club Captains. We were very proud to announce Rhianna Leontsinis and Ben Huntley as respective Captains, both of whom lead their peers throughout the season on Sundays, on patrol and at carnivals with maturity and acceptance of responsibility. Congratulations Rhianna & Ben, you both should be very proud of your contribution to Cronulla SLSC.

Under the leadership of our Lifesaving & Age Manager Coordinator, Justin Ingram, our groups introduced a new weekly program this season, learning and developing new skills with a greater focus on lifesaving and water safety. The program found an even balance to include all nippers, be they competitive or non-competitive kids. Basic CPR, signals and surf awareness are all skills which were taught to groups as young as our under 10s, skills normally taught in the under 14s and the SRC course. As we went through the season, we had a great response from all the kids, in particular our competitive nippers who found it a breath of fresh air to not have to 'race' every Sunday, but could relax and enjoy themselves learning with their mates. I would like to thank and congratulate Justin for the time and effort he has put into the role. Most times first to the beach in the morning, and last one there helping to pack up, but also the many hours through the week putting the programs and timetables together. It goes without saying, sincere thank you, to all our brilliant Age Managers who give up their time each weekend to lead and teach the children and create such a fun environment.

Over the course of the season, our nippers completed many awards. U6 & U7's do not receive an award but the age managers work through the Surf Play 1 & 2 lesson plan books, a total of 235 nippers completed their surf education booklets. A total of 386 under 9's to 13's received their relevant surf education awards during the season.

We once again conducted our Blue Fins program with 12 registered members over a 10-week program from October to December. Beside our Sunday activities, our Blue Fins competed in several carnivals over the season, including our own Cronulla Carnival and the Wanda Carnival. It was very encouraging to see all clubs working together in collaboration to grow and develop this program. The increasing opportunities for children and young adults to participate meaningfully in inclusion initiatives across nipper and carnival activities is an important development for SLS and all families involved.

Unlucky to miss the overall point score, our Crays raced hard and competed with pride and determination on their home beach. Special mention to the Carnival organising committee, under the professional experienced leadership of Greg Allum AM.

Our team competed strongly through a number of other carnivals as the season progressed including Ohana, Wanda, Nth Cronulla, Manly carnivals, plus the Cook Community Classic.

For fear of omitting I shall not name them, but I would like to thank those who; arrived early to get the gear down from the container; got boats ready; set courses; drove the IRB; swum around the course numerous times; encouraged concerned kids; paddled boards; helped ashore those who felt they couldn't make it; counted kids in and out of the water; started races; packed up long after others had left. You make me proud to be part of such a dedicated, productive and above all selfless team.

SURF EDUCATION REPORT



Despite the season providing an endless supply of challenges from the first 4 weeks of being unable to complete the new season proficiencies due to unfavourable surf conditions, to nippers being cancelled due to the tragic bushfires on several Sundays, even a day where nippers was cancelled because the sand was too hot to walk upon, all education awards were gained by all nippers.

Thanks must go out to all age managers and assistants in prioritising the Surf Education at the beginning of the season to ensure all our requirements were met. Over the past few seasons we have made an effort to make surf education an equally important part of Sunday morning nippers along with surf sports training and it's also with thanks to the age and assistant managers for supporting the JAG in this effort.

I would like to recognise and say a big thank you to the Assistant Life Saving Coordinator, Ilana Crowe, for all her hard work and time spent processing the awards and following up any issues to make sure all nippers were correctly awarded by the end of 2019 as required by SLISA. Ilana has been assisting the Life Saving Coordinator for a number of years now and I would like to pass on my appreciation and gratitude to her for the time and hard work she has given to nippers over those seasons.



The awards breakdown is as follows:

U6 & U7's do not receive an award but the age managers work through the Surf Play 1 & 2 lesson plan books, a total of 235 nippers completed their surf education booklets.

109 x U8 received Surf Aware 1 Certificate

70 x U9 received Surf Aware 2 Certificate

75 x U10 received Surf Safe 1 Certificate

49 x U11 received Surf Safe 2 Certificate

51 x U12 received Surf Smart 1 Certificate

32 x U13 received Surf Smart 2 certificate

A total of 386 under 9's to 13's received their relevant surf education awards during the season.

22 under 14's gained their Surf Rescue Certificate, trained by Carlo Villanti and Rodd Sanchez and went on to patrol regularly throughout the season.

LIFE SAVING COORDINATOR

Along with the focus on making sure the Surf Education requirements were covered, the age groups were encouraged to include some life saving skills training each week during nippers. At the beginning of the season to assist with surf education we had a former nipper helping to teach signals, basic first aid etc to the nippers. The groups were also encouraged to practice life saving skills in the water, including the Under 8's getting their first experiences with a wading tube rescue. The older age groups regularly practiced tube and board rescue skills. We were not able to hold our life saving skills days due to circumstances beyond our control but we used the twilight nipper sessions as life saving skills sessions, which were greatly enjoyed by all the age managers, nippers and parents involved.



The groups were also encouraged to interact with the patrol on duty as much as possible during nippers to help familiarise the younger groups with the teams on patrol and also help create better links between the reasons for nippers and the understanding for their journey through nippers to become patrolling members of the Club. I would like to pass on my gratitude to all the patrols and captains for their enthusiasm and help in this interaction, hopefully this will continue to grow in the future.

