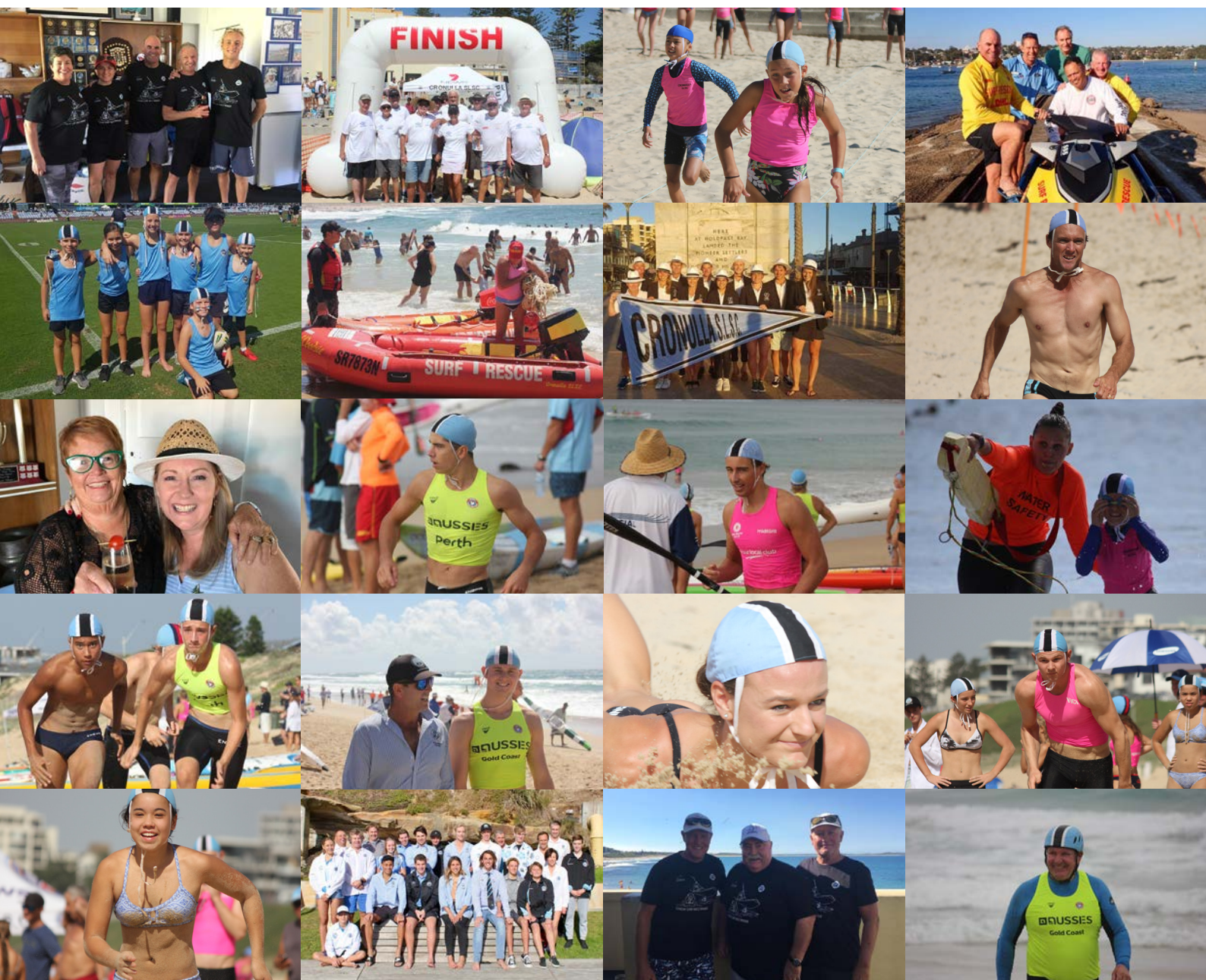

PRESIDENTS REPORT

As all members are aware, this season has been one of inconvenience and compromise due to the building project but I wish to stress how proud I am of everyone who simply just got on with the job and made everything happen when it was required. We also received tremendous community support which enabled us to operate and in particular I would like to acknowledge the following:-

SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

There are many staff at Council who have assisted the Club this year with various aspects of our operation and I must acknowledge their willingness to assist whenever we have asked. The support and assistance we have received extends through many sections of the Council from the Mayor, Councillors and CEO through to the legal and finance sections and the staff on the ground who are involved in the building and parks works. I cannot recall a time when telephone calls, emails or requests for meetings has not been promptly responded to. In addition the Council has permitted us to place a container in the park and another at Kurnell to store our equipment that we need to be readily accessible.

Well done Mark and George.

On the competition side, who could not be impressed with the performances of our beach section at the Branch, State and Australian titles. Their performances were stunning. I am sure that other members who were at the Australian Championships would agree that the initiative of holding the sprint events under lights in the evening was a terrific spectacle, and for me as President I was proud to see the number of water competitors who were at the track cheering on our sprinters to win medals.

I am looking forward to the ensuing twelve months.

SECRETARYS REPORT

As I present to you the 112th Annual Report of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club for the 2018-19 season, I wonder where the last year has gone.

It has been an interesting year with a great deal of focus on the Clubhouse, or lack thereof, which has been touched on well throughout this report. My only comment in this regard is to congratulate all the members for working through the situation at hand and to say well done on operating at such a high standard.

Prior to getting into 2018/19, the off-season held several events including the 2018 SLSNSW State Conference. State Centre launched their new 2018-2021 strategic plan outlining how they will build on strengths through continued evolution, innovation, consolidation and growth. There were several engaging workshops and networking opportunities for the President, Club Captain and I to take part in and I congratulate SLSNSW for conducting the event. It was a great way to kick-off the season.

The last AGM saw the elevation to Life Membership of two outstanding club members – Darryl Ward and Wendy Ward. Darryl joined Cronulla SLSC in 1996 and quickly immersed himself in leadership, committee and sub-committee roles. He held the roles of Deputy Chairperson and Chairperson of the Crays, and then went on to hold the position of Operations Committee Convenor, which he has held since 2012. Wendy joined in 1994 spending much of her time as a trainer and assessor before quickly securing her place as the Chief Instructor for several years. Along with this she held the position of Cadet Captain. The Lifesaving Committee one again ensured there were 'no lives lost' on Cronulla Beach during the season, meeting monthly and ensuring that patrols were well covered. Darryl Easton does not have an easy job in allocating members and patrols but he manages this very well after some time in the role. Thank you to the Committee, in particular the Patrol Captains and Vice-Captains who diligently work with their teams throughout the patrolling season to make sure our patrons are safe on their visits to the beach.

Two standout patrollers this year are Bryan Wild and Nick Rubbi who have both achieved great milestones in their lifesaving careers. Nick Rubbi has entered the ranks of 10 years of 100% patrols including three as Vice Captain and five as Patrol Captain. Bryan has excelled and is now the first Cronulla SLSC member to achieve 15 years of 100% patrol. This is a great show of commitment from these patrolling members.

In the competition arena, a small team represented the Club at the World Lifesaving Championships in Adelaide. Chloe Mannix-Power once again took out gold in the Youth Female

Beach Sprint claiming back-to-back victories after winning in the Netherlands in 2016. Our Masters also brought home two gold medals with super-mum Nicole Jones taking out the 30-34yrs Female Beach Sprint and line throwing legends Phil Cole and Stephen Street winning the 55-59yrs Male Line Throw. Further details and results of our World Team, State and Australian Touring teams can be found elsewhere in this report.

