AUSTRALIAN SURFING HALL OF FAME – JOHN HOLT OAM

On Sunday 24 July 2022, Life Member John Holt OAM was inducted into the Australian Surfing Walk of Fame at Maroubra Beach. The Surfing Walk of Fame pays tribute to the outstanding achievements of Australia's leading surfers and surf life savers. John is a former World, Australian and NSW Iron Man champion who trained at Des Renford Leisure Centre and Maroubra Beach to hone his skills. He is the 1971 and 1974 World Ironman Champion, a two-time Australian Ironman Champion (Junior 1970, Open 1977) and has won 95 out of his 123 Ironman events. John was awarded the OAM in 2014 for his service to surf lifesaving, ironman and triathlon, and in 2019 was inducted into the NSW Hall of Champions. Currently John is one of our Nipper Age Managers and Coaches.



COOK COMMUNITY AWARD – EMMA LARSEN

At the annual Cook Community Awards ceremony held on 4th December 2021, Club Secretary Emma Larssen was an award recipient. The Cook Community Awards provides the opportunity for people to be recognised for their contribution and selfless service in the community. Emma was acknowledged for her volunteer contribution to Cronulla SLSC and life saving involvement including eight years as Honorary Secretary, held numerous sub-committee positions, a current Patrol Vice-Captain, National Medal recipient, Surf Sports Official, International Life Saving Federation Instructor as well as competitor. It was noted Emma is an extraordinary woman who has for many years given up numerous volunteer hours to support Cronulla SLSC, its members and the community. Her work behind the scenes in many aspects of the Club often goes unnoticed.

Our opening celebrations then culminated on Saturday 26th March, when with much pleasure we officially opened the new building with the assistance of Prime Minister of Australia Scott Morrison, NSW Attorney General Mark Speakman and our Sutherland Shire Mayor Carmelo Pesce. As I said on the day, to be able to open the building with these dignitaries, as well as so many of our members and their families who have given lifetimes of service to our great club, made the occasion truly historic – a once in a lifetime opportunity for all of us.

The week leading into that official opening also saw the final dissolving of the Building Development Committee who for over 15 years fully oversaw the consultation, scoping, documentation, funding and delivery of this monumental project with the full range of good times and challenging ones, heated discussions and laughs.

I was truly honoured to serve on this committee for about half of its life and would like to acknowledge and thank all of our members who have given their time to this project: Rob Short (Convenor), Ken Adams, Greg Holland, Steve Mackay, Alan Metti, Doug Murray, Richard Pinker, Lee Schmalfeldt, John Suann, Brad Turner, Daniel Wood. Our club is forever indebted to you for your services.

In resuming operations at the club, the mammoth task of providing access to all of our members began. With the advent of electronic access, all members needed to be programmed into the system and issued fobs. The Executive also took the step of providing a formal induction for all members into the club and also including policy and procedure reminders. While this added a lot of work, it has really enhanced the way that we have been able to support the re-entry of the building. Many people contributed to this, but the largest load was carried by the office staff and the Executive – thank you all for your dedication to this process.

The greatest challenge facing surf clubs over the last few years – COVID-19 placed a continuing shadow over our operations this year. However it was the deteriorating weather and beach conditions at Cronulla and across Australia that impacted this season the most. While Cronulla beach fared better than many, including those

to our north, we did experience significant erosion and changing ocean conditions that made running club activities difficult and patrolling our beach challenging. Despite these challenges, I must commend the quality of our patrols who once again protected the swimming public and did so with skill and perseverance.

What was also pleasing to see was the number and quality of SRC candidates entering our patrols this year. I must commend the entire Crays team who also had to contend with difficult conditions to run nipper activities in this year, and particularly our trainers who have worked hard to provide a strong pathway for these young surf lifesavers – they are our future. And the quality and focus of our lifesaving training was not just limited to our SRC candidates. After a number of years of lower numbers of award trainees, training of many awards increased this year with particular focus on Bronze, ARTC and IRB awards with higher order training also undertaken by many members. What has been most pleasing however has been the number of new trainers to have become qualified and commenced training of our candidates – a huge commitment and one that will ensure we have many trainers to be able to share the load for our increasing number of award candidates.

The wild weather and beach conditions also significantly impacted our Surf Sports Calendar. While training was able to recommence in earnest once COVID restrictions were lifted, the ability for our members to compete was limited. This continued for the entire season and included all of the major championship carnivals. The Sydney Branch Championships were relocated to Little Bay. After some of the most horrendous weather conditions for the youngest nippers to compete in, the remainder of the NSW State Championships (Youth, Opens, Masters) was Cancelled. The bulk of the Australian Championships was relocated to Kirra. These relocations and cancellations were challenging and for many extremely disappointing. But despite these challenges, we sent a bigger squad than recent years

to the Australian Championships where we witnessed some outstanding results that show the growing depth and skills of our members. I was particularly pleased to be able to share time on the beach with our squads at both Kurrawa and Kirra to see Australian Champions crowned, medalists awarded (many in events that we had not expected) and witness some outstanding efforts. Ending the championships to witness both our men's and women's Open Taplin Relay teams competing in finals was a true joy – it has been some time since we have been able to see this.

This year has also seen the commencement of our very first Youth and Women's Mentoring program. This program has seen a number of our members participating in learning and direct mentoring sessions with their mentors and I have seen first hand the growth of these members in their involvement within the club. This is year one of this program, but I am sure that it will be something embraced by our members for many years to come. Thank you to all of our mentors and mentees for your dedication to this program.

As many of you would know, the end of this season has hit me particularly hard with the loss of mum. She was 'one of us' – a stalwart of Cronulla, one of my biggest supporters and I miss her dearly. I could not have gotten through this difficult period without the love of my family – Sonia, Thomas and Cara; Michelle, David, Jackson and Maddi – you guys are my rock. Thank you for always being there. Mum's passing also reminded me how close my other family is – my surf club family. There is something so comforting and strengthening about having such a presence of club members there on the day of her funeral – I truly appreciate your support. And a special call out to the Executive – to Daniel Wood, Suzanne Storrie, Emma Larssen and Chris Barber. The contribution you all make at the best of times is outstanding. The work you did to keep the club moving forward while I was out of action for a bit was exceptional. Thank you.

The end of this season will see the retirement of three of our long serving members of the executive and the ushering in of a new Executive. Daniel Wood will be standing down as Deputy President, Chris Barber stepping down as Club Captain and Emma Larssen standing down from her second stint as Club Secretary. Each of you has been a dedicated servant to the club and your contributions will be felt for many years to come. I personally thank you for your contributions as I know all of the members do.

This year we will also farewell Jenny Pinker from our office. Jenny has worked in the club office for 19 years, serving 6 presidents and countless executive and management committees. She has been a tireless servant to the club going above and beyond to provide the officers with outstanding support. You have become a fountain of knowledge in the operations of the club and its systems and you will be deeply missed. Enjoy your retirement.

This year marked a transition point for our club as we returned to our building that was first opened in 1940, but which had been renovated to cater for the club of the future. On the day we opened the building, I encouraged us all to build on our culture and history and drive towards the future. I close this report with my closing remarks on that day. "Today we celebrate all that is great about Cronulla Surf Club – tenacity, focus, dedication, vigilance and services. May we all continue to be the custodians of our cultures as we pass on this legacy in the hallowed halls of this club for many years to come".

