



MICHAEL BANISTER'S MERITORIOUS AWARD

On Sunday 1st of January 2012 at approximately 7 p.m., Club Member, Michael Banister and his family after parking their car at the southern end of Prince Street, North Cronulla started walking along the Esplanade south towards Cronulla Beach. As they walked, Michael noticed a group of approximately ten people playing on a sand bank close to the shore. Two of this group were further out and had jumped into a large hole not realizing they had jumped into a rip. They managed to drift south with the rip onto an outer bank where they were able to stand.

It was at this stage Michael said to his wife Sue that they were in a dangerous place. Michael and his family continued their walk and made it to the Alley Rock Pool when Michael noticed that two of the group was trying to swim back to the inner bank across the gully that had formed a strong rip. They were not strong swimmers and started to struggle, but they were lucky enough to get back to the outer bank. At this point Michael became concerned about their safety. He decided to return to North Cronulla, while his wife Sue continued on to collect the children who had run ahead to Cronulla.

As Michael started walking back, two of the swimmers attempted to swim back to the inner bank again. They started to struggle as the rip seemed to be stronger. At this stage Michael summed up the situation and formed a plan for rescuing the two. He noticed an old boogie board left at the southern end of the wall about 100 metres from the inner bank. He thought he would use that as his second option. His first option was to get a rescue board and others to help from North Cronulla Surf Club, so he ran there but found it locked, and no one in attendance. The Patrol had left the beach, as it was after Patrol hours. By the time he ran back over the hill next to the lifeguard tower, four members of the group had jumped into the gully to try to help the first two. By now they had also found themselves in difficulties.

Michael then raced to the boogie board and ran across the inner bank ordering the rest of the group back to the beach. He jumped into the rip; the first girl he reached was a non swimmer and was just going under. He struggled with her at first as she was panicking and trying to climb on to him.

They were both swept further out to sea where he got the second person, also a non-swimmer. The next two were able to tread water but were very weak. At this stage Michael had lost sight of another one of the group as he had initially counted six in the group. He then got the stronger of the men to help him kick across to the fifth person who was the one of the two who initially went in. He tried to calm all of them and two were able to help him kick. Now there were five, plus himself, holding the first girl, however, they were all able to hang onto the boogie board. It was then that he saw that the sixth person had made it back to the outer bank. He then had to kick out of the rip and back to the outer bank. After sometime they all got onto the outer bank where they could stand in knee deep water.

Michael then looked for the sixth man who he thought had made it back to the beach, but he again had been caught in the rip and was much further out than what the first five had been. Michael told the five to stand together on the outer bank, and not to move until he got back. He used the rip and boogie board again. The man was now a long way out and he lost sight of him on two occasions. When Michael finally reached the this person, the patient was very weak and unable to hang on, so Michael used the board rescue technique to get him back to the outer bank, where the other five had remained as instructed. This took some time to negotiate the heavy swell. Michael then ferried the six back from the outer bank individually though the rip to the beach.

Michael Banister's extraordinary effort showed a tremendous awareness of the situation at hand, and he displayed an outstanding amount of skill and courage. Michael's actions were described by an independent eye witness who said,

"Michael repeatedly placed his own life in danger in this heroic rescue, and without his efforts, six persons would have undoubtedly drowned that day".

Michael's history within the Club goes back a long way from when he joined the senior Club in 1981, following a long career in the Crays. He was born in 1967, being the second son of Peter and Moira Banister, who were Cronulla Club stalwarts from the early fifties. Peter, a distinguished surf lifesaver was later to become a Life Member of our Club, and Moira was a member of the Auxiliary Committee for many years.

Michael has had a long and excellent record within the Club, being a competent competitor and a dedicated surf lifesaver. He was a popular Patrol Captain for six years. He has served the Club well as an administrator, as he's been a member of the Management Committee for seven years. Before gaining admission to NSW Fire and Rescue, which is his present occupation, he was a Life Guard with Sutherland Shire Council for five years, patrolling and working on the beaches of Bate Bay.

All of the above experience no doubt played an important part in Michael's actions in saving these people from drowning on Sunday the 1st January 2012.

Michael Banister's actions on this day are a wonderful testament to the extensive training surf lifesavers throughout the world receive. Cronulla SLSC and the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia are justifiably proud of Michael for his untiring effort to save six people from certain drowning.

In recognition of Michael's heroic rescue, and on the recommendation of our Club, Surf Life Saving Australia decided to award him their second highest award for bravery, the Meritorious Award, Individual Certificate of Merit with Bronze Insert.

