

CENTENARY OF ANZAC

On 9 February 2012 the NSW State Centre wrote to the Club advising that it intended to develop and publish a database of all lifesavers, male and female who served with Australian forces from the Boer War through to the current conflicts in Iraq & Afghanistan.

Our Club has a rich history of members who have served in war and on peacekeeping operations. Sadly, four in WW1 and seven in WW2 of our members made the supreme sacrifice during those conflicts.

The Club readily agreed to participate in the project and appointed Life Member and Past President, Ken English to oversee the Club's contribution. Ken prepared a history of Club members who had served and are currently serving and liaised with the SLSA Historian, Stan Vesper to ensure Cronulla's contribution was included in the database.

On 30 June 2012 it was announced that the establishment of a permanent National Monument to formally recognise the sacrifice of Australian Lifesavers in war would be undertaken and that the memorial would be situated in Goldstein Reserve along the Southern end of the promenade in Coogee and feature a bronze sculpture of a Lifesaver and a Soldier - titled 'Fallen Lifesavers'. Terraced seating, landscaping works would also be included and future works would include a remembrance wall listing the names of the fallen,

The official opening of the memorial occurred on Sunday 27 April 2014 and although it was a wet and overcast day the opening was well attended by a broad range of SLS Clubs including our own.

On 27 June 2015 the database in the form of a book titled -

"Those who Served - Surf Lifesavers at War"

was launched by the Governor of NSW, His Excellency the Honourable David Hurley, who stated that it is an important book because it is about service and putting community first which is the essence of the Australian spirit.

Along with the above project, two ladies from the Shire, Marilyn Handley & Sue Hewitt commenced work on a book titled "Sutherland Shire Memorials 1914 - 1918 as their contribution to the Centenary of ANZAC. Ken again liaised with the ladies providing names and details of WW1 members and providing access to Club records retained in our Archives Room to ensure accuracy of detail of those member's stories.

The result of the work undertaken by the relevant parties has seen the publication of two excellent books, which will be purchased by the Club for its memorabilia collection, whilst members are encouraged to make the trip to Coogee to view the memorial.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It has been another long season for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club - but once again, a fruitful one. Allow me to briefly recount the story of our season.

The first thing we should always report on is our lifesaving activities. This season our lifesaving was managed in a professional manner by Club Vice-Captain, Paul Cavanagh and we ran very good patrols, kept our beach safe and we met both the standards set by our association and the expectations of the public. We were recognised for this by winning the Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch Patrol Efficiency award for the second season running. Well done Patrol Members and families.

In particular, we excelled in lifesaving awards again, with very good numbers in some special awards such as Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate and First-aid Certificate. The really big achievement though is that we achieved the most IRB awards of any club in the Branch for the second season in a row. Our instruction was coordinated by Chief Instructor, Kerrie Hammell who was assisted by an able team. Chris Barber, Craig Jordan and Daniel Wood ran the IRB squads. Thank you to you all for a season of good squads and high award numbers.

Our lifesaving for this season and its organisation and planning for the future has been rejuvenated by a very proactive Lifesaving Committee. Members of the committee have met in extraordinary meetings to set some goals and designed some processes to improve and ensure lifesaving standards in to the future. This has been a very refreshing and encouraging approach from a very enthusiastic group of patrol leaders.

This season saw a slight growth in Crays numbers meaning a full beach of activities each week. Surely the sight of several hundred young Cronulla Members on the beach each Sunday is a joy to all of us. I don't need to say any more than that really.

The Coaching and Competition section has continued the re-establishment and development process started last season. Strong team spirit, effective communication, good organisation and well run processes at carnivals culminated in the well executed operation at Aussies. I am unsure who should be lauded more - the team management group or the young athletes who competed strongly individually and also committed completely to their teams and to the Club Team.

Our result at Aussies was not quite what we are used to or expect but we came away with three gold medals - one each from the three separate carnivals which combine to make Aussies. Congratulation to Chloe Mannix-Power for her place in history winning the first Cronulla gold medal at the Inaugural Youth Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships. The highlight of the Open carnival was, of course, Ngaire Hadfield's flag win. As I have said a few times, a great individual competitor win supported by virtually the whole Club Team in attendance.

There was a wonderful photo taken of the Goode-Halpin family early in the season. We pride ourselves on being a family Club and the Goode-Halpins are now a four generation Cronulla Surf Club family. We have many three generation Club families but few surf clubs can brag four generations - all on the beach at the same time, all in the same photo.

The Black Caps Nipper group for young members with special needs continues to operate very successfully thanks to the good work of Cameron and Lauren Pyett. I was fortunate to attend their presentation session on the last day of the season and was glad to be able to be part of an activity with such a happy group of members and parents.

The building refurbishment and development process has been long and arduous at times. A lot of work has gone into this project over the past few years to ensure that we get it right - especially within the confines and constraints of our Club footprint plus heritage and other conditions with which we must comply. Sutherland Shire Council's allocation of one million dollars plus the outcome of the Special General Meeting held in early May means that the project now has initial funding, endorsement of the Membership, a clear direction and it is now able to proceed more rapidly. Since that meeting, the Council has been consulted at several sessions, we have obtained professional advice on how to proceed and the architect has been engaged. I am sure that all Members look forward to seeing the final recommendations and plans for the future of our Clubhouse, and indeed, the future of our Club.

A very significant amount of internal and external maintenance issues have been identified in a Building Condition Assessment which was carried out by Council. Some areas of our buildings are in a very poor state of repair and we cannot allow them to stay like this. There is a risk of further deterioration and permanent damage or damage to internal fittings plus it also presents the Club in a poor light to visitors and community groups who visit our premises. Discussions between Club and Council have been held, a budget allocated and a program is currently being formulated to address these issues.

The beach has been in good condition for along time now and this made our beach a very pleasant and safe place to be. Also this season we were able to enjoy the benefits of the work of the past two winters - a completely rejuvenated Esplanade. This has provided a wonderful gathering place in front of our Club and is a fantastic focus point for our community.

The District Council was chaired again this season by Cronulla Life Member and Past President, John Bentley continued in the role of District Chairman. John led a

good team of people from all four local clubs. One of the main goals this past season was to build stronger ties with the Branch Support Operations Group and assist with developing the Support Ski (jet-ski) patrol. This service is the technological "now" and possibly future for surf life saving.

Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch continued its remodeling and new productive approach to managing Branch and Club issues. This has led to a much more harmonious relationship with the Clubs. Branch is led by President George Shales from Maroubra. Cronulla's Wayne Druery has continued in the role of Director of Surf Sports where he has and continues to introduce innovative thoughts and processes.

Your Management Committee and the various subcommittees have continued as good forums where, at times, vigorous discussion has been promoted to ensure good and $\bar{\text{measured}}$ decision making. The message Igive to our volunteer Members is the same as previous. We are all volunteers in our Club and give our valuable time freely. However, we still carry the responsibilities of the positions we accept. So, the message remains simple - know your role, do your job and allow others to do theirs. I believe that the Management Committee has operated effectively this season. The sub-committees have generally delivered on their responsibilities, though some could meet more often and/or provide more comprehensive and timely reports to the Management Committee.

The Club Executive, Brad, Paul, Richard, Kieran and myself has remained a tight group. We remain in constant contact, discuss issues openly, do not always all see things the same way and we accept that - so I suppose that is a strength. Hopefully we have provided the right support and decision making this past season. We get along well together and again this year we worked hard together and we played hard together.

Brad, Paul, Richard and Kieran have quite literally worked tirelessly while managing the day to day affairs and some bigger issues, all for the betterment of our Club. In particular, our administrative processes have been thorough and efficient and our financial management remains sound and possibly the envy of other organisations. They put in a lot of hours, often at personal cost. It is a pleasure and a privilege to work with these people.