As we started the new season began we were again hit with varying challenges including Covid-19 restrictions, La Niña weather, beach erosion and dangerous surf conditions. However, this did not detract from the fact that we were finally able to occupy our new clubhouse! Excitement grew when we heard whispers of occupancy certificates, craft being gradually moved back into storage and the patrol room ready for flags up. Unfortunately the Nippers start was delayed until November but this ultimately coincided with our new clubhouse soft opening, where we again enjoyed Friday night bar, with a surprise guest appearance by the then Prime Minister, The Hon. Scott Morrison MP. It was an auspicious occasion, which saw plenty of opportunity for "selfies" and relaxed conversation, and I thank the PM for giving of his time to join us.

On Patrol, we concluded with another season of safeguarding our beach successfully by applying our motto of "Vigilance and Service", resulting in no lives lost whilst Patrols were on duty. Well done and thank you to all our patrolling members on the beach as well as those in various support operations roles. Of course, to ensure our patrolling members have the necessary skills to complete their duties, our Trainers and Assessors completed many hours to ensure the completion, maintenance and upgrade of various lifesaving awards. Thank you to our educational team for your dedication.

In the competition arena, we once again saw a range of carnivals unfortunately cancelled due to a variety of reasons that almost seem unbelievable and had everyone asking "what next?" but, after the last couple of years we have come to realise that anything can happen. There were a few standout performances and full results of those competitions that did go ahead are noted within this report but I would like to congratulate our 2022 Australian Champions. Ace Haslam took out the U19 Male Beach Sprint, while club stalwart and Life Member Allan Metti claimed double gold in the 75yrs+ Male Iron-person and 75yrs+ Male Board Race. Fantastic efforts representing the sky blue, black and white.

Further details on our patrolling, education awards and competition results are furnished within this report and I thank those section heads that have forwarded those details as requested in a timely manner.

As per my previous reports I find that reading through submissions gives me the opportunity to tell stories and highlight other events that have not been mentioned. Rather than reiterate what you may read on other pages, I hope to present other aspects of club members' accomplishments and endeavours.

They achieved some amazing results for their teams most notably Ace who won 3 from 3 in the sprint event. Well done!

On the 26th March 2022, we finally saw the official opening of our new clubhouse. After nearly four years when the barricades went up and the walls came down, it was a memorable day that saw club members, politicians, invited guests and members of the public, come together to celebrate the new building. A stand out along the Esplanade in Bate Bay, we look forward to welcoming members, guests and the broader community, to come together to socialise, discuss and exchange ideas, and in general enjoy what the facility has to offer. This was exactly what some past R&R members did the evening before the opening. An event organised by Doug Murray and Barry Ezzy,

saw a reunion of old surf club mates who, I am sure, discussed old escapades and reminisced on the past whilst in the presence of the new.

For the third season in a row, Cronulla SLSC nominee for Patrol Captain of the Year once again won the Sydney Branch Awards of Excellence title. CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

To my fellow Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club members, this is my report for my sixth and final season as Club Captain & also contains some reflection on the last six seasons.

Another turbulent season due to COVID, with more restrictions and severe weather impacting our beaches, which not only affected patrolling and competition but attracted additional people to our beach given that most the other Bate Bay beaches were continually closed. Believe it or not, we even experienced a tsunami! See "Beach Closed" sign pictured - positioned by Lifeguards due to their frustration with swimmers disregarding the sign and entering the water. We also had the highest rainfall in years, unprecedented in records dating back to 1859.

The State Championships were partially cancelled due to excessive rain, poor water quality & debris in the water. Just when we thought we had been thrown enough curve balls, we had a huge & damaging storm (like the 1974 storms) which washed away half of the Bate Bay beaches. This severe beach erosion then reoccurred a few times in following months. Even with all that, you will agree that Cronulla is still the most beautiful beach in Bate Bay.

Half my term as Club Captain has been without a club house. Obviously, this has created many additional challenges. Challenging keeping our gear secure and maintained, patrol members personal belongings safe, and operating with gear spread across different locations. On the positive side, we strengthened our relationship with the Lifeguards through sharing their space and proved to ourselves that we were able to demonstrate our strengths by operating in such minimalistic settings and facilities.

As a lifesaving group we worked together to overcome these challenges and continued to deliver our lifesaving capabilities for the community and most importantly, no lives lost. The monthly Life Saving Committee meetings have been extremely positive with a lot of valuable information shared between captains and committee members. Beyond their patrol duties, attending these meetings is a key additional duty of a patrol captain.

This season we re-occupied our amazing new clubhouse with much excitement, positiveness, and vibe. This included holding our presentation night in the new Ballroom. We saw a few changes to the management committee positions, which improved committee engagement, bonding, positiveness, and progress.

Occupying our new club house along with rising interest rates put budgetary pressures on our club, however, we made changes to accommodate these pressures showing the professionalism of our executive and the flexibility of our members. Even

Our lifesaving section was again hugely successful with strong, well-attended and highly experienced patrol members. Handing over the reins, I feel our patrols are at their best. Thanks to every patrolling member and the Life Saving Committee including our Patrol Captains, Vice Captains, IRB Drivers / crew, IRB Captain Max Walker and IRB Vice-Captain Graham Burt. Thank you all for your commitment, diligence, and expertise.

Special mention to Gear Steward -Rob Short, Radio Officer -Rodney Dunn and Chief Training Officer & First Aid Officer -David Dalla-Camina for their setting up of the new patrol room and first aid facilities.

As part of our lifesaving succession planning, 4 new Patrol Captains were onboarded - Rich Hedley, Chris Hodge, Rodd Sanchez and Jared McLachlan. All these new captains did an excellent job in their first season and built on their patrol's strength and culture.

Welcome to our new Vice-Captain Scott Jackson who did a great job in his new role engaging all members especially the youth and will be progressing into the Club Captain role next season.

Congratulations to our 39 patrol members who gained 100% attendance including 6 outstanding attendance patrolling members.

Winning Patrol this season was no.12 led by Patrol Captain Scott Jackson.

Our lifesaving training section boomed thanks to our new Chief Training Officer -David Dalla-Camina and Deputy Training Officer -Rodd Sanchez. In my term, we experienced a few challenges in the training environment (no dedicated training room, no

extraordinary training record scrutiny by Branch and CTO changes) these were addressed and resulted in a positive outcome. We did over 180 recognised awards which was an increase of nearly 60 awards (40% increase), ranked 3rd in Branch and first in Bate Bay. We have nearly doubled the number of our Trainers and Assessors. The Training group ran a few community lifesaving awareness courses including schools, Silver Salties, and others. Our new Training Room is state of the art. We also held multiple Branch training sessions at our Club.

The high number of SRC's this season really added to our patrol strengths with most patrols receiving 2 to 3 new SRC's. Some of these SRC's even completed significant rescues.

The Patrol Person of the year was Bronessa Smith and as you can see it was a tough line-up. Patrol Person nominees were - Tania Cooper, Greg Oldfield, Richard Pinker, Rebecca Ingram, Marcus Kennedy, Phil Cole, Georgia Turner, Jackie Bryant and Rob Short Junior. Congratulations Bronessa & all nominees.

We entered multiple individual and team award nominations into the SLSS Branch Awards of Excellence. This saw us winning the Surf Lifesaver of the Year - Chris Barber, Patrol Captain of the Year - Glenn McLachlan (second year in succession), Official of the Year - Carlo Villanti and the Patrol Efficiency award for Cronulla/Sutherland. Other nominations were for Jnr Development Team of the Year - Cronulla U13 sprint team, Community Education Program of the Year -Silver Salties, Trainer of the Year -Rodd Sanchez, Volunteer of the Year - Rob Short and Youth Surf Life Saver of the Year - Nicolas Piriz.