Michael Banister is the epitome of what the Cronulla Club perceives to be a model member. He has triumphed as a competitor, he is a competent and dedicated surf lifesaver who is prepared to risk his own life to save others, and he has made a significant contribution to the Club's administration.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Once again I find myself in this unenviable position as I sit down to put fingertips to keyboard (for the e-minded lot) for this, my fourth Annual Report. It is my hope that it will contain a comprehensive record of events of the past season and from what I've read and present to you, I can only say that the contributions from Section Heads and Committee Convenors have done just that and I commend them.

Much has happened during this past season.

There are a few things that come to mind and obviously some that are forgotten.

So I shall take the opportunity to apologise for the latter now.

Council works on the promenade were finally completed just in time for the summer season and after the pain and suffering endured by all, the completion has made the beach precinct a hub of endless and varied activity. The Complex, 'barefoot on the beach' and Zimzala are reaping the benefits of the upgrade and really, where else in the world would you rather be than on the promenade at Cronulla Beach?

Perhaps the season didn't start too well for us competitively. With some competitors making a move for financial gain, others moved for different reasons. Sometimes the old adage 'the grass is greener on the other side' is not necessarily the case and perceived changes for the better are not always realised. Historically, the Cronulla Surf Lifesaving Club is renowned for its nurturing and production of some great champions and whilst we acknowledge and accept members' departures, we are also only too happy to welcome them with open arms should they choose to return.

The introduction of a Director of Coaching is paying dividends and together with the Coaching & Competition Committee, the Club and members are beginning to benefit from the fruits of their labour. The results at the back of this report are a worthy read and considering the age of most competitors, there is no doubt that the direction we are heading is positively onwards and upwards.

Elevation to that of Life Member in any organisation is rarely given. One of the criteria is that the member 'rendered distinguished service to the Club'. It was at the 106th AGM last year that this was bestowed upon Frank Doran. A long, standing ovation was given, which was testimony to the appreciation offered by all in attendance. A well deserved honour for an outstanding Club member.

The 106th Annual Report had just been 'put to bed' when the announcement was made that Club member Nathan Smith had been inducted into the NSW Hall of Fame. Nathan is one of the greatest Ironmen NSW has seen. He created a surf lifesaving milestone in 2005 when he won the NSW Ironman Championship for the fifth consecutive year – six titles in total.

An outstanding year for some Life Members of our Club began with the Australia Day Honours Awards.

For former Ironman champion John Holt it was a most pleasant day. John is regarded as one of Australia's greatest ironmen and was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for his service to sport, particularly through surf lifesaving, ironman and triathlon competitions and administration.

For Life member Dick Bignold the year was one to remember. During the season Dick was appointed by SLSA to the position of Board Appointed Chair of Sport for a two-year term. This is the highest sport position

within SLSA and it is an outstanding achievement. Dick was also awarded the Surf Life Saving Australia President's Medal for his most significant and outstanding service to surf lifesaving.

'Aussies' at Scarborough Beach WA, saw the elevation to that of Life Member SLSA for Club Life Member Ian Goode. Ian has served on both Surf Sports Boards and Board of Junior Activities across all levels of the organisation and has held roles as Referee, Coach and Team Manager at Club, Branch, State and National levels.

A most successful partnership forged with building development company PAYCE, saw an initial sponsorship of the prestigious Shark Island Swim race for the first year extended for a further four. This will enable the club to plan for the immediate future without any financial concerns.

Coogee Beach on April 27th was the scene of the unveiling of an Anzac Day monument for those fallen lifesavers that made the ultimate sacrifice for their country. There is to be a second stage to the memorial with a wall listing the names of all lifesavers that died serving Australia during war. This is due for completion in time for the Anzac centenary in 2015. Life Member Ken English represented the Club on this most solemn occasion and at present is compiling a list of Cronulla SLSC members to be placed on the memorial.

There are those in the club that go about their business in a somewhat covert way. I don't mean 'sneaky' necessarily, but as quiet achievers. One in particular is the Ski Vice-Captain, Michael Roye. The nature of the group's disabilities can make participating in mainstream sport very difficult, so this was intended to create an environment which is supportive of their individual needs and one which they are able to compete against others with similar ability to themselves.

Like all of our Crays the Black Caps are competitive and love to win, this group is able to provide a more level playing field, a space in which their disability is not a barrier to them participating in sport.

The returning Black Caps from last season had improved out of sight with the group's favourite activities being flags, wade and board paddling.

Over the weeks we watched their skills and confidence soar as they began diving for flags, paddling their boards independently and coming together as a team. This year the Black Caps also joined in with other age groups for a number of activities.