Our Coaching and Competition Committee continues to establish and develop their processes from past seasons. It is positive to see large and increasing numbers of members at craft, swim and beach training sessions. Cronulla SLSC had another fine season with some stellar results once again in the beach section. There were many other positives from using our temporary patrol area including the increased interaction with the lifeguards but also the fact that patrolling members couldn't go missing in the Ballroom which ensured our patrol members got more actively involved in patrolling the beach. We would like to thank the Sutherland Shire Lifeguards for their assistance in ensuring that our patrols functioned effectively and also thank you to the Polar Bears for the use of their area above the Sports Complex which all worked out perfectly. The flexibility shown by the council lifeguards was second to none and built even more on the lifeguard / lifesaver comradery. The relationship the Bate Bay surf clubs have with the lifeguard's is the best in the country and one, which other councils are attempting to emulate.

Special thanks to the Life Saving Committee members including all our Patrol Captains, Vice Captains, IRB Drivers / crew, IRB Captain Max Walker, Gear Steward Rob Short, Radio Officer Rodney Dunn, First Aid Coordinator David Dalla-Camina, Cadet Captain Guy Telfer and our Chief Instructor Scott Rofe with the support of his trainers for their commitment, diligence and expertise. Congratulations to our 38 patrol members who gained 100% attendance including 3 outstanding attendance patrolling members. Winning Patrol was No. 11 led by Greg Cooper in his first year as captain. This season our lifesaving was again very successful, even without our clubhouse thanks to our Patrol Captains, Vice Captains, IRB drivers / crew, every patrolling member and especially my Vice Captain, Darryl Easton for his invaluable support. The strength and depth of patrols was extremely high. Cronulla volunteer patrols also undertook 2 full patrols at Garie at the request of Sydney Branch. Next season we're going to try a few new patrolling initiatives including revising our proficiencies and trying to make patrols as interesting as possible by running frequent emergency scenarios to hone our skills and be even more rescue ready. Even our remote logistics and gear handling went well this year with a lot of effort by Gear Steward Rob Short and his valuable assistants (Rodney Dunn [Mini me], David Dalla-Camina and Carlo Villanti). Not to mention gear inspection that was held at Hungry Point including laying every item of lifesaving equipment in the carpark. Two of our Patrol Captains Peter Wyer and Jeremy McPherson will be standing aside to mentor new captains Anette Tasker and Anna Crane. Extra special thanks must go to Jeremy McPherson who has a long history serving our club as a great competitor and patrol leader. Jeremy has patrolled most years since 1982 and became a patrol Captain in 1987, was a patrol captain for a number of years and also a Vice Captain other years. Jeremy won winning patrol, completed several 100% patrol attendance and won the Most Inspirational Member award just to name just a few of his achievements. Jeremy is an amazing person and a true clubman.

This season we witnessed Bryan Wild clocking up 15 years 100% patrol attendance (longest in the history of the club) and Nick Rubbi achieving 10 years 100% patrol attendance. The major awards were again hotly contested and it's so exciting going through the selection process as there were so many

deserving members nominated. The biggest cheer erupted and also with a standing ovation at the presentation night rightly so, for the Most Inspirational Member – Mark Redrup. The Patrol Person of the Year award goes through a rigorous process including interviewing, 6 amazingly strong candidates that were nominated by their patrol captains which was won by an excellent lifesaver, David Dalla-Camina. We even have members who served a total of over 340 additional patrolling hours on the RWC (jet ski) which is the highest numbers of hours and riders in Bate Bay.

The Coaching and Competition section was well run by Mark Redrup. I'd like to recognise Rachael Dawson for her behind the scene work who in conjunction with the office ladies managed the carnival entries and logistics. Our coaching structure again was very strong with thanks to super coach Mark Redrup, Guy Telfer, Stuart Braine, Mick Roye, Alex Fleming, Daniel Neilson, Garry Allman, and Craig Hawkings. Another tough year for the boaties this season with some unlucky results.

All these changes you'd think would have affected our Sunday Surf Races but no, Darryl and Wendy forged ahead and didn't let anything get in their way and carried on as per usual. The Sunday races are the highlight of most club members week and the spirit and competitiveness remained high. Sunday drinks were well catered for afterwards in the Polar Bear's area, which again was a great savior. The Sunday races were still well attended with members either wheeling/carrying their craft down or using rescue boards. Great effort by Robert Walker in winning multiple disciplines and also age groups.

This season we didn't have as many closed beach days due to large swell conditions. Sometimes on our beach we can become a little complacent and relaxed so I emphasise how we must always be prepared and rescue ready. In our role as a surf life saver we put ourselves at risk and this year we saw a tragic rescue and we spare our thoughts for the father and son volunteer lifesavers from Port Campbell, in western Victoria, that drowned in rough surf while trying to save an international tourist. Cronulla did however respond to a few major rescues and some which were also outside of patrol hours with 3 majors rescues and 2 of these major rescues being awarded rescue of the month (George Ordenes at Wattamolla and Mark

Simpson at Green Hills). One other major rescue occurred at Stanwell Park also where the Browning family who were surfing at the time were involved in assisting in Stanwell Park lifesavers including Steven Pearce who was on patrol that day in a rescue which unfortunately resulted in an unsuccessful outcome. One rescue effort that really stood out was the North Cronulla rescue where 3 Bate Bay Clubs including a major response from Cronulla, with the council lifeguards worked seamlessly together in a mass rescue of more than 40 swimmers after a sandbank collapsed. Hard to believe but swimming was the worst activity for drownings with 35% of all coastal drowning deaths occurring during swimming/wading. Just a few statistics to emphasise the hard work of all the Bate bay Clubs this year with 6.2 million visitors to our beaches, 804 Rescues performed an increase of 73%, Shark Sightings 14 an increase of 17%, 4,520 First Aid an increase of 25%, 103,267 Preventative Actions and increase of 42% and our population is on the rise. We acknowledge the selfless work of our members and the vigilance, bravery and commitment that our surf lifesavers have displayed this season.

Our Aussies, State and Branch results were solid including several medal winners and placings but most importantly every competitor doing their best and with a smile on their face. I enjoy attending these events and watching every competitor race. A highlight is watching place getters and winners but this years highlight was at the Aussies U19 Womens Ski Final when Phoebe La Coste was rightly hesitating to compete due to large swell, however, after being convinced into competing by her boyfriend Cody Gaddes and others made it out through massive waves (just make it over a 6 – 8 foot wave at the cans and other competitors getting wiped out) and returned to the beach receiving extremely loud cheers and applause. It actually bought a tear to my eye thinking, wow, now that's competition. Another highlight was watching the surfboats competing in these conditions witnessing both fear and bravery. Thank you to all our coaches and especially coach and leader Mark Redrup who put in so much work and time.

Our club spirit showed its strength through the holding of several major events still proving to be very successful including the Shark Island Swim, Cronulla Carnival etc. Even the gear had to be trucked from Hungry Point for all these major events which demonstrated our commitment to success. The Cronulla Carnival led by Greg Allum OAM was once again named as one of the best Bate Bay carnivals held. Good planning and teamwork paid off with these events including excellent logistical planning. The 22nd Masters carnival (huge turnout and success with 22 teams competing) was another testament and also the Club Championships that were fiercely contested thanks to our referee Phil Cole.

To our volunteers that undertake water safety and officiating roles. Without you we couldn't compete and you're an essential part of our club. A very rewarding role that sees everything first hand. This is an area we'll be trying to build next year and be bringing people through from the nippers and getting them involved. A stand out with his contribution to the IRB section was Daryn Metti who did countless hours in the IRB at carnivals this year. Also, special mention to our IRB Captain Robert (Max) Walker and Vice IRB Captain Graham Burt for rostering the carnivals. Training, as you can also imagine was also marginally challenged mixing the practical and theory aspects however, we still managed to train similar numbers and wards to previous years thanks to our Chief Training Officer Scott Rofe and his many trainers. Even our IRB Driver and Crew training continued and was well enjoyed with IRB needing to be transported to the beach for each session. Thank you to our management, trainers, people holding key positions, parents and supporters.

Cadet Captain Guy Telfer did a great job getting the youth actively involved planning several social evenings at Eat Burger, Il Gusto and with support of the coaches organized an action-packed weekend at Era Surf Club. Guy thank fully also got actively involved in the Life Saving and Coaching & Competition Committees which was a welcomed change.