Sunday Surf Races continued to get better and better and provided Sunday entertainment for most members. Sunday Surf Races are one of the main drivers that brings club members together from a competitive and also social perspective. Special thanks to life members Darryl and Wendy Ward.

The Coaching and Competition section went from strength to strength, with athletes including Jay Furniss, Jackson Turner, Ace Haslam, Zoe Duchet-Catherine, Carla Papac & Lachlan Brinkley to name a few. Our coaching structure again was very strong with thanks to super coaches Ryan Hartup, Mark Redrup, Guy Telfer, Stuart Braine, Nikki Jones, Paul Littlejohn, Michael Roye, Scott Allen, Ryan Wood and Pat Burke.

Our surfboat section led by Pat Bourke continued to build, ensuring inclusion and involvement at all levels. We also participated in the Gotcha4Life 24 hour rowing marathon for mental health awareness, which all sections got involved in.

All these initiatives were supported by the new Coaching and Competition chairperson Pat Burke who also further developed our Coaching and Competition strategy. Next year I look forward to seeing a further upward trend with new and returning competitors to our club.



As a club, we are unique and so fortunate to have and utilise the Gunnamatta boat shed as a resource which no other club in Bate Bay has.

This season Mark Redrup, through his school Port Hacking High School, again built on his sports / lifesaving program by initially targeting a learn to surf ski program. This program led to a significant increase to our cadets and under 18 competitors which built further on our teams and patrols. Great seeing these smiling young faces being injected into surf lifesaving at their age and finding new skills and talents.

Next season we are excited about re-kindling, after many years, our Champion Lifesaver Program which will be driven by Rodd Sanchez. This is primarily being driven for lifesaving development.

Due to the stubbornness of the W.A. Premier and luckily for us, Aussies were held at Broadbeach. Ace Haslam won gold in the U19 Sprint at the Australian Championships along with some other great results by the CSLSC Aussies team. Competitors who won the gold medal last year returned to try and do it again. Once again, where we stand out is our team camaraderie proudly supporting the sky blue, black and white.

Once again tough conditions at Aussies with the weather and swell but our competitors are some of the best. The weather changed halfway through Aussies and the beach events were held at Broadbeach,

surf boats at Bilinga and the water events at Kirra. Even some the team coaches, section heads, and competitors were unfortunately struck down with Covid which challenged the team. We had a new team manager this year Glenn Carter taking on the role and doing a fantastic job. He is now known to the competitors as Glenn as opposed to Georgia's father. Thank you to everyone who made this event happen.

Each report I've tried to share a special moment, and this is one of my favourite stories. This members name is Nicholas Piriz, better known as Nick and he lives in Auburn and was nominated this season for the SLSS Junior Lifesaver of the year award. Nick was watching a TV show about Surf Lifesaving. He asked his father if he could do nippers and learn more about surf lifesaving because watching the show really got him excited and passionate to branch out into something different. So, Nick a few years ago now, badgered his dad to take him to Cronulla and enroll in nippers where he can learn more about lifesaving and experience surf conditions. Swimming in Auburn is not a common sport & Nick extended himself out of his comfort zone.

I witnessed Nick growing into a mature young man, developing improved athleticism, communication skills, getting involved in community, mixing well with other kids & adults, demonstrating leadership qualities by encouraging his peers & himself. When starting nippers, he was challenged and became overwhelmed, however, he never quit or gave up. His age manager Cody Gaddes (an ex-nipper himself and an inspirational person) helped him immensely to learn new skills and stick it out. Nick went on and received his Surf Rescue Certificate and then his bronze medallion and became active in patrols. Nick has not missed one patrol achieving 100% patrol attendance travelling either by car from auburn or catching two trains to Cronulla (catching a train from Auburn to Cronulla one-way takes 1h 42m) plus walking time to and from the stations. The driving distance between Auburn to Cronulla Beach is 32 km and takes approximately 1 hr on a good day. This is a huge commitment not to mention the cost. A great story and Nick has gone on to so many other things in the club including ski paddling and surf boat rowing.

To our nippers and the future of our club, well done. The Nipper executive worked as a cohesive team led from the top by Matt Aitken.

This year I was honoured to have an Achilles inflatable rescue boat (IRB) named the "Chrisby Barber. Thank you so much.

There are some amazing people who work and volunteer in our club. They all pitch in and make things work which is what clubs are all about.

VICE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

To my fellow Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club members,

This is my first report as Club Vice Captain, and it has been a pleasure and an honour to take on this role for the 2021/2022 season.

This season once again has been a challenging one. Starting with Covid-19 lockdowns, limited access to the building, Sydney's wettest summer for 30 years and large swells that have eroded out beaches, it has been testing to our members. However, through these challenges I am very pleased to say that our members once again have risen to the occasion and overcome the difficulties thrown at them this season.

As a lifesaving group this season, we have worked incredibly hard to ensure that Cronulla Beach has remained one of the safes beaches in Sydney. Our members have stayed highly skilled through the increase of new awards and high proficiency numbers and I can proudly say we have been successful in this area. Our lifesaving community meets once a month, discussing current lifesaving events, patrolling moments and reports from each lifesaving sections.

For the second year running Glenn's Quiz has educated our patrolling leaders on current lifesaving event, upkeep of skills and lifesaving knowledge, which our patrol captains have then taken to the patrolling groups. Glenn's quizzes have been a great addition to our lifesaving meeting agenda, and I would like to thank Glenn McLachlan for this great addition to our meetings.

Once again, our Lifesaving section can be proud to say that zero lives have been lost at Cronulla beach while our patrols have been in operation this season. The success of our patrols was acknowledged at the Sydney Branch Awards with Cronulla winning the Cronulla/Sutherland Patrol Operations Efficiency Area award.

As per previous years our lifesaving groups have continued to strengthen their relationship with the Lifeguards by operating as a cohesive team; this relationship keeping our beach safe over the 2021-2022 season.

The season kicked off with uncertainty on the patrolling requirements through the lockdown. However, we started our patrolling season as per our lifesaving charter with the raising of the flags on the on Saturday 18th September. Due to our Covid-19 restrictions, our patrols were limited to 6 members who had to be within the Sutherland Shire LGA and be fully vaccinated. The patrols still needed to cover the minimum advanced awards of Silver Beach Management, IRB driver and crew and ART. A big thank you to all those members who patrolled through that time that Covid-19 numbers where quite high.

Although we started the season off with limited patrol capacity, our patrols were able to access our new Patrol room prior to the club opening to our members. Thanks to Rob Short Senior, Rodney Dunn and David Dalla-Camina for setting up the new patrol room prior to the season starting.

This season our members supported our fellow National Parks Clubs with our members undertaking

a patrol at Garie Beach to help our national park clubs fulfill their charter, This patrol was also limited to a capacity of 10 members. The Garie day was successful with a great balance of young and old members which provided a well-rounded skill base of water competences and lifesaving experience. The weather turned up that day with what felt like one of the only sunny days we had all season and there were no incidents to report for the day. I would like to thank those members who attended; myself, Bradley Dunn (VC) Rob Short Senior, Rodney Dunn, Stewart Dunn, Rob Short Junior, George Palamidis, Mitchell Pountney, Crystal Pountney.

This season we had Rich Hedley, Chris Hodge, Rodd Sanchez and Jared McLachlan take on new leadership roles as Patrol Captains. Each of these captains has brought a wealth of experience and knowledge to their patrol groups and the lifesaving committee. All four of these captains did an outstanding job and we hope to see them continue in these roles next season.