Elite sports complex/Cronulla Swim School repairs and maintenance to this old dinosaur is always a week-by-week conversation with tenant and Council. Council have spent thousands repairing damage from rainwater and deteriorating substrate. Council's future scope of works include replacing the failing fibreglass roofing, replacing skylights, repairs to the Polar Bears area including balcony waterproofing, painting, replacing rotten barge boards, rusted guttering that surround the building construction and finally repainting the exterior of the complex and Lifeguards room the same colour as the Surf Club.

Business for both co-operator's Cameron Hoban and Mark Simpson was proceeding exceptionally well in a very competitive industry until COVID 19 brought everything to a standstill. Because of the nature of their operations, turnover dropped to zero, and apart of a few personal trainers doing the odd park boot camp sessions, doors have remained closed. However, with the Club's rental rescue package and JobKeeper, staff retention was made possible for a return to business as usual in the months ahead.

Barefoot on the Beach (juice bar) The Sotiropoulos family have been trading going on 7 years. During that time, they have worked tirelessly to build a very popular and successful healthy food business serving a vast range of exotic juices, wraps and coffee. Although profit margins were less than normal due to the effects of COVID 19 the nature of their business with walk-in, walk-out take-aways, their shop was able to remain open and continued to trade with reduced staffing.

The income from these operations continue to be the integral part of the Club's financial future, so I would encourage all members to support their patronage when any occasion arises. All revenue from these operations is reflected in the treasurer's report.

CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

Due to the Clubhouse refurbishment project we did not have the Club gear sheds available again this season so two changes persisted related to lifesaving gear and equipment. These involved the annual Gear Inspection and the storage and access to patrol equipment during the season.

Gear inspection was held on Saturday 7th September 2019. Similar to last year, all of the Cronulla SLSC lifesaving equipment was prepared and presented in the grounds and building at Hungry Point. There was an impressive outdoor and indoor display with the patrol arena and rescue equipment set up in the park area and IRBs and motors set up in the car park areas while the first aid, resuscitation and training equipment was all laid out inside the building.

This equipment included the following items:

- 19 rescue boards
- 35 rescue tubes
- 10 radios
- 2 patrol first aid kits and supplies
- 1 trauma/haemorrhage kit
- 3 spinal boards and straps
- 2 defibrillators
- 4 oxy-viva kits
- 4 suction equipment sets
- 2 stretchers
- 18 resuscitation mannequins
- 3 trainer defibrillators
- 6 IRB
- 6 IRB fuel cells
- 8 outboard motors
- 11 lifejackets
- Patrol area and tent
- Signal flags, evacuation (shark) flags and beach signs
- Miscellaneous items including swim fins, loud hailer, binoculars, patrol bum bags.

The inspection team visited all clubs in the Branch in one day. After completing the eastern suburbs clubs in the morning they arrived at Cronulla early afternoon and then moved on to the other Bate Bay Clubs. The following members helped prepare the club gear for the start of the season - David Dalla-Camina, Rod Dunn, Robert Walker, Graham Burt, Scott Jackson, Glenn McLachlan, Chris Chambers, Rob Short Jr, Darryl Easton and Chris Barber. It was a very successful inspection. Thank you to all involved.

Sutherland Shire Council Lifeguards allowed us to continue to share their facilities for patrol equipment storage and operations during the season. Inside the Lifeguard facility we stored first-aid, oxy vivas, defibrillator kits, spinal equipment and patrol radios. We also maintained use of the temporary storage area outside the Sports Complex where we were able to locate rescue boards, patrol tents and the patrol arena. Due to space limitations in the lifeguard facility we constructed a secure fenced compound on the Esplanade where two fully fitted out IRB were stored under tarpaulin and accessible for the duration of the season. This gave us a secure and safe place to store all of our essential patrol equipment and from which to operate our essential services. Additional to this, the Polar Bears area above the Sports Complex housed all of the additional items required for lifesaving award training. All necessary equipment and consumables were moved to these locations ready for the start of the season. The remainder of the equipment was stored at Hungry Point, ready to access as needed during the season.

Rod Dunn continued as Radio Officer this past season and ensured that all radios were in top condition and available for patrol and water safety uses throughout the season. David Dalla-Camina continued in the role of First Aid Officer and all first aid equipment and consumables were readily available

and of a high standard. Rod and David also kept watch over and cared for all equipment through the season. Robert Walker and Graham Burt as IRB Captain and Vice-Captain respectively managed all of the IRB items. They are all a great team.

Lifesaving is our core business and the cost of purchases of new and replacement equipment along with service and repairs is a necessary annual expense. Cronulla always has good lifesaving equipment available. Costs have been a little lower over the past two seasons as we have not bought a lot of new equipment while out of the Clubhouse. Excluding IRB items, the expenditure to be ready for this past season was approximately \$8,000. This included, board repairs (\$1,100), radio servicing (\$1310), oxy-viva and defibrillator servicing (\$568), first-aid and resuscitation consumables (\$850), training consumables (\$1800) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$190). We also purchased some uniforms, rash shirts, sun hats, sun screen plus log books and other patrol items (\$1000) from the SLSA shop. We purchased patrol caps (\$1,200) from Club family company, Fineprint.