The benefits of the Crays program for this group went much further than being on the sand on Sunday mornings. For many, it improved their strength, coordination and balance, all areas in which children with cerebral palsy can have difficulties. It also created an environment for both the children and parents to meet others who are in a similar position to themselves and build these relationships.

As Black Cap leaders we couldn't be prouder of each and every single member of the group. The determination and eagerness they showed each week was incredible and the improvements we saw each week made every Sunday morning with them worthwhile. The sportsmanship they showed when competing against and with other Crays' groups was truly inspiring. Each week they showed up with a smile ready to go taking on whatever challenges we threw at them.

Thanks must go to the Black Caps and their parents for another successful season.

Once again if anyone has any interest in this area and would like to be involved helping and running the group we would love to hear from you. Lastly we would like to thank Cronulla SLSC for supporting another season of the Black Caps.

<u>CHIEF GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT</u>

Gear preparation proceeded very well this year and Gear Inspection Day was a great sunny Cronulla day giving us a chance to present our patrol, water safety and training equipment in a grand fashion.

The IRB display and equipment laid out in the Ballroom, Training Room and Monro Room always looks quite spectacular. If you have not seen it you should drop in on next season's inspection day and have a look. This year was no exception and the display of equipment passed successfully, ensuring we were ready for another season.

All of Cronulla's equipment was prepared, repaired, renewed and submitted for the inspection held on Sunday 8th September 2013. The gear submitted included:

18 Rescue Boards 2 Stretchers 36 Rescue Tubes Patrol Area & Tent 9 Radios Patrol Uniforms 4 Oxy-Viva Kits Board & Tube Stands 2 Patrol First Aid Kits Signal Flags & evacuation (Shark) Flags 1 Club First Aid Kit 13 Resuscitation Mannequins 9 Spinal Collars 2 Trainer Defibrillators 3 Spinal Boards & Straps 5 TRBs 2 Defibrillators 5 Outboard Motors 4 Suction Equipment Sets 7 Trailers

A single inspection team of dedicated Sydney Branch Officials visits all clubs in the Branch over one weekend. Following the inspection we supplied refreshments to the inspection team before they set off for the long trek into the National Park beaches. The following members helped prepare the club gear and premises for the start of the season - Col Haywood, Rob Short Jr., Ken English, Bryan Wild, Brian Dalgarno, Carlo Villanti, Daniel Wood, Mitchell Barber and Chris Barber.

Purchases of replacement equipment this season were high, but not unreasonably so. This is important equipment and well worth the expense. Excluding IRB items, the expenditure this season was a little over \$17,000. This was made up of \$13,300 Club outlay plus \$3,670 of subsidised items. This included board repairs (\$1190), radio servicing (\$490), oxy-viva and resuscitation manikin servicing (\$883), ten new rescue tubes (\$1118), three new rescue boards (\$4195), one new radio (\$699), new training mannikins (\$210), resuscitation, spinal management and defibrillator items (\$890), first-aid supplies (\$720) and miscellaneous expenditure (\$530). We also purchased some uniforms and rash shirts (\$825) and patrol caps (\$1580). Surf Life Saving Australia provided \$2335 from the DHL subsidy to purchase most of our patrol uniforms and we were fortunate to receive a further \$1335 equipment subsidy from the SLSNSW Equipment Grant

Once again this season, every patrol member was supplied with a reversible Club-Patrol cap as part of their uniform allocation and we managed to find a spray jacket for each newly qualified lifesaver. New Patrol Captains were supplied with a heavy duty SLSA patrol jacket and peaked cap. We also purchased rash shirts for all IRB drivers and crewpersons. We believe that this is very worthwhile support of our patrol members.

This year we had plenty of tents for competition, social and fundraising activities. Col Haywood, who serves as unofficial Radio Officer also gave great support to the management of patrol equipment through the season and his behind

the scenes work has been of enormous help to me and invaluable to the Club. As in the past season, I believe that we have been able to provide Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club with the best possible equipment for patrol, training, competition and community purposes.



On completion of the golf a presentation dinner was held in the Golf Clubhouse.





VALE ARTHUR EARNEST STIRLING

Arthur Earnest Stirling was born on 15 December 1925 and passed away on 14 August 2013. In his youth, while living in Lakemba, he became a fine Rugby League footballer.

Arthur joined Cronulla Surf Club on 4 February 1945. No time is recorded on his record card for his test swim, however, he qualified for his Bronze Medallion on 20 January 1946. These recorded facts may indicate the primary reason why he eventually became a surf boat rower.