It has been a long-standing tradition in our club that while our competitors are away competing at the State and Aussie titles, we hold volunteer patrols in those weekends. Firstly, I would like to thank all the members who volunteered for those weekends with a lot of these members doing more than one patrol shift. I also would like to especially thank the patrol captains and advanced award members who ensured we maintained full strength patrols. In saying this, we did struggle with numbers and on a few patrols only just met our minimum obligations. Next season if volunteer number are low again for these weekends, we will review and look at adding these patrols back into the standard patrol roster.

The Patrol Competition this season was incredibly competitive as per previous seasons. The competition is based on Patrol attendance, training and upkeeping advanced awards, committee meeting attendance, Patrol Surf Sports competition, the First Aid competition and Sunday surf race attendance. The

Patrol Surf Sports competition was hotly contested this year with Chris Hodge's patrol winning the day. The Patrol competition is a great way for us to assess the patrol groups and look at the areas we can help improve all the patrols for the next season.

However, there can only be one winner and this season the Winning Patrol was Patrol 12 who won the overall Patrol Competition. Patrol 12 won 3 of the 7 competition categories and finished 2nd in 3 of the other ones. Congratulations to Patrol 12.

This season we had 9 great nominations for Patrol Person of the Year, each one of the candidates truly represented the best of our patrol members this season. Both Chris Baber and I spent an evening interviewing these candidates and this year there was a clear winner who met the criteria and stood out in the interview. This year's Patrol Person of Year was Bronessa Smith. Congratulations Bronessa.

With the easing of Covid-19 restrictions this season, the lockdown ending and our members playing catchup for 2 years of holidays and socialising, we still managed to have 41 patrol members gain their 100% attendance and an additional 3 outstanding attendance patrolling members. Congratulations to those 44 members.

We also nominated seven members for branch awards. The night at the ICC was a great night where we acknowledged the contributions of our lifesavers across the branch. In the Life Saving section we took out 2 awards, Glenn McLachlan won the Patrol Captain of the Year for his outstanding leadership of Patrol 6 and his contribution to Lifesaving at our club. Our Club Captain, Chis Baber received the very prestigious award of Lifesaver of the Year for his contribution to our Club, District and Branch. Congratulations Chris and Glenn and very well deserved.

Under the guidance and leadership of our Lifesaving Coordinator, Rodd Sanchez we continued our greater focus on learning and developing new skills in relation to lifesaving and water safety. During the season all of our Under 14s gained their Surf Rescue Certificate and went onto patrol for CSLSC. 34 kids in total, the most of any Bate Bay surf club, with many going on to conduct rescues in their first season of patrolling. A special mention and thank you to our experienced trainers Carlo Villanti and Rodd Sanchez.

We once again conducted our Blue Fins program over a multi-week program. Under the leadership of Yvette Larkin, Lisa Dietrich, and Georgia Carter, our group continued to develop their skills in a fun inclusive environment for all. The increasing opportunities for children and young adults to participate meaningfully in inclusion initiatives across nipper and carnival activities is an important area of focus for surf lifesaving.

At a competition level our season was again heavily impacted due to COVID factors, surf conditions and water quality. Some carnivals were cancelled prior to commencement and some were cancelled midway through the event!

Unfortunately, the Branch Age Championships were impacted again through relocation of some events to alternative locations and cancellation of other events. Consistent with previous years this was not an ideal lead-in to State Age Championships for our competitors. But we are still very proud of the results that our Branch competitors achieved.

The NSW State Championships were held at Manly in some of the most horrendous weather conditions you will experience at a carnival. Cronulla competed strongly with Scarlett Tracey and the U13G Beach Relay teams picking up Silver Medals before the event was cancelled early on Saturday due to water quality and general conditions – a shame for many of the 13s and 14s water competitors who I know were eyeing off a medal haul. For the first time in many years, we held a Back to Cronulla event at our club on the Sunday afternoon to recognise the achievements of all of those that attended State – a great event that should continue for many years to come.

One of the season highlights for some of our competitors was the opportunity to attend and compete at Aussies in Queensland. The first time the U13s have been included in Aussies. And for the 18 kids we took to Youth Aussies the results were outstanding with 3 competitors making individual finals, 4 teams making finals and the U13G competing in the U13/U14 age category reaching the

semi-finals of the beach relay. With the one of the more awesome moments being reserved for when Jackson Turner and Lachlan Brinckley won silver in the Board Rescue – it's also worth noting the Board they used was one donated by Neil Swane.

Congratulations to all of our competitors throughout the year who donned the famous sky blue, black and white cap, and competed to the best of their ability.

During the season our coaching teams spent many hours training our nippers, including running a school holiday nipper camp. Jay, along with Bano, Ryan, Goodie, and the assistance of a number of our cadet athletes, ensured our competitors had access to a wealth of knowledge and experience from which to further develop their water skills. On the beach, Nicki put together a great program for our beach athletes and we saw real improvements as a result of her input and insights.

Congratulations to Scarlett Tracey, Jackson Turner, Lachlan Brinckley, the U13G Beach Relay team of Zahli Blattman, Sabina Di Battista, Ella Minchew and Ivy Timpson who were all recently nominated for Surf Lifesaving Sydney awards.

Thank you to the Club Executive team, led by our President, Chris Giles, for their continuous support of the Crays. Many thanks to Jenny and the office team for the countless hours spent on carnival, registration and administration requirements for the Crays. And to Jane and Nicole for all of their work with the apparel - you continue to make us look awesome in our Cronulla colours no matter where we go.

A big thank you to Richie Hedley, Tamara Summers, Russell Brinckley, Ali Sanders, Sam Schneider and Rodd

Sanchez for their contribution throughout the season - I believe the team did an outstanding job. In particular I'd like to acknowledge Tamara whose time on the Crays Exec is coming to an end. Her tenure and commitment has spanned 6 seasons and 3 chairpersons! Thank you Tamara from all of Cronulla surf club.

I once again humbly thank the broader water safety team for their ongoing support, commitment and enthusiasm. It is this that enables our children to train, compete and develop their skills. Fundamental skills, so they may contribute fully to the core function of the "Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club" into the future, and that is, saving lives.

This season we further developed our close working relationship with the Lifesaving Committee and respective Patrol Captains. Our Sunday mornings on the beach offer a distinctly "one club" feel, further evidenced by the inclusion of some of our more capable nippers in the Sunday Surf Races. In addition, we continued to build on our relationship with the Sutherland Shire Council Lifeguards, whose willingness to both assist and accommodate, any way they could, made far easier the running of nippers in often trying beach conditions. I would like to warmly thank them for working with us so closely on Sunday mornings. These relationships make Sunday morning nipper activities far easier to organise and indeed possible.

As per last season, the Water Safety Team ran a split session each Sunday. This meant our water safety numbers were spread thinly again across the two time slots. We continue to be grateful for the large group of parents from the younger age groups who continue to very ably provide Water Safety to the Nippers. I am particularly excited as some of these parents will now span across the two sessions next season. I thank some of the long standing parents who will bow out as their children transition away from nippers and into other areas of the club.

This season the water safety team continued to focus on maintaining both compliance and strong well-delineated process in an environment where we drew on a core group of volunteers week in week out. We

are always excited to be joined by new team members as they complete their Bronze and SRC. The new team members who joined us this year have again placed us well, and strongly aided us in meeting our water safety obligations. Looking forward to next season we will continue to look to build our numbers from parents of younger age groups as well as provide the opportunity for our cadets to remain actively involved in the Nipper function of the Club through assisting with Water Safety.