The NSW Lifesaving Equipment Grant, funded by the NSW government and distributed by SLSNSW is awarded each year in the off season and the 2019 cycle provided us with an oxy-viva kit, three helmets for IRB crews and a fuel cabinet to a total value of \$3,400. The Australian Government again committed to fund every Club in the country with a grant towards the cost of lifesaving equipment. This season we received \$5,000, which was put to purchase a fully fitted out IRB. Surf Life Saving Australia provided \$2,000 (88 uniforms) as a patrol uniform subsidy.

As in previous seasons all new Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate awardees had a patrol cap presented at their assessment and a uniform and sun hat on their first patrol. All new IRB drivers and crewpersons were presented a SLSA rash shirt and peaked cap to wear while on duty. New Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLSA patrol jacket and peaked cap. The Club continued to subsidise the purchase of PFDs by IRB Crewpersons and Drivers if they wanted to purchase their own. Having our lifesavers fitted properly and safely on the beach and in the water is a high priority and a small cost well justified.

Thank you to all of the Patrol Captains and their patrolling Members who used and cared for the Club lifesaving gear during the season. Cronulla SLSC has a large amount of lifesaving equipment, which must always be in good condition and ready for purpose. This past season, I believe that the arrangements worked very well and patrols were able to operate as well as they have in the past. Importantly, due to the commitment and application of several Members, I believe that we have been able to provide the Club with the very good equipment for patrol, water safety, training, competition and community purposes.

See you on the beach at Cronulla - where else would you rather be?

BUILDING DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The good news for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club from the Club building project is that after a considerable delay period the construction and basic fit-out of our refurbished Clubhouse was completed so that the building reached Practical Completion earlier this year. What has been delivered is a wonderful looking building from the outside and a well fitted out building on the inside. Unfortunately, by the end of the season we were still not able to take full handover. Due to slow resolution of a few compliance issues the building was not fully certified and we had not received our Occupation Certificate, which is required to allow us to move in.

CONSTRUCTION DELAYS

Despite some progress, the completion rate on the building through the middle of 2019 was very slow - and obviously so. This was partially compounded by unexpected structural problems including some concealed concrete cancer and the discovery of some lead paint which had to be removed by a specialist team. With these considered and all notified delays taken into account, the formal completion date was fixed as early September. However, progress appeared unexpectedly slow and we had concerns as there were strong indications we would not meet that completion date.

We responded to this situation through two formal meetings held with the builder, one in each of July and September. As well as this, monitoring and updating of progress was reported at the fortnightly project site meetings.

At the first meeting with the builder in July he indicated a delay beyond the official practical completion date of approximately one month. It subsequently became apparent that the project was slipping even further and there was no indication of meeting the completion date. Following the meeting with the principal of Momentum Built in mid September he subsequently provided an updated program with works scheduled to finish in December and a revised project completion date of 23 December. This date was also not met and we were advised at the final site meeting for the year that the goal for completion was now mid January. After further delays all significant works were ultimately completed mid February with Practical Completion agreed with the builder on 10 February 2020.

Practical completion meant that building works had been completed except for the resolution of minor defects, provision of relevant documents and certificates, some necessary testing carried out and the removal of rubbish, site sheds, fencing etc. All of these latter points would be finalised post completion and before final occupation.

PROGRESS

Despite the slow progression of the project and the significant unacceptable delays, some obvious progress in the construction process was able to be observed over the course of the year and the list is worth reviewing.

Visibly from the outside of the building we could see completion of:

- A new two story Monro wing
- A modified Purcell balcony substantially increased in size
- The partial reroofing of the Purcell wing and installation of a new balcony awning

- A new roof to the majority of the building
- The rear Esplanade entry bridge and entry to the upper levels of the Clubhouse
- The heritage section windows completely removed, refurbished and reinstalled including three new custom built windows
- Installation of all external doors, windows, lighting and fittings
- External painting
- Internally the changes were also substantial and included:
 - New change rooms, bathrooms, gym, meeting rooms, kitchen, bars, cold room and office - all constructed and fitted out
 - Construction of a new ballroom and elevated mezzanine area.
 - Beach foyer construction and fit out
 - Patrol room expansion and fit out
 - Lift installation
 - Ceilings, insulation and trims installation to both new and existing areas
 - Floor coverings including tiles, terrazzo, carpet, vinyl and Ballroom timber floor
 - Craft racking installation
 - Exhaust ducting and air conditioning installation
 - A modern audio-visual system
 - A comprehensive security system
 - IT and communications hardware installation and network set up
 - Electricity, water, gas, telephone and NBN connected
 - Electrical and plumbing fit-out
 - Internal painting completed

Concurrent with this we were advised late in the project that the existing fire hydrant was no longer considered compliant to our requirements and we installed two new fire hydrants outside the building.

It is a pretty impressive list and exciting developments overall. It is just a pity that it could not have been done in a more timely manner, allowing us to get into the Clubhouse when anticipated.

DEFECTS AND COMPLIANCE

Post completion a list of defects was compiled and provided to the builder for rectification. Simultaneously, compliance inspections were performed by the certifiers. They identified a number of items that did not comply and these were added to the list for rectification.

The majority of building defects were related to quality of finishes on several aspects. These included tiling, plasterwork, caulking, painting and some areas of flooring. The compliance issues were primarily related to some equitable access requirements and the detailed fit-out of the accessible bathrooms.

Many of the defects were addressed and resolved promptly. However, action on some defects was delayed and had not been finalised by the end of season despite constant review with the builder. None of these prevent us occupying the building.