This report see the departure of two Executive Members after long tenure, Kieran as Club Captain for seven years and Richard setting a new record of ten years as Club Treasurer. The expression "hard act to follow" was written for exactly this sort of situation but I am sure that the incoming Captain and Treasurer, receiving some good support and guidance from those they succeed, will once again meet the high Cronulla standard.

Our Office staff - our Administrative Coordinator, Jenny Pinker and her good friend and workmate, Robyn Cole - continued to run a very successful operation. These ladies have contact with most Members at some time whether that be a newcomer to our Club or a veteran. The whole Club thanks them for their dedication and achievements. Robyn retired from employment towards the end of the season and Jenny has had assistance form Emma Larssen in between her international sojourns. Emma brings a wealth of knowledge from her time as an employee at SLSA and her years in surf life saving. All three deserve and receive our thanks for the continued excellent job that they do.

I thank all involved in our fundraising activities but especially those who organise and coordinate them the same people really as last season. These include Chris Gough (200 Club), Michael Banister and Ross

Diver-Tuck (Golf Day), Glenn Carter (Shark Island Swim) and any others that I have missed. I must also thank Richard Pinker and Brad Turner for the work they have done in retaining sponsors such as PAYCE, Caltex, Coca Cola, Commonwealth Bank, 7NEWS and all of our other sponsors - large and small.

Mick's ashes were scattered beyond the break in a memorable ceremony by boats from Cronulla and his old Club, North Cronulla. A vale remembering Mick's life appears in this annual report. Fortunately, we were only called together to farewell a Member on a few other occasions and when we were, we remembered our lost ones with respect and sympathy but also celebrated their lives in an appropriate way.

In this very rapidly changing world an organisation like ours has a need for a modern communication strategy involving all media. We have people who still rely on hard copy reports and newsletters while most of our young people thrive on electronic media and transfer of information. SECRETARY'S REPORT

Members of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club, I present to you the 108th Annual Report and Financial Statements for the past year.

It doesn't get any better than a day at Cronulla Beach and our patrolling members made it that much safer during the surfing season and ensured that another passed with 'no lives lost'.

Season 2014/15 opened on the 20th September and it was to welcome in a significant year, that of celebrating 100 Years of the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships - 'The Aussies', that of the Centenary of Anzac - our lifesavers heading off to war on shores further afield and the development of the club building beginning it's journey to fruition.

The Aussies this year included for the first time the inaugural Youth Championships, held prior to both the Masters and Opens. In what was an historic event, young female 'beachie' Chloe Mannix-Power won the inaugural Under 14's Beach Sprint title.

Another memorable event was the final of the Under 17's Female Beach Flag event where Ngaire Hadfield took the honours. Both champions had now completed the trifecta of winning these events at their respective age group at Branch, State and Aussies. Well done girls! And for you Chloe, you're the first ever.

Anticipating a larger crowd than usual, the Cronulla RSL Sub-Branch made a wise decision to shift the annual Anzac Day service form its home in Monro Park to a more suitable venue at Cronulla Park. An estimated attendance of more than twelve thousand people gathered to witness a stunning sunrise over our beach whilst listening to veterans and dignitaries and Club member and current serviceman Phillip English who gave the keynote address. Our Club members Hayden Sawyer and Kimberley Short read diary excerpts from soldiers of the time. A real treat indeed, as the weather leading up to and the immediate day after was very ordinary to say the least.

The sunrise at Cronulla was simply perfect that day and befitting such a solemn occasion.

The future of the club building was cemented (no pun intended) at the Special General Meeting held on the 17th May 2015. The concept plan for the redevelopment was formally endorsed and the program now is to embark on immediate preparation of detailed plans and other information required for a DA submission. Seeking sufficient funds to complete this mammoth project is a huge job and a financial plan needs to be developed. The journey begins.

Talking money brings me to the subject of the Honorary Treasurer, Mr Richard Pinker. After ten years service Richard is not seeking re-election. He has assured us though, that he will be continuing duties in the IRB section - laying the course for the Shark Island Swim, can laying with the President at the Masters Twilight and likewise as IRB water safety at carnivals.

IRB CAPTAINS REPORT

There were plenty of fun times, great memories, along with hard work throughout the season in the never a dull moment IRB section. Overall a very successful year, taking out the number one club in the IRB Branch Awards for the second consecutive year training 12 new IRB Drivers and 30 new crewpersons. This achievement emphasises our Club Member interest and involvement in the IRB section. Being part of the IRB team provides another interesting aspect to Patrols and skills these members retain for a lifetime, let alone the thrill of plunging through the surf in an IRB.

Each of our IRB assessments this year were all extremely challenging but our drivers and crew took on the large waves and rough seas with vigour and enthusiasm. One assessment left Cronulla with the only remaining upright IRB due to some excellent crewing by our new recruits while the other Club, not mentioning names (starting with E?), rolling all their three IRB's. Sky blue, black and white excelled, go Cronulla! Well done to those Members in achieving a high standard of competence along with having a good time. This success of our training is due to some of our other drivers (Bob, Daniel and yes Mitch, your help was also appreciated) getting involved in assisting training and in particular the support of my Vice-Captain, Craig Jordan.

The IRB team covered 15 Carnivals throughout the Season including additional sporting events, which is a major commitment. The Shark Island Swim IRB team captained by Richard Pinker is likened to being part of an elite SAS squad.

The State and the Australian Championships were further commitments including up to 10 rostered shifts at Aussies. Thank you to all the drivers and crew that assisted at these carnivals and it's always a risk mentioning specific names but thanks must go in particular to Daryn Metti and John Mamacan for the State and Aussies coverage. Gaining coverage at Carnivals is a difficult task and one that I am addressing with the Carnival and Competition Sub Committee to ensure more competitor involvement supporting the IRB section at Carnivals.

The year wasn't without a few casualties, but fortunately with a positive outlook towards recovering, two IRB team members received accidental injuries during service. Operating an IRB, like other sports, comes with its risks, and unfortunately both Knox Glenn and Jenni Trevillion received broken bones. After long healing processes both have returned with vigour and enthusiasm to get back into the IRB. Knox sustained a serious foot injury with many months' recovery and Jenni a broken arm. I'd like to especially recognise Knox and his mother Mel for their positive outlook and working through this injury and the slow healing process. Knox is an active and valued member of theCclub and was keen to get back onto Patrol and drive the IRB, not to mention getting back to his football. The mention of these injuries is not to deter new recruits, but to thank these people for their continued involvement and courage.

There were also other challenges and changes with the introduction of the mandatory wearing of life jackets (PFDs) and the removal solo driving an IRB. These changes were challenging and difficult to implement at first, but have since been embraced by the team and the PFDs are now just part of our life saving uniform that we naturally don.

This Season we welcomed our new IRB Vice-Captain, Craig Jordan, to the IRB team. I use the words 'IRB team' because one of our main aims is to work together as a cohesive team with everyone taking ownership for the IRB's, chipping in to help out and look after the

IRB's. Looking after and driving them carefully and safely also ensures that the IRB's last longer and need less maintenance.

The IRB section held an IRB Gala night, which was well attended and has since been requested as an annual event. Prior to the event and following a safety briefing, several events were held including circuit races, manoeuvring an unladen IRB (without an engine), a team race which involved swimming, overturning, paddling, surfing the IRB then finishing the race carrying the boat on your shoulder. Lastly was a skills event that included the rescue of an unconscious patient. Chief Photographer of the night was Bobby Johnson and our BBQ Chef was Marcus Kennedy, thank you to both. A fun evening was had by all involved, not to mention the beach goers and spectators on the Purcell Room balcony.