The future of our club begins in the juniors (Nippers) and is reliant upon members and their families getting involved and taking on positions. It's pleasing to see a cycle of experienced and active past members and their kids returning to the club.

We farewell our prestigious Club Patron Geoff Forshaw as unfortunately his 5-year tenure has been reached. Geoff was always involved in anything that was being organised and loved mixing with all the competitors. Next season we'll see some changes in the Nipper executive with Michele Cole standing down as Chairperson after 3.5 years in the position combined with an overall 10 years active involvement in Nippers. Thank you Michele for your dedication and passion towards youth development in surf lifesaving. We wish the new executive all the best in the coming season.

Our annual presentation was held at Cronulla Sharks Leagues for the second and final time as next year it'll be in our clubhouse, which will be a momentous occasion. A lot of work goes into this event and special thanks to Jenny Pinker and Emma Larssen. Already we began our coaching and competition strategy by listening to our younger and upcoming members for next season with focus on team building, water coaching, building nippers (ground up), competitor recruitment and C&C strategy review. As our new club house nears completion, we'll be soon re-occupying the building which will be a major milestone. Our new clubhouse will re-vitalise our club spirit and put us into a good position. Our new clubhouse will be a major part of building on our club culture including getting parents and especially our younger members involved. Every club member will need to look after our clubhouse and treat it with the utmost respect and care.

There are some amazing people in our club that all pitch in and make things work which is what clubs are all about, including lifetime friendships formed from bronze training sessions, patrols, competition etc. To Jenny Pinker (clocking up over 15 years' service), Robyn Cole and Kathy Ford in the office, a big thank you for your support throughout the season. To my fellow Executive team members Richard Pinker, Emma Larssen, Daniel Wood and Chris Giles, you're all a pleasure to work with. Lastly and most importantly, without the support of our partners and this note is dedicated to my wife Julie for her support, without it I couldn't have committed fully to this role.

We are all involved in surf lifesaving because of our passion and will to provide great community service. I'm privileged to have served this year in my third term as Club Captain because of the enjoyment I get from working with great people, seeing smiling faces have fun, keeping our beach safe and ultimately serving our club doing my role to the best of my ability. CLUB VICE CAPTAINS REPORT

Fellow Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club members,

My fourth season as Vice-Captain, and things are chugging along nicely. We have had a great season, with good patrol attendance, lots of 100% awards, a strong patrol competition, and most importantly, great lifesaving and no lives lost.

This year has been particularly challenging, but in many ways that has made it even more rewarding. Without the normal clubhouse facilities, we needed to work closely with the Council Lifeguards to rationalise our gear, and essentially work out of their IRB Shed. The Patrol Captains and patrol leaders took on the challenge and, with some creative thinking around storage, gear usage and process, we overcame many potential obstacles to continue to provide an excellent lifesaving service. The Council Lifeguards, especially manager Brett Richardson and his senior Lifeguards really went out of their way to accommodate us and work even more closely for our common goals.

The monthly Life Saving Committee meetings have been extremely positive with a lot of great information shared between captains and committee members. I encourage all Patrolling Members to ask their Patrol Captains what was discussed and the outcomes from the Lifesaving Committee.

Patrols teams and structure were again relatively stable from the prior season. We saw a number of new members to the club join patrol, as well as new members moving in from Nippers, and from SRC to Bronze Members. Our young members continue to contribute strongly to our lifesaving capabilities.

Next year two patrol captains are moving aside to allow new patrol captains to take a leadership role. Significantly, Jeremy Macpherson is standing aside as Patrol Captain after many years of service. The commitment to lifesaving of members like Jeremy is the lifeblood of the club. I would like to extend my personal thanks to Jeremy for his support over my four seasons.

The patrol competition was hotly contested this year. We had good participation in all areas; new awards, competition days, Lifesaving Awards, Patrol Leadership, and patrolling members competing in Sunday races 383 times.

After winning the patrol competition for the last 2 years, Patrol 6 nearly did it again, but even after a count back they could not topple new Patrol Captain Greg Cooper, and Patrol 11, who took out the Patrol Competition for the season by

a slim margin. Patrol 11 scored well in the Surf Sports and Sunday Race competencies, but also took our first place for the highest average number of 100% Award recipients, so are obviously a truly well-rounded patrol. Congratulations to Greg and Patrol 11.

This season 30 members earned the 100% Award, down from 43 last year and 3 members the Outstanding Patrol Attendance Award (100% less one with a substitute). Importantly, 22 members only needed to have organised a sub' and done a substitute patrol themselves to have earned the Outstanding Patrol Attendance Award. The Club and Lifesaving Committee understand that not everyone can obtain 100% for the season; in fact only about 10% of patrol members achieve that. Making the effort to organise a substitute is a great help when we are managing our patrols and lifesaving obligations. This is an area that other clubs do very well and where Cronulla could do a lot better. Thank you to all the 100% Award and OPAA recipients for your service over the year, and congratulations on your achievement.

In context of the challenges we recognise members face to try and achieve 100%, it is exceptional that this year Bryan Wild achieved 15 consecutive years of 100% Attendance, with Chris Barber continuing to push him to one more year from a position of 14 consecutive years. If anyone is unfortunate enough to be Bryan's 'friend' on Facebook, and therefore know how extensively he travels every year, the effort required to coordinate that around his patrols must be extraordinary.

Finally to our Patrol Person of the year. This award was decided by a process of nominations from each Patrol Captain, the Club Captain, and myself as Vice-Captain. Six candidates were interviewed by the Club President, Club Captain and myself. All of the candidates spoke about how honoured they felt to have been recognised for their efforts, and it was very difficult to split the candidates. The eventual winner was David Dalla-Camina from Patrol 8, who is also the Club's Chief First Aid Officer. Congratulations David.

This patrol season was a typically busy one on our beach. We provided over 9950 total patrol hours and 8135 rostered patrol hours, to keep a recorded 66,694 people safe. We

recorded 70 first aid instances, including 2 where the victim required ambulance transport. We helped 4 lost parents. We rescued 20 people whose day at the beach could have ended tragically if not for our intervention. Most importantly, we recorded 953 instances where we intervened before someone got themselves into serious danger.

Over the season Patrol Captains started using the new Patrol Operations App on an SLISA supplied Samsung Tablet. Some Patrol Captains had more success using the App than others, and that is reflected in the collection of stats for the season. The Lifesaving Committee has provided detailed feedback to SLSNSW to help guide further developments in that area.

As a Lifesaving Committee, our big push is to drive the number of people patrolling to the roster. This season again Rostered Hours attendance was a little under 60%. This relatively low attendance rate creates a lot of challenges rostering patrols. If members patrolled to the roster we could reduce the number of members on each patrol, and increase the total number of patrol teams. This would reduce the number of times a member is rostered to patrol each season.

The Lifesaving Committee and the Club Management continue to put measures in place to enable and encourage members to patrol to the roster rather than at their own will.

Thanks must go to all of our Lifesaving Committee, Patrol Captains, Vice captains and IRB crews, a special thanks to Chris Barber (Club Captain), Robert 'Max' Walker (IRB Captain) and Scott Rofe (Chief Training Officer) and his team of trainers for all your support and hard work once again this last season.

Finally, to our Patrolling Members. Thank you all for your service over the season, especially with consideration of the conditions we needed to operate in. Without your contributions, our Club would not be able to meet our obligations to our various stakeholders, and most importantly, keep the public safe from harm. I hope that you will return next season to continue our life saving service and maintain our club's high standards of Life Saving.