Almost all compliance issues were resolved quickly with some most of the remainder being completed shortly after the end of season. The final major issue still pending from a compliance point at the time of writing is the certification of the newly installed fire hydrants. These require final sign off by Fire Rescue NSW and once this is done the Occupation Certificate should be issued.

COMMISSION AND OCCUPATION

In preparation for occupation of the building we have progressively commissioned many aspects of the building to get them ready for our moving in. This task has primarily been managed by a group comprised of our President and Club Executive.

- Key Members and staff have undergone building systems training in lighting, electrical, audio-visual, ventilation, security, kitchen and bar services.
- Statutory and way finding signage has been installed
- The Gym, Board Room and function rooms have been fitted out with the necessary equipment and furniture.
- Keying and secure access procedures have been developed and are being implemented
- A modern IT and communications network has been set up

BUDGET

The unexpected issues including the structural problems, the lead paint removal and the new fire hydrants resulted in significant costs beyond the contingency. These issues plus the protracted delays also resulted in unanticipated consultants charges. The final building cost will now exceed the allocated budget. You will find the full details on this in the Treasurer's report elsewhere in this annual report.

NEXT

The final steps that are in front of us start with obtaining the Occupancy Certificate. Following this we will be able fit-out further areas within the building, relocate Club and Members' equipment and finally move back into our Clubhouse. This is a much anticipated event and, I am sure, will be accompanied by the usual celebrations and conviviality.

CHANGE CONTROL

Following occupation, some changes will almost certainly be required progressively to our new building as we settle in and learn more about its use. However, this is a wonderful new building and we don't want to rush in with poorly thought out modifications. To ensure that all changes are well considered and justified and are carried out in a suitable manner, a change control policy and process has been endorsed by the Club Management Committee.

This policy limits changes or additions in the six months post occupation to "mission critical" and essential changes. All requests for changes will be reviewed by the Building Committee in association with the House Committee and subsequently reviewed and approved by the Management Committee. In addition to this, all changes and additions must be done by appropriately identified and authorised personnel.

SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

Sutherland Shire Council has conducted a large range of concurrent works to complement our project including the construction of a waste management area, extensive frontage works and parks works to the rear of the Club and the refurbishment of the public change rooms and toilets.

Council has also provided valuable support with project delivery and a group of Council officers has met with Building Committee representatives on a scheduled fortnightly basis, or more often as required.

THANKS

On behalf of the Building Committee, I thank our Club Members for their patience through the protracted completion period and for their support and positive comments regarding the building.

I again offer my thanks and that of all Club Members to the members of the Building Development Committee who have all contributed extensively over the length of the project. They are Daniel Wood, Steve Mackay, Doug Murray, John Suann, Ken Adams, Richard Pinker, Chris Giles, Greg Holland, Lee Schmalfeldt, Alan Metti and Brad Turner. The success of this project has relied on their commitment of time and effort plus their very professional approach.

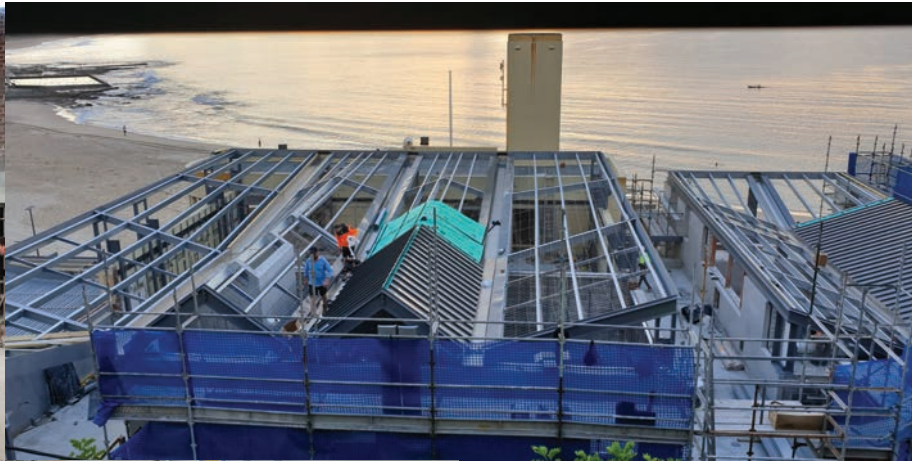


PHOTO & TROPHY COMMITTEE

CRONULLA SHORT COURSE SURF CARNIVAL

In excellent conditions the Pulse Property Agents Cronulla SLSC 9th Annual Short Course Carnival was conducted on Saturday, 16th November 2019.

Over the past decade the Cronulla Carnival has grown to be the major early season event on the surf lifesaving calendar. The Carnival continues to feature fast and enjoyable short course racing in traditional swim, board, ski and run disciplines, complemented by a few boutique races over longer distances.

This year there was a record 1,121 plus late entrant U8 to O40 aged competitors from 23 clubs from as far afield as Warilla Barrack Point to Cooks Hill. With athletes, club supporters, mums and dads and carnival officials, it was estimated that there were well over 3000 people in attendance creating a wonderful festival atmosphere with supporter stalls, club tents and club BBQ and Snow Cone stalls in the Park.

In all, medals, trophies and random draw give-aways totalling more than \$7,000 were distributed to event winners and lucky participants.