This Season we completed a full renovation of the IRB shed including construction of the innovative IRB storage rack, new tool cabinets and security roller door. These changes have added to the efficiency and use of our small area. Bob Sagar was the key driver to the success of these changes.

Annual gear inspection was supported by Daniel, Carlo, Bob and Craig, which was very successful and a good opportunity to get all the IRB gear out for checking and repair as required.

I think I said thank you too many times but thanks must go to lovely Club Administration ladies who are sometimes unsung heroines. These ladies always eagerly assist in providing prompt and efficient support.

In summary, I'd like to recognise Daniel Wood for an excellent hand-over and his continued support. As I say, you'll never take the IRB out of Daniel. Daniel is one of the best drivers in the Club and the Branch and has a wealth of experience that he shares. For these reasons and as mentioned above, the IRB Award for the 2014/15 was awarded to Daniel Wood.

CHIEF TRAINING

As my first full year as Chief Training Officer draws to a close, the Training Team can look back on having completed a very busy year with five Bronze and two SRC squads. These are our courses which introduce new Members into the Club and train them to be our new lifesavers. Though the numbers in each squad were small compared to previous years, 53 new members have joined Patrols and Water Safety teams and were dedicated lifesavers on our beach over this Season.

Firstly, thankyou to all our instructors and helpers who volunteer their time and expertise to train Bronze and SRC squads over many weeks and to conduct proficiencies for approximately 230 members this year.

Proficiency days are particularly intense and would not have progressed as smoothly without Brian Dalgarno, Tony Coffey, Bryan Wild, Dave Brukmann, Rob Short, Belle Bruce, John Mamacan and Jen Maclachlan. Thank you also to Chris Barber and his IRB Team and the Water Safety Team for maintaining a vigilant watch over the water component of the Proficiency and for conducting the IRB Proficiences.

A Proficiency was held on the first Patrol day of the season so that anyone who may have missed last year's proficiency and who wanted to aim for 100% Patrol could become proficient at the beginning of the season before their patrols commenced. Two Friday nights and five Sunday proficiencies were also scheduled and completed between September and December in predominately calm conditions.

For a small group of members who each individually applied for a late proficiency, approval was received from Sydney Branch and was held on the 31 January, 2015. The Branch Education Director attended and the proficiency went ahead in the most difficult conditions, the beach only being open for 3 hours on that day due to dangerous surf. All participants triumphed over an extremely difficult swim, and also performed simulated rescues in hazardous conditions.

Every member who wishes to perform Water Safety, Patrol or be a competitor must maintain their proficiency. Proficiencies must be completed by the end of December. I plan to run a similar schedule this year finishing before Christmas, and I hope everyone attends early to avoid extreme weather conditions.

Bronze Squads for adults were conducted by Dave Brukmann and these three squads ran almost continually over the summer season. Our new Trainer, Kerry O'Neill, ran new innovative programs for the SRC squads and for the 15 year old Bronze group which I'm sure the candidates enjoyed immensely. Thank you to Brian Dalgarno and Tony Coffey for stepping in and assisting with these groups whenever requested and to Bryan Wild for conducting each adult Bronze group's induction.

Thank you to Brian Dalgarno and Tony Coffey for advising and supporting John Mamacan and myself through the running of three Advanced Resuscitation Technique Courses assisting 18 Members to gain this Award.

Cronulla Surf Lifesaving Club hosted a Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue Course in mid March, where three of our Members successfully undertook two theory nights and an all day practical session of activities and rescues in the Bay. Bate Bay turned on strong currents and challenging windy and unseasonally cool conditions for rock and boat rescues. This is a course for our most experienced members and not for the faint hearted.

Chris Barber, assisted by Craig Jordan and the IRB team, trained many of the IRB crewmen and Drivers throughout the winter months with great success.

TEAM APP

This is well accepted now in the Nipper group as a quick an effective notification tool. Toward the later part of the year we realized Team App was not suitable for Nipper carnival entries so we created a simple on-line form attached to our website.

FACEBOOK

Since the inception of our facebook page in August 2014 we now have two hundred and ninety-seven likes with 60% women and a current maximum reach of about five hundred people.

Our Nipper Members Group now has one hundred and sixty-five members and is growing. Both of these have added a great method of interclub communication along with photo and results sharing.

THE BLACK CAPS

The Black Caps were back!!!!!! - back on the beach for their third season with Cronulla Surf Club. This year saw an increase in numbers to fifteen. Young Club Members in ages between 8-12 years with predominately physical disabilities such as cerebral palsy took to the beach. The nature of the group's disabilities can make participating in mainstream sport very difficult, so this is intended to create an environment which is supportive of their individual needs and one in which they are able to compete against others with similar ability to themselves. Like all Nippers, the Black Caps are competitive and love to win and the group was able to provide a more level playing field, a space in which their disability was not a barrier to them participating in sport.

The returning Black Caps from last season had improved out of sight with the group's favourite activities being flags, wade and board paddling. This year the group focused on surf awareness, which including learning things which would keep them safe while attending the beach. Over the weeks we watched their skills and confidence soar as they began diving for flags, paddling their boards independently and coming together as a team. This year included some new activities including body surfing, wave catching on boards and tug o war.

As Black Cap leaders we couldn't be prouder of each and every single member of the group. The determination and eagerness they showed each week was incredible and the improvements we saw each week made every Sunday morning with them worthwhile. The sportsmanship they showed when competing against and with other Nippers groups was truly inspiring. Each week they showed up with a smile ready to go taking on whatever challenges we threw at them. Thanks must go to the Black Caps and their parents for another successful season. Once again if anyone has any interest in this area and would like to be involved helping and running the group we would love to hear from you. Lastly we would like to thank Cronulla SLSC for supporting another season of the Black Caps.

CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

Lifesaving equipment in good condition, plenty of equipment and the equipment always available for patrols and water safety - these are the primary goals of the Gear Stewards. All of Cronulla's equipment was prepared, repaired, renewed and submitted for the inspection held on Sunday 31st August 2014. The IRB display and equipment laid out in the IRB Shed, Ballroom, Training Room, Radio Room and Monro Room always looks quite spectacular. This year was no exception and the display of equipment passed successfully, ensuring we were ready for another season.

The gear submitted included: 19 rescue boards 2 Stretchers 36 rescue tubes Patrol area and tent 9 radios Patrol uniforms 4 oxy-viva kits Board and tube stands 2 patrol first aid kits Signal flags and evacuation (shark) flags 1 club first aid kit 13 resuscitation mannequins 9 spinal collars 2 trainer defibrillators 3 spinal boards and straps 5 TRB 2 defibrillators 5 nuthnard motors 4 Suction equipment sets

7 trailers

A single inspection team of dedicated officials visits all clubs in the Branch over one weekend. After completion of the Cronulla inspection we supplied refreshments to the inspection team before they set off for the long trek into the National Park beaches. The following members helped prepare the club gear and premises for the start of the season - Col Haywood, Rob Short Jr., Ken English, Brian Dalgarno, Carlo Villanti, JohnTangohau, Daniel Wood, Bob Sagar and Chris Barber. Scott Rofe looked after the Club tents and ensured they were in good condition all season.

SLSNSW has placed some tracking requirements on patrol radios that were not able to be met by three of our older but very good radios. We have withdrawn these and managed the season without them. From next season radios will operate on a new digital network and all of our radios will need replacement at a total cost of approximately \$7,000.

SLSA has assisted with this with a grant through the Branch and we have already procured three new radios to set us on our way.