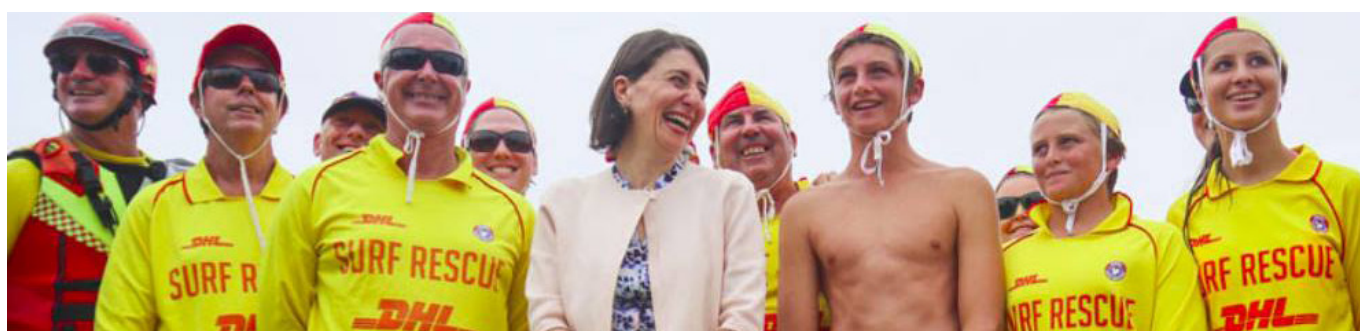

CRAYS LIFESAVING COORDINATOR REPORT

I am pleased to present this report on behalf of all the members, parents and helpers who made the lifesaving and education a success for our nippers this season.

A quick snapshot of the surf education awards shows a total of 561 awards gained. This is against 562 awards for the previous 2017-18 season. The surf education process encourages our nippers to obtain an age specific level of knowledge and skills within the beach and surf environments. To facilitate this, the Cronulla Crays are blessed with a dedicated group of Age Managers, ably lead by Justin Ingram.

Part of the Crays Lifesaving Coordinator role is the management of water safety education. This season, 21 parents gained their Bronze Medallion/Certificate II Aquatic Rescue and Public Safety Award.

There were 24 Nippers who moved through the Surf Rescue Certificate award process this season. Spread over three separate squads these new lifesavers were trained and mentored by David Brukmann, Carlo Villanti and Scott Rofe. Seventeen of these new lifesavers also gained the Radio Operators Certificate.

The Crays held two separate lifesaving days involving well over 500 nippers. These demonstrations included mock rescues and the use of rescue equipment, including the club IRB and branch jet ski. Simulation of Resuscitation and First Aid rounded out the skills days.

I would like to single out Justin Ingram, Jamie Power, Chris Giles, Alana Street and Rodd Sanchez for their efforts in making the Crays education and lifesaving seasons such a success. A very special mention to Michele Cole for her encouragement and dedication to the Crays.

OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

This past year has proven costly for repairs and maintenance, which occurred mainly in the Sports Complex. Repairs to aging plumbing in the boiler room required a reconfiguration that was carried out at a cost of \$10,313. Around Christmas time last year the boiler, which heats the water in both the 25 metre and the baby pool failed, and as most businesses had closed for the Christmas break Hawthorne Heating incredibly were able to persuade the Melbourne based boiler manufacture to reopen its doors and arrange transport by road. Within a few days we had received the new replacement heater and it was installed with minimal disruption to business, and a cost of \$27,290.

Apart from these larger repair costs there were several other repair issues, which have also affected our nett return from the rent. The Sports complex has not aged well over the years and there are concerns regarding its future structurally. Sutherland Shire Council who are the head lessor are in discussion with all surf clubs to establish responsibility for the ongoing repairs and maintenance where clubs receive a commercial income.

Zimzala restaurant is the Club's major asset. Both Ray and Rebecca Nelson and their team work extremely hard to maintain the high standard required to satisfy their large clientele in a very competitive market. The restaurant construction commenced in 2007 and the harsh environment has caused much damage over the years and in particular the year the huge waves smashed through the front door and surrounding walls. All repairs and maintenance have been actioned to the highest standard and most costs have been borne by owner Ray Nelson to keep the clubs most important assets in good repair.

Barefoot on the Beach continue to trade well. Owners Michael and Sue Sotiropoulos and their team have worked tirelessly over the years to build a strong customer base, which is apparent by the long lines of customers waiting to be served fine foods and juices, particularly on hot days.

The Purcell function room suspended trade in March 2018 due to the redevelopment of the Club. All revenue for the above operations is reflected in the Treasurers Report.

These Operations are instrumental in providing a strong financial future for our club and I would encourage all members to support them when an occasion arises.

Thank you to these committee members Phil Hamilton LM, John Bentley LM, Neale Johnston LM, and Bill Lloyd for their support during 2018/19 season.

CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

An interesting year started with the need to move all gear out of the Clubhouse and store securely off site at the end of last season to allow building works to commence. This challenge was met well with virtually all patrol related items stored in the basement or storeroom at the Hungry Point facility. The Club IRBs and motors were largely stored in the garage at Hungry Point with some also kept in Robert Walker's personal storage.

There was a big change for gear inspection at the start of the new season with the Clubhouse unavailable and the facility and grounds at Hungry Point served us well. All of the Cronulla SLSC lifesaving equipment was prepared and presented in the grounds and building at Hungry Point for the annual inspection held on Saturday 1st September 2018. There was an impressive display with the patrol arena and rescue equipment set up in the park area and IRBs and motors set up in the car park areas while the first aid, resuscitation and training equipment was all laid out inside the building.

This equipment included the following items.

- 19 rescue boards
- 36 rescue tubes
- 10 radios
- 2 patrol first aid kits and supplies
- 1 trauma/haemorrhage kit
- 3 spinal boards and straps
- 2 defibrillators
- 4 oxy-viva kits
- 4 suction equipment sets
- 2 stretchers
- 18 resuscitation mannequins
- 3 trainer defibrillators
- 3 IRB
- 5 IRB fuel cells
- 7 outboard motors
- 11 lifejackets
- Patrol area and tent
- Signal flags, evacuation (shark) flags and beach signs
- Miscellaneous items including swim fins, loud hailer, binoculars, patrol bum bags.

The inspection team visited all clubs in the Branch in one day. Starting at North Bondi very early on Saturday morning they arrived at Cronulla early afternoon and then moved on to the other Bate Bay Clubs. The following members helped prepare the club gear for the start of the season - David Dalla-Camina, Rod Dunn, Carlo Villanti, Robert Walker, Graham Burt, Scott Rofe, Daniel Wood and Chris Barber. It was a very successful inspection. Thank you, all.

We were fortunate that Sutherland Council Lifeguards invited us to share their facilities for patrol operations during the season. Inside the Lifeguard facility we stored first-aid, oxy viva and defib kits, spinal equipment, patrol radios, IRB on trailer and motors. Additionally, Council arranged construction of a temporary storage area outside the Sports Complex where we were able to locate rescue boards, tents and the patrol arena. This gave us a secure and safe place to store all of our essential patrol equipment and from which to operate our essential services. All equipment and consumables were moved to these locations immediately after gear inspection, ready for our patrols.



Rod Dunn continued as Radio Officer this past season and ensured that all radios were in top condition and available for patrol and water safety uses throughout the season. David Dalla-Camina continued in the role of First Aid Officer and all first aid equipment and consumables were available and of a high standard throughout the season. Carlo Villanti continued as Gear Steward and kept surveillance on and cared for all equipment through the season.

Lifesaving is our core business and the cost of purchases of new and replacement equipment along with service and repairs is a necessary annual expense. Cronulla always have good lifesaving equipment available. Excluding IRB items, the expenditure to be ready for this past season was a little over \$13,000. This included, board repairs (\$2550), radio servicing (\$430), new radio bags (\$450), oxy-viva and defibrillator servicing (\$787), oxy-viva and defibrillator supplies (\$790), first-aid supplies (\$275) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$335). We also purchased some uniforms, rash shirts and sun hats (\$2270) plus log books and other patrol items (\$570) from the SLSC shop. We purchased patrol caps (\$1500) from Club family company, Fineprint.