The highlight of the Carnival was the Letizza Pizza Bases "Competitor with a Disability" events. The 14 competing athletes were ushered by Georgia Carter and Yvette Larkin into swim, board, wade, beach sprint and flag events to the applause of their fellow competitors, officials and spectators.

Another highlight was an exciting new event, the Pulse Property Agents Open 4 Person Mixed Lifesaver Relay. This event starts with a 500m run leg followed by swim, board and ski. Teams are free to choose which gender (two males and two females) completes which leg of the race. In a seesawing event North Cronulla burst through in the final ski leg to claim the win.

Other highlights of the Carnival included:

- The Vici Shark Island Ski Races were won by Elouera's Nathan Neale and Wanda's National Representative Georgia Sinclair.
- Continuing their domination of Beach events, the FreightPower Mixed All Age Beach Relay was won by home club Cronulla.
- The Caltex 2km Beach Runs were won by Kai Hammond of Wanda and North Cronulla's National U17 Champion Tiahna Woodger.
- The 7News Open Ironman was won by North Cronulla star Will Budd and Wanda champion Taylar Puskaric.
- A historic draw for the overall point score trophy. North Cronulla and Wanda shared first place followed by Cronulla then Elouera.
- A strong financial return.

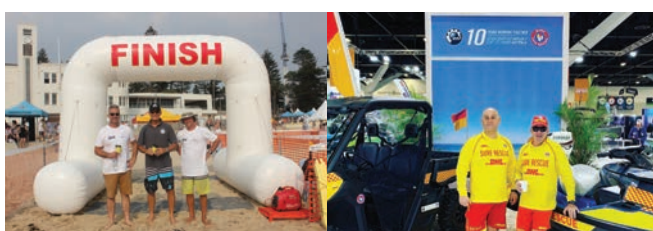

VALE- ALLAN HANSON

It is with deep sadness that I record the passing of our esteemed past President and Life Member Allan Hanson on the 19th March 2020 after a long battle with dementia.

Allan was a true friend and mate to many members of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club.

In September 1954 then senior member Les Vernon, who was Allan's, and his younger brother Jimmy's, cousin, introduced them to the club when Allan was aged 13. Les also encouraged John Hollingdale and the late Jimmy Stansell who were both 14, to join the club at the same time

As Cadets, Allan and I joined Frank Jordan's swim squad at Gunnamatta Bay. Our first competitive event was to represent the Club at the Inter-Club where we were selected in the clubs Cadet 6 aside surf team.

Allan gained his Bronze Medallion on the 28th October 1956 and his Instructors Certificate in the 1959-60 season. Allan was awarded the Best Trainee Instructor in the same year.

As juniors Allan and I joined the Junior R&R Team with Barry Ezzy, Lex MacPherson, John Wilson and Graham Webster with Bill Eady as our coach. Our team were runners up in the Branch Metropolitan, State and Australian Junior R&R Championships at Scarborough Beach Perth W.A in 1958. Bill also became our mentor and life coach. Who would have known that many years later Allan, Barry, Lex, John, Bill and myself would all become Life Members.

Allan was successful and placed in many Junior and Senior Surf and Belt events at Surf Carnivals and Club Championships. As a Senior, Allan became a Vice Patrol Captain for 3yrs and Patrol Captain for 5yrs. Allan was the Deputy Chief Instructor in 1960 and was then elevated to Swimming Captain from 1973-1975.

After these early years Allan turned to making a career in real estate in which he was very successful. Allan married his wife to be Carole, and they had three children James, Ben and Luke. James was named after Allan's father Jimmy who was a member of the North Bondi Surf Club in the late 1930s. Allan and Carole's boys joined their grandfather and father as Life Savers when they joined the Cronulla Surf Club, the boys were all club members and fierce competitors.

Allan took the position of Crays Junior Surf Club Chairman from 1980-1983. The Junior Club were State Champions each year that he was Chairman. Allan became the Publicity Officer of the club in 1987 writing many articles for local and wider area newspapers. Allan was elevated to Life Membership in 1990, which he saw as a great honour.

Allan held the role of World Team Manager in 1990-91. He escorted the team to Germany for the World Team Championships and then to Japan for the Pan Pacific Championships.

In 2001 Allan was elected Club President by the members of Cronulla Surf Club. As President, Allan kept up the high standards set by past Presidents and the mantle of being one of the strongest and competitive Surf Clubs in Australia. In 2004, Allan became the NSW Surf Life Saving Administrator of the Year.

Allan was always a loyal and highly respected Club Member who made a wonderful contribution to Cronulla Surf Club. Allan's membership to the Club spanned 66 years. This is a significant achievement.

VALE- BOB LEIX

On the eleventh of June 2020 Cronulla SLSC lost one of its most revered members, when Robert (Bob) James Leix passed away in his hometown of Denver in the USA, aged 79. Bob joined our club in 1959 aged 18 years. During his 61 years as a member he made an enormous contribution to the club, and he achieved many things. Bob's forte was in administration, and apart from some successful participation in various March Past Teams, his entire career in Surf Life Saving was dedicated



to administration. Bob also devoted a lot of his time to the Sydney Branch Board of Examiners. In 1963 he obtained his Examiners Certificate, and went on to be the No. 2 District Supervisor. Apart from these duties, Bob was a very active Examiner on Bate Bay, and was a judge at many surf carnivals, Local, State and National.