Purchases of replacement equipment this season were high, but lifesaving is our core business and the equipment is well worth the expense. Excluding IRB items, the expenditure this season was a little over \$12,000. This included: two new rescue boards (\$2790), board repairs (\$1690), radio servicing (\$490), oxy-viva and resuscitation manikin servicing (\$677), resuscitation, spinal management and defibrillator items (\$174), first-aid supplies (\$526) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$40). We also purchased some uniforms and rash shirts and other patrol items from the SLSA shop(\$2220) plus patrol caps (\$1240). A new requirement for the compulsory wearing of PFD jackets by IRB drivers and crew was implemented this season and the Club purchased a number of these and also subsidised the purchase of PFDs by members if they wanted their own (~\$2500).

This past season, for the first time, the Australian government funded every Club in the country with a \$5000 grant towards the cost of lifesaving. This was largely spent on IRB motors. Surf Life Saving Australia provided \$2300 from the DHL subsidy to purchase most of our patrol uniforms and we were fortunate to receive a further \$1810 equipment subsidy from the SLSNSW Equipment Grant for future purchase of radios. This season every patrol member was supplied, by the Club, with a lightweight jacket to wear on cooler days and every patrol member was supplied with a reversible Club-Patrol cap as part of their uniform allocation. New Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLSA

patrol jacket and peaked cap. We also purchased rash shirts for all IRB drivers and crewpersons.

As in the past season, I believe that we have been able to provide Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club with the best possible equipment for patrol, training, competition and community purposes.

See you on the beach at Cronulla - where else would you rather be?

CRONULLA SLSC BUILDING DEVELOPMENT

SUMMARY INFORMATION

The Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club building redevelopment was started due to the needs to modernise our Club - to make it more efficient to use, to improve the facilities for members, to make it comply with current building and safety standards and to ensure that it will meet our needs into the future. Our Club was formed in 1907 and the first Clubhouse was a tram on the beach. The current Clubhouse was opened in 1940, added to in the sixties, seventies and again in the mid nineties when the Purcell wing was added.

The building has many issues, not surprising considering that the core is ~75yrs old and the newest part is > 20yrs old. The dated facilities are inefficient and raise many issues.

- Primary building issues
- Access entry, stairs and doors are old & inadequate, poor security, no lift
- Circulation disparate floor levels, middle floor has five levels, corridors
- Dated facilities and fittings kitchen, toilets, bar, lounge areas
- Storage is inadequate for lifesaving equipment, Nippers and competition craft
- Electrical system is aged 8 data infrastructure is minimal
- · The roof just leaks everywhere
- $\cdot \ \mathsf{Gender} \ \mathsf{equality}$
- Primary compliance issues
- Fire safety including prevention, detection, suppression, safety of persons in event of fire and safe exit.
- · Electrical safety
- Equitable access and facilities entry, stairs and corridors are not user friendly and there are no lifts, ramps, disabled toilets etc.

The Building Committee followed a very controlled process to arrive at where we are today.

- A functional design brief was compiled by interviewing a large group of people identified and endorsed by the Management Committee as primary stakeholders. These included Section Heads, a range of Club Officers, key Management Committee members, Club staff and others and they encompassed the range of lifesaving, competition, administration, commercial interests, Club history and culture, external groups and specifically a cross section of female Members. This brief was, in turn, endorsed by the Management Committee.
- An architect was engaged by the Management Committee and concept sketches drawn up based on the design brief. There were discussions with a range of Sutherland Council officers who provided frequent review and advice.
- The initial concept was presented to the Members and their comments and alternate ideas were compiled and considered. Some significant changes were then made to the concept sketches to arrive at the current proposal.
- The concept proposal has been developed in consideration of the heritage status of the building

core and constrained by the limitation of staying within the existing footprint and vertical profile (height).

BASIC REQUIREMENTS

The key issues identified from the Club design brief were:

- Review location and adequacy of toilets and change rooms
- Improve space and access for life saving equipment
- Increase space and improved access to IRB storage
- · Increase board and ski storage
- · Improve surf boat storage
- Improve gym location
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Improve kitchen with adequate refrigeration and storage
- Improve cold room and beverage storage including access
- · Provide appropriate memorabilia display areas
- · Have a dedicated small meeting room
- Maintain the current commercial features and potential
- Resident Members Quarters, if incorporated, should accommodate a couple.
- At the same time we had to address the issues of access and movement within the building, compliance plus simple modernisation of the facilities.

Requirements indicated in meetings and communications with SSC were:

- Conserve the core heritage component with relaxation of some initial constraints
- Contain the building within the current footprint and vertical profile

Assessment of the proposed concept against the design brief indicates that all key requirements have been met while retaining a respect for the history and culture of our Club and Clubhouse. Additional to this, we have the support of Sutherland Shire Council who have described the concept as respectful of heritage, footprint and local impact. Also, we have engaged a BCA consultant who has reviewed the concept and declared it as fully compliant for both BCA (building code) and DDA (disability/equitable).

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

The proposed improvements are contained in a series of concept sketches which were presented to the Members and are available in the Clubhouse and on the Club website.

FINANCIAL

It is anticipated at this stage that the project will cost approximately six million dollars.

The Club has the capacity to contribute significantly from accumulated funds and we have received supportive comments from our bank on availability and ability to repay a significant loan. Cronulla SLSC has a proven track record of successful financial management of building projects such as the Sports Complex, Purcell Room and Zimzala. There is confidence that the amount to be suggested to be borrowed can be repaid in a manageable and timely manner - not burdening the Club with either a large repayment schedule or excessively long term debt. Good news for our Club came when Sutherland Shire Council confirmed a commitment of \$1 million dollars

in the 2016-17 budget towards the compliance costs associated with building refurbishment. Mayor Kent Johns and Ward Councillors, Kevin Schreiber, Carol Provan and Scott Williams have shown great respect and support for our Club through the initial funding nrocess.

The building Committee believes that Club and Council contributions put us at half way in the search for funding for the total project. Sources of other funds will include State & Federal grants, SLS grants, Heritage grants, Sports facility grants, Member and public donations and hopefully further support from SSC if needed.

To assist with DA preparation we have already obtained two grants - a Federal grant of \$100,000 obtained by Member for Cook, Scott Morrison and a SSC grant of \$40,000 specifically allocated to assist with DA preparation.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

The long awaited Special General Meeting for Members to determine the course of the project was held on Sunday 17th May. The information outlined in this report was presented to the Members followed by questions from the floor. The following were then put as a single motion.

- 1. That Members endorse the developed concept.
- 2. That approval is given to engage Redshift AA to prepare plans and other information required to allow the Club to progress the building project to DA stage.
- 3. That approval is given to allocate the funds from the Federal grant and SSC approved allocation for the DA preparation phase.

4. Endorsement of the Building Development Committee to proceed as it determines necessary and appropriate through to DA application and to continue seek appropriate sources of funds for the proposed development.

The motion was successful.

TIMETABLE

Now that the project has Member endorsement we have embarked on immediate preparation of detailed plans and other information required for DA submission.

We have a huge task in seeking adequate funds and development of a final financial plan.

Once the final plans are ready and a financial plan is in place we will return to the Membership at another General Meeting to seek final Member endorsement of both the plans and funding proposal. Then the fun part may start.

The members of the Building Committee have worked hard to get the project to this point. Recognition and thanks for a committed and professional approach must go to Stephen Mackay, Daniel Wood, John Suann, Alan Metti, Lee Schmalfeldt, Doug Murray and Greg Holland.

VALE – EDWARD GOUGH WHITLAM AC QC

Edward Gough Whitlam was born in Melbourne on 11 July 1916 and passed away in Sydney on 21 October 2014.