Arthur became one of the most proud and loyal members of Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club, never considering a move to another surf club for any reason. He always fiercely retained his positive views of our Club and of our Members. He was never satisfied with any activity he pursued until it was performed to the very best of his considerable ability.

A plumber by trade, Arthur's skills in most trades can be seen at the home he built at Oatley. This huge project was completed while he and his beloved wife, Audrey, were living in the downstairs garage which also served as Arthur's weight lifting gym. This home stands as a legacy to Audrey and their children, Merril (born 1956), Peter (1959) Bradley (1960), and Clayton (1963).

Another passion of Arthur's in later years was that of breeding racing pigeons but although he raced his pigeons he could never beat them!

As a boat rower, Arthur became a member of Cronulla's B crew before his tenacity, determination and skill saw him elevated to the A crew under sweep George Challis. After George Challis retired from sweeping, Nick Dixon took charge of the A crew. During this era only two boat events were conducted at Australian and State Championships, the Senior A's and Junior A's.

Arthur's prowess in the bow seat placed his stamp on Cronulla's crews and because of his short stature he made a detachable extension for his seat so that he could get maximum efficiency from sliding to gain extra power from his legs. He was a member of the crew that won a gold medal in 1953 and a bronze medal the following year at the N.S.W. Championships.

Arthur achieved his ambition in rowing when he rowed bow at the Australian Championships at Bondi in 1957, winning the coveted gold medal.

Despite his fun-loving larrikin streak he never did harm to anyone. Keith Suann has perfectly described Arthur Stirling as "a very special person."

John joined Cronulla Surf Club in 1949 and soon became involved in the Boat Section. Our legendary sweep George Challis got together a Junior Boat Crew of Barry Clapham, John Griffiths, Nick Dixon and Roy Barton. In 1951 this crew won the N.S.W. State Junior Surf Boat Championship. They then travelled to Scarborough Beach, W.A. where the crew won both the Australian Junior Surf Boat Race and the Interstate Junior Surf Boat Race.

John played football for St George Rugby Union Club, together with fellow Cronulla Members Terry McClenaughan, Lance Turbet, Ron Boler and Don Buchan.

John later moved to Western Australia to follow work opportunities. He spent the rest of his eventful life in that state becoming heavily involved in Surf Life Saving. As a member of Sorrento Surf Club, he served as a Committee Delegate, Boat Captain and President.

Whilst in W.A. he also became a member of Trigg Island, Cottesloe and Mullalloo Surf Clubs. He was elected President of Mullalloo Surf Club. He was also appointed to serve on the W.A. Centre Board of Management and went on to become W.A. Director of Competition.

John found time to coach and sweep boat crews at several surf clubs, after first trying his hand at this skill at Cronulla. He put this skill to the test one Christmas Day when a crew was appointed to row a surfboat from Attwell's Boat Shed in Burraneer Bay, where it was being repaired by Laurie Trim, to Cronulla for use at the next day's surf carnival. Only three 'boaties' turned up for the task: John Griffiths, Brian Henderson and Brian O'Donnell. "Griffo" as the senior member, took charge and allowed the two Brians to row all the way!

Throughout his life, John's curly hair, deep suntan and beaming smile portrayed his sense of fun and his dedication to Surf Life Saving.

<u>FOREIGN</u> <u>CORRESPONDENT</u> <u>REPORT – BALI</u>

Greetings once again from the Island of the Gods!

Time again for another update on my activities here in Bali...has a year really passed by? The latter half of last year saw me spend my final six months on the Australian Volunteers for International Development program continuing my work with the Indonesia Surf Life Saving Association (Balawista). What started out initially as a one-year placement in October 2010 has extended somewhat as I come up to my fourth year living and working in Bali.

It was a great last few months working with Balawista. I started a third Nipper program, was part of the inaugural Bali Beach Games, supported many lifeguard training programs, saw the opening of several new lifeguard towers in Bali and helped with the coaching of athletes for various competitions.

One of the great highlights and achievements of my time here in Bali has been the introduction of the Nipper programs of which I have been instrumental. Kuta Nippers began its fourth year in April 2014. Lebih Nippers in Gianyar, about an hour east of Kuta, now have a sponsor and are building their own clubhouse, and the newest Nippers in Canggu, just north of Kuta, started in September 2013. With the help of the local Rotary Club and Canggu Surf Community (CSC), Canggu Nippers now run regularly and it is great to see so many smiling faces on the kids of a Sunday morning.