Bob was elected to many positions within the club, which included R&R Coach, Social Organiser, Patrol Captain for seven years, Chief Instructor for two years, Secretary for four years, President for three years. Bob was also a member of numerous Sub-Committee's, too many to detail here, all of which he served with absolute distinction. As a Patrol Captain it's worth noting Bob won the coveted Patrol Shield on three separate occasions, a very commendable effort.

In 1976 Bob was rewarded for his devotion to the club he loved so much, when he was elevated to Life Membership. In 1984 he was awarded his 25year membership badge, and in 2009 he was awarded his 50year membership badge. Bob was a great believer in the wonderful traditions of the club, which were established by many cherished office bearers who had served the club in years gone by. He was a great admirer of past administrators like Don Lucas, Tony Purcell, Harold Spurway, Nick Dixon, Ron Simmons, Frank Jordan, Bill Eady and Bill Marshall. He often told me how much he admired and respected these men, and how much they had influenced his life. I feel it's now fitting that Bob Leix's name should be added to this list of immortals whenever Cronulla greats are mentioned in future.

During Bob's three years as our President, from 1973 to 1976, he will be long remembered for his input and contribution to seeing the club's biggest asset, the Cronulla Sports Complex, being built and completed. The Sports Complex was by far the biggest commercial venture the club had ever undertaken, and it's been due to the foresight of those responsible that a sizable return to the club has been realised since. Bob was a tenacious achiever and organiser, who demanded and received respect from all who worked with him in the best interests of our club. Bob dedicated an enormous amount of time and effort into successfully obtaining various Federal, State and Council grants and a huge amount of fund raising was done to see this venture through to its completion. Whilst he had the full support of a very robust and capable

Committee at that time, it was down to Bob Leix's astute business acumen and organising ability, which eventually saw our ultimate dream materialise. Who will ever forget that momentous day when the then Prime Minister of Australia, Gough Whitlam officially opened the Complex in 1974?! On that day Bob was at his finest as he presided over the opening ceremony in his usual professional manner, which saw the proceedings flow without a hitch.

Bob had many occupations during his working life, and his main occupation was in the earth moving industry, specialising in the sale of heavy earthmoving machines and equipment. In 1980 much to the club's misfortune, a business opportunity arose which resulted in Bob relocating to the USA, from which he never returned, apart from his many reunion visits. During his time in Northern America Bob established a successful business, and with his wife Margaret, they raised their three children there.

During Bob's 21 active years with the club before moving overseas, he made an indelible mark on the club, which the club will be forever in his debt. From the time he first joined the club to the day he died, he never lost his love of the club, and was always willing to speak up when he felt his input was needed.

Farewell O'Leix, you will never ever be forgotten by those of us who remember your untiring efforts to see that your beloved Cronulla SLSC was the best club in the Association. You were a great mate and a good bloke, and you're going to be truly missed.

You were one of our favourite sons, and now may you rest in peace with your many esteemed mates who went before you, "out the back".

VALE - ROBERT ATHOL PRATT

BEACH SECTION REPORT

Despite experiencing a partially interrupted season due to COVID-19, which ultimately resulted in the cancellation of the Aussies, Cronulla saw a number of exemplary and hugely promising results from the senior beach competitors throughout the 2019/20 season.

In late September/early October 2019, our very own Bella Walker represented not only Cronulla but Australia in the International Surf Rescue Challenge, held in Durban, South Africa. To say she performed exceptionally would be an understatement, as she took home 5 gold medals and 1 silver from the 6 events she competed in. However, this would only be the start of the success for Bella this season.

Fast forward to later in 2019, where a number of Cronulla competitors competed in the Sydney Water Series. There were some fantastic results, culminating in Ace Haslam and Bella Walker winning the overall series for their respective age groups. Max Geronimo, Sasha Popovic, Josh Tattam and Jasper Walker also came away with impressive results throughout the series and considering these athletes were in their first season of competing in the seniors, the sky is the limit for what they can achieve in the coming seasons.

As a reward for their efforts and results across the Sydney Water Series, Ace Haslam and Bella Walker were selected to represent NSW at the State Development Carnival, held in Bulli on the 1st of December. Both athletes did themselves, their State and Cronulla proud achieving 3rd in sprints and 8th in flags (Bella) and 9th in sprints and 10th in flags (Ace) for their respective age groups.

The weekend of the 7th-8th of December saw 2 Cronulla competitors, Bella Walker and Max Geronimo compete in the Interbranch Championships held in Bulli, NSW. They both competed extremely well, with Max Geronimo, competing for the Mid North Coast Branch taking 4th place in the Youth Male Beach Sprint and an impressive silver medal in the Youth Male Beach Flags, while Bella, competing in the Opens for the Sydney Branch, took home a silver and bronze medal in the Open Female Beach Sprint and Flags respectively.

The annual Cronulla Carnival was held on the 16th of November and again saw some impressive individual and team results, notably Josh Tattam taking out both the 17's and Opens flags as well as the Mixed All Age Relay team taking first place. For many, this would be the first real chance to dust off the competitive cobwebs and get the ball rolling for a big season ahead.

The next carnival on the calendar was the North Cronulla Christmas Carnival, held on the 14th of December, where Cronulla again saw success from Max Geronimo who won the 17 and Open sprint double, with Josh Tattam winning the flags from Sasha Popovic in a Cronulla one-two.