For fear of omission I shall not name them, but I would like to thank those who: arrived early to get the beach ready; got boats ready; set courses; drove the IRB; swum around the course numerous times; encouraged concerned kids; paddled boards; helped ashore those who felt they couldn't make it; counted kids in and out of the water; started races; attended countless training sessions; fulfilled our requirements at carnivals; packed up long after others had left. You make me proud to be part of such a dedicated, productive and above all selfless team.

EDUCATION AND LIFE SAVING COORDINATOR REPORT

In my second year in this position, it was great to see the progression of all the Cronulla nippers. It is always fabulous to see the happy faces of the nipper kids, parents and age managers on out Sunday morning gathering on Cronulla beach. As always my thanks goes out to all the hard working individuals and families that come together to make our club an organisation of surf lifesaving excellence. The season was somewhat smoother with the use of our new clubhouse, which was well received by kids and parents.

Gratitude goes to all the age managers, assistants age mangers and water safety, who kept surf education as a constant agenda every week. There were countless hours shared to help our nippers kids meet their surf educational needs and develop up and coming lifesavers. We are blessed to have many lifesavers in our ranks to help with real life scenarios and practical CPR mannequin work both on the beach and clubhouse. Our mission is still to regularly practice the basic essential skills, tube and board rescue skills, and signal communication.

We are happy to report that a total of 549 (up from previous year 491) nippers completed their surf education during the 2021-2022, which was an outstanding achievement.

The awards for Surf Education are breakdown as follows:

- 82 x under 6 completed Surf Play 1
- 105 x under 7 completed Surf Play 2
- 76 x under 8 received Surf Aware 1 Certificate
- 85 x under 9 received Surf Aware 2 Certificate
- 55 x under 10 received Surf Safe 1 Certificate
- 53 x under 11 received Surf Safe 2 Certificate
- 58 x under 12 received Surf Smart 1 Certificate
- 35 x under 13 received Surf Smart 2 certificate



During the season we were proud to train, assess and announce that 34 new Surf Rescue Certification (SRC) patrolling members, who entered into the ranks of Cronulla patrolling members. These young adults completed their nippers journey and transformed from under 14's to gain their Surf Rescue Certificate who were trained by Carlo Villanti and Rodd Sanchez. They performed admirably during their training and assessment and made Cronulla surf club proud. The new SRC's are now patrolling regularly throughout the season and some have shown their learnt skills by participating in real water rescues on patrol.

The next season, brings a change to the look of surf education. After a few years in development and testing, they will be implemented into the next season. The age groups will still be present and we will see the introduction of stages. The new look Age Guides are designed to be a 'one stop shop' for an age manager to deliver the requirements for the specific junior age group award. Guides contain lesson plans, which have been developed as a simple, practical, and easy to understand way to deliver the learning outcomes for the particular topic. They are in a step by step format with content support and options for delivery where necessary, is looking at creating scenario-based training which incorporates surf skills and first aid skills, utilising mannequins in the training scenarios.

We once again had Lisa Dietrich join Georgia Carter and myself as the main volunteers this season with little additional water safety volunteers required due to our low numbers. I'd like to once again take this opportunity to thank Georgia and Lisa for their energy, commitment, care and surf skills.

We aim to continue to foster collaborative relationships with our neighbouring Bate Bay inclusion groups next season and invite more inter-club interactions. We look forward to a returning season and welcome any new Bluefins members and volunteers who may wish to join/assist our group next season, so spread the word.

CLUBHOUSE OPENING COMMITTEE

At the request of President Chris Giles, I was honoured to be asked to convene a Sub Committee to arrange the Official Opening of the new Club House.

The Sub Committee consisted of Patron, Life Member and former President Ken English, Honorary Secretary Emma Larssen, Crays Chair Matt Aitkin, Life Member Wendy Ward, Publicity Officer Melissa Irwin, and Club Member and Council Lifeguard Jack Robertson.

The first meeting of the Sub Committee was on 6 June 2021 and included the Convenor of the Finance and Sponsorship Sub Committee, John Zagame and the Convenor of the Photo and Trophy Sub Committee, Paul Larssen. Both Convenors were kept informed of the Opening Sub Committee's deliberations during the year.

The Club's Executive had decided that the Official Opening would be conducted by the Prime Minister and Federal Member for Cook, Hon Scott Morrison. Discussions commenced with the Prime Minister's Electorate and Canberra Offices to work towards an Opening date of 26 September 2021. The rest is, as they say, history, as the pandemic, the Prime Minister's busy schedule and the uncertainty of an election date, moved this date, not once, not twice but three times to finally arrive on a locked-in date of 26 March 2022.

The invitation to the Prime Minister was made given Scott's unswerving interest and support of the Club, its Members and all its activities. As the Member for Cook, Scott had secured a grant of \$3m to support the Club's own finances and the other significant financial support from the NSW Government and Sutherland Shire Council. The Club recognised the support of both these organisations would not have been achieved without the leadership of the State Member for Cronulla and NSW Attorney General, Mark Speakman and Council Mayors Steve Simpson and Carmelo Pesce. The Club also recognised the support of the building project and opening by Council Deputy Mayors Michael Forshaw and Carol Provan.

The Sub Committee discussed many options for the involvement of the entire Club membership, including the Crays, however, the uncertainty of the opening date and the pandemic forced our hand to organise a relatively small, but appropriate, Official Opening.

The best decision that the Sub Committee made was to invite Emma Larssen and Jack Robertson to be the MCs for the event. This departed from the Club's long tradition of having some of the Club's best claimed orators as the MC. The Sub Committee also acknowledged the normal practice of most public and private events by inviting a member of the local indigenous community to provide a Welcome to Country ceremony. This was provided by Aunty Maxine Ryan from the La Perouse Community through their close association with Bate Bay.

Emma and Jack provided a flawless guide for the proceedings, with Emma describing the long path supervised by Presidents Holland, Short, Pinker and Giles to arrive at the Official Opening. Emma and Jack then simply, but with distinction, introduced each of the

speakers: Mayor Pesce, Attorney Speakman, President Giles, and the Prime Minister.

The President gave an excellent summary of the challenges of the building process, acknowledged the support of Governments, the Council and particularly the time and effort of the Building Sub Committee, led by Rob Short. The President then graciously introduced the Prime Minister.

The Prime Minister proudly acknowledged that Cronulla is the best surf lifesaving club in the world, commenting that in his travels across Australia, he always felt welcome in any surf life saving club. He also acknowledged the work of the previous Presidents, the current President, and the Building Sub Committee to finally get to the Official opening. The Prime Minister then unveiled the Official Opening Plaque. He graciously acknowledged and invited for the official photograph along with the President Giles the Patron Ken English, Emeritus Patrons Barry Ezzy, and Geoff Forshaw and the three former Presidents.

To thank the Prime Minister and all guests Emma and Jack invited the Patron Ken English, along with the U14 Crays Captains, Lucy Aitken, and Lachlan Turner to speak which they all did in true Cronulla fashion, particularly Lucy and Lachlan.

At the conclusion of the ceremonies being wrapped up within an hour, dignitaries and guests then moved around the Club to enjoy refreshments and comradery.

At the Management Committee Meeting on 19 April 2022, I had great pleasure in thanking the Official Opening Sub Committee for its work over the past nine months and the great success on the Opening day. I then moved a motion to dissolve the Sub Committee and acknowledge their contribution for a milestone event. As part of that motion, I also moved that the Building Sub Committee be thanked for their contribution and work. I recommended that the Club acknowledge the Building Sub Committee with an appropriate recognition event later. The Management Committee unanimously accepted and adopted the motion.

I thank the Executive, the Management Committee, Club Members, the Sutherland, NSW and Federal Governments and their representatives, and the surf lifesaving community for their support.