In August 2013 the inaugural Bali Waterman's Awards night was held. Myself and Made Suparka from Balawista were the only nominees

in two categories for the Nippers program and came away as winners of the General Mentors Award -"for exceptional achievement in mentoring children and young adults in watersports/adventure while encouraging a healthy marine environment". We were, needless to say, extremely proud of this achievement. This year has seen a growth in surf life saving in Indonesia with two new clubs forming in Java and a training program being held in Mentawais. The Indonesia National Championships (Baywatch Competition) was held again this year at Pangandaran Beach in West Java. The competition saw some new teams and clubs join in, including Lebih Surf Club from Gianyar, Bali. They (without any influence from me, I might add) have chosen similar



sky blue, black and white colours to Cronulla SLSC and when I suggested to them to wear the Cronulla cap during the competition they did! There were some very proud moments as they came away as victors winning nearly every event.

Continuing on the competition front, there will be two clubs – Badung Balawista and Lebih Surf Club – attending Rescue 2014 the World Surf Life Saving Championships to be held this year in France during September. It will be the first time there have been two clubs competing from Bali in Interclub events.

Once again the year has seen many Cronulla SLSC members visit Bali including Marty & June Hart whose son was married in Bali, along with Warren & Gail Sawyer, Baden & Jenny Green and of course Paul & Carole Larssen; the little brother Carl Larssen dropped by in August; the Elliott family; Dad's 60th with some Polar Bears on tour including Greg Holland, Glenn Brown, Shrek and the Missile??; the mother Carole visiting in December; the Murray family; Brian & Roz Dalgarno; Phill & Sharyn Hamilton; BamBam & Karla; and Frank & Cathy Doran.

It was great to see so many familiar faces during the year and catching up on the latest news and events from back home. Many of these visitors also acted as 'mules', bringing various Cronulla and surf life saving paraphernalia into Bali to be used by the locals. I can't thank people enough for their generosity and assistance with these items – Brian and his First Aid books and spinal board, the Murray's bringing over 'Little Anne' (kindly donated by the Rofes)plus rashies, Mum and Dad with a dozen tubes and of course Frank Doran's generous donation of 40 brand new pairs of goggles and rashies to be used by our Nippers. Matur Suksema!! These small gestures are helping to give the Balinese, and Indonesia, a boost in swimming and surf life saving. Also thank you to Melissa Seeley and the Cronulla Crays for their donations during the year – some Cronulla Nippers t-shirts, singlets, rashies, shorts and swimmers – most of these have been thankfully received by the kids as they battle it out in Nipper competitions to win these coveted prizes.

After finishing my volunteer placement with Balawista, I was approached by the Canggu Club in Bali to work fulltime as their swim program coordinator and coach. This then led to me becoming SPLASH Water Park Manager, overseeing various parts of the newly constructed water park and children's play area, including training lifeguards, conducting First Aid courses, decking out First Aid rooms and looking after various health and safety issues around the Club. It is quite the change from the local volunteer work I had previously undertaken but is just as rewarding. I still continue to volunteer with Balawista when and where I can and I look forward to watching them grow and develop as lifesaving spreads across the Indonesia archipelago.

Thank you once again to those that have supported me, and Balawista, whilst I have been in Bali. It has been a great experience for me and one that I will always cherish. But alas, I hear the waves on the shores of Cronulla Beach calling... I look forward to seeing you all there one day soon.





Nathan is one of the greatest ironmen NSW has seen. He created a surf lifesaving milestone in 2005 when he won the NSW Ironman Championship for the fifth consecutive year – six titles in total.

As the sole NSW representative in the Australian team at the 2004 World Championships in Italy, Nathan collected a huge haul of medals including five gold, two silver and a bronze medal significantly helping Australia win the World Championships that year.

At the 2005 World Lifesaving Games in Germany, Nathan was the winner in the Open Surf, Board and Board Rescue races. His victories in the Open Surf Race, Open Ski, Board Rescue and Ironman events at the 2006 World Championships in Australia, resulted in the Australian Team being named back to back World Champions.

Nathan was NSW Athlete of the Year in 2004-05.

The Coolangatta Gold is still one scalp he aims to achieve. After five podium finishes, Nathan is continuing that elusive quest and we wish him well.

JOHN HOLT - OAM

John joined Cronulla SLSC in October 1967 as a sixteen year old and was the first the first of many swimmers who emerged from the Ken Wiles "Surf-Swim Squad" based at the Sans Souci Olympic Pool. As a fourteen year old he was Australia's number one ranked 800 metre freestyle swimmer.

The determined Holt and his sky blue, black and white Cronulla cap, became synonymous with National and International surf lifesaving success in a dominant decade between 1967 and 1979 which saw him contest 123 ironman races for a remarkable 95 wins, 11 second places and 8 thirds.