Rolling into the New Year, Alexandra Headlands hosted the Interstate Championships on the 24th of January, where Bella Walker and Ace Haslam were again deservedly selected to represent NSW. Both athletes achieved amazing results, with Ace taking home the gold medal in the U17's Male Beach Sprint and Bella Walker taking the silver competing as a 17 year old in the Open Female Beach Sprint. These athletes should be extremely proud of their efforts.

Back closer to home on Australia Day, a number of Cronulla competitors took part in the Manly Carnival, the first carnival for the new year for many. There were a number of impressive results this day, including most notably, gold medals to Max Geronimo (U17's Male Beach Sprint), Tia Lacoste (U19's Female Beach Sprint) and Josh Tattam (U17's Male Beach Flags), as well as an Open Female and an Open Mixed Beach Relay team. Max Geronimo also picked up a silver medal in the U17's Male Beach Flags (Cronulla taking out the 2 top spots), with Lizzy Rigg also taking home a bronze medal in the Open Female Beach Sprint.

The Wanda Carnival, held on the 1st of February, would be the last competitive hit out before the State Championships, a little over a month later Ace Haslam again showed his class finishing 3rd in the Open Marc Leabeater classic to Michael Hannah and Jamie Smith. This carnival was on the hottest day on record for 50 years I might add.

The Branch carnival was postponed twice due to surf conditions then COVID-19 put pay to any rescheduling, but we enjoyed a positive state titles at Swansea Belmont for the 4th year running amassing a total of 104 pts from the beach section. These full results are available and listed elsewhere in this Annual Report.

The 2019/20 season, albeit cut short, was another successful competitive season for the Cronulla Beachies, with a number of impressive results achieved across each of the carnivals. All competitors should be extremely proud of their efforts, but also aim to improve for a big 2020/21 ahead. A big thanks should also go out to the coaching staff of Mark Redrup and Paul Littlejohn. Their tireless efforts to make each athlete as prepared as possible to succeed are greatly appreciated and should not go unrecognised.

SWIM SECTION REPORT

The 2019/2020 surf season was definitely a memorable one! It was my first season in the Swim Section Captain role, and it was such a pleasure to captain a small but very talented group of athletes. I want to take this opportunity to credit you all for your actions and response to the news that Aussies was cancelled. I can especially understand how difficult it was for all of you to have trained all season to then be given that news. You all took it so well and have made it clear to me that we will be back bigger and better next year.

Before I acknowledge our amazing swimmers' performances during the season, I feel that it is important to firstly mention our athletes who kicked off the season early and competed at the Coolangatta Gold. Our only individual long-course competitor was Tim Ford, who finished in an amazing 24th overall with a time of 4:39:59. In a star-studded field of professional ironmen, what a fantastic result from Tim! We also had an Open Male Team with Ski Captain, Michael Roye, who generously took on the starting 23km ski leg, Will Banister who did the 3.5km swim, Cody Gaddes who did 6.1km board, and Jack Robertson who took on both run legs, which included a 2.1km run between the ski and swim, and the finishing 7.1km run. The team finished in 4th place in a time of 4:36:16. In the short course events, we had Callum Redrup finishing 5th in the U19 Male Individual race (13th overall), and in the Open Female Teams, Phoebe La Coste took on the ski and run legs and Cate Hochwallner completed the swim and board. Great effort by these girls who came away with a 3rd place. Congratulations to you all, we had a great time away, and you all did the Club proud. Special thanks also goes to Mark Redrup who towed the gear trailer for the team and whose knowledge, help and assistance is always greatly appreciated.

We started off the carnival season at our own Cronulla Short Course Carnival with some great results. Will Banister finished 2nd in the U17 Male Surf Race, Isabella Turner finished 4th in the U17 Female Surf Race, and Tim Ford finished 2nd in the Open Male Surf Race. 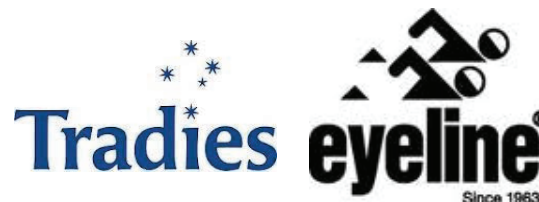

TREASURERS REPORT

Season 2019/20 has represented another challenging one for Cronulla SLSC as we completed another patrolling, surf sports and nipper season and approached the completion of the club's historic building project. However in March 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic cast Australia and the world into crisis, turning upside down the way we live our lives and in the way we are able to interact with our friends and families. For our small part, the impact that COVID has had on our activities has also been significant. We saw the cancellation of the Australian Championships, the early ending to our Patrolling Season and from a financial perspective an agreement with our commercial tenants to offer some rental relief to help them survive through the government restrictions. Despite all of these difficulties, the club recorded a full year operating surplus of \$1,049,698.

Once again, this result is an extraordinary one fuelled largely by further receipts of building related grants from the Commonwealth Government and Surf Club Facilities Grant. In addition to these extraordinary expenditures, this year we have also tidied up our asset register ahead of the reoccupation of our new building which has seen us write off a number of assets and inventory. These decisions added extraordinary expenditure of \$300,519. If these extraordinary items of income and expenditure were excluded the club would still have delivered a regular full year surplus of \$195,000 which amidst the financial challenges presented by our building project and COVID is outstanding. I once again would like to commend and thank all sections of the club for their continued tight control on spending and collective fundraising efforts.