Here ends a most significant chapter in the history of our Club.

CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

There was no formal Gear Inspection by an external team prior to the 2021-22 season. On Saturday 4th September 2021 all surf lifesaving clubs in NSW performed a self audit on lifesaving equipment. Equipment still had to be prepared for the season and was made available on that date to be inspected by the Club Captain, Chief Gear Steward and IRB Captain. Thanks to the excellent preparation work done by our team all equipment was ready and fully functional.

This equipment included the following items.

- 19 rescue boards
- 36 rescue tubes
- 10 radios
- 2 patrol first aid kits and supplies
- 1 trauma/haemorrhage kit
- 3 spinal boards and straps
- 2 defibrillators
- 4 oxy-viva kits
- 4 suction equipment sets
- 2 stretchers
- 18 resuscitation mannequins
- 3 trainer defibrillators
- 5 IRB
- 6 IRB fuel cells
- 7 outboard motors
- 11 lifejackets
- Patrol arena and tent

Signal flags, evacuation (shark) flags and beach signs

Miscellaneous items including swim fins, loud hailer, binoculars, patrol bum bags.

Thanks to the following members who helped prepare the club gear for the start of the season - Rod Dunn, David Dalla-Camina, Robert Walker, Graham Burt, Rob Short Jr, Scott Jackson and Chris Barber.

Rod Dunn continued as Radio Officer this past season and maintained all radios in top condition throughout the season. David Dalla-Camina continued in the role of First Aid Officer and all first aid equipment and consumables were of the highest standard, well organized and readily available in the new Patrol Room. David also served as Chief Instructor this past season and the new Training Room facilities and all training equipment met and exceeded the Club's needs. Rod, David and Rob Jr. kept watch over all patrol equipment through the season. Robert Walker and Graham Burt, as IRB Captain and Vice-Captain respectively, managed all of the IRB items.

We moved lifesaving operations into the new Patrol Room prior to the start of the season. The rescue craft remained in an external compound until November when it was relocated to the new sheds. The new facilities proved successful and popular with patrol members, providing much better spaces for all facets of lifesaving.

Lifesaving is our core business and the cost of new and replacement of equipment along with service and repairs is a necessary annual expense. Cronulla always has good lifesaving equipment available. Excluding IRB items, the Club expenditure for this past season was approximately \$6,450. This included board repairs (\$1,370), radio maintenance (\$710), oxy-viva servicing (\$411) plus first-aid and resuscitation consumables (\$155). We also purchased patrol uniforms, rash shirts, sun hats and other small patrol items (\$1175) from the SLISA shop. We purchased patrol caps (\$1980) from Club family company, Fineprint and incurred miscellaneous expenditure (\$646). Expenditure from Club funds was quite low over this past season as we purchased many

items from grant funding.

The 2020 NSW Lifesaving Equipment Grant, funded by the NSW government and distributed by SLSNSW provided an amount of \$2,161 which could be used to purchase equipment from a set list. We obtained binoculars, loud hailer, radio bags, an oxygen resuscitator kit, a child resuscitation manikin and pulse oximeters.

The Australian Government gave every Club in the country an extraordinary \$15,000 grant towards the cost of lifesaving equipment. With this we purchased a first aid bed and freezer for the new Patrol Room, rescue boards, IRB lifejackets, IRB fuel cells, a water rescue training manikin and almost all of our defibrillator and essential first aid consumables. Surf Life Saving Australia also provided \$1,800 as the annual patrol uniform subsidy plus three hundred new patrol shirts courtesy of a new sponsor.

Again this season all new Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate awardees had a patrol cap presented at their assessment and a uniform and sun hat on their first patrol. All new IRB drivers and crewpersons were presented a SLISA rash shirt and peaked cap to wear while on duty. New Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLISA patrol jacket and peaked cap. The Club continued to subsidise the purchase of lifejackets by IRB Crewpersons and Drivers if they wished to purchase their own. Having our lifesavers kitted properly and safely on the beach and in the water is a high priority, a relatively small cost and very well justified.

Thank you to all of the Patrol Captains and their patrolling Members. The Club lifesaving gear was cared for and managed well in our new surrounds. Cronulla SLSC is incredibly well stocked with lifesaving equipment which is always ready for purpose. Importantly, I believe that once again we have been able to provide the Club with excellent equipment for patrol, water safety, training, competition and community purposes and will be able to continue to do so into next season.

See you on the beach at Cronulla - where else would you rather be?

BUILDING DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

After the extensive and unexpected delays in the building project we finally moved into our newly refurbished building on November 5 2021.

The delay experienced in 2021 was related to the need to install a new water line to our new hydrant. The only solution to a poor and deteriorated water supply was to run a new mains from Surf Lane to the rear of our Club. Unfortunately we experienced protracted delays with Sydney Water and their initial and final approval of the mains.

The line installation started in June within a week or so of Sydney Water approval and was completed in a prompt manner. Final testing by Sydney Water was delayed by the state wide Covid shutdown of all construction and we could obtain no answer when they would finally sign off on the mains. Fortunately, a Club member had a professional relationship with a Sydney Water senior executive and he was able to expedite the last stages. The hydrant was finally signed off as compliant on 7 October.

A review of all safety and compliance certificates and other contractor sign off documents for the building had to be redone due to the delays. Once these were completed we had our final visit by the certifier on 2 November. He in turn issued the occupation certificate at 4:41pm on Friday 5 November. We wasted no time and opened the Clubhouse to Members and held a welcoming function commencing at 5:00pm that day.

Also fortunately, we were given approval by the certifier to utilize the Patrol Room (only) from the start of September for lifesaving and patrol purposes. This allowed an early return of some normality to our primary function.

The Clubhouse is now in full operation and Members can look forward to many years of use of the facilities. These include:

- The Members area on the ground floor including change rooms and showers, gym, craft sheds and patrol room.
- Function areas, balconies and bars on middle floor
- The office, meeting and training rooms on top floor.

The responsibility now lies with the designated Club Officers and all Members to respect, care for and maintain the premises ongoing.

By mid March 2022 all outstanding invoices had been paid and all outstanding grant funds received. The final report from the Building Committee was tabled at the Management Committee meeting in March. At that stage the Building Committee was officially dissolved as of 21 March 2022.

I give thanks to all of the Members who helped with various aspects of the project over the past couple of years – whether helping with craft sheds, Members facilities and specific or general advice. In particular, thanks to Jenny and Robyn for their invaluable input at various stages of the project.

Special thanks must go to Scott Williams who provided

the internal and external signage plus some other internal aesthetic aspects and who assisted in the final stages with the required statutory signage for the hydrant – virtually all free of charge and on short time turnaround.

On behalf of the Building Committee, I thank our Club Members for their patience through the protracted completion period and for their support and positive comments regarding the building.

I again offer my thanks and that of all Club Members to the members of the Building Development Committee who have all contributed extensively over this lengthy project. RWC REPORT

The RWC Support Operations Group primarily uses rescue water craft (RWC) or jet skis to assist patrols on the beach and patrol unpatrolled locations. During the 2021/22 season there were six skis covering an operational area that stretches from South Head to Garie Beach in the Royal National Park. The RWC's generally operated two five hour patrols each day, plus extra time for refuels, pack up and wash downs.

SupportSki One(SS1) and supportSki Two(SS2) operated in Bate Bay area with over 1,030 patrolling hours and travelling a combined 9,712 km for the season (SS1 travelled 3,347km and SS2 travelled 6,365km), that is equivalent to traversing the entire NSW coast 4.5 times.