Included among those successes was the elusive Australian open ironman title he finally won in the freezing waters of Victoria's Bancoora Beach in 1977, the first Australian Junior Ironman championship in 1969 and two World crowns, including Australia's first world championship in 1972 and a second in 1974.

John was also a member of four Australian Surf Life Saving Teams between 1971 and 1975 and the NSW team between 1970 and 1978 when he was named Captain of the team.

He was one of five Australian ironmen named among 23 athletes in the inaugural induction in the SLSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

John was also the foundation President of the Cronulla Triathlon Club. John is regarded as one of Australia's greatest ironmen and was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) this year for his service to sport, particularly through surf lifesaving, ironman and triathlon competitions and administration.

Ian Goode has been a member of Cronulla SLSC for fifty-two years.

In that time Ian served as a member of Cronulla SLSC Management Committee for 43 consecutive years and is currently Senior Vice Patron and is a Life Member.

Ian has served on both Surf Sports Boards and Board of Junior Activities across all levels of the organisation and has held roles as Referee, Coach and Team Manager at Club, Branch, State and National levels.

Ian has made a conspicuous contribution to the development of both women and juniors in surf lifesaving.

As Chair of SLSA's Australia's 'Women in Sport 10 Years on Committee', Ian identified the limited opportunities existing for women in sport at the time, promoted the growth of women in surf lifesaving and advocated for equal competition events for women which our members now enjoy.

As the National Board of Junior Activities Competition Coordinator, Ian contributed to the integration of the Board of Junior Activities into Surf Life Saving as a whole and encouraged the development of an integrated Competition Manual that included modified competition for juniors. Ian's involvement assisted to create a more seamless organisation that eased the transition of children into clubs.

This year Ian was elevated to Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Australia for his sustained, distinguished and conspicuous service.

Cronulla SLSC congratulates Ian Goode on his service to all levels of Surf Life Saving and for being awarded SLSA's highest honour.

RICHARD (DICK) BIGNOLD

Dick Bignold has been a member of Cronulla SLSC for fifty-six years.

Dick has been a significant contributor at all levels of surf lifesaving. Over the years Dick's formal roles have included Club Captain, Australian Championship winning R&R Coach, District Life Saving Superintendent, Sydney Branch Competition Director, SLSNSW Director of Surf Sports and SLSA Board of Surf Sports Member.

Dick is a Life Member of Cronulla SLSC and continues to assist the Club on working groups. He is also Deputy Referee of the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships.

During this season Dick was appointed by SLSA to the position of Board Appointed Chair of Sport for a two-year term. This is the highest sport position within SLSA and it is an outstanding achievement and honour for Dick personally and also for Cronulla SLSC.

This year Dick was awarded the Surf Life Saving Australia President's Medal for his most significant and outstanding service to surf lifesaving.

<u>COACHING AND COMPETITION</u> <u>COMMITTEE</u>

The CGC Committee is responsible for setting the guidelines and structure of the coaching and competition within our great club. The committee consists of the Coordinator, Club Captain, Section Heads and what the sub-rules refer to as "other appropriate persons" such as representatives from the Youth Development Committee. Meetings were held on the first Monday of most months throughout the season and have continued on since as we continue with our planning for next season.

The Financial Assistance Scheme was modified this year for Athletes, Coaches and Officials; it is broken down into 7 points below.

- Fund a Director of Coaching. The Coaching and Competition Committee had assigned Anthony Lyon to this position for the 2013/14 and will continue throughout the 2014/15 season. Anthony is a long time competitor and is busy putting together programs and working closely with the selected club coaches to develop our athletes. Anthony has already put together strength and conditioning programs, he has made some changes that you will see in the club gym.
- 2. Discipline coaches to receive club funding and for the 2013/14 season it was in the form of subsidised travel/ accommodation for State and Australian Titles
- 3. Athletes were supplied a subsidised team uniform (e.g. cap, shirt, shorts, warm top) for \$30
- Subsidised craft, equipment & training subsidies were increased from past years up to a maximum of \$30,000
- 5. Athlete travel & accommodation subsidy was supplied for State and Australian Titles
- 6. The subsidy for Club Officials will be on the same format as that for competitors.
- Club payment for repairs to personal craft has been discontinued. The funds previously allocated to this have been diverted to craft and training subsidy. However, consideration will be given to extenuating circumstances.

The requirement for receipt of Craft & Training and State and Australian Travel subsidies is the completion of 30 hours of patrol. Priorities for this season were to increase club moral and consolidate our competitors through our younger members. This year has been about rebuilding our competitive section with the retirement and moving on of so many of our senior competitors. These goals were realised through the tireless efforts of the Section Heads along with the Cadet Captain and Junior Captain.