The NSW Lifesaving Equipment Grant, funded by the NSW government and distributed by SLNSW is awarded each year in the off season and the 2018 cycle provided us with an oxy-viva kit, rescue swim fins, binoculars and uniforms to a total value of \$2,500. The Australian Government again committed to fund every Club in the country with a grant towards the cost of lifesaving equipment. This season we received \$5,000, which was used to purchase IRB fuel cells, rescue tubes, first-aid kits, a rapid response backpack, a megaphone and a range

of first-aid and resuscitation requirements. Surf Life Saving Australia provided \$2,800 (83 uniforms) as a patrol uniform subsidy. Cronulla RSL once again donated the full cost of an IRB motor. The remainder of the lifesaving expenditure was from Club funds.

As in previous seasons all new Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate awardees had a uniform, patrol cap and sunhat presented at their assessment and all IRB drivers and crewpersons were presented a SLSC rash shirt and peaked cap at their assessment - all to wear while on duty. New Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLSC patrol jacket and peaked cap. The Club continued to subsidise the purchase of PFDs by IRB Crewpersons and Drivers if they wanted to purchase their own. Having our lifesavers fitted properly and safely on the beach and in the water is a high priority.

Cronulla SLSC has a large amount of lifesaving equipment which must always be in good condition and ready for purpose. This past season we had some unique and interesting storage and operational challenges. I believe that the arrangements worked very well and patrols were able to operate as well as they have in the past. Importantly, due to the commitment and application of several Members, I believe that we have been able to provide the Club with the best possible equipment for patrol, water safety, training, competition and community purposes.

See you on the beach at Cronulla – where else would you rather be?

BUILDING DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

This last year has seen the commencement and progression of construction of our refurbished Clubhouse. The Federal Government Grant for the refurbishment of the Clubhouse pushed us towards a construction phase starting immediately after the end of the 2017-18 season and we met that goal.

STORAGE AND CLUB OPERATIONS

Our Office staff were the last people to vacate the Clubhouse on Tuesday 1 May 2018. The required decant and storage or disposal activities were completed and the Club was effectively emptied by Wednesday 2 May 2018.

The processes put in place to store everything had to have capacity for long term storage as well as allowing good access to all items as required for patrols, lifesaving education, surf sports, junior activities, meetings, special events and a range of other activities. These needs were met by availability and utilisation of many diverse areas.

The Bay Shed proved a valuable facility. All Club racing boards, Club skis and two surfboats were initially housed there and used for winter training until some were later relocated for use at the beach and at carnivals.

We were very fortunate to be given approval to temporarily occupy the old NSW Fisheries building at Hungry Point. The first intentions at Hungry Point were primarily for storage, however, it was able to serve a wider purpose of also housing our administration operations. As well as the Office we were able to set up a training room, meeting room and store room on the main floor plus use a large basement storage area and a lock-up garage. All lifesaving equipment, education items, kitchen and bar items, Shark Island Swim equipment, retained furniture, some gym equipment plus miscellaneous items were stored at Hungry Point either permanently or until needed.

Some things just could not be fit into Hungry Point or the Bay Shed but we were able to find a location for them with great assistance from several sources.

Sutherland Council gave approval to locate the Club's storage container and a small fenced compound in the beach park. The container housed and IRB, rescue boards, Crays' activity items and several Club racing mals. The compound housed our craft trailers loaded with skis and boards for training and carnival use.

Sutherland Council also allowed placement of a shipping container at Bonna Point Reserve at Kurnell to store and give training access to our third surfboat.

Robert Walker and several Crays parents were kind enough to locate many items in their personal storage facilities or garages

Mark Simpson invited the Club to use a storage room inside the Sports Complex and another in his warehouse at Taren Point where we were able to store and access Club tents, some nipper craft and the belt reels.

Cronulla Polar Bears supported Club use of their area above the Sports Complex for education, surf sports training, meetings and the important Friday and Sunday social gatherings. All necessary Club equipment was relocated to the Bears' area at the start of summer and moved back to Hungry Point storage immediately the season ended.

BUILDING PROGRESS

The builder took control of the site on Monday 7 May and building demolition commenced on 16 May with the bulk of demolition completed in July. Areas demolished include:

The entire southern wing including the Monro Room, Craft Shed and Nipper Shed.

The Purcell Room northern and southern ends and the ground floor entrance.

Much of the rear spine of the building.

While the shell of the original 1940 heritage building remains intact, almost all of the interior of the building was removed to allow replacement, relocation or refurbishment of virtually every room.





When the demolition was completed, construction started and it was heartening to see something finally going back where the old had existed and the new building starting to take shape. Works completed include:

New concrete floors were laid to all levels of the building.

The Monro wing was rebuilt including the Monro Room, balcony, kitchen, bar, toilets and boat shed.

The Purcell balcony extension was built including the structure for an awning roof.

The internal space of the core heritage building was rebuilt with new change rooms, gym, relocated ballroom and a restored foyer.

An equitable access ramp, new internal and external stairs plus the lift well have all been completed.

All the windows in the original 1940 heritage building have been removed to be completely restored and refitted.

Design for the audio-visual system, the wi-fi system and Purcell balcony awning plus the fit-out design for the kitchen, bars, office and craft sheds have all been finalised and are awaiting installation.

DELAYS

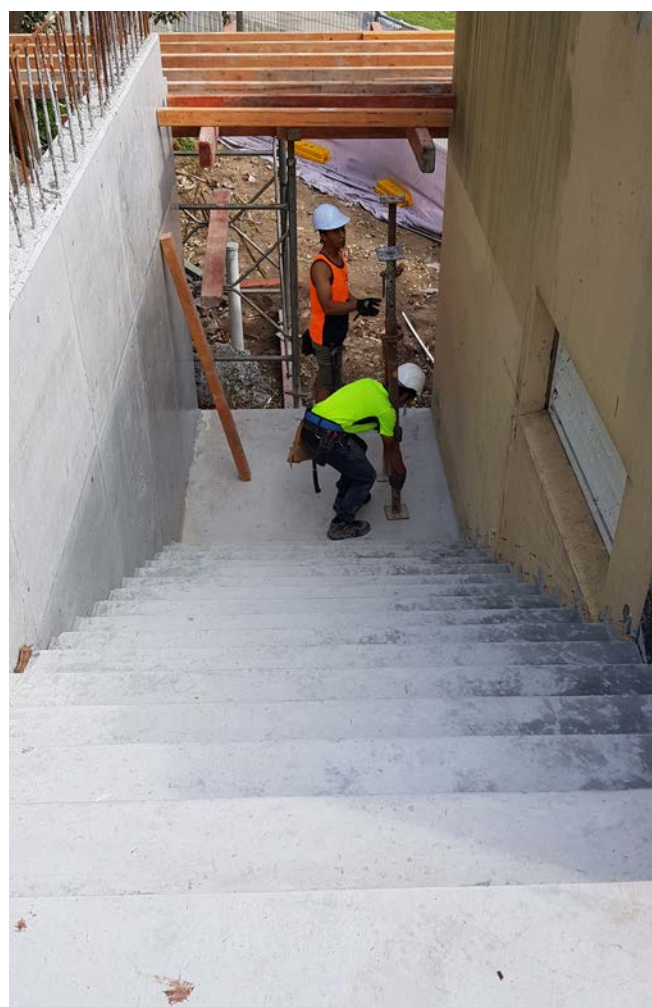
We have experienced significant delays of two types over the course of the project - weather related and latent building condition related.

After a very dry year we suffered extreme rain in May and June 2018 extensively delaying demolition. Further rain delays occurred in September and October 2018 and again in February and March 2019 delaying external construction.

The latent building and structural issues that we have faced have been those expected but hopefully avoided in a building of the age and in the location of ours. These have largely been detection of areas that were structurally unsound due

to either deterioration or concrete cancer type issues. As a result every floor in the building has now been completely rebuilt as have some concrete beams and walls. This work, including documentation and rebuilding, led to delays in the project schedule.