The season was a particularly arduous one, with the skis operating in big swells, on flooded coast line on the cold and wet days that seem to prevail during this unusual summer. Toward the end of the season the skis assisted in the Department of Primary Industry in their shark drumline projects.

VALE JOHN FRANCIS MAGUIRE

16/09/1944 – 06/07/2022

Born in the Riverina town of Junee the Maguire family moved to Cronulla in 1948. John and his brother Michael enjoyed growing up in a seaside environment and attended St Aloysius Primary and later on De La Salle College.

John initially joined Wanda SLSC where he gained his Qualifying Certificate and in December 1965, he joined Cronulla SLSC where he immediately became involved in the management area along with participating in the Surf Boat competition arena. In 2015 he acquired his 50 yearlong service award.

His sound management skills were instantly recognised, and he held positions of assistant Secretary/ Treasurer for 3 years, convenor of the House Committee for 2 years and Committeeman for 2 years. In the Lifesaving area he was exemplary as a Patrol Captain for 5 years. Awards gained during his active time were Bronze Medallion, Instructors Certificate and Examiners Certificate.

His love of all sport saw him excel at Rugby League where from being selected in 1964 the first ever Cronulla/ Sutherland Presidents Cup Team from which he was called up to grade at St

George. In 1968 he signed with Cronulla-Sutherland. In 1973 Cronulla reached their first ever grand final against Manly-Warringah. He played in the grand final which is often remembered as one of the most brutal grand finals due to the solid defence of both teams. As a testament to his mental and physical fortitude he was only one of two Sharks players that played in every game that season. He left Cronulla at the end of 1975. In 1976 he became Captain-Coach of Corrimal who played in the Illawarra competition. In 1977 he signed with Parramatta was part of the Parramatta side which won the Reserve Grade Grand Final that year.

Even after retiring from professional football John continued with a lower contact sport in the form of Touch. Cronulla SLSC formed a team, 'Gus's Goers' sponsored by Gus Reeves Sports Store (Gus was a member of Bronte SLSC). John was an inspirational leader and tutor for the younger spirited players like Mark "Hoppy" Hopkins and Warren "Bucko" Buchan Jnr.

Touch continued for some time and later on Life Member, John Hollingdale established and entered a team in the mature age division. This team consisted of members from all the Bate Bay

Clubs in which John was an exceptional teammate and leader.

His other love was that of education and he excelled as a Mathematics Teacher. He plied his trade at Endeavour High (where he met his future wife Maria), Canterbury Girls, Marist Penshurst, Kogarah Marist Brothers and finally as Principal at his old school De La Salle College, Cronulla. Many members of all the Bate Bay Clubs were fortunate to be educated both by John and Maria.

Other areas of life which he enjoyed. were golf, cryptic crosswords and sudoku; but his standout would have to be that of 'mine host'. When entertaining at home, no lady would ever have an empty glass of bubbles and no man would be without a cleansing ale.

John, affectionally also known as Muggsy, Macca and Macquarie will be sadly missed for his friendship, kindness, advice, and sense of humour.

To Maria, son Damien, daughter in-law Kirsty and grandchildren Tay, Kieran, Emily, and Hamish sincere condolences.

May he rest in peace, reunited with son Nathan. Thank you for the many fond memories and decades of friendship.

VALE BRIAN HENDERSON

Dear fellow members and friends of Cronulla SLSC,

It's with much sadness I advise you of the sad passing of our esteemed Life Member Brian Henderson. Sady, Hendo as he was affectionately known, passed away last Thursday after quite a long battle with prostate cancer, aged 86. Brian made a significant contribution to our club during his years as a member. I will attempt to outline some of his many outstanding achievements during his lifetime of service to our club.

Brian joined the club in 1951 which means he's been a member for 71 years. He gained his Bronze Medallion in 1953. and his Instructors Cert; in 1959. He was a much-respected Patrol V/ Capt. for 3 years, and Patrol Captain for 3yrs. Brian was in love with rowing surf boats, and spent many years in various crews competing for the club. He was in the wining crew which won the Junior Australian Surf Boat Championship in 53/54 season. From there Brian's surfboat career commenced, and he spent many years doing what he liked most, rowing surf boats. During that time, he was in many crews who performed exceedingly well for the club, and they were placed many times

in Championship Carnivals, and at the Interclub. I fondly remember Hendo graciously removing North Cronulla's Ike Smith from the Cronulla boat during an altercation at the Interclub at Wanda, many years back. The five foot five Ike, decided to teach the Cronulla crew a lesson when their two boats collided on their way to the buoys, and leapt into the Cronulla boat, only to be confronted by the six foot four, peace loving Hendo. Hendo in his usual calm and peaceful manor grabbed Ike by the scruff of the neck and the seat of his pants, and ceremonially dispatched him back into the ocean, thus diplomatically avoiding a potentially ugly Interclub incident, and much to the delight of the large crowd watching.

Brian also made a considerable contribution to the good management of the club, serving on the management Comm' for 1 yr. and was Club Vice Captain, for 1 yr. However, his major contribution was commenced when Bill Marshall asked him to be part of the History Comm' around 1999, and you may recall that this was when the beginning of the mountain of work began in writing of the Cronulla Story. Brian served a Mammoth 16 odd years on this Comm' including 3yrs as it's convenor. He made a major

contribution to this wonderful book, which outlines the first 100 yrs. of our fine club so well. In recognition of his major contribution to the club, he was elevated to Life Member in 2008.

Brian was such a nice and likeable bloke, and he inspired so many younger members of the club during his Vice Captain and Patrolling days, helping them to become better people. Recently I've had a number of fellow members relating to me their fond memories of Brian during those early days. I just want to remind you of one of Brian's great contributions to the early history of the club and indeed the Shire. In the mid 1950's a lot of younger members wanted to form a rugby league team and to enter it in the district comp in the name of CSLSC. The club being a proud supporter of rugby union at the time decided that it would not support such a move, and denied us permission to use the club's name. So, the enterprising young lads of that time decided that despite the club's lack of cooperation, to form their own team, and to call it the Cronulla Sharks RLFC. They approached Brian to become their coach, which he gladly accepted, and thus the very first Cronulla Sharks were formed, with Brian as the coach.

Brian having been a champion first grade rugby league footballer himself, was only too happy to impart his vast knowledge of the game to those then young lads. The team played for about 3 seasons, eventually folding from lack of interest due to other activities taking over. Hendo did a wonderful job as coach of the Sharks, and his efforts and enthusiasm were very much appreciated by all of those who helped form that famous team.

Whilst on the subject of football I've been asked to relate a small story about Hendo's contribution to the then annual clubs' Men V's Brats football match. When Tubby Turner and Matt Henderson were budding football players, and were proud members of the Brat's team, Brian Hendo came out of retirement playing for the courageous Men's team. In an effort to teach the boys that they weren't quite the footballers they were telling everyone they were. When Matt Hendo received the ball from the first kick off, he was only to be crash tackled by his ex-first grader Dad, Hendo. Well, the game then had to be stopped there and then when young Hendo was stretchered from the field. A lesson was well learned that day, when some Brats learned just how hard and tough old Hendo was. And as a consequence, they treated him with the upmost respect from then on, that he rightfully deserved.

Hendo was a very proud and private person, and during the last part of his life he desired to keep the knowledge of

In keeping with Hendo's desire for privacy, he decided he didn't want a funeral service, so respecting his wishes, Matt informed me that the family have decided that there will only be a private family cremation.

Vale Hendo, you will be long remembered by your many mates at Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club, and now may you rest in peace.