Our club coaches did a great job throughout the year under the new coaching Director: Bluey Garnsey (board), Anthony Lyon (beach), Kevin Neilson (pool), Garry Allman and David Young (boat), Michael Roye (beginner ski), Mark Simpson and Phill Hamilton (advanced ski) and other helpers.

The State Championships were in early March at Ocean Beach, Umina on the central coast of NSW and we finished a creditable 6th this year.

Our boys; Daniel Karagiannis, Charlie Gluskie, Cody Gaddes and Lachlan Vitnell finished in 4th palce, and our girls; Ngaire Hadfield, Talia Munro, Talei Holmes and Jamyka Blattman topped off our relay performance taking out the gold. Well done all.

For those that could, the Aussies had you travelling to the West to experience the sun setting over the sea – and the amazing flags 'cauldron'. Unfortunately, I was unable to make it across this year, and would like to thank Coach Anthony Lyon and others for supporting the team without me. From what I hear though, everyone enjoyed themselves and performed well.

Individually we saw Charlie Gluskie repeat his performance at State once again finishing just outside the medals with a 4th place in the under 15 men's flags. Kyla King too repeated her State Championship performances taking out 5th in the flags and the bronze medal in the under 17 sprint. Putting this result in perspective, the two girls that beat Kyla in this race are the two most recent Open women's sprint champions – certainly in good company. Ngaire once again also reached the medal stage of the under 15 women's flags and but for a fingertip, nearly took out the title. But a silver medal at an Australian Championships is nothing to sneeze at, and I'm sure there are only bigger things to come. On the relay front, our gold medal winning under 15 relay team from State backed up with a silver medal. Our under 17 women once again backed up in the under 19 relay with a 4th and streaked away for the gold medal in the under 17 relay. This is back to back Aussie titles for these girls, and a fantastic achievement. Well done to everyone who headed across to the West.

At the Aussies, our Club awards a number of members for their efforts and contributions. One of these awards is to the person who makes the greatest contribution to the Beach Section. One of the stories of the Titles for us, was that our under 15 women's beach relay team nearly didn't run. One of our team members was injured, leaving us with three runners. Jamyka Blattman received the call from Sydney, was on a plane to Perth and played a starring role in the silver medal winning team. Without her contribution, this result would not have been possible and it is for this reason she was awarded the Member who gave the greatest contribution to the Beach Section at the Australian Titles. The Club as a whole also provides the Tony Purcell award for the Club Member who provides the greatest contribution to the Club at the Titles. This year, this award also went to a member of the Beach Section. With gold and a bronze medal, plus 4th and 5th places, Kyla King was by far the Club's most successful competitor at the Aussies and a worthy winner of this award.

And that marks the end of another successful season for the Cronulla Beachies. This year has seen me out of action for much of the season and I must thank Coach Anthony Lyon and all the parents who helped guide the team during the time I was away. TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to again be able to report that the Club has returned a surplus and has improved on its financial position. The surplus for the year was \$138,558 which was an improvement on the prior year and in accordance with our budgets. The cash flows generated from the operations totalled \$275,007 and these were applied for the payment of property, plant and equipment of \$112,112 and an increase in our cash deposits of \$162,895 bringing the total cash and short term deposits to \$912,994. During the year there were major renovations to the men's facilities in the Complex and also repairs were carried out to the upstairs area and the boilers in the Complex. This expenditure totalled \$72,638.

This year welcomed two new major sponsors on board, being 7 News and Payce to add to our existing long term sponsors. 7 News have supported the nipper section, the boat section and provided substantial support for the Shark Island Swim via their media portals and segments included in their nightly news report both before and after the event. If you have seen the new promotion for 7 News you will notice that our President Rob Short and the "Barry Ezzy" surfboat feature in the promotional video. Payce have become the major sponsor of the Shark Island Swim and have committed to five years of support for the event. The Shark Island Swim was again our major fundraising event for the year and I would like to also mention the Golf Day, the 200 Club and thank the organising committees for their efforts in running these events which provide substantial funding to the Club.

The Club is in a strong financial position for the future and I am confident that the incoming management committee will maintain the diligence that has enabled the Club to get to where it is at present. As always I would ask that everyone takes the time to review the sponsors that are listed in this report and those that have made donations as these funds contribute substantially to the financial position that we are in.

PRESIDENT'S ADDENDUM

Welcome to the end of another long season for Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club. On first impressions, this looked to be a bit of a mixed season for our Club. Allow me to briefly recount the story of our season.