Gough, the Member of Parliament for the Federal seat of Werriwa, which included Cronulla, was a Vice President of the Club from his early days as the local Member and continued to take an interest in the Club following his retirement from Parliament in 1978.

Gough and Margaret Whitlam had come to live in Wangi Avenue Cronulla in 1947 to build their first house with a war housing assistance loan following Gough's service in the RAAF during Word War II.

Margaret Whitlam (nee Dovey) who was born at Bondi, represented Australia in swimming at the British Empire Games in 1938. With three young children she insisted that their new home would be close to the beach where she could teach the children to swim.

Gough stood for the local government election for the Sutherland Shire Council in 1948, and for the Sutherland seat in the New South Wales Parliament in 1950. He lost the latter election to C O J "Joe" Monro, Club Patron from 1924 – 1966, by 991 votes.

Writing in the Cronulla newspaper The Observer, which is kept by Sutherland Shire Library, Whitlam congratulated his opponent. "It was my privilege to be among the first to visit and congratulate him on Saturday night," he wrote.

Whitlam stood for the federal seat of Werriwa at a byelection in November 1952. Werriwa (or Weereewaa) is the Aboriginal name for Lake George. in 1901 the electorate centred on the rural city of Goulburn but 50 years later, it covered the rapidly growing southeast and southwest Sydney suburbs and extended to Wollongong. Whitlam won the seat with a record majority of 66 per cent of the vote, and celebrated by buying the family's first car and a hat - then essential to the politician's outfit.

As the local Member, as well as a Vice President of our Club, Whitlam was a member of the South Cronulla Public School Parents and Citizens committee, and of Cronulla RSL and the Progress Association.

In 1957 the boundaries of Werriwa moved west and the Whitlams moved to Cabramatta, centered in the new seat. In the same year, Whitlam was a special guest at our Club's Jubilee celebration reunion dinner at Cecil House. Gough continued to support the Club long after he had moved to Cabramatta as he is recorded as a continued donor to the Club for many years.

Gough, as Prime Minister of Australia, officially opened the Cronulla Sports Complex on 9 March 1975 under the Club Presidency of R J "Bob" Leix. The Complex offered much needed training and recreational facilities not only to Cronulla Club Members, but to the wider Sutherland Shire community as well. According to "The Cronulla Story", Whitlam in his speech, noted, in part: "It does, of course, serve to remind us what an extraordinary Club this is, founded in 1907 with the motto 'Vigilance & Service'. You have indeed served your community with uncommon excellence – the people of Cronulla and surrounding areas have reason to be especially grateful – for your unselfishness in opening these facilities to the whole community – and not restricting them to Club Members only."

"The Cronulla Story" went on to add, "it was particularly relevant that Whitlam should open the Complex. No one had more impact on the early to mid-1970s in Australia. A Member and a great supporter of the Club, Whitlam led



Labor to victory in 1972, after 23 years in Opposition."

The Club has been honoured and continues to be honoured by having our Federal and State Members of Parliament elected as Vice Presidents.

The Club thanks Gough for his many years of public service to Australia and for his support to Cronulla Surf Lifesaving Club.

Greg Holland - President (2008 - 2012)

VALE - BRUCE BREADNER

Bruce Breadner was born 27 September 1937 and passed away 17 July 2014. He had a great love of swimming and the ocean and will be remembered as a notable contributor to Surf Life Saving at many levels.

Locally, Bruce was a great worker for both Cronulla SLSC and Wanda SLSC over many years. He was also a member at Terrigal and Red Rock Corindi surf clubs and in his latter years was a very active long service member at Woolgoolga SLSC.

Bruce was the Founder of our Shark Island Swim and was Convenor of the organising committee for the first four years. He was also the Cronulla Sunday Surf Race Handicapper for two years and during his tenure introduced some novel variations on the standard surf race including a longer distance race.

Outside Club activities, Bruce has a long record of involvement. He was a member of the Organising Committee of the Australian Bi-Centennial Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Elouera

He also held the position of Sydney Branch Board of Control Secretary and was our local District Supervisor. Bruce was also active in the Junior Activity area and was a member of the team responsible for formulation of the Nipper Surf Ed program and the manuals still in use by our Nipper groups today. He was a Life Member of Wanda SLSC JAG, the Bluebottles.

In his retirement to the far north coast, Bruce kept up his active involvement in many areas including some outside surf life saving. As well as remaining an avid swimmer, he was a member of the local triathlon group and through his church activities played an active role in nurturing and mentoring young people with special needs.

Bruce's funeral notice ended with the words "Gone swimming". That says it all.

VALE - BARRIE EDWIN KELLAWAY

Cronulla Surf Club sadly notes the passing of Barrie Kellaway on 6th April, 2015 at the age of 80 years.

Barrie came to the club in 1953, after a brilliant career in Australian Swimming. Joining with his brother, Peter, the two were warmly accepted, having been enticed to join up by a young Frank Jordan and life member, Harold Spurway, the manager of the Rural Bank branch which employed Barrie at the time.

Barrie Kellaway began swimming at Granville Swimming Club at an early age, coached by Tom Penny who also had world record holder, Barry Darke, in the squad.

Barrie won his first NSW title at the age of ten (10). He then began an association with Forbes Carlisle in the famous Palm Beach Swimming Club:-

- NSW 55 yds, 110 yds, 220 yds, 440 yds Junior Freestyle titles
- 1948 Australian 440 yds Junior Freestyle
 - NSW 440 yds, 880 yds Junior Freestyle
- 1950 Empire Games, Auckland NZ, 440 yds and 1650 yds Freestyle
 - Silver Medal, 4 x 220 yds Freestyle Relay
- ·1951 - Melbourne Australian Titles, Barrie swam his memorable 440 yds victory over the world's best of the day, defeating the French champion, Alex Jany and Australia's Barry Darke.
- •1947-52 Barrie won ten (10) NSW Championships and four (4) Australian Titles.

Upon joining Cronulla Surf Club, Barrie had immediate success at Sydney surf carnivals, joined by his good mate, Frank Jordan, who was at his best. He joined a very strong R&R team which shared success with Freshwater, Manly and Bondi, rarely being out of a place over a few seasons.

Barrie never won a club championship because he swam at the same time as the great Frank Jordan, but recorded several wins at carnivals, including the annual nonchampionship surf race at the Australian Championships.

From the first day of joining Cronulla Surf Club, Barrie and his brother, Peter, fitted into the club culture and spirit. They enjoyed all the club activities and social life and eventually met their future wives.

To Barrie's wife Marilyn, former member of the Auxiliary, and her family, we extend our sympathy.

Rest in peace my friend.

John Johnson - Life Member

VALE - JOHN MAXWELL JONES OAM

John, or "JJ", as he was affectionately known, was born on the 13th May 1935 in Bulli, NSW and died on the 8th March 2015 in Brisbane after a short illness.

John was born into a hard working coal mining family of which he was the fourth generation. It was assumed John would follow family tradition and follow his forefathers into the mines. John had other ideas and pursued a more academic career. He was educated at Bulli Primary School, at Wollongong High School and later he attended Melbourne University. He excelled both academically and on the sporting arena, majoring in swimming, cricket and baseball.

Aged 14, John joined the Bulli SLSC which was the beginning of an outstanding career in surf life saving, which was to last until the day he died.