The combined effect of the delays has been the progressive rescheduling of projected completion. The original Practical Completion Date of the end of May 2019 has now been extended several times.



BUDGET

The contracted construction cost is \$5.99 million. The Club included a contingency amount of 10% to cover unforeseen issues so the full budgeted construction costs are set at \$6.59 million.

The contingency has progressively been applied to the costs of a range of variations to the original tender, many of which are anticipated as standard for any building project

while others were less expected. Many have been small or moderate value amounts and some have been larger but they all add up to a significant total.

Some variations have been directed to areas not included in the contract but deemed necessary as we progressed. Some of these were to improve and bring up to a higher standard the presentation of some areas. A decision to refurbish the heritage building windows was made on this basis. Some variation costs were to enhance the modernisation of operations of our Club. The primary example of this was a decision to upgrade the audio-visual and communications systems originally planned.

However, a significant amount has also been applied to resolution of the latent and structural issues mentioned earlier in this report. The extent of these was much larger than anticipated and as a result, as well as causing significant delays, they have also led to significant expense.

When the budget was set it was anticipated that the contingency would be more than adequate to cover all variations. It has become obvious that the challenges we have faced with unexpected issues will now in turn challenge us remaining within budget.

FUNDING AND SUPPORT

Our funding model includes a Club cash commitment, Sutherland Council cash commitment, the Commonwealth grant and a Club financed bank loan.

A Member and Sponsor appeal saw a reasonable early response and the Club continues to seek financial contributions from the wider membership base.

In late 2018 the Club successfully applied for a further amount of \$150,000 from the NSW Government Surf Club Facility Grant to use for Club fit-out of equipment, fittings and furniture.

Sutherland Shire Council has committed heavily to our project. As well as providing funding, Council has also committed to a range of other related areas. These include extensive park and frontage works to the rear of the Club, the construction of a waste management area and the refurbishment of the public change rooms and toilets.



NEXT

It is expected that the project will continue in a timely manner and we will work to the completion of build accompanied by the fit-out of those areas included as part of the construction program.

Once construction has been completed a range of consultants involved in design and construction will all sign off that the works have been done to specifications. Once they have done this the Certifier will review all documentation and building works and provide an Occupancy Certificate.

The commissioning process will then include fit-out of some further areas, return of Club equipment and other items into the new building and the Clubhouse will be ready to be re-occupied by the Members and staff.

In conclusion, I offer my thanks and that of all Club Members to the members of the Building Development Committee Richard Pinker, Daniel Wood, Chris Giles, Stephen Mackay, Doug Murray, Ken Adams and John Suann plus Jenny Pinker, Robyn Cole and Kathy Ford who provide great support from our Club Office. The progress of this project has relied on their commitment of time and effort plus very professional approach.

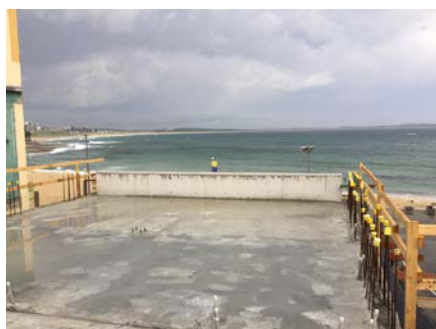


PHOTO & TROPHY COMMITTEE REPORT

CRONULLA SHORT COURSE SURF CARNIVAL

Cronulla SLSC hosted its 8th Annual Short Course Carnival in ideal conditions on Saturday, 17 November 2018.

Notwithstanding that our longstanding carnival date clashed this year with the final round of the Sydney Water series and also the Masters Life Saving World Championships in Adelaide, our carnival remains a major club event on the surf lifesaving sport calendar.

In addition, this season the Club was challenged in the conduct of the carnival because of the unavailability of the clubhouse due to the major building programme underway. Rather than cancel, the Management Committee agreed with Carnival Sub Committee that the carnival would be an excellent club bonding opportunity.

It is with regret that Cronulla SLSC notes the passing of Brian O'Donnell in 2019.

While attending Canterbury Boys High School, Brian found that he was the only one of his mates who was not a member of the surf club. John Salmon and Ernie Johnson persuaded Brian to join whereby Nick Dixon invited Brian to learn to row and also to play in the club's rugby team. He protested that he had never played rugby, but played in the school's successful tennis team, where he was one of the best players.

Brian joined the surf club in September 1952 gaining his Bronze Medallion the following year in November. Being a big lad he was placed in the Junior Boat crew almost immediately. In later years he joked he was convinced, "that to choose boat rowers, possible recruits were lined up against a wall and had house bricks thrown at them. Those who did not think to duck or dodge were then placed in a boat crew!".

When winter came, Brian played rugby with us and developed into a fine second row forward, mainly paired with Ron Harrison-Williams.



We won the Sydney wide competition most years, up through the 18's, 20's and Senior years.

Brian was in the Junior boat crew that won the Australian Championship in 1953/54 in his second year in the club. At the 1954 Bondi Royal Surf carnival, he stroked the Junior boat crew to victory in the presence of Queen Elizabeth II.

He went on in the ensuing years to compete in the Australian and State championships where he had great success with wins and minor placings in most events and participated in Marathon boat races too.

In 1953, Brian followed Frank Jordan and I into the Physical Education course at Sydney Teachers College to a career in High Schools. In 1956/57, the three of us taught year three children to swim in the original Dept. of Education special swimming scheme, with the long-term aim for all children in NSW being able to swim. This scheme expanded over the years from kindergarten classes and up and this original program is still in place today.

At a later stage in his career, Brian transferred to Primary school and with several promotions reached the position of Deputy Principal.

In the surf club Brian was a Patrol Vice-Captain, a member of the committee for three years between 1962-64 and later spent ten years on the History Committee, preparing for the production of the 100 Year Club book - 'The Cronulla Story'. Brian was a tireless member of this project and with the development of the archives room, spent a lot of time there.

Brian was elevated to Life Membership in 2003 - not bad for a tennis player!

Jeff Steer wasn't a member of Cronulla SLSC for a lengthy period of time but during his years of membership he made an enormous contribution to our Junior Activities Group. He enrolled his two sons into our Nippers in the early 80's and was instantly impressed in what he saw with regards to the professional and competent manner in which our junior activities were being conducted on our beach. During that era our Junior Club was experiencing large numbers of youngsters into our ranks and that required dedicated people to be on the beach to contribute to the training and safety of the many participants.



It did not take long for Jeff himself to become involved in the Junior Clubs' activities. He was Team Manager for the Junior Club's NSW State titles in seasons 1985/86 and 1986/87. At that time both our Junior and Senior clubs were very strong competitively and we were achieving good results in carnivals. In season 1986/87 the Junior Club created a record by winning the water point score at every major carnival including the State Titles.

Jeff was highly complemented by the manner in which he carried out his duties at State Team Manager being described as 'magnificent' and 'unparalleled'.

Jeff was praised for his efforts in obtaining a number of worthwhile sponsorships, which were invaluable to our club. He was also credited for introducing a weekly news sheet that was informative and popular with the members.

Jeff then decided to involve himself with the upper management of the Junior Club. He was Deputy Chairman for two seasons 1987/88 and 1988/89 and Chairman for the 1989/90 season. During those years Jeff performed the functions in a hugely professional manner and earned praise and gratitude from his fellow administrators.

To all those who knew Jeff, he was regarded as a gentleman and a true friend. He will be sadly missed. May he rest in peace.