As forecast last year, the key financial challenge this year has been to manage our cash flow through the closing months of the building project where receipt of the final government grants follows the final expenditure on the project. In 2019/20, cash expended on fixed assets exceeded \$4m which was funded through a combination of debt, operating cash flow and the club's opening cash position. Overall, the club's cash balances declined by \$1.1m over the course of the year to end with a closing balance of \$187,954.

The most substantive fixed asset expenditure throughout this and previous years has been on the building redevelopment. Expenditure on the building project in 2019/20 totalled \$3.7m. Other than one final claim, this expenditure closes out the construction phase of the building project. From its inception, this project has included many hours of work from club members over many years across many phases including concept design, DA development, CC and tender and construction. Throughout all phases, the project has now expended in excess of \$7.65m. To the Commonwealth and State Governments and to Sutherland Shire Council, who collectively have committed \$4.5m to this project – we extend our sincere thanks. The balance of this project (over \$3m) has been funded directly by the club either through cash balances or borrowings. To the members for your continued commitment to this project and to successive management committees who have overseen the sustained financial management of the club to enable this level of financial commitment, well done!

A big part of this financial success has been due to the overwhelming support we have received through the Building Development Capital Appeal – Building Tomorrow's Future. During 2019/20, over \$33,000 was donated to this appeal taking the total funds raised for the building at the time of writing to \$108,580. To all of the members and supporters of

Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club – thank you for your generosity. It has made a significant difference in the way we have been able to manage the funding of this project and the long term financial sustainability of the club.

I'd also like to once again extend our thanks to all of the donors, supporters and sponsors of both the club and the Association at large. These corporate partners are listed elsewhere in this report (as are all individual donors), however I'd like to take this opportunity to extend a warm welcome to our newest partner – LEDA group who have made a significant contribution to the club this year. I would encourage all of our members to support these businesses that support our club. A big thanks also to the Surf Life Saving Foundation for their continued work in fundraising on behalf of the entire Surf Life Saving Movement. The club has once again benefitted from these fundraising efforts receiving a distribution of \$6,100.

In amongst the challenging circumstances that this season has given us, I do want to make mention of the positive movements the club has made towards building a truly 'one-club' culture. This has been spoken about for a long time at Cronulla and while many have aspired to create a unified organisation, I think we can safely say that this season we have taken huge strides in making these aspirations a reality. This has been built upon outstanding cooperation between the Club Executive and the Crays and we have been able to find new ways of working, to consolidate our activities and to build united strategies for the future. We have found our unique one club culture. For my small part, the work to integrate the crays accounts and payments into our existing day to day services has transitioned seamlessly and I'd like to thank the Crays for their support in making this happen. This seemingly small task will streamline the club's accounting function into the future whilst still ensuring the responsible and timely spending requirements of the Crays activities are met similarly to those of other club activities.

In rounding out my third and final year as the club's treasurer, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all members of the club have supported us in our efforts to manage the financial affairs of the club and ensure our short and medium term financial sustainability. In particular a few additional votes of thanks:

To Baden Green and his team for their continued professionalism in the audit of our accounts and for their ongoing generosity in acting as our Honorary auditors and providing this service pro bono. Across the last three years, this has saved the club in the vicinity of \$30,000;

To our office staff for their tireless support;

To the management committee and executive – I think we have managed our club extraordinarily well during a challenging time and you should all be commended;

And finally to our outgoing President Richard Pinker. Thank you for your continued focus on building our club for the future and for allowing all of us to buy into that future and play our small part in it. Your contribution has been outstanding.

And so that draws together another season. I look forward to leading our club in a different capacity next season and hope that you are as excited for our future as I am. See you all on the beach.

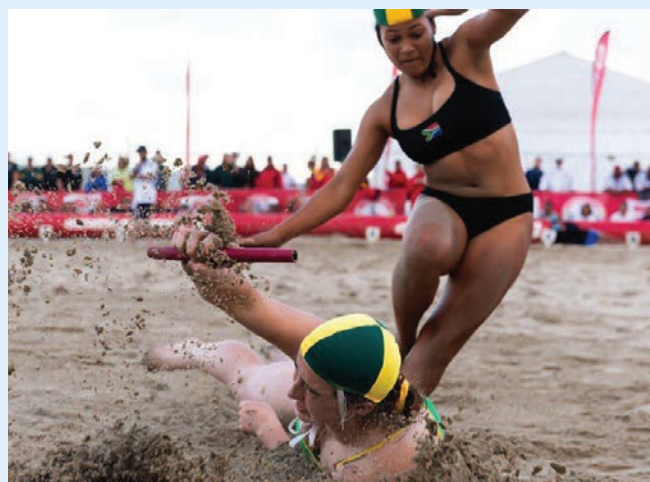

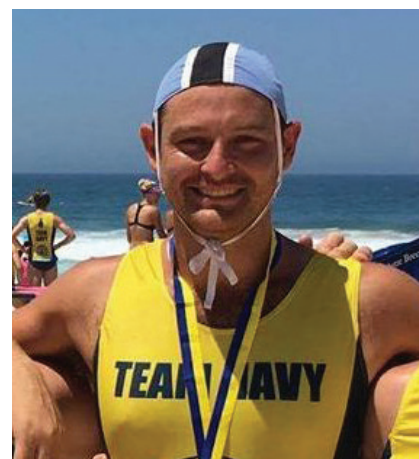