John's connection with Cronulla SLSC began in the early 1960's when a sister club arrangement was commenced with the Bulli Club. John progressed to Club Captain of Bulli and held that position for 8 years. Through his enthusiasm the sister club venture developed and became a very beneficial situation for both clubs. Numerous competitions were held competing for the Bud Norton Trophy annually, resulting in many life long friendships being formed and valuable competition experience gained by both clubs. Unfortunately we no longer continue this competition but its legacy lives on to this day. Due to these interclub activities John grew very close to Cronulla, and subsequently joined our Club in 1989 and remained a valued long service member until

John achieved many things at Bulli SLSC during his time there. However, I believe the achievement which stands out the most is his foresight in forming the "Bulli Aqua Lads". This was, I believe, the first Nipper club in Australia. John's belief that the surf life saving movement's future lays in its younger members has been proved correct time and time again. I believe Australia's wonderfully successful Nipper movement reflects back to John Jones's foresight in the mid 1960's. What a pioneer!!

Due to his occupational commitments and a desire to improve his and his family's financial position, John decided to relocate to Victoria in late 1972. As surf life saving was now well and truly part of his life, John joined the Point Leo SLSC where amongst other achievements he went on to become their Vice President, President and was elected a Life Member.

Following a tragic motor accident in 1984 resulting in the death of John's and Helen's eldest son Bradley, John decided to move to Queensland where he lived until his death. This was to be to the benefit of Surf Life Saving Queensland, the Gold Coast and Southport SLSC, as John decided to join Southport. John gave exemplary service to SLSQ which continued until his demise.

JJ will be fondly remembered for the many wonderful things he did throughout his remarkable life. I would like to mention just a couple.

John was heavily involved with what was first called the "Announcing Team", later to be renamed the "Commentary Team" at the Australian Championships. JJ will be long remembered as a leading commentator with a great presence and voice, and for his particular understanding and knowledge of the athletes, particularly in swimming events. JJ was given the unofficial title of "The Voice of the Aussies", by leading sports commentator - Ian Hanson.

John Jones was a leading SLSA Member, Administrator, Coach, Manager and a respected mentor. He was elected as a Life Member of SLSA in 1992. He attended many Lifesaving World Championships as a delegate and as an official. John received an International Life Saving Citation of Merit for his contribution to ILS. In 2007 his country recognised his "Outstanding contribution to Surf Life Saving" and awarded him an OAM. John was so justifiably proud of this Award, and so was his adoring family.

John was an outstanding leader and mentor of many men and women and his legend will live on for many years to come. I can't help comparing him with legendary club captains from yesteryear which include - Tony Purcell, Bill Marshall, Bill Eady, Barry Adams, Cliff Marsh, Doug Murray, Warren Rennie and Jamie Walker.

JJ followed a variety of professions during his long life. The majority of his working life was involved in the timber industry, where he excelled. During that time he had the loyal support of his dear wife Helen. John and Helen were devoted to each other, and were married for fifty three years. Helen pre-deceased John by only two and a half months, following a very long illness.

To JJ's surviving son Cameron, and his family, we extend our sincerest sympathy.

Vale John Jones, you were a great Australian, your service and contribution to Surf Life Saving will never be forgotten by surf life savers everywhere, and particularly by your mates at Cronulla SLSC. I was proud to know you, and even prouder to be considered a friend.

VALE - KING MICHAEL FITZGERALD

King Michael Fitzgerald was born in June 1927 to Louise and Thomas. He was one of five children with two older sisters, Bernice and Dorothy, an older brother, Jack and a younger brother, Robert. He grew up and spent his early years at Leichardt before his family moved to Gymea Bay and then to Cronulla where he then stayed for the rest of his life.

Mick joined North Cronulla SLSC in 1945. He became a boat rower and rowed in the North Cronulla "B crew" and the "A crew" and he told some good stories of rowing in big seas.

Mick saw the light and in 1958 he joined Cronulla SLSC Where he remained a Member for the rest of his life. Some recollections of Mick's early days include:

- He was renowned as a fit young man, a fine example of the male physique, possibly one of the fittest blokes around. He was also a good and enthusiastic football player not quite making selection in a grade team. He would have loved to play for St George.
- As a single man, he fitted into and was almost adopted by several Surf Club families.
- Mick himself would tell stories of trips to the snowfields, golf trips, days at the races or other holidays or weekends away with Club Members
- Many of his friends have made observations on a young Mick's natural ability in working the beach with a special talent for conversations with young female beach goers, in particular off duty nurses.
- And he was a great punter all of his life. He'd bet on most things.

Mick became the Resident Member at Cronulla in 1974 and he remained in that position and lived in the surf club from that time until he left us in his fortieth year as Resident Member. He carried this role with a great commitment to our Club and a great knowledge of its procedures and traditions. He knew what had to be done and how it should be done. He knew everybody and greeted and spoke with most people whenever he saw them. He was also a fierce guardian of the Club premises and property. Our young cadet and junior members in particular will have fond memories of Mick's approaches to them when in the Change Rooms or when they were rinsing off using the hoses in front of the Club sheds.

The range of duties performed by our Resident Member was quite extensive - from opening and closing, checking the security of the premises, setting up furniture, providing access for meetings of Members, tradesmen and visitors, cleaning, receiving deliveries, general maintenance, reporting faults, providing advice whether requested or otherwise, hounding cadets and juniors and, of course, annoying the office staff. Basically, almost everybody who dealt with our Club met and knew Mick.

Mick had close relationships with many Club Members but two standout. The first is with Bill Eadie, our late and respected Life Member. They had a special relationship borne of years spent as friends and club mates. Bill was one of the few people that Mick would immediately pay heed to. The other, of course, was with Jenny and Robyn who run our Club's daily operations from our Office. Mick would drop in daily - several times - and improve productivity with his presence and comments. If you saw Mick downstairs he would say "I'm just going upstairs to see my mother." They cared for him and that went beyond simple concern with Jenny and Robyn helping organise various aspects of his life. Mick, in turn, cared for them deeply and would do anything for them or to help them.

In recent years, for the obvious reasons of age, Mick was not able to perform all of his duties as well as



he once had. Some of these the Club made alternate arrangements for, which was something he only begrudgingly accepted. But he was still prepared to offer advice to or on the people now entrusted with his tasks. Mick received a lot of help with other things around the place from some of his very good friends and when they were in or around the Club doing their jobs he would turn up to help them or give the benefit of his advice.

Mick's health fluctuated a lot in recent years with gout, diabetes, a few mystery illnesses and most recently, a cancer scare with a diagnosis of lymphoma. But he always recovered and despite his frail appearance he maintained his level of activity and independence.

Still, many of us were concerned for his situation as he obviously aged despite this independence. He lived on the top floor of a three story building and walked two stories of stairs several times a day and still tried to do a range of physical jobs.

There were many discussions amongst ourselves and with him about what he would do if he couldn't get around and look after himself inside the Clubhouse.

He had faith that he would just move along one day - but that day didn't seem to ever come, or even move closer until, one day, he just left the building.

It is fortuitous that when something did happen, Mick was sitting in our Club Office with the person he humorously, but maybe with a bit of insight, referred to as his mother. So he got the immediate care that he needed.

When Mick was sick during his final days his long and good friendships came to the fore.

At St George Hospital a nurse commented "For a man with little family he has a lot of visitors."

At Thomas Holt we were told "We have never had anybody staying here who had as many visitors as King."

A man can do worse than have a lot of friends

King Michael Fitzgerald was friend to everyone. He was a cranky old man at times and he was a terror to strangers and cadets. He loved company and to have a good time with friends. He cared deeply for his friends and would do anything within his reach for them. He was a hardworking, independent, strong man who despite his small stature still set the standard in his late years. For many of us, he was possibly the single most constant factor in Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club for forty years.

Michael Fitzgerald was a great Cronulla man.

<u>FOREIGN CORRESPONDENT -</u> VIETNAM

In August 2014, I travelled to DaNang to assist Cudgen Headland SLSC Life Member David Field to train Members of Surf Life Saving Vietnam (SLSV), taking with me donated equipment I had procured including pocket masks from Cronulla SLSC.