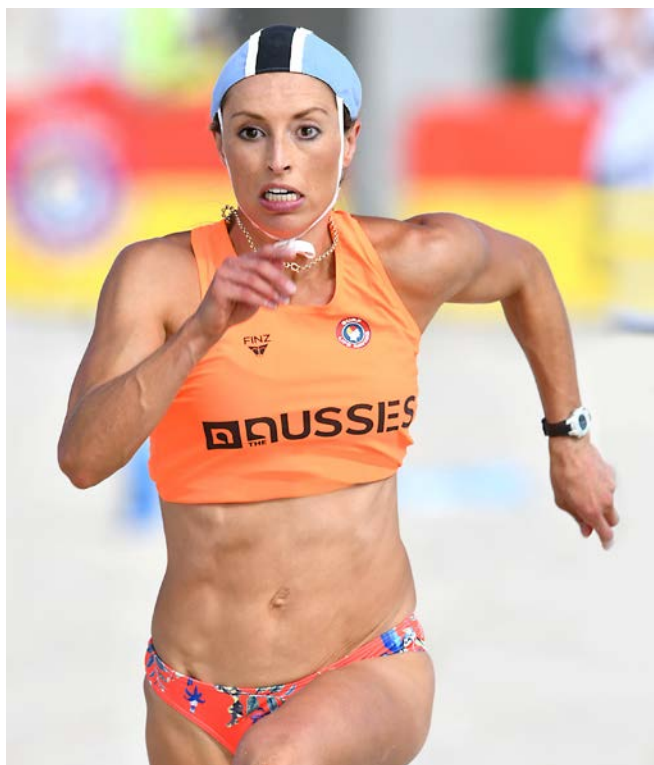

COACHING COORDINATORS REPORT

Firstly I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the Cronulla Coaches this season. Whether it be Guy Telfer, Stuart Braine and Michael Banister at Board training, Michael Roye and Max Walker at Ski, Ryan Hartup at Surf swimming and Alex Fleming at Board and Iron training each week or the Assistant Beach Coach Paul Littlejohn who ran and assisted me at Beach training each week, we had a positive season with increased numbers in each section and are continuing to build depth.

Training numbers were consistently good with an average of 20 plus for the Board section, around 12-15 for the Ski and well in excess of 30 for the Beach section (sessions had to be split into 3 hours to accommodate individual needs). Tempo running training saw the peak in the numbers with presence from all Sections and on occasion, over 50 at training!

PERFORMANCES

At Aussies, Isabellah Walker and Tim Ford were our best and both achieved medals, with Bellah winning Silver in the U17 Flags and despite missing the U17 Beach Sprint (due to National track commitments) she arrived in time for the Relays, anchoring the U17 Women to Gold and the Open Women to Silver. Those teams were Tia La Coste, Bellah Walker, Ellie Pracy and Genevieve Reiprich, and Nicole Jones, Bellah Walker, Tara Stortenbeker and Renee Stortenbeker. Tim took the Silver medal in the U19 Belt Race and placed a very unlucky 4th in the U19 Surf Race too.

Callum Redrup and Nathan Ford also made the Belt Final finishing 5th and 7th respectively in some very tricky surf conditions. Callum also made his first Aussie Board Final and placed 9th as the youngest competitor in the race.

In the Female water events Phoebe La Coste made her first U19 Aussie Ski Final (not bad for a Beach convert) in surf that made most of the ladies shake with fear. Again, Carla Papac showed she has a love for big waves and made the Open Women's Ski Final. Both girls raced well and placed 9th respectively. Ellie Pracy placed 6th in the U17 years Female Beach Flags.

At the Junior Aussies it was the boys that took the honours, winning Cronulla's first Male Beach Relay for 34 years. Ace Haslam passed to Sasha Popovic, who in turn passed to Josh Tattam who had the run of his life to give Max Geronimo the anchor leg to win the Gold. In the U15 Mens Beach Sprint, Ace Haslam took Silver with Max Geronimo placing 7th. The Flags saw all the Cronulla boys reach the Semi-Finals with Sasha Popovic finishing 4th despite an injured groin.

A special mention should go to Nicole Jones who as a Master won the Beach Sprint and placed 3rd in the Beach Flags before joining the Open Relay Team as previously mentioned.

CHAMPION LIFESAVER REPORT

Some of us may be aware that Cronulla has been competing in the Champion Lifesaver competition with the Branch, State and Aussies for some years now. With a small group - Alanna Street, Emma Larssen and Daryn Metti - leading the way we now have seven members training and attending carnivals.

This season we had Alanna Street competing in the Open Female, Emma Larssen in the 30-39yrs Female, and Shana Crowe, Charlotte Flanagan, Zoe Taciak, Crystal Pountney and Zafira Leontsinis in the Under 15 Females.

The Champion Lifesaver event is broken up into three components. The first being a multiple choice questionnaire, testing knowledge of lifesaving and patrol skills, first aid, communications, along with the history and organisation that is SLISA. The second part requires a demonstration of CPR and patient care on both manikin and live patients. Finally a practical component of surf sports activities, including a sprint race, surf swim, board race and rescue tube race.

Training for the event commenced back in December 2018. Practical and knowledge training was held on Tuesday nights in the Polar Bears Room and Hungry Point. Sunday's were dedicated to the aquatic events. The girls purchased lifesaving manuals and uniforms to ensure they gained the knowledge as well as looked every part the Champion Lifesaver.

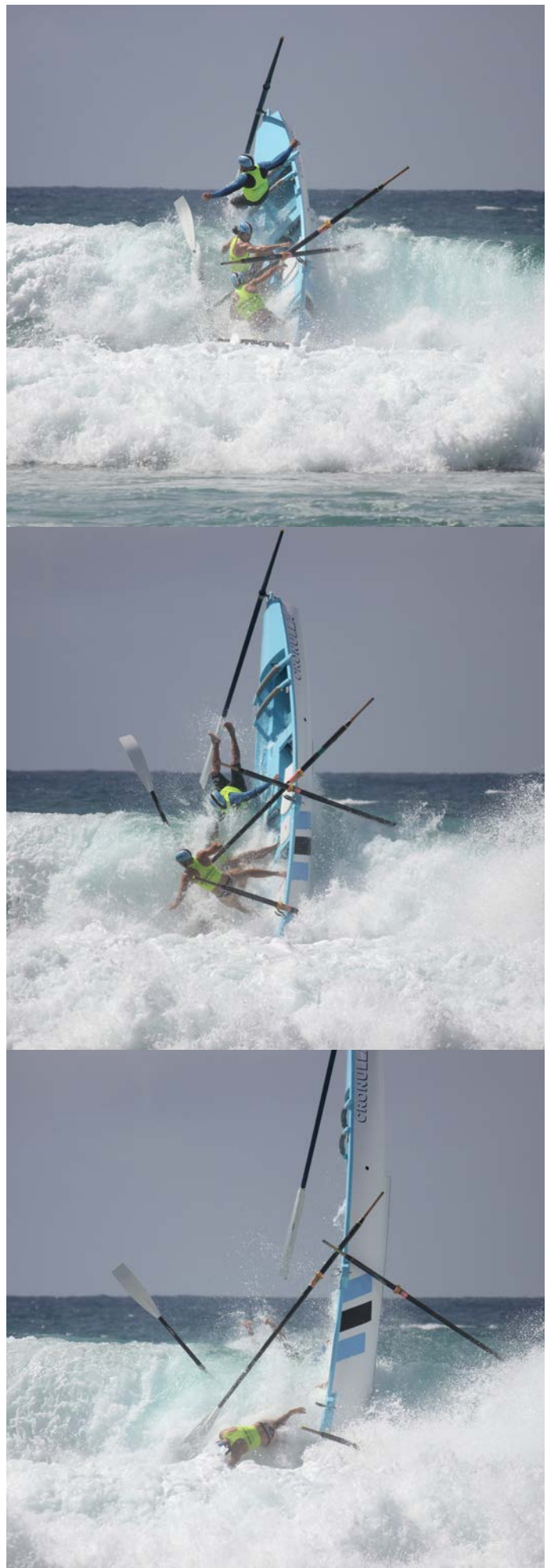

TREASURERS REPORT

It is with great pleasure that I report to you the financial results for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club for the financial year ending 30 April 2019. This year, the club recorded an extraordinary consolidated operating surplus after depreciation of \$3,215,571. On the surface, this represents a tenfold increase in the club's profitability however this increase is solely driven by the receipt of Government Funds for the purposes of the building project. In accordance with the Accounting Standards, these funds have all been recognised in the Profit and Loss as Revenue, however funds spent on the building are recognised as depreciable capital assets rather than expenditure and do not impact on the full year profit and loss. Total building grants receipted to date from the Commonwealth Government, NSW Government and Sutherland Shire Council total \$3.045m. Excluding these grants from the P&L would see an operating surplus of \$170,571.