At our 2013 Annual General Meeting we saw the election of a new Life Member - Francis Patrick Doran. Frank is, as we would expect, a hard working member and is known particularly for his efforts in fund raising and enhancing the image and reputation of our Club. Congratulations Frank.

The accolades for Club Members continued through the season. Life Member, John Holt was conferred with an OAM in the Australia Day Honors List. This was bestowed on John for his lifetime of work in surf sports, triathlon and other sports areas. Life Member, Dick Bignold was awarded the SLSA President's Medal for his long service to surf sports and in particular as a senior official at National level. Life Member and Vice-Patron, Ian Goode was elevated to Life Membership of SLSA for his lifetime of service to Lifesaving in general including contributions to lifesaving, administration, youth development, women in lifesaving and surf sports. Cronulla can only be proud of these members who have each given a lifetime of commitment and dedication to our movement and to our Club.

The passing of Club members and family and friends of Club Members is always a sad occasion. Fortunately, this season we were only called together for this purpose on a few occasions. However, when we did meet we remembered our lost ones with respect and sympathy but also celebrated their lives and our own fond memories.

Your Management Committee and sub-committee meetings have continued as good forums where, at times, vigorous discussion has been promoted to ensure good and measured decision making. The message I gave at the first Management Committee for the season was much the same as last year. We are all volunteers in our Club and give our valuable time freely. However, we still carry the responsibilities of the positions we accept. So, my message was simple - know your role, do your job and allow others to do theirs. I believe that the Management Committee has operated effectively and the sub-committees have met and delivered on their responsibilities.

There are some significant long term, outstanding matters such as the rejuvenation of the Clubhouse and a range of ongoing operational matters. I believe that we will address all of these by continuing to operate in a deliberate but careful manner.

The season start was again impacted by the final stage of Sutherland Shire Council's program to resurface the Esplanade at Cronulla Beach. The work through the 2013 winter affected access to the Club and the local area with a particular impact on training and social activities. However, we survived and our thanks again go to SSC Lifeguards and Council Officers for their support during this time. Work finished on the resurfacing just in time for the commencement of the patrol season and we are now enjoying the benefits of the work - a completely rejuvenated Esplanade - a fantastic gathering place and a fantastic focus point for our community.

A few items of internal works were carried out this season. This was primarily repair and maintenance work in the Sports Complex. This allows this building to continue as a source of revenue for the Club and also as a major community asset.

The District Council operated successfully again this season. Cronulla Life Member and Past President, John Bentley continued in the role of District Chairman and handled his role well within a good team of people from all four local clubs. Thank you John.

Surf Life Saving Sydney (Branch) continued in its active fashion. As well as coordinating life saving and competition activities, this season the Branch continues with the task of a redesign of its own management structure. The final solution is close with a trial model for the next year of a Branch Council comprised of the fifteen Branch Club Presidents and four Branch Executive Officers. The Club Management Committee has been kept informed of developments and proposals.

Our lifesaving ran quite well this season. I congratulate our Club Captain, Kieran Day and our Vice-Captain, Paul Cavanagh on a job well done and commend their reports to you. All patrols appeared to run well and kept our beach a safe. The quality of our patrols was recognized when we were presented the District Patrol Efficiency Award. Well done.

In particular, though, we excelled in lifesaving awards, topping the Branch in several awards. Our instruction was coordinated by Chief Instructor, Kerrie Hammel who stepped in mid season when her predecessor, Sam Barlow unfortunately had to resign due to relocation to the north coast. Thank you to both for a season of good squads and high award numbers.

Our competition season started a little flat with the departure of several senior competitors - some for financial reasons and some for other reasons. Once we got going though, things started looking up. Our remaining senior competitors, our coaches and the section leaders quite literally led from the front and our members in the younger age groups, along with the Opens and U19s, rose to the challenge and trained and competed in a way that could only make every Club member proud. We ended up with exceptional results at the major carnivals with a fifth at Branch, sixth at State and a twenty-second at Aussies. And we put in a solid effort to finish third at the Interclub.

The Club Executive, Brad, Paul, Richard, Kieran and myself remains a tight group. As I wrote last year, we work hard together and we play hard together. We do not always all see things the same way but are all willing to listen and give weight to those who have special knowledge and skills and I believe that we usually make the right decisions or give the right guidance.

I believe that our Club administration operates well. Club Deputy President, Brad Turner bring his breadth of experience in dealing with public matters coupled with his forthright and open manner to the very successful management of Club issues. Our Club Secretary, Paul Larssen is efficient, thorough and a tireless worker in the conduct of the Club's day to day affairs, communications and general administration.