Over a very intense four day period we ran a number of lifesaving activities including: -

- Community Emergency Care Course. This initiative is part of SLSV's drive to connect with the local community and improve first responder capability. The course was well received and feedback has been positive and has been repeated every second month since.
- DaNang Nippers (which starts at 6.00 a.m. due to the heat and the Vietnamese sun sense) is a small group with ages ranging from eight to 18 years. I conducted a swimming workshop for older members in a resort swimming pool while others practiced on old donated Nipper boards. SLSV is hoping to grow this number in coming years.
- Training public lifeguards in DaNang. This 90 strong lifeguard team has effective beach management but low level rescue and ocean skills. Over the summer months this beach has daily usage in excess of 80,000 people (most of them non swimmers) and lifeguards use traditional fishing craft in rescues. If you get the opportunity I suggest that you have a look at this demonstration of a Thung Boat rescue https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Zu8LAye62kw

SLSV supports the Son Tra Lifeguards as a humanitarian project, and is funded through providing commercial training to local hotels and resorts.

To promote surf lifesaving, the inaugural Festival of the Sea was organised for September and I was privileged to be part of the first Surf Lifesaving Carnival held at DaNang beach with 83 competitors from several South East Asian countries giving it their all to the delight of the locals and the media.

In April 2015 a group of lifesavers from New South Wales and Queensland came to Vietnam to assist the lifesaving effort and enjoyed a tour of the country. Darryl and Jenny Easton from Cronulla and their boys arrived on tour bringing with them two retired rescue boards - a very generous donation from Cronulla SLSC that will be put to good use on DaNang beach.

Highlights of the tour included a moving Anzac Day dawn service at Long Tan, a ceremonial return of surf lifesaving to the beach at Vung Tau, where the first patrols and carnivals were held while Australian troops took R and R during the Vietnam War, training lifeguards at a major resort beach in Nha Trang and of course the second Festival of the Sea at DaNang before heading north to HaNoi and its highlands.

Team Cronulla was well represented at the carnival by Daryl and Angus Easton and Tony and Caitlin Coffey.

Another mini Carnival was held in Nha Trang in July with competitors from Son Tra Lifeguards as well as resort lifeguards forming teams. It is great to see the enthusiasm continuing to grow.

I will continue my involvement with SLSV and Son Tra Lifeguards into the future and encourage Cronulla members to do the same.

I am very pleased to report that Cronulla SLSC is now widely known and highly regarded by the lifesaving community in the district and any member travelling to Da Nang need only mention that they are from Cronulla they will be treated like family.

FOREIGN CORRESPONDENT - BALI

I am thrilled to be reporting again on the surf life saving movement in Bali and greater Indonesia as a Cronulla SLSC Foreign Correspondent and am pleased to say that things are looking better than ever!

Since last year's annual report I am pleased to say that all three Nipper programs in Bali are continuing successfully and in early July 2015 the first ever Bali Interclub Nipper Competition was held on Kuta Beach. This involved members from all three Bali Nipper programs - Balawista Kuta, Balawista Canggu and Lebih Surf Club. It was a fantastic day with children competing in beach flags, beach sprint, the wade, surf race and board race. With over 80 children registered in the competition it will be great to see this become an annual event for the Nippers every year. The overall champion club was Lebih Surf Club but Nippers challenged them til the end from Kuta and Canggu.

Rewinding, earlier in the season several lifequards were selected for the Balawista Badung - Team Bali, who travelled to France to compete at the World Life Saving Championships 2014. It was a huge effort for many of the athletes to travel this far, some having never been off the Island of Bali let alone on a huge A380 plane for 15hours! There was a larger team from Balawista Badung and a smaller one-man team from Lebih Surf Club. The stand out event for the lifeguards was the beach flags where several qualified through to the quarterfinals and one member through to the semi-finals. Due to my work with the Nipper program, lifeguard training and water safety education, I was selected as a finalist in the Humanitarian Role Model Award category. I may have

The start of the 2015 marked the fifth season of the first Nippers program in Bali, held on Kuta Beach in 2010. It also marked the two year anniversary of Lebih Surf Club and Balawista Canggu Nippers. There are many dedicated people in each of these clubs that ensure their continuing success. These people range from Bali locals, expat community members and many of you, Cronulla SLSC members, who come to visit, donate time and equipment to the Nipper Surf Life Saving Movement in Bali and continue to support me.

Several of our Cronulla SLSC members may have also met some of Team Bali when they travelled out to the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships and competed in the 100th Aussie Titles. It has been a great journey and one that I can look back on and be proud of. There are too many to name but \boldsymbol{I} want to say a big thank you to everyone for their support! Bali will always be a special place for me and I will continue to be involved and provide advice to all surf life saving programs in Bali and other parts of Indonesia. It has been a great pleasure to represent Cronulla SLSC and I hope the relationship with Bali will continue in the years to come.

CRONULLA SHORT COURSE SURF CARNIVAL

On Saturday, 22 November 2014 over 1000 surf club members representing twenty three Clubs from as far afield as Newcastle to the Shoalhaven attended Cronulla SLSC's 4th Annual Short Course Carnival.

For the first time in Sydney Branch a junior, youth, open and master's carnival was conducted as one event and on the one day.

Caltex, Coca Cola and 7 News as well as Life Member Frank Doran sponsored the Carnival. In addition, support was received from Vici, Engine, Catfish, Affiniti Living, Ohana, Get Hooded, Lunacy, Mango and SharkSkin.

The weather and surf conditions were ideal and the carnival was complemented by a festival atmosphere on the beach and in the park and featured BBQs, Snow Cones and other community and supporter stalls.






PHOTO RE-ENACTMENT AND WOODEN BOARD DISPLAY

Saturday 14th February 2015, an event was held at our Club the likes of which will never happen again.

The iconic photo that was taken on our beach in 1955 of 14 members of our Board Section holding their hollow 16ft boards was re-enacted 60 years later.

Incredibly, ten of the original participants were available and the remaining four were represented by family or close friends.

Unbeknown to the participants in the original photo, Australian surf culture was about to change in a way they never thought was possible and our Club was at the forefront of this momentous development.

Just one year later a team of American paddlers and surfers arrived one Friday night for a Civic Reception hosted by our Club before they travelled on to Torquay to compete in the International Surf Carnival that was held to coincide with the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne. After the official engagements were complete the Americans, who included such famous names as Greg Noll, a noted big wave pioneer and the first to surf Pipeline and Tom Zahn, the quintessential Californian beach boy who had dated Marilyn Monroe, unveiled their Malibu boards and took them out to surf Cronulla Point. The Cronulla members who were there that afternoon vividly remember the effect this immediately had on those present. The boards had never been surfed before in Australia. It was to change not only surf clubs, but it could be argued, Australian culture forever and it happened at OUR Club.

The significance of this event, its impact and Cronulla Surf Lifesaving Club's role in it has never been fully acknowledged. The organisers of the re-enactment, Michael Banister and James Young, were invited by the organisers to run the event as part of the Surfretrospect festival which was being held to celebrate Duke Kahanomoku's introduction of surfing to Cronulla in 1915.

In conjunction with the photo re-enactment a wooden surfboard exhibition was held in the Clubhouse. Many members of the Cronulla surfing fraternity, including Jackson Surfboards and local legends such as Dave Wilson, Glen Pringle, Jeremy Macpherson, Neil Stenhouse, Wanda Surf Club, Barry Regan and Mark Reilly lent their

board collections. The evolution of local surf craft from wooden slabs to "toothpicks" to locally made Malibu's made an extremely impressive and interesting display. This display, held in the Bill Marshall OAM Ballroom attracted over 1,000 viewers over two days.