At this point I'd like to once again thank all levels of Government for their contributions to our building project. The club has been successful in securing \$4.5m of public money to help fund this project, with \$3m from the Australian Government Department of Infrastructure & Regional Development, \$0.5m from the NSW Government's Surf Club Facilities Grant program and \$1.0m from Sutherland Shire Council. These grants are an essential component to our funding for the significant clubhouse redevelopment.

This season has seen significant disruptions to the club's operations across all aspects including on beach and back of house. Despite this, I'd like to commend all sections of the club for their efforts in maintaining a sense of normality. We delivered a number of events including a Sports Lunch, the 200 Club, Cronulla Carnival and Shark Island Swim without a clubhouse contributing vital revenue during a period where other revenue streams – particularly related to functions and bar trade – were disrupted. Overall, non-building revenue was down more than \$300k but strong and consistent spending discipline ensured that our operating expenditure was also reduced by \$167k, significantly reducing the impact to the club's bottom line position. Thank you to all sections of the club for your cooperation.

Construction on the building is now well advanced. Total expenditure attributed to the building asset totalled \$3,408,060 including all payments made to the managing contractor, the club's project manager and all consultants. Of this, the club is holding a retention sum of \$316,391, half of which is due at practical completion and the other half due following the 12 month defect liability period. In addition, the club was forced to replace the boiler at the Sports Complex this year costing the club \$27,086.

A club of our size does not operate without the generosity of our donors and sponsors. I extend my sincere thanks to the club's and SLSA's major partners who are listed elsewhere in this annual report, and formally welcome our newest corporate sponsor – Pulse Property Agents who have joined us on a three year deal supporting the Shark Island Swim event and the Crays. The club's individual donors are also listed in the annual report, and I take this opportunity to thank you. A big thanks also to the Surf Life Saving Foundation for their continued work in fundraising on behalf of the entire Surf Life Saving Movement. The club has once again benefitted from these fundraising efforts receiving a distribution of \$6,078.

The club's major building capital appeal has continued to generate significant donations from members and supporters, with donors included in the full donor list in this report. The club received donations to the building fund during the period to 30 April of \$25,920. This brings total donations to the fund at time of writing this report to \$71,415. This demonstrates the generosity of our members and I thank you all greatly. For those yet to donate, I encourage you to be a funding contributor to this transformational redevelopment before the project is finished. No matter how much you can share – every donation is welcome.

Next year promises to be an exciting one in the history of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club as we open our new club facility and set ourselves up for the future. In working toward this point however, the club will face some extremely tight cash flow periods with our final \$0.75m of Grant Funding only being paid once the project has concluded. While this pinch point has been anticipated it will ensure that very strict spending discipline will need to be applied across all operations. I thank you all in advance for your cooperation and patience.

Finally, I would like to thank Baden Green and his team for the professional approach they have taken to auditing our accounts over the last two years and to the significant financial contribution this has made in that the services have been provided pro bono. Thank you again to the office staff, members of the management committee and my fellow executive committee members. We have achieved a lot through our collective efforts. Looking forward to a big year ahead.

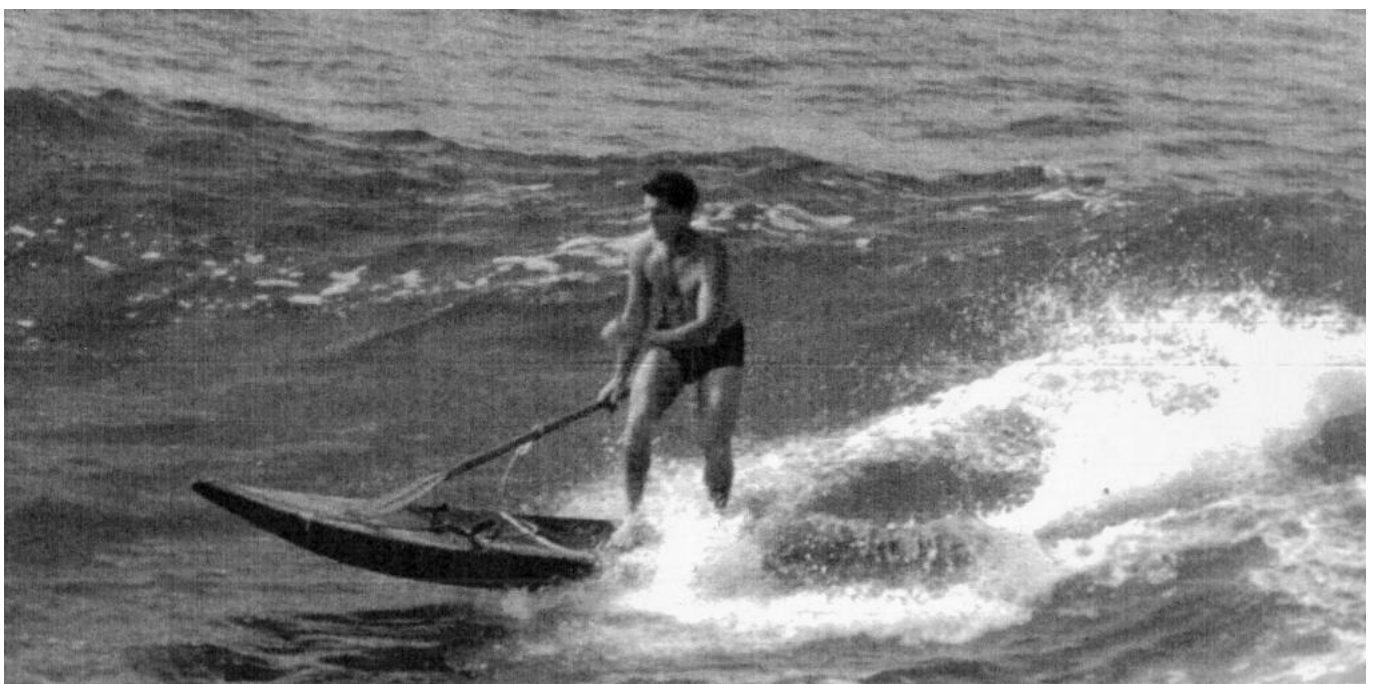

DAVID O'BRIEN OAM – CRONULLA SLSC

A member of Cronulla SLSC for 43 years, David was the first Australian athlete to represent his country internationally in three separate disciplines in the water: pool swimming, surf lifesaving and marathon swimming. After making his first Australian team in 1985, in what is now the Pan Pacific Games, David then specialised in surf lifesaving, winning the Australian Open Surf Belt National championship at the 1988 titles held at Wanda. He was chosen to captain the Australian team for the Trans Tasman Test to New Zealand in 1989. David is also a crewmember for helicopter and offshore marine rescue services.



CHRISTOPHER ALLUM OAM – CRONULLA SLSC

For his service to lifesaving, Chris has spent many years supporting the movement and is one of the most accomplished surf sport athletes in Australia, having enjoyed a stellar career at all levels. Chris represented Australia on 15 occasions including captaining the National team in 2011, and the NSW team for 13 seasons including captaining the State on multiple occasions. Chris received the honour of being SLSA Athlete of the Year in 2008 and was the SLSNSW Athlete of the Year between 2003-2008 and again in 2010. He was also a recipient of the Australian Olympic Committee Medal for Excellence in 2006.