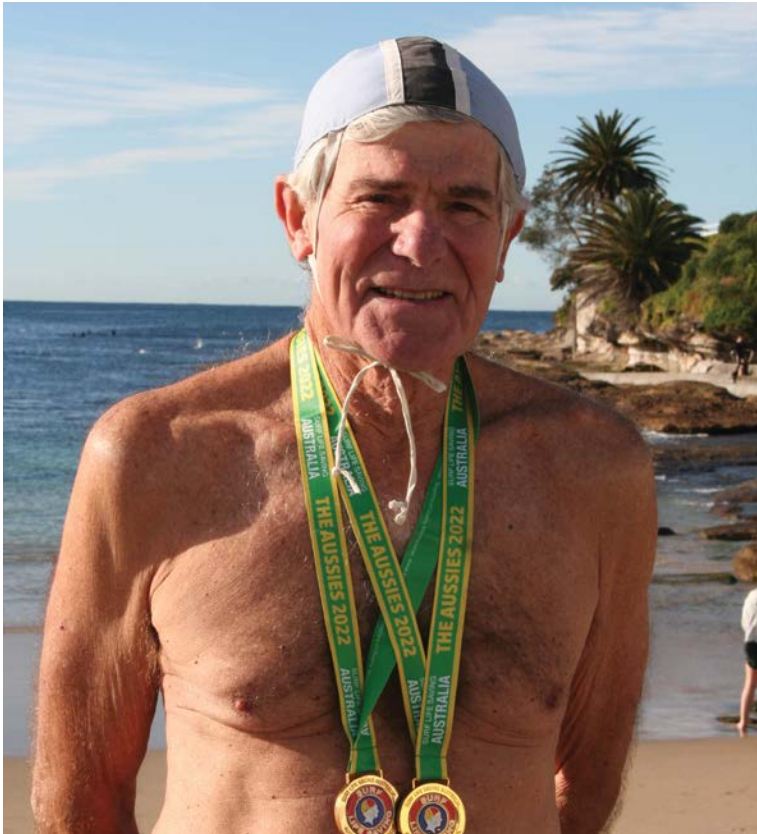

CADET CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Last October a survey was commissioned to explore why nippers (and their families) join Nippers, and why many of them do not continue into the senior club. Retaining Under 15s in sport is challenging and we gained some excellent insights from this initiative.

The 2021/22 season again posed challengers, lock downs, no club house, floods, dangerous and damaging surf, Covid 19 and poor water quality left us all wondering if we would be able to do anything let alone compete. Thanks to the support of my great Vice Captain Stuart Braine and our Board Head Coach Guy Telfer, the challenges seemed easy.

A big thanks to Frank Doran for the donation through Doran Financial Service of a 90Kg racing board.

November 2021 and finally we were able to gain entry to our club and I'd like to thank the building committee and our surf club for giving us what must be the finest board and ski shed in Australia.

Our first carnival in early December was when the Summer of Surf round one came to Wanda then we waited till the Australia Day weekend at Manly until we were able to race again. TREASURER'S REPORT

I'm pleased to present the 2021/22 financial statements for Cronulla SLSC.

This financial year the Club has achieved an overall financial statement surplus of \$115,666, compared to an operating surplus of \$218,486 in 2021/22.

Our full year revenue was \$1,351,447 compared to the prior year of \$819,842. This included our final building related grant of \$300,000 and additional donations to our Building Tomorrow's Future campaign of more than \$61,000 (more than \$200,000 over the life of the campaign). We greatly appreciate the support of the Federal Government for the building grant, to the NSW Government and Sutherland Shire Council for their generous support and the generosity of all individual, family and group building fund donors whose names are listed on the donor board as you enter the Club from Gerrale Street.

The 2021/22 season was challenging. In addition to the water pressure remediation works (costing more than \$470,000), we faced a second COVID-19 lockdown in Sydney. To address the forecast drop in revenue and additional (unbudgeted) costs, as a Management Committee, we took proactive steps to ensure we remained solvent. We reduced our pre-Covid budgeted spending, negotiated with suppliers, and agreed a 6-month principle holiday on our building loan with the Commonwealth Bank.

Our revenue to 30 April 2022 was impacted by the requirement to provide rent relief to our commercial tenants whose trade was impacted by COVID-19 lockdowns. We were successful in applying for and receiving the NSW Government Job Saver support which provided great support through the second lockdown.

With the re-occupation of the Clubhouse from early November, we have been able to commence functions and events through our partnership with the RSL. While there have been some teething issues, including needing to invest \$72,000 for new kitchen equipment, we have been very pleased with the level of functions being booked (even in the slower, winter months) and the average revenue per function for the Club. We will continue to work with the Cronulla RSL to refine the operating model and ensure costs are appropriately accounted for and equitably shared. We also greatly appreciate the generous support by the RSL of a number of club events during the season, including our Club opening and our International Women's Day lunch.

We were fortunate to be able to hold a number of fundraisers during the season. The 2022 Shark Island Swim was hugely successful (net profit \$36,883), despite being impacted by a weather-related date change and we greatly appreciated the support of 7News who came on board as the SIS naming right sponsor, in addition to our loyal SIS sponsors: Pulse, Ace Gutters and D'Arte Group. The 2021 Golf Day was a great day, well supported and we appreciated the support of our sponsors Ayers (net profit \$1,831 in the current year, but an additional \$23,450 profit taken to account in the prior year accounts). The International Women's Day lunch became a fundraiser for the first time (net profit

\$6,541) with the event well attended, fantastic support from the RSL and generous donations and a successful raffle. We were also pleased to see the return of the 200 Club event (net profit \$5,772). I'd like to thank Kieran Day (Convenor, Shark Island Swim Committee), Ross Diver-Tuck (Convenor, Golf Day Committee), Annalyse Crane (Convenor, Social Committee), Chris Gough (Convenor, 200 Club) and their hard-working teams for very successful events.

We made the difficult decision to cancel Friday night drinks during winter as they were loss making. With the introduction of monthly social events at the Club, we are looking forward to ensuring enjoyable and profitable (or at least break-even) social events at the Club.

We also grateful for the ongoing support and funding from SLSA and SLSNSW.

I'd also like to acknowledge the generous support of Baden Green and his team for the audit of our accounts and acting as our Honorary auditors. This is the fifth and final year that Baden Green will provide this service pro bono and we are greatly appreciative.

We ended the year with a loan balance of \$1,568,744, down from \$1,726,637 (reduction of \$167,893). As we came out of the COVID-19 second lockdown and we reopened the Club, the Management Committee agreed to make a re-payment of \$100,000 which returned us to essentially a "budget neutral" position for our loan by year end. We have agreed that in a rising interest rate environment that we will continue to pay down our loan (with access to loan equity) as we have free cashflow to minimise our interest payments.

Our endorsed budget for the 2022/23 season is a break-even cash budget, but the impact of depreciation charges with a full year effect will likely see us make a substantial statutory loss.

A special thank you to Jenny and Robyn for many years of service to the Club and we will miss your years of knowledge and wisdom. Many thanks to Sandra Marshall who has done a wonderful job, particularly as

we have bedded down processes regarding the RSL agreement and finances and who had also ably stepped up to learn the member services role, to Kaila Bergen who supported with Nippers administration and to John Whittingham who recently joined the Administration team. I'd also like to say thank you to Pat Bourke who has stepped in as the volunteer office manager and we worked through the transition of Jenny's retirement.

Once again, a big thanks to the Executive and Management Committee's for your support. Couldn't have survived this year without you! I wish the next Treasurer and the Club every success.