An informative talk was held in the Ballroom hosted by Stuart Nettle, the editor of online surfing website Swellnet, who facilitated discussion around the local surf scene before the cultural explosion that occurred after the introduction of Malibu's, the development of the local surf industry and the characters who were in attendance. It was standing room only in our historical Ballroom. Talk participants included Barry Regan, John Salmon, Nigel Dwyer, Garry Birdsall and Brian Jackson.

The day was a roaring success with many Members', old and new, renewing friendships and reminiscing. Notable attendees such as Patron Emeritus Barry Ezzy, Patron Geoff Forshaw and President Rob Short were seen enjoying the occasion.

SLSNSW RESCUE OF THE MONTH

CRONULLA SLSC MEMBERS: RICHARD 'BLUEY' GARNSEY & JON LAVERS SLSNSW RESCUE OF THE MONTH - NOMINEES FOR SLSNSW RESCUE OF THE YEAR TO BE ANNOUNCED 29TH AUGUST 2015 **RESCUE 7.00 A.M. 12 DECEMBER 2014** CRONULLA BEACH. HUGE SEAS

As I got to work at 6.45 a.m. I walked into the First Aid room when a group of body boarders yelled out that a swimmer was in trouble 30 metres off the south end of the beach in a large rip. The surf at this time was about two metres in the corner. I radioed in hoping that someone would hear me that I was going in for a rescue - this was at 6.50 a.m.

I reached the male patient and brought him back to shore where he was o.k. but a little shocked and out of breath. Then, when putting the board back in the rack on the beach another man ran down from Cronulla point to me saying that two guys had been drifting off the Point about 500 metres out to sea and one of them did not have a board.

I ran to the First Aid room and grabbed the binoculars and pin pointed the two guys. By this time they were heading north waving for help. I radioed again to the Supervisor, gave him the relevant information and then headed out to sea to rescue them on my rescue board.

I was the only Lifeguard at Cronulla at this time of the morning, the surf was huge with the sets pushing two metres on the shore and bigger. As I moved out though the break trying to pin point the two patients I saw them getting picked off by a three metre set rolling them four times. I was soon out the back but still had about another one kilometre to paddle to get to them.

During this time the Supervisor had placed the Jet Bike on to the beach and had lifeguard Jon Lavers come from Wanda to assist on the Jet Bike. By now I had made it to the two men, a father and son, who had been surfing off the Point when the father's leg rope snapped.

Fortunately they stayed together, however, both were not great swimmers. The father was out of breath and was very distressed thinking he was going to drown, as was the son. In the meantime we were getting smashed buy three to four metre swells.

I calmed both of them down as much as I could but due to the huge sea conditions we had to move north about another 500 metres. This meant going through some bigger waves. At this time I had the father on my rescue board and the son paddling next to me keeping them both calm at all times - well, at least trying to anyway.

The father at this time repeatedly said he didn't have any energy to get back to shore and was completely out of breath as he was exhausted. He said he couldn't go under another wave. I tried to keep him at all times assured that we would be o.k., to hang in there as help was on the way.

At this time as I looked out to sea and saw a set about 100 metres away starting to stand up. I told the son to roll his board and dive as deep as he could because, at that moment I knew that we were going to get cleaned up by this set of waves as we were now about one kilometre off shore.

I jumped onto the back of the patient who was on my board and wrapped my arms and legs around him praying not to lose him and told him to just hang on as tight as he could to the straps. We then rolled the board under the wave as it stood up to about three metres plus in size. Holding on to the patient and the board we popped up in the white water still together. Thank God, as we had been out in the surf now for 30 minutes but it felt like one hour going under at least six sets.

Finally and at last, Jon had arrived on the Jet Bike. We were all stoked as he battled though the four metre swell for 10 to 15 minutes. As soon as he got to us we put the father onto the back of the Jet Bike and as another set was coming Jon and the father just got out of the way of the wave. But this wave smashed the son and me washing us both around like rag dolls. I just had to do my best keeping the son afloat and calm while we were out at sea as he had no energy to paddle or get back in the four metre swell.

After another 15 minutes John dropped the father back to shore he returned through the huge seas on the Jet Bike to pick the son up, who, by this time was very tired. We put him on the Jet Bike and after discarding his board at sea, Jon dropped him back to shore leaving me out at sea.

I then started to paddle back to the safe area in the middle of the Bate Bay but was still about one kilometre off the beach still getting picked off by huge heavy four metre sets. John returned on the Jet Bike to pick me up and we headed back to

The whole rescue took over 50 minutes out at sea. This incident could have turned out very different with the dangerous and huge seas on this (Big Friday) at Cronulla Beach.

Both men later told me that another five minutes alone in the huge seas the father was ready to give up, the father also told me that he had broken some of ribs from the wipe out at the Point but he didn't feel a thing at the time.



DIRECTOR OF COACHING REPORT

The 2014/15 Season saw the implementation of the Club's new Coaching and Competition Pathway from under 8 through to Opens. The goal of the Pathway is to unite Nipper and senior training under one structure.

From a training perspective, we had a separation of ability levels to ensure the athletes at each level are reaching their athletic potential. The Nipper training was split into beginners, intermediate and advanced training groups. This ensured that each group were able to focus on the skill development required for continuous improvement. In the seniors, the under 14 and under 15 competitors were given their own dedicated coaches to ensure a smoother transition from the Nipper competition that provided an opportunity to develop at their own pace.

Also under the new structure, our Cadet and Junior Members have been given the opportunity to learn additional coaching and training skills by helping train the Nippers. These development coaches are learning how to be future leaders of the Club, and what it takes to be a coach. In this way we are hoping to develop our next generation of coaches for the Club.

Finally, from an administration point of view, we saw the introduction of 'TeamApp', the Club's new coaching and competition communication system. Everything from training programs, news updates, carnival entries and live results are posted on TeamApp. The app has streamlined the coaching and training activities into one simple solution.

We definitely won't stop here, and have some exciting developments in the pipeline for next Season. Watch this space.

Training for next season has already started, with very strong attendance (especially to pasta night) to each session.





TREASURER'S REPORT

The Financial Statements for the year disclose an operating surplus of \$174,905 which was an improvement over prior periods and in accordance with our budgets. Our operations generated cash flows totalling \$289,932 and these were applied for the payment of plant and equipment of \$77,954 and an increase in our cash deposits bringing the total of cash and short term deposits to \$1,124,972 at year end.

The Shark Island Swim was again the Club's major fundraising event and I would like to thank the committee and all the volunteers on the day which made this event a success. Our thanks also go to the sponsors who generously support this event and to 7 NEWS for their coverage and promotion of the swim. The 200 Club was again a successful day and whilst the golf day income appears down that is only due to the event date being just after our year end. The donations received were substantially greater this year and that was due to a donation of \$20,000 received from the Estate of Micky Fitz.

The Club is in a strong financial position which will enable it to proceed with the building redevelopment. Our tenants have all renewed their leases and have requested further options for renewal. I am confident that the incoming management committee will maintain the diligence that has enabled the Club to get to the position it is in.

I would like to thank the office administration team of Jenny, Robyn and Emma for their assistance and dedication to ensure that the Club runs smoothly. I am stepping down as Treasurer this year and I would like to take this opportunity to thank those who have been on the Management Committee during my time as Treasurer and in particular Kevin and Sandra Neilson, Greg Holland, Matt Bruce, Emma Larssen, Paul Larssen, Kieran Day, Brad Turner and Rob Short who have all been part of the Club's Executive during that period. They have been a pleasure to work with.
